

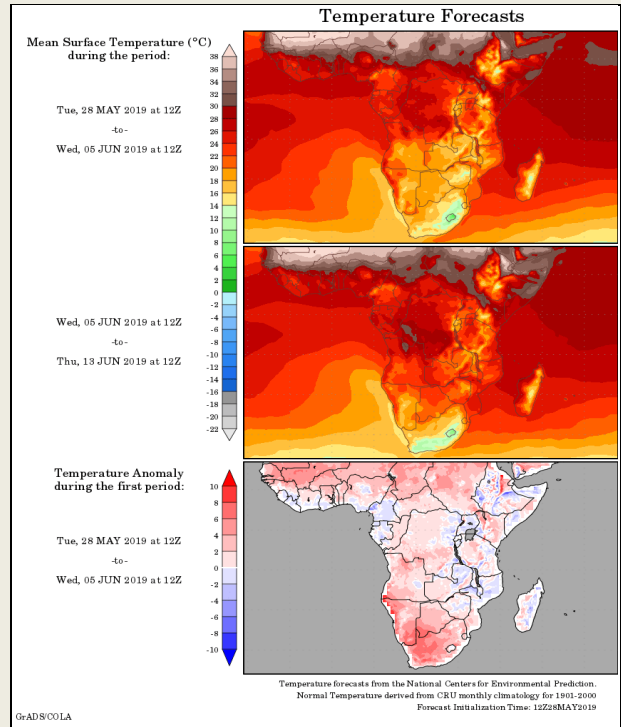
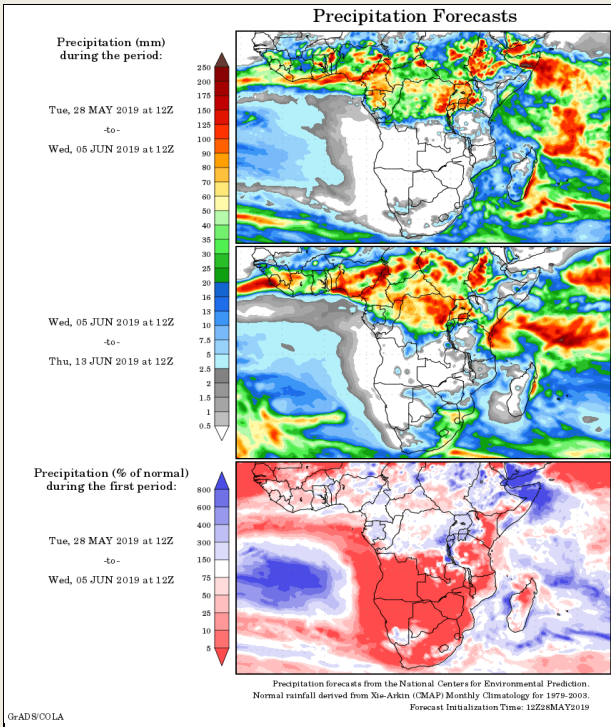
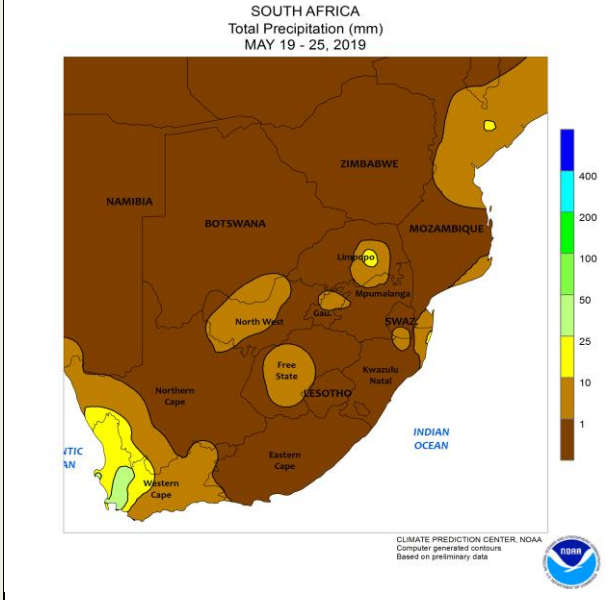
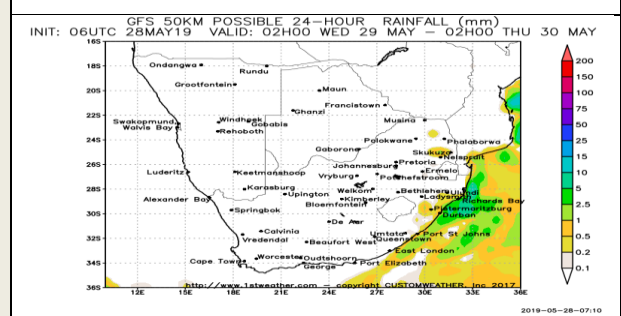
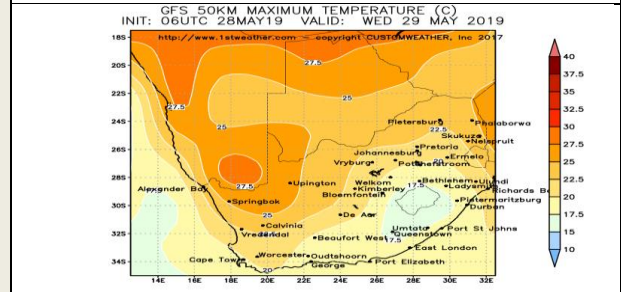
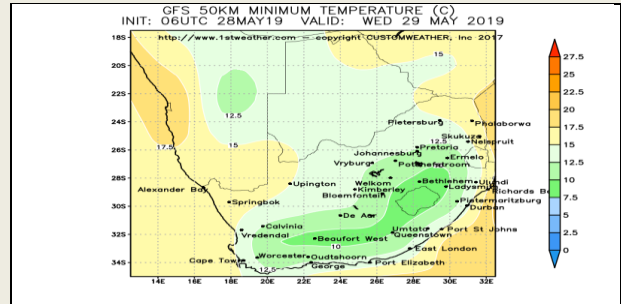


