



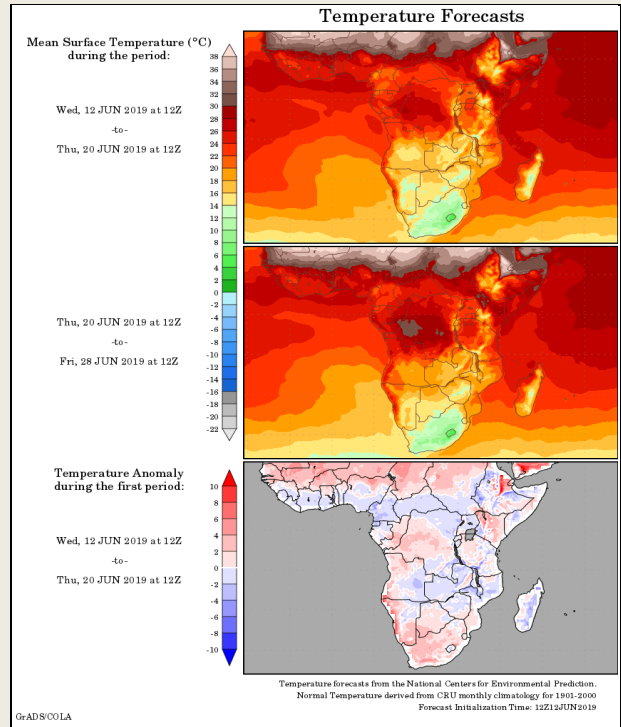
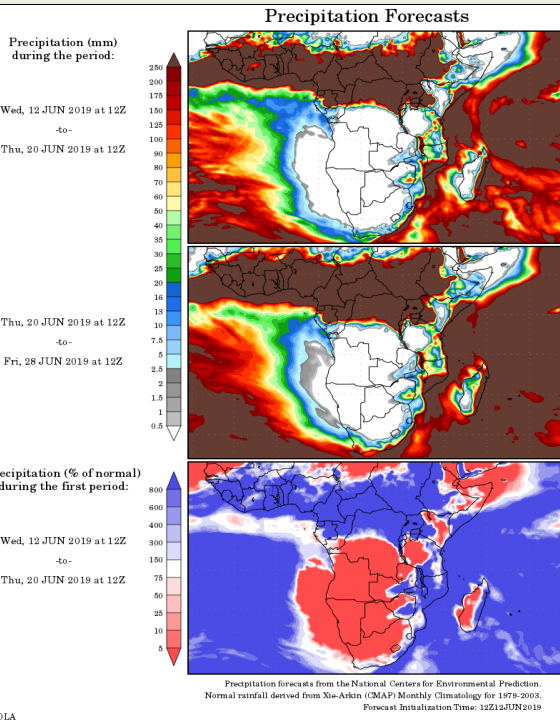
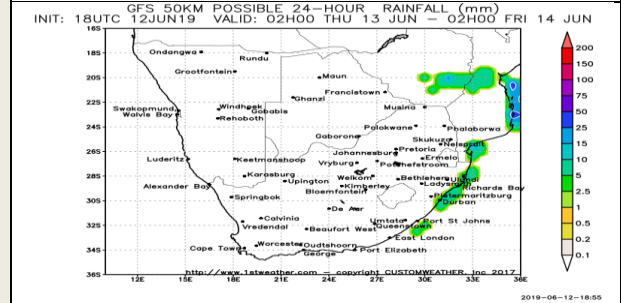
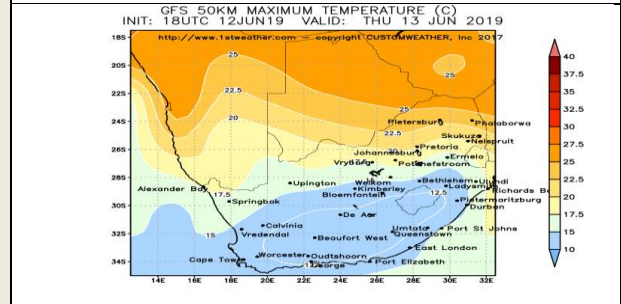
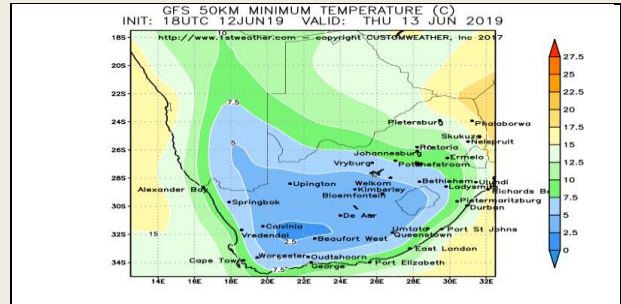
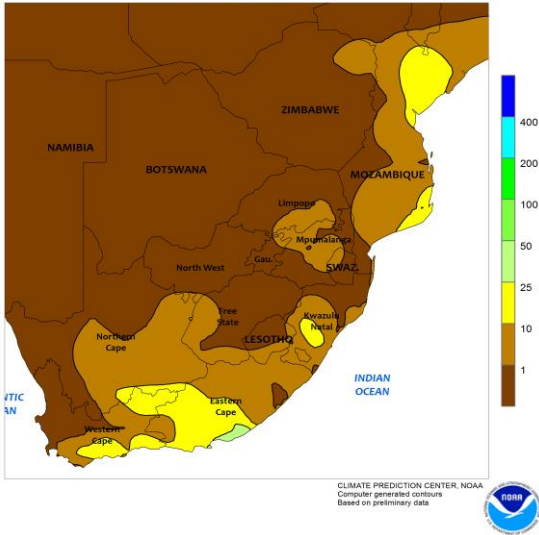
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

- Late season harvesting will advance with few disruptions
- Soil moisture will further decrease in Western Cape, Free State, and neighboring winter wheat areas
 - o Portions of southwest Western Cape recently saw periods of light rain that promoted minor relief from the dryness, though the moisture profile remains short
 - o Free State also already has a shortage of moisture
- The main winter wheat areas would benefit from timely rain late this month into early July
