South Africa - Weather

Harvesting and general fieldwork will advance with few disruptions

- Free State and neighboring winter wheat areas will need to see a boost in rain in June to maintain a good environment for the crop
- Planting will likely advance with few disruptions, though producers may wait for better rainfall to get the rest of the crop in the ground
- Timely rain is still needed to improve Western Cape winter wheat planting and establishment
- Temperatures will remain above average through next Friday
- Daytime highs will peak into the 70s and 80s with pockets warming to the 90s as well
- Overnight lows will be in the 40s and 50s with pockets cooling to the 30s
- Portions of eastern and extreme southern South Africa will only cool to the 60s at times

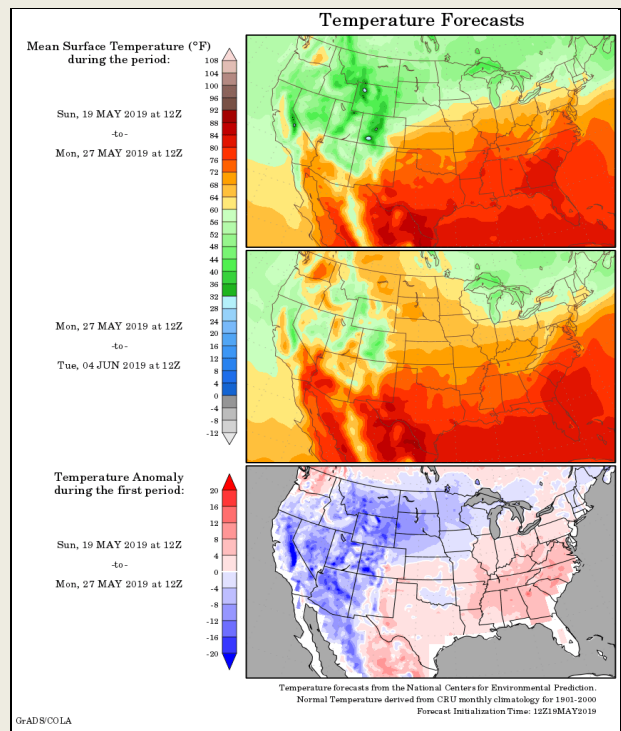
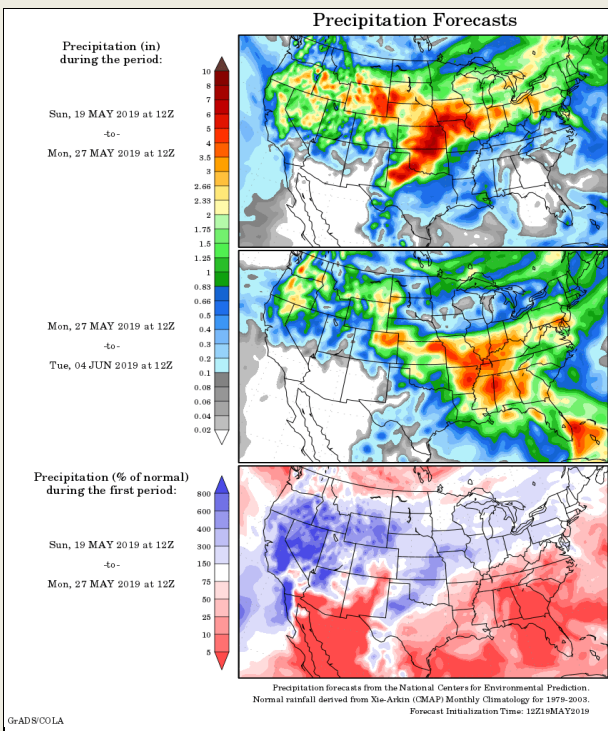
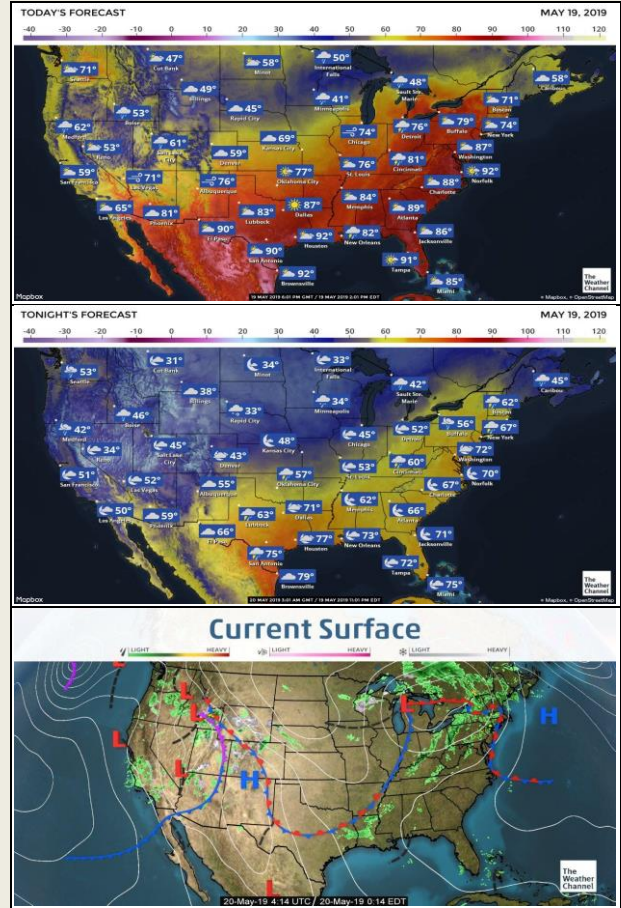
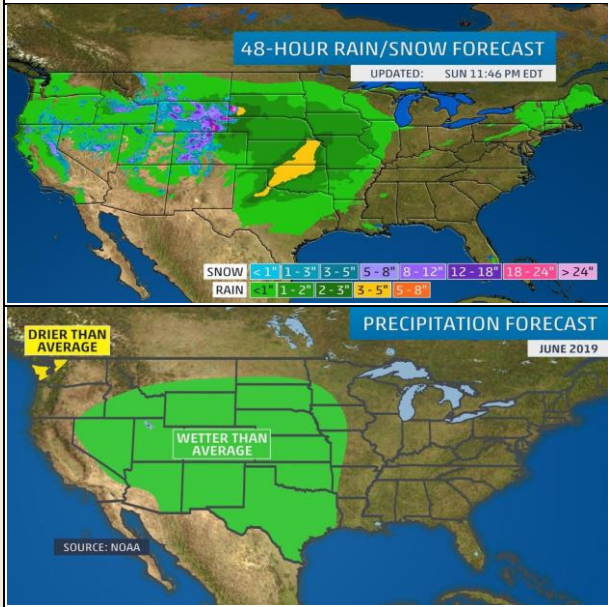

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Many areas in the Midwest will see part to more than a day of dry weather and aggressive planting should occur in many areas before rain increases Saturday. Three rounds of rain will occur by Friday of next week with eastern Kansas to central and eastern Iowa and Wisconsin seeing the heaviest rain and some flooding. Today's forecast is a little wetter for late next week and frequent rounds of showers and thunderstorms from Saturday into the following Friday will stall planting in many western and central areas while some fieldwork should occur in the east where rain will be lighter and less frequent.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Flooding along the Mississippi River will gradually decline in the north through this weekend with more significant declines next week while the river will gradually rise in the south through early next week. Rain is needed from southern Georgia and nearby Florida into portions of southern South Carolina.