Weather Report

29 May 2019

South Africa - Weather

- Any harvesting that is not yet complete will advance with few disruptions during the next two weeks
- Production losses expected in Northern Cape and portions of Free State and North West due to dryness over the growing season
 - However, cotton yields will be near normal
- Eastern South Africa will see near normal production yields
- Western Cape, Free State, and neighboring areas would benefit from a shot of rain later in June
- Free State initially saw good winter wheat planting and establishment conditions, though most areas have been drier biased in recent weeks
- Light rain slightly alleviated the dryness in portions of Western Cape earlier this month, though most areas have not received enough rain to promote ideal establishment and growth

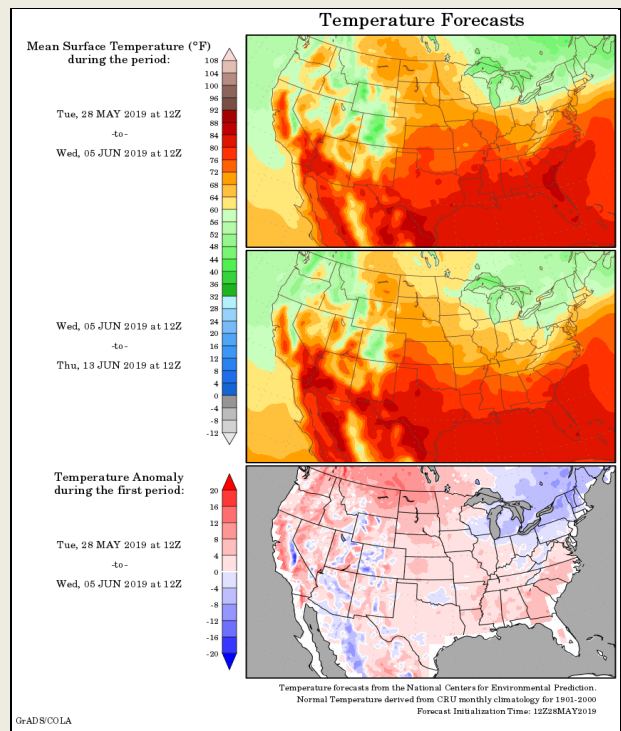
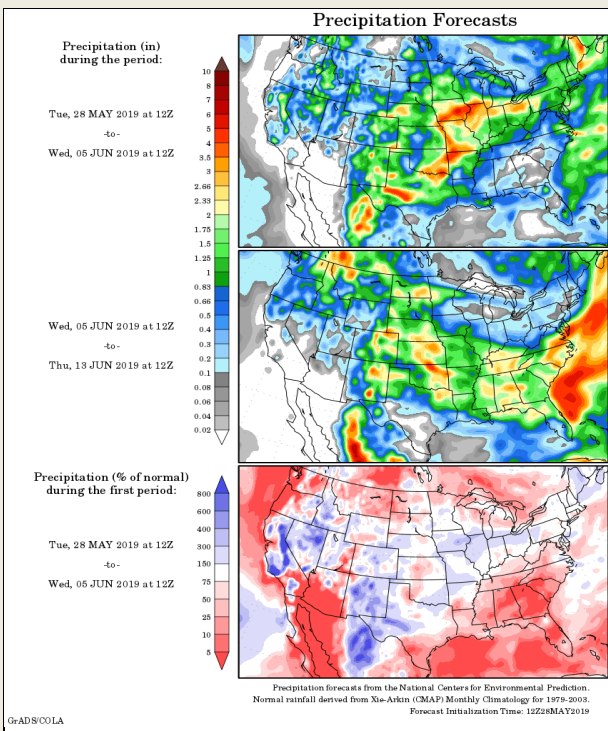