 - o Planting and establishment initially got off to a good start in Free State before the drying trend evolved in recent weeks
 - o Western Cape has otherwise been too dry to support ideal winter wheat conditions

MAY 26 - JUN 1, 2019

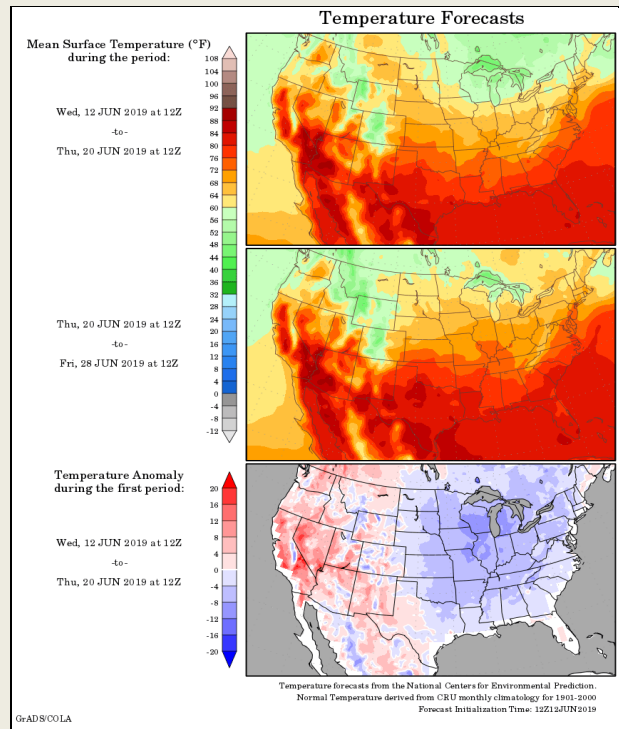
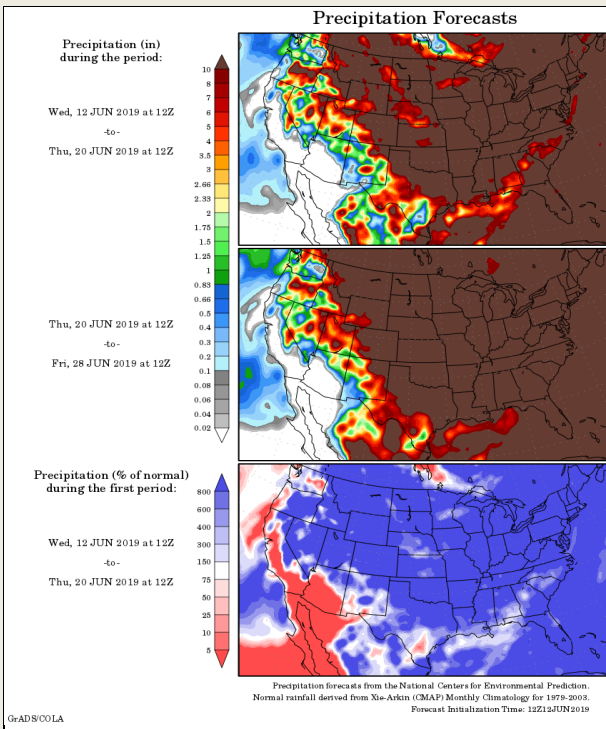
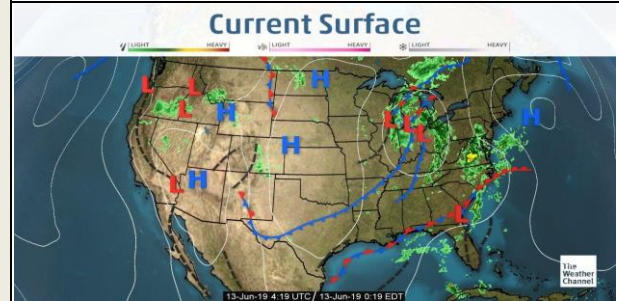
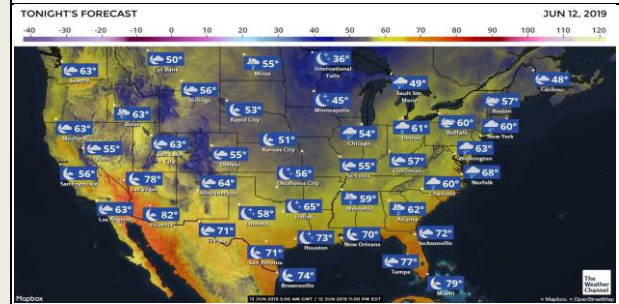
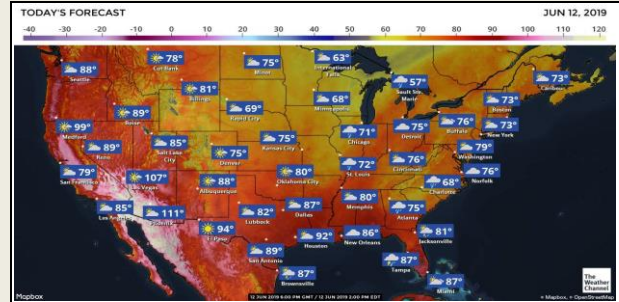
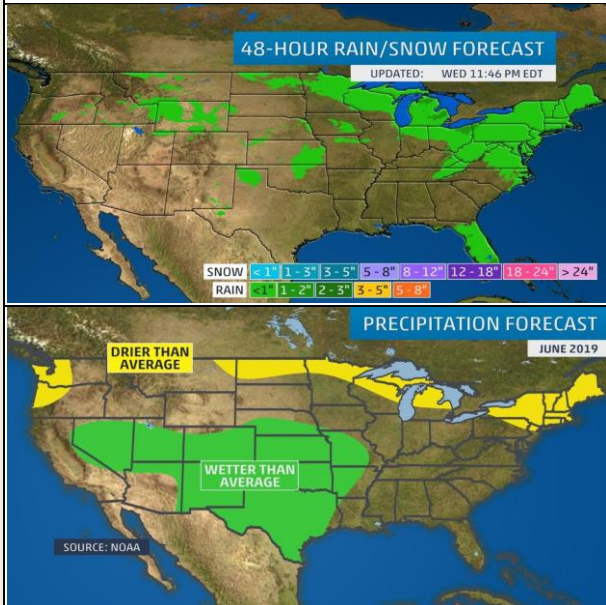

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The two-week outlook has not changed much since Tuesday and some opportunities for planting will occur during the next few days before frequent rain in the lower and eastern Midwest Saturday into next week stalls fieldwork in much of the region. The northwestern Corn Belt will see lighter rain than the remainder of the Midwest and late planting should advance well overall while Michigan into Ohio will see the poorest conditions for fieldwork.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Rain will continue today in portions of the southeastern states causing more interruptions to planting and further improvements in soil moisture while the Delta through western Alabama is mostly dry. Today's forecast includes less rain for June 21-23 and with only isolated to scattered and mostly light showers expected June 21-26, the central and southern Delta will need rain soon. Water levels and flooding along the Mississippi River will gradually increase in the north during the next week while the south sees an increase in flooding into this weekend.