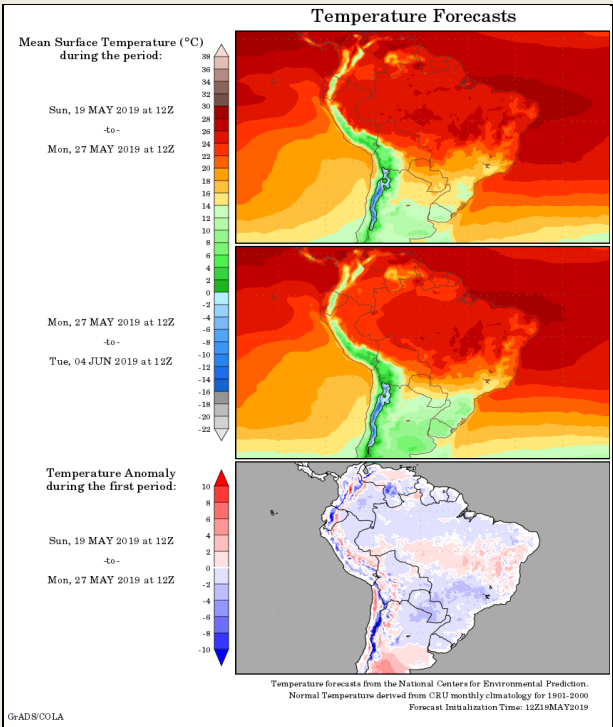
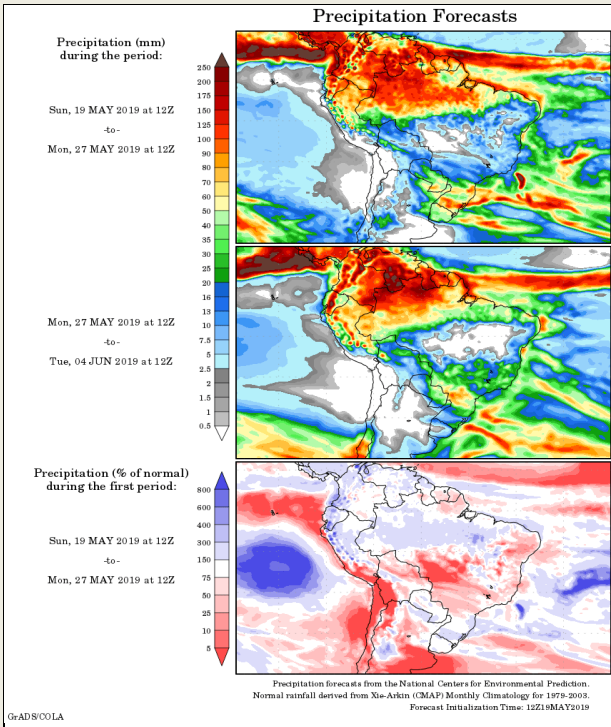
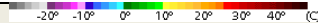
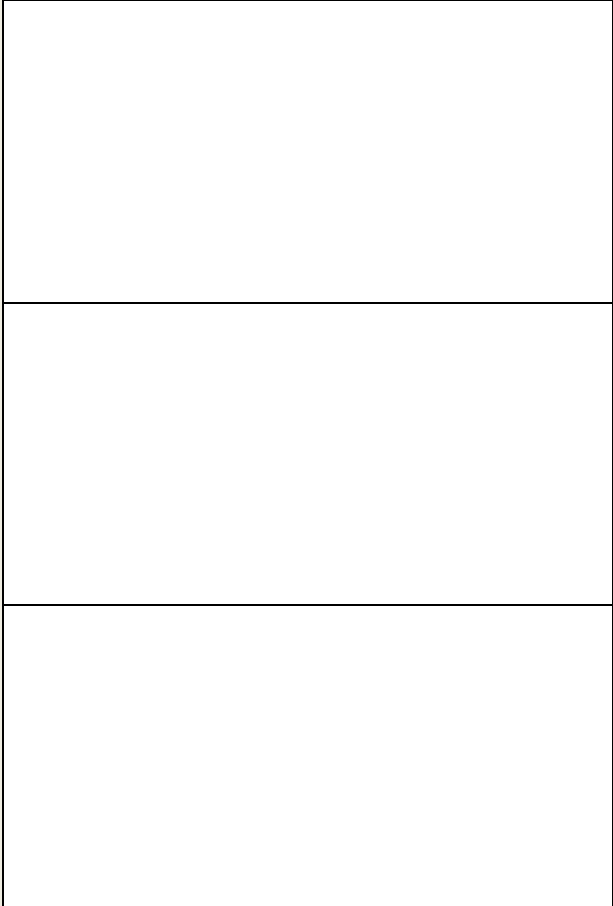
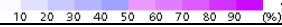
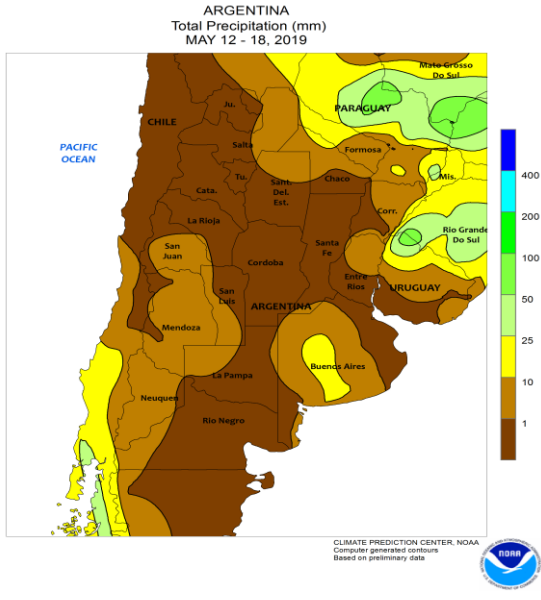

BRAZIL: A good mix of rain and sunshine is expected through the next two weeks in most of