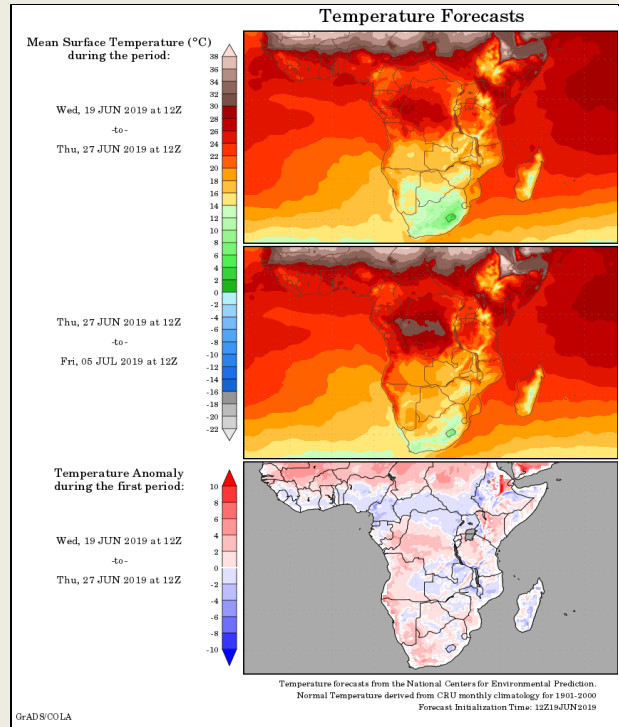
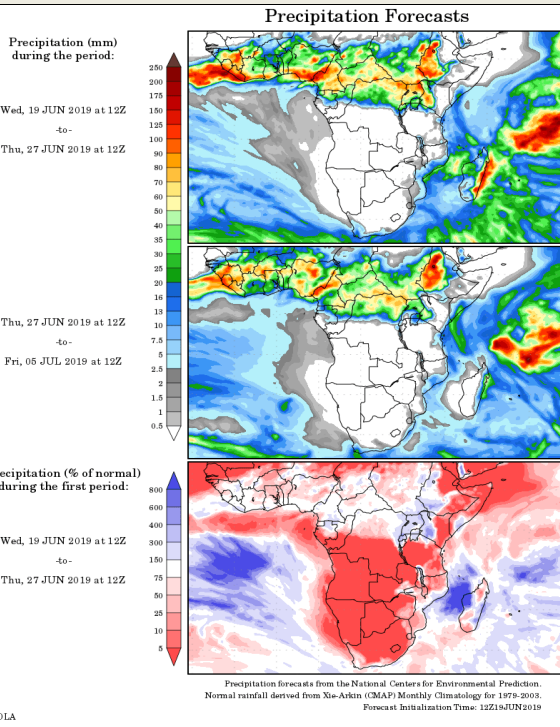
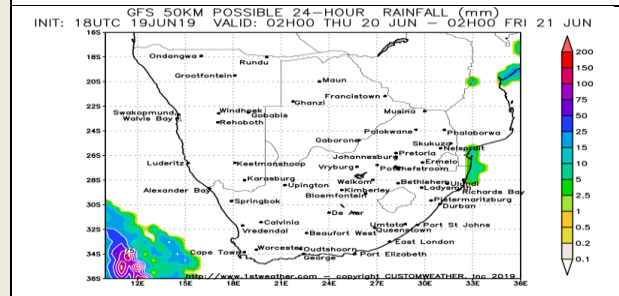
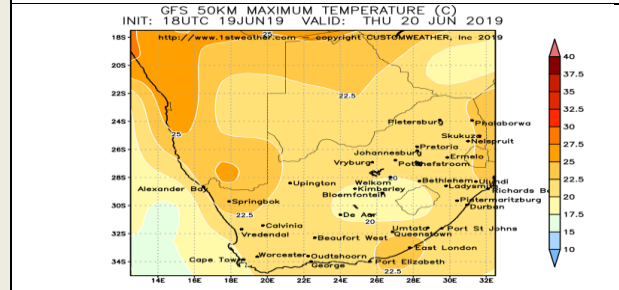
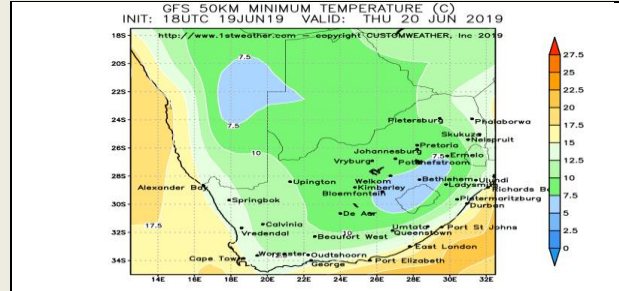
South Africa - Weather

- Harvesting and general fieldwork will advance swiftly during the next two weeks
- Rainfall in Western Cape during the next few days will only offer minor relief from the dryness
 - o Most areas will not receive enough rain to significantly improve soil moisture
- Free State and neighboring areas will otherwise continue to dry down
- Only minor improvements expected for winter wheat in Western Cape in the coming days
 - o Crop development conditions will otherwise remain less than favorable
 - o More frequent rain will be needed in July to further ease the dryness and support better development
- o Free State and neighboring areas also need to see more rain to improve development

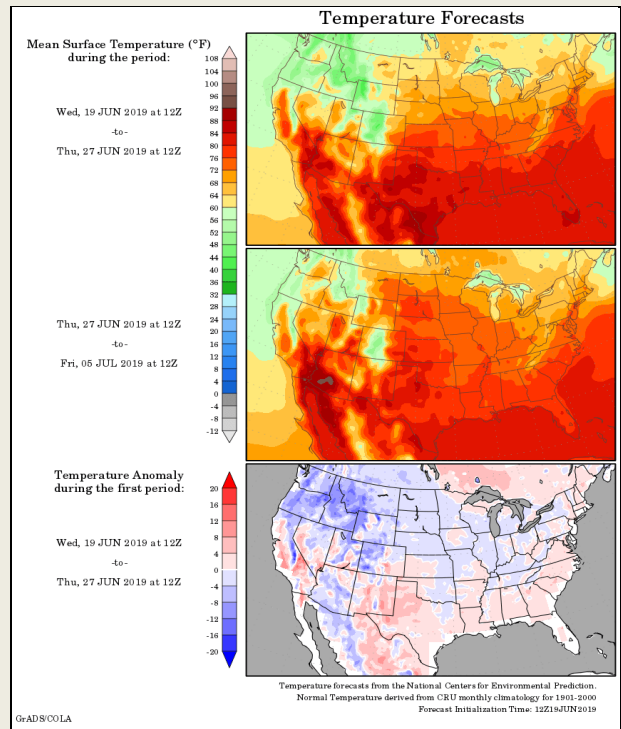
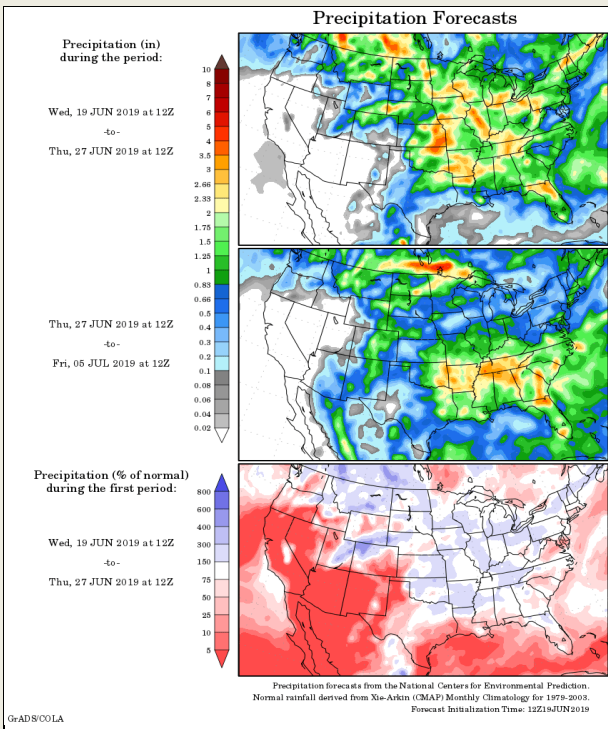
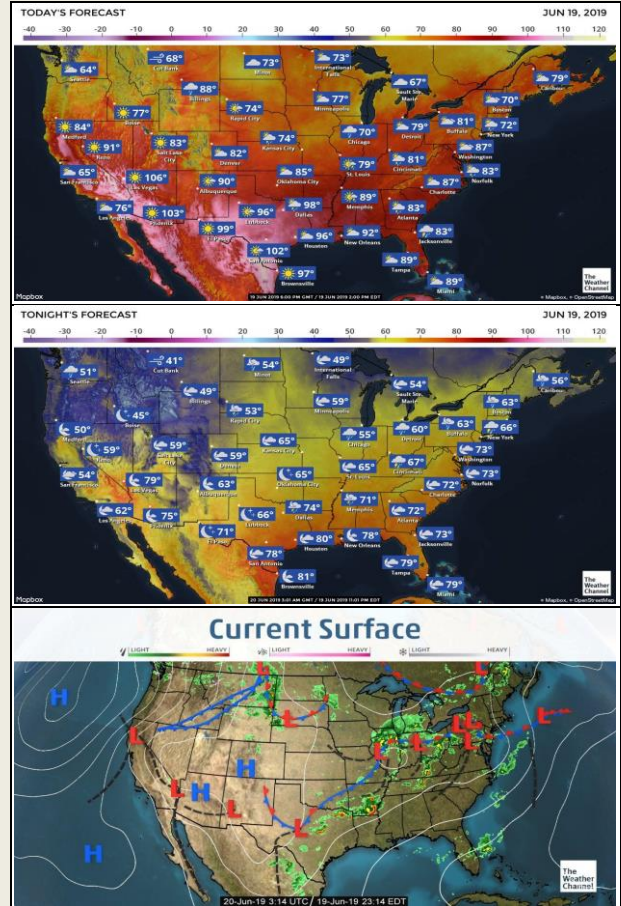
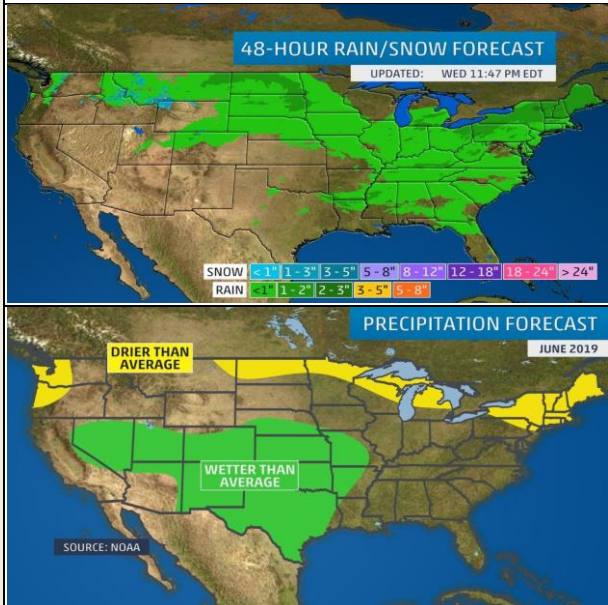