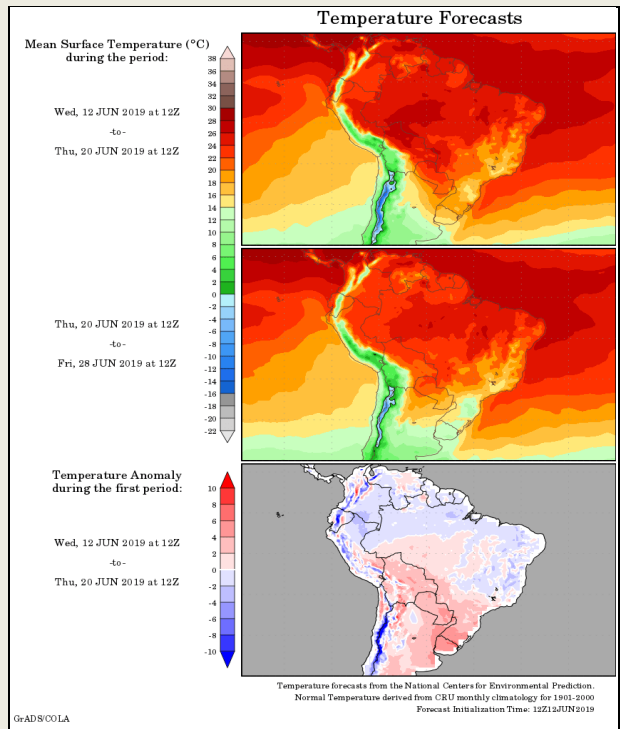
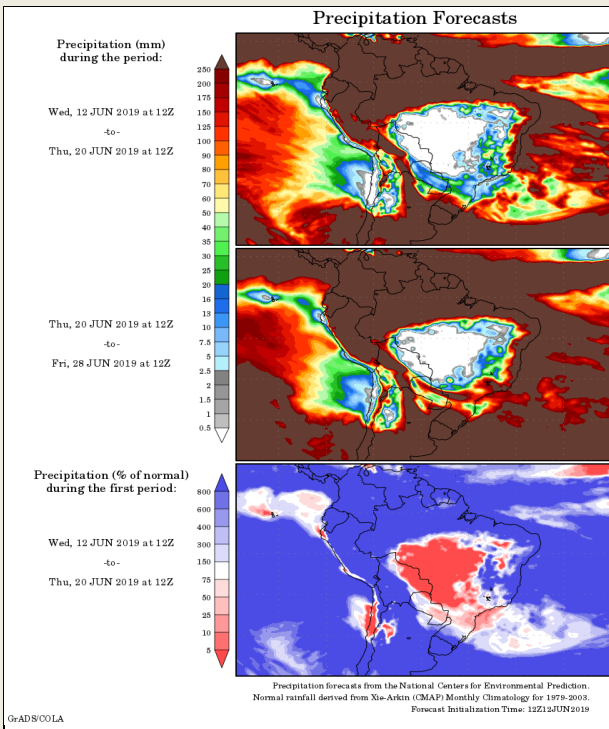
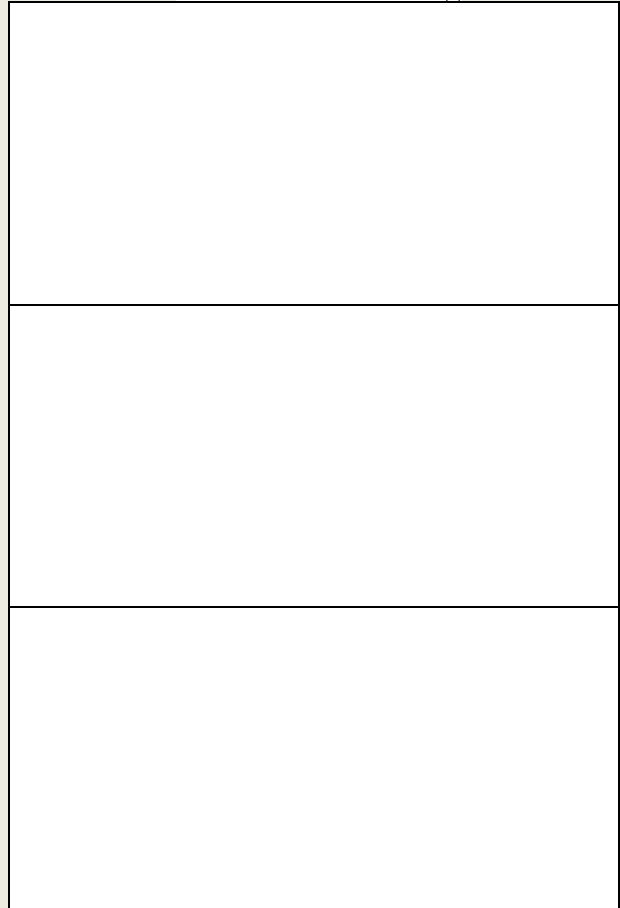
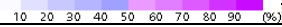
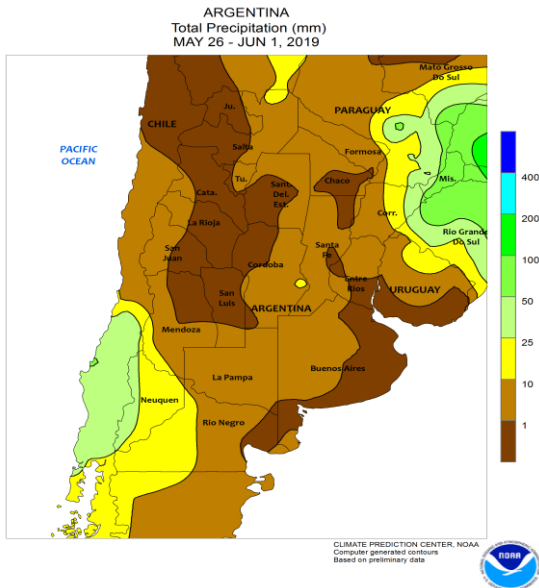

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Most of Brazil and Paraguay will see a restricted rainfall pattern during the next two weeks and good harvest progress should be made. A few light showers will occur in far southern Brazil through Monday before rain increases June 18-19 with some additional showers June 23-26. Portions of northeastern Brazil will see occasional rounds of light showers through the next two weeks.