

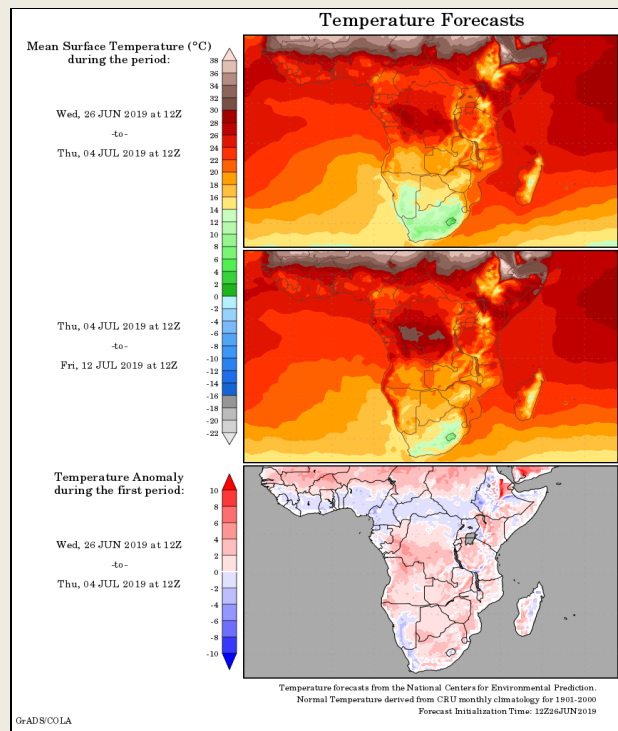
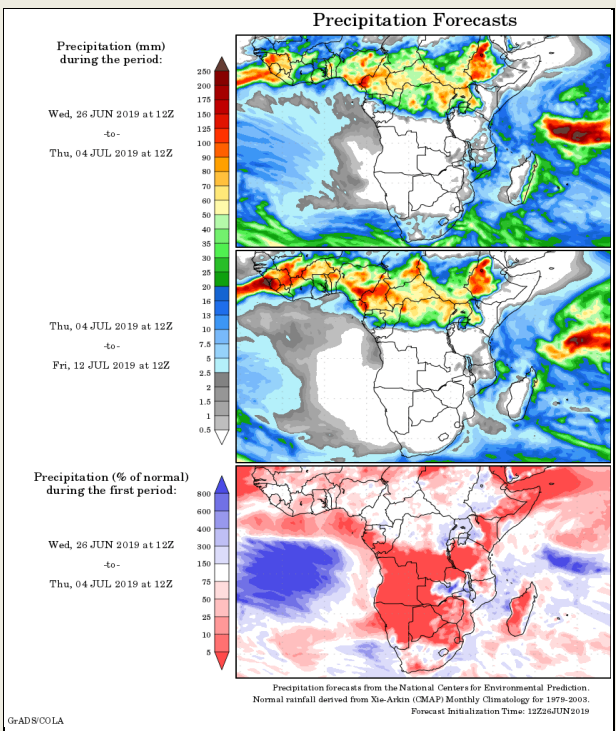
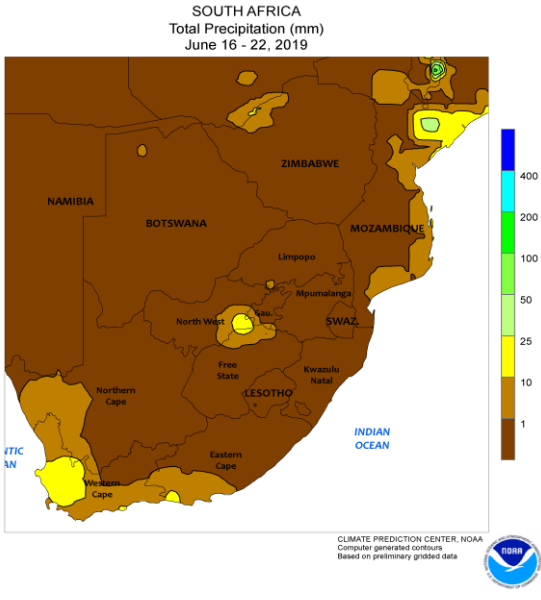
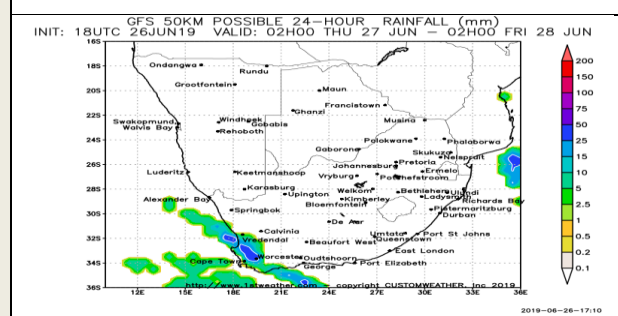
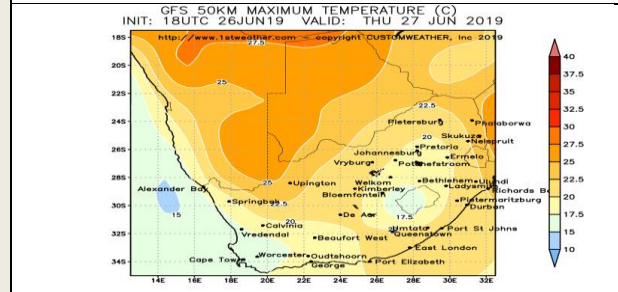
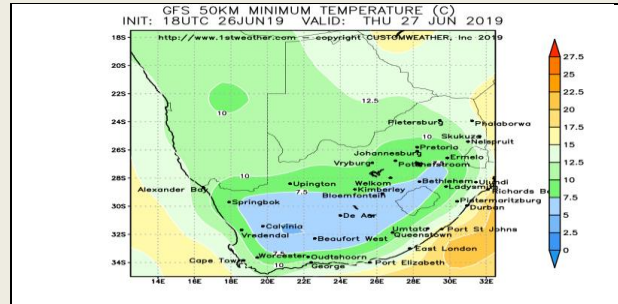


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

- Any harvesting and fieldwork that is not yet complete will advance swiftly
- Most areas through the middle of next week will not receive enough rain to counter evaporation or impact long-term soil conditions
 - Winter wheat is dormant or semi-dormant in much of Free State and neighboring areas
 - Planting and establishment conditions were generally favorable for these areas earlier this year
 - Timely rain will otherwise be needed once the crops exit dormancy
- Western Cape would benefit from a good shot of rain to improve soil moisture and promote ideal conditions for the winter wheat