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A highly favorable weather pattern is expected for all established summer crops in the Midwest during the next two weeks. Alternating periods of rain and sunshine are expected in this first week of the outlook with temperatures in a seasonable range. June 27-July 4 weather will be a little drier and warmer biased than in this first week, but crop development should occur aggressively. Weather conditions will not be very good for aggressive planting due to frequent rain in this first week of the outlook. It will be too late to plant crops in the second week of the forecast when conditions are drier and warmer.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: A favorable mix of weather is expected in both the Delta and southeastern states over the next ten days to two weeks. The environment will prove to be good for crop development. The driest and warmest conditions will evolve next week, but sufficient soil moisture will be present to support crop needs in many areas. be disrupted for a while this workweek and during the weekend due to rain, but conditions should improve next week.



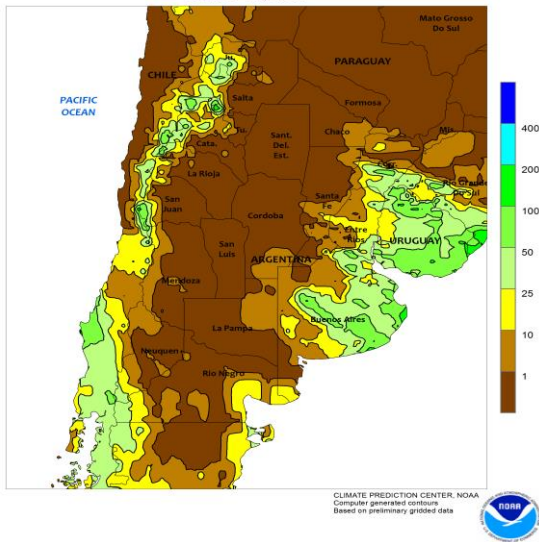
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Mostly dry weather occurred again Tuesday and early today. High temperatures were in the upper 60s and 70s from northeastern Rio Grande do Sul through eastern and southern Sao Paulo to Rio de Janeiro and southeastern Minas Gerais. Highs farther to the north were in the middle 70s through the 80s with some lower to middle 90s in Mato Grosso.

ARGENTINA: Rain Tuesday was limited to far southern La Pampa and southern and central Buenos Aires where amounts through 0600 GMT today were mostly less than 0.25 inch. Bahia Blanca was the exception with rainfall reaching 0.96 inch. Dry conditions occurred elsewhere and high temperatures were in the 50s and lower 60s Fahrenheit.