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through Tuesday and planting of winter wheat and harvesting of summer crops will be slowed by the rain while soil moisture is increased and will be supportive of winter wheat establishment and development in most areas. The drier areas in southwestern Argentina will see multiple rounds of rain and although a full restoration of soil moisture may not occur, enough rain should fall to induce notable improvements in conditions for winter wheat.

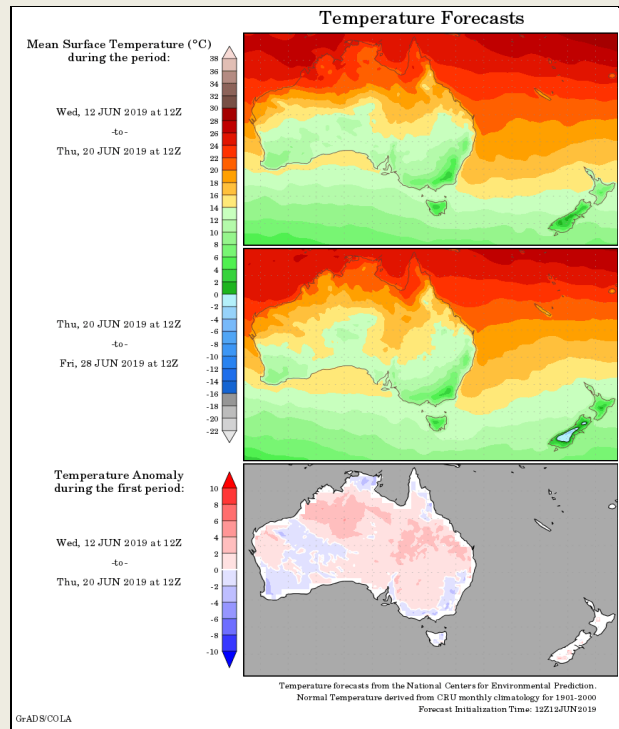
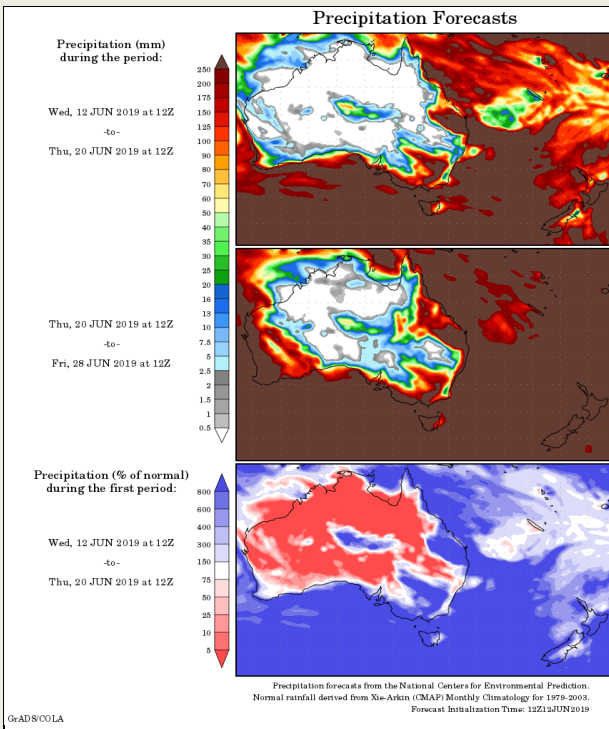
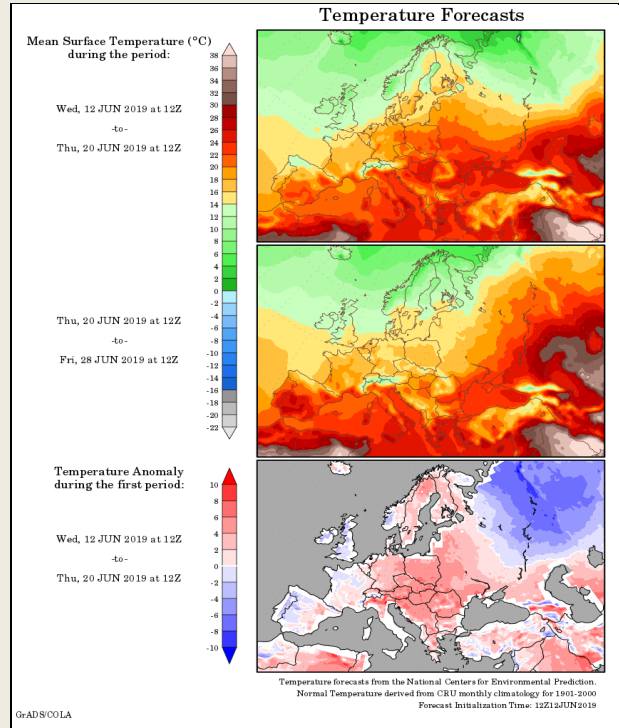
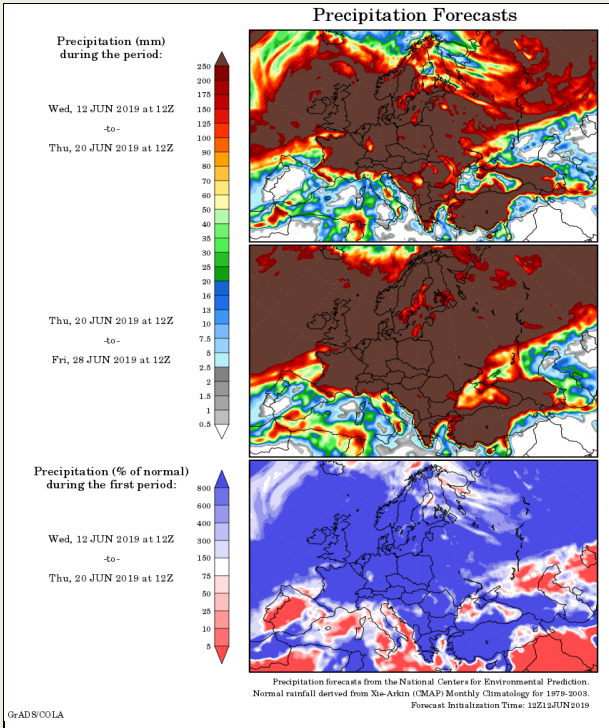

EUROPE: A good mixture of rain and sunshine will occur throughout most of Europe this week. Some stronger storms will produce heavy rainfall in portions of the U.K. as well as Switzerland, north Italy, Austria into east Europe where some 1.00 to 3.00-inch totals will occur. Otherwise, frequent light precipitation will occur most often. Favorable soil moisture conditions will occur in most locations

AUSTRALIA: Needed rain increased over southeast South Australia into western Victoria Tuesday. Moisture totals varied from 0.20 to 0.91 inch and local totals up to 1.77 inches. Scattered showers lingered over southwest Western Australia and east Victoria into southeast New South Wales where totals varied up to 0.40 inch and local totals up to 0.70 inch