Brazil and Paraguay. Outside of parts of northern Brazil most areas will receive enough rain to maintain favorable conditions for second season corn while breaks between rounds of rain allow for fieldwork to advance.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see dry conditions most often during the next two weeks and fieldwork should advance well overall. Two exceptions will occur and much of the country will receive at least some rain today into Tuesday with some northern areas seeing rain May 26-28.

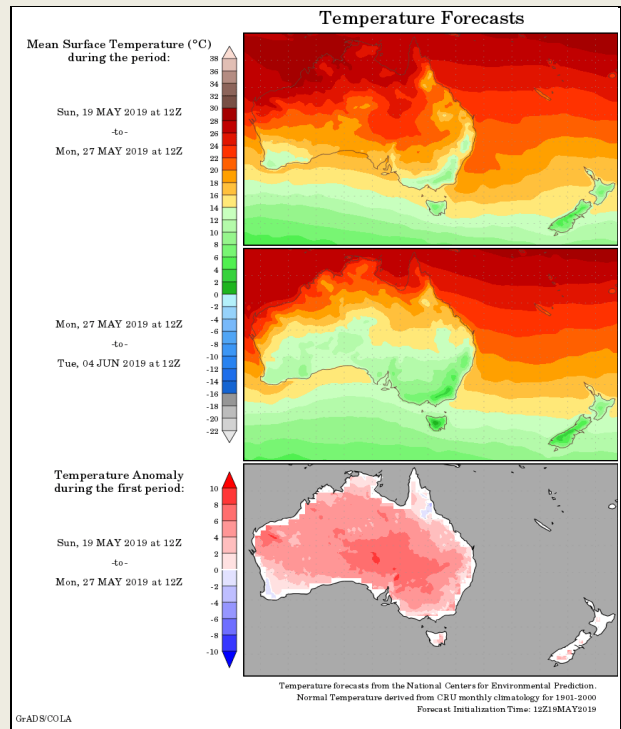
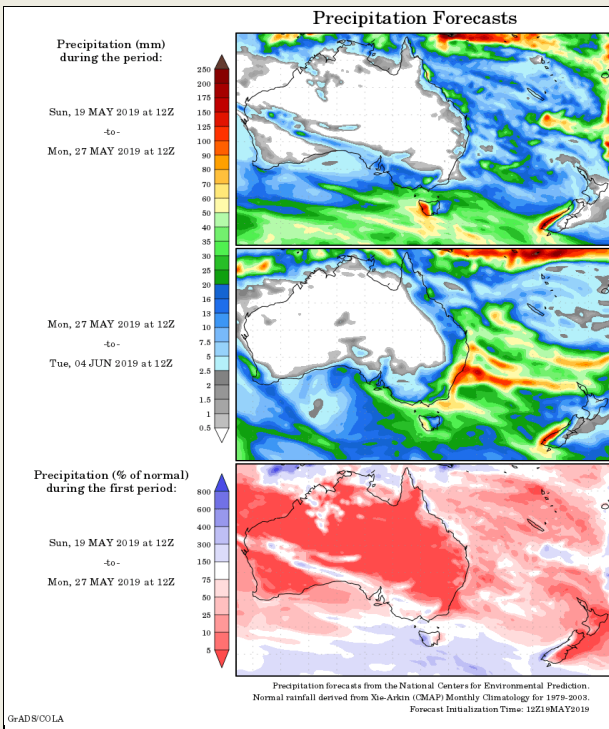
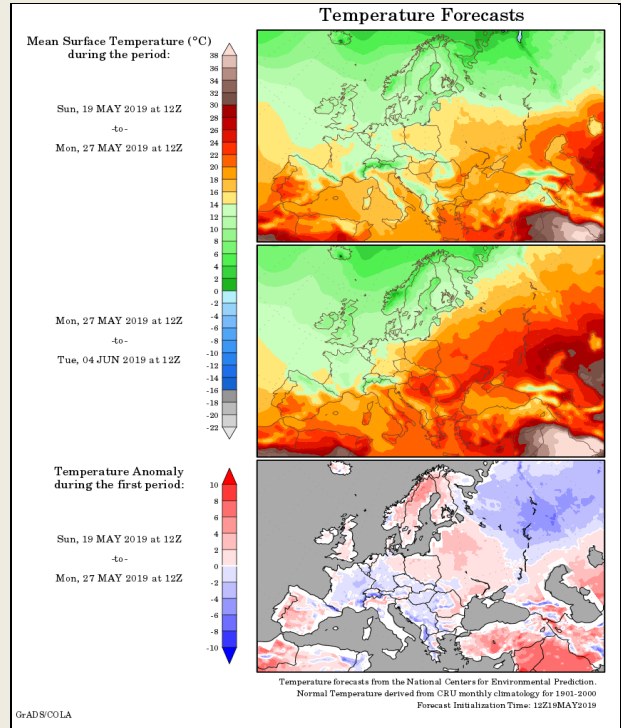
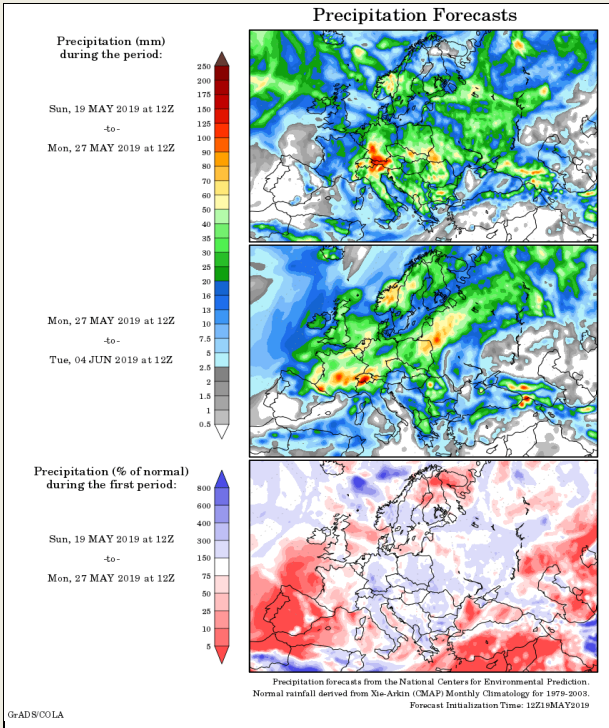