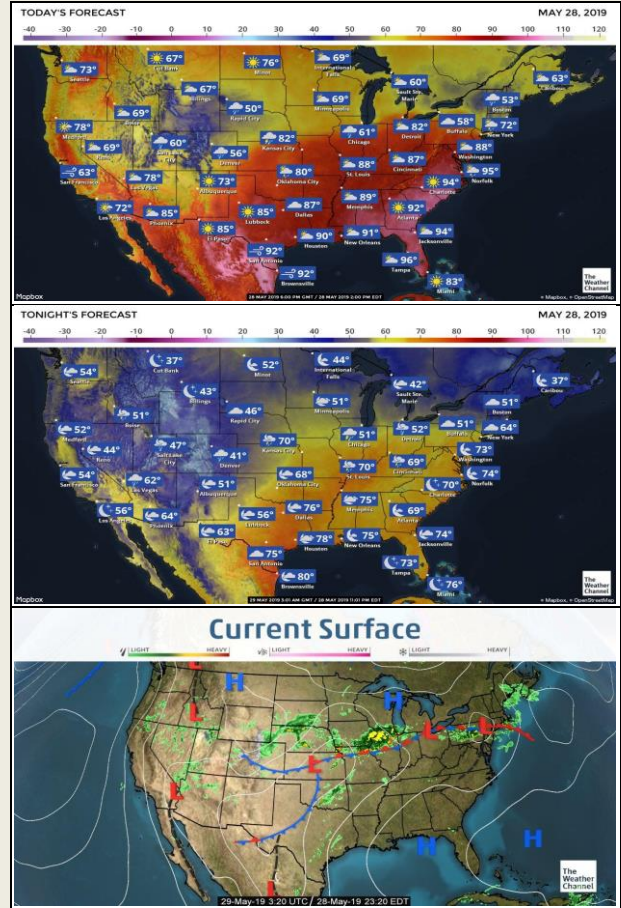
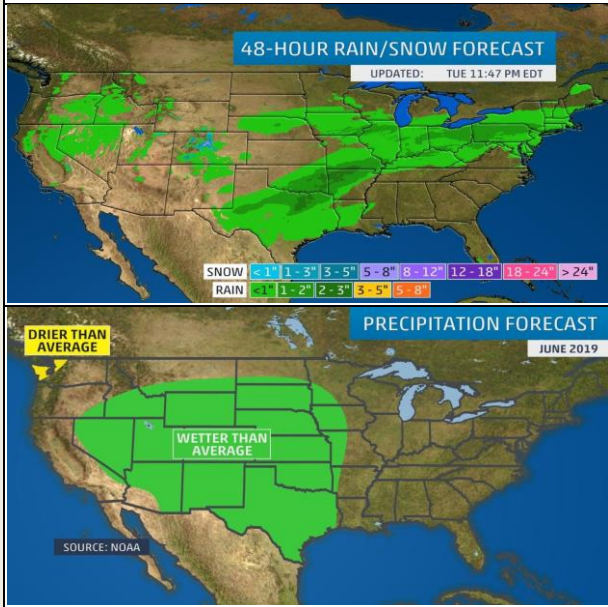

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Frequent rain will continue through Wednesday of next week and planting will be sluggish in many areas, especially from southern into eastern Iowa and northeastern Missouri into northern Missouri where heavy rain and some flooding will occur today. Some planting will occur around the rain, but planting will not be aggressive in many locations due to high frequency of rain expected.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will continue to dry down during the next ten days to two weeks and planting should advance swiftly while crop stress increases and expands in the Southeast. Water levels and flooding along the Mississippi River will not change much in the north during the next week while the south sees an increase in flooding.

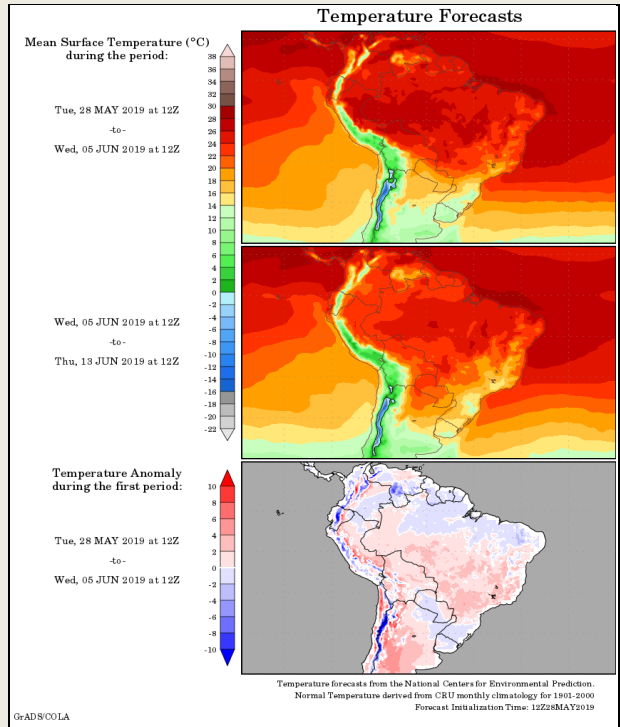
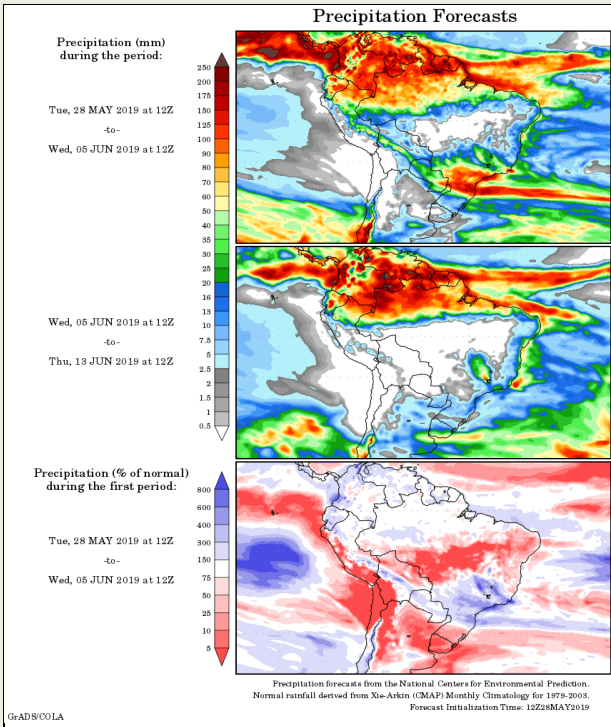
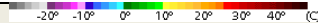
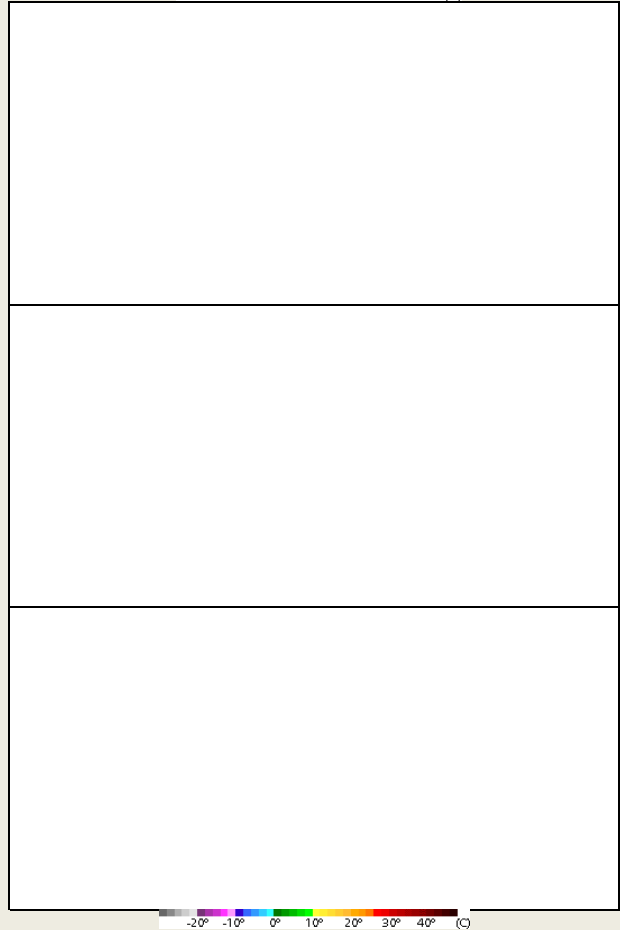
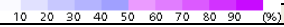
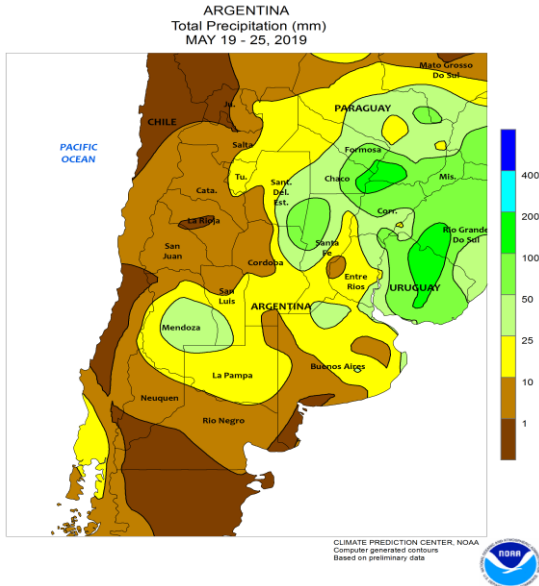

BRAZIL: Regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur through the next week from southern Paraguay into portions of southern Brazil and fieldwork will be slowed while little rain falls elsewhere. Another round of rain will affect southern Paraguay and southern Brazil June 7-10 with restricted rain in place elsewhere.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks allowing for good harvest progress to be made.

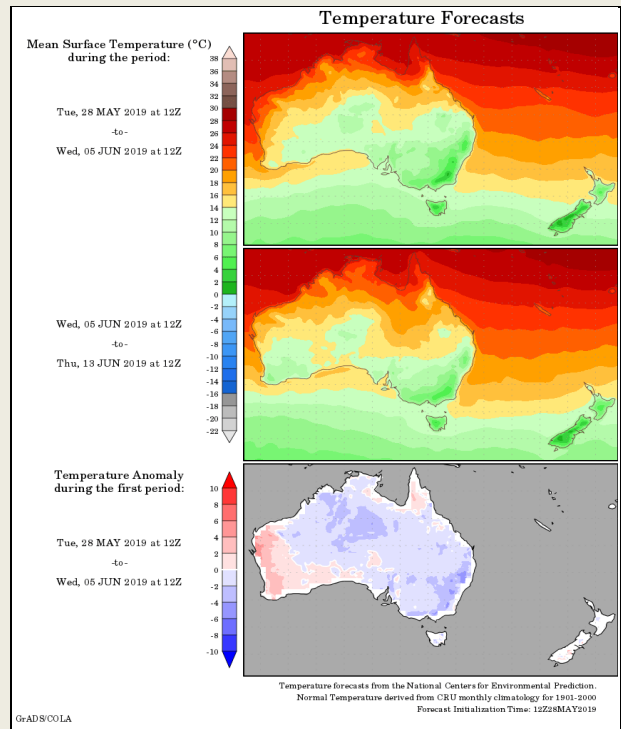
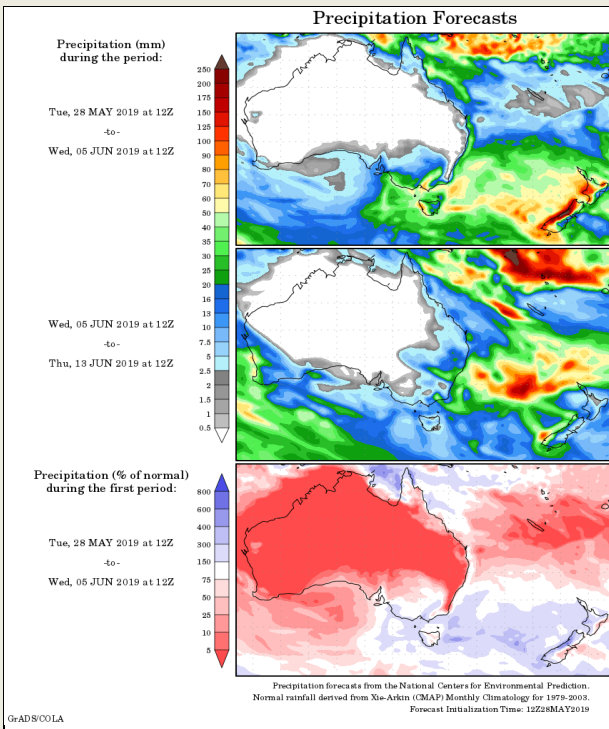