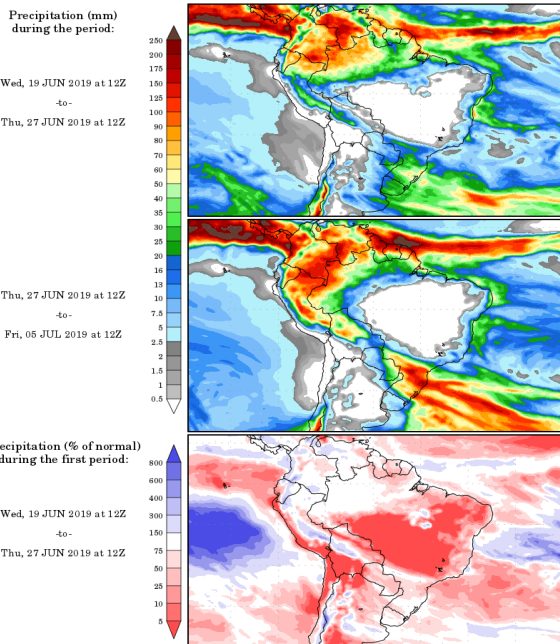
ARGENTINA

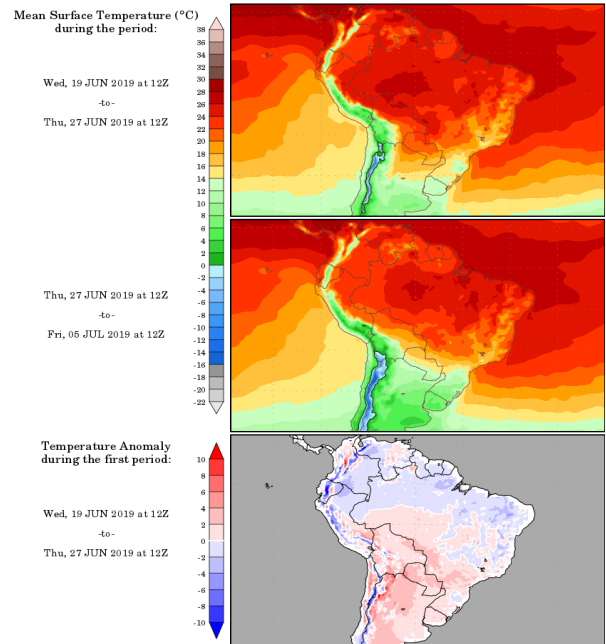
Precipitation Forecasts

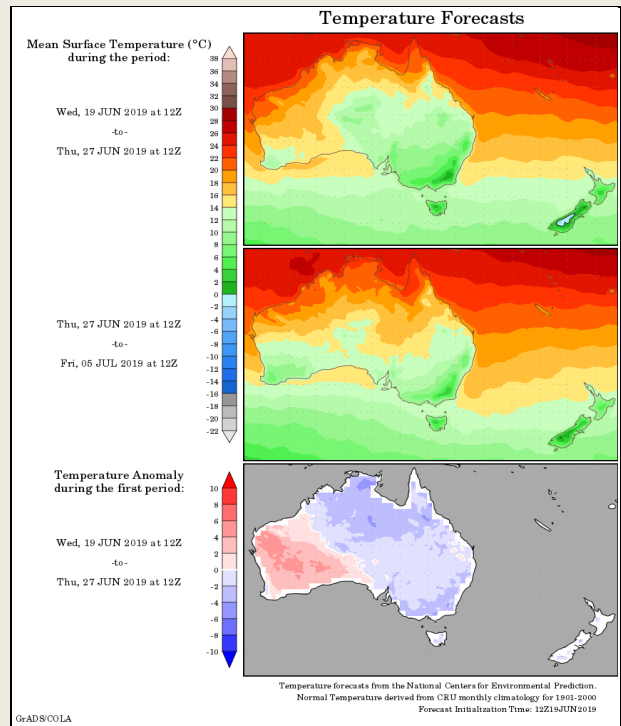
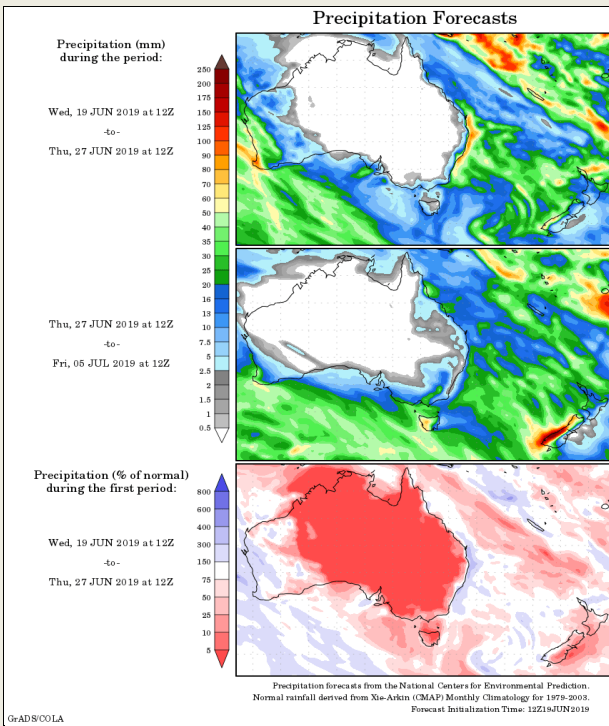
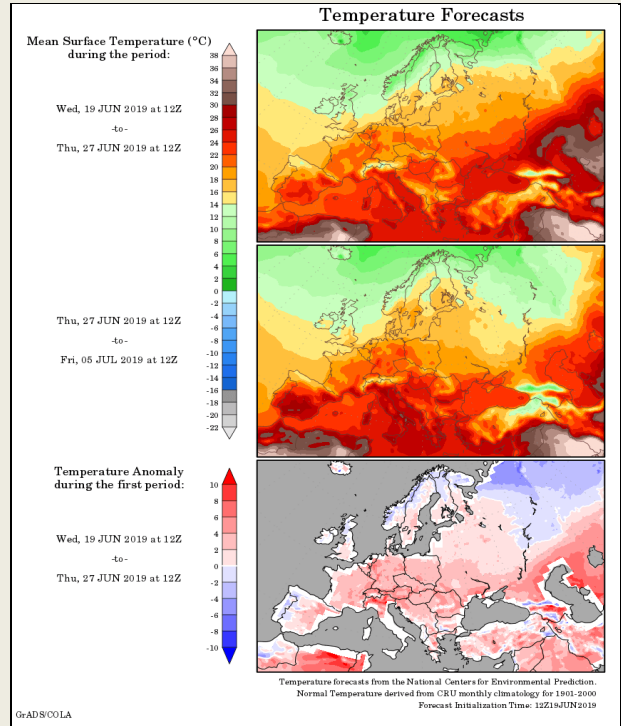
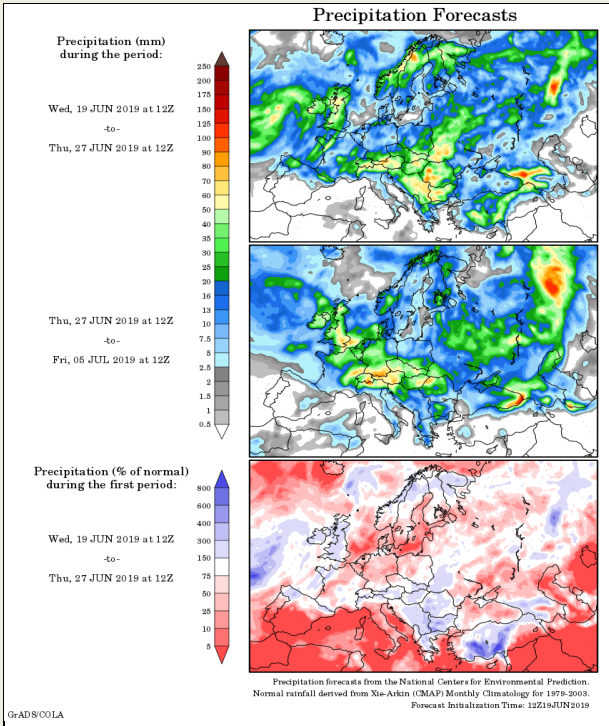
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Moist conditions will prevail from southeast France, south Germany, north Italy, the Czech Republic, Austria and Slovenia through southeast Poland, Slovakia and Hungary through the Balkan Nations this week. Moist conditions will also prevail in the U.K. and into Norway and central Sweden this week.

AUSTRALIA: Precipitation will eventually return to Western Australia this week, although drying will prevail through Friday. Rounds of precipitation will increase in Western Australia this weekend and into early next week. The moisture will bolster soil moisture conditions and crops will benefit. Moisture totals by this time next week will range from 0.50 to 2.00 inches and locally greater amounts in most production areas. The greatest moisture will occur in western locations. In the meantime, restricted precipitation and drying will occur in eastern Australia.



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
