
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
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
South Africa - Weather


Harvesting will advance swiftly between the rain through the end of next week o Cotton yields will be near normal.

- The brief periods of light rain will only offer minor relief to the dryness for Western Cape, Free State, and neighboring winter wheat areas through the end of next week.
- Free State and neighboring areas initially saw good winter wheat planting and establishment conditions, but would benefit from timely rain in June.
- The potential for more rain during the second week could improve planting and establishment conditions in Western Cape.









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United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see frequent rain through Tuesday before many areas see a break in rain Wednesday into Thursday with rain increasing again May 31-


June 1 followed by a period of less frequent rain and overall improvements in conditions for fieldwork June 2-7. Some planting should occur through Tuesday, but all areas will receive rain during the period and aggressive fieldwork is not likely in many


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a drying trend during the next ten days to two weeks that will allow for good planting progress as well as improved flood conditions. Raii is needed from southern Georgia and nearby Florida into portions of southern South Carolina and stress to crops is likely to rise until rain returns. Flooding along the Mississippi River will steadily decline in the north into early


next week before runoff from the Midwest makes its way downstream and

causes water levels to remain steady or slightly increase for a few days. Flooding in the south along the river will not change greatly through the next ten days.









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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur through the next week in southern and portions of central Brazil while west-central and northern areas see little rain and good harvest progress. Far southern Brazil and southern Paraguay may become wetter than some producers desire as rain will be frequent into the end of the month.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see a restricted rainfall pattern through the next two weeks allowing for good harvest progress to be made. A few rounds of showers will occur on occasion with portions of northern Argentina seeing rain Sunday into Monday and again late next week with further declines to cotton quality possible.


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
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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Wet weather will continue to maintain moist conditions this week. Conditions will remain cooler than usual in central Europe • Rain will be welcome and beneficial for crops later this year, but the wet conditions will so fieldwork, planting and early season crop development from Italy into east-central and northeast Europe. Elsewhere a good mixture of rain and sunshine should occur and mostly favorable conditions will be present. The wettest conditions will occur from Italy, Switzerland and Austria through Hungary, northwest Romania, Poland and west Ukraine AUSTRALIA: Greater and more frequent precipitation will be needed to bolster soil moisture and support planting and establishment of winter crops • In the meantime, rounds of light rain will occur over southeast South Australia into Victoria and south New South Wales during the next ten days to two weeks. Greater rainfall will still be needed over interior South Australia and interior south New South Wales.









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