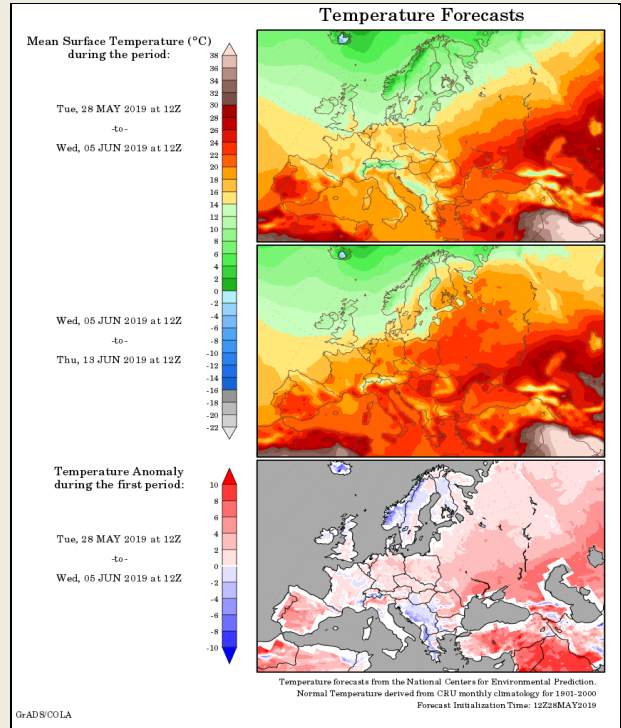
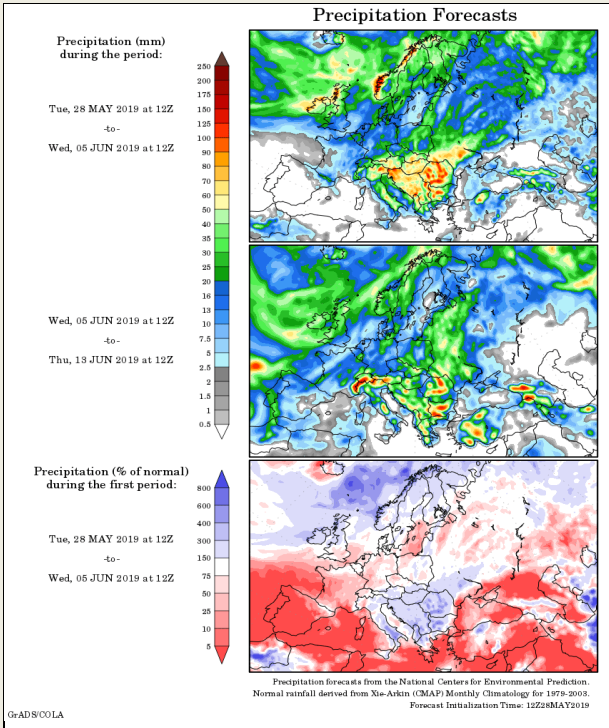

AUSTRALIA: Greater and more frequent precipitation will be needed to bolster soil moisture and support planting and establishment of winter crops. The one exception will be rounds of light rain over southeast South Australia into Victoria and southeast New South Wales. Rain will be greatest in Victoria which will help support planting and establishment of winter crops. Greater rainfall will still be needed over interior South Australia and interior south New South Wales
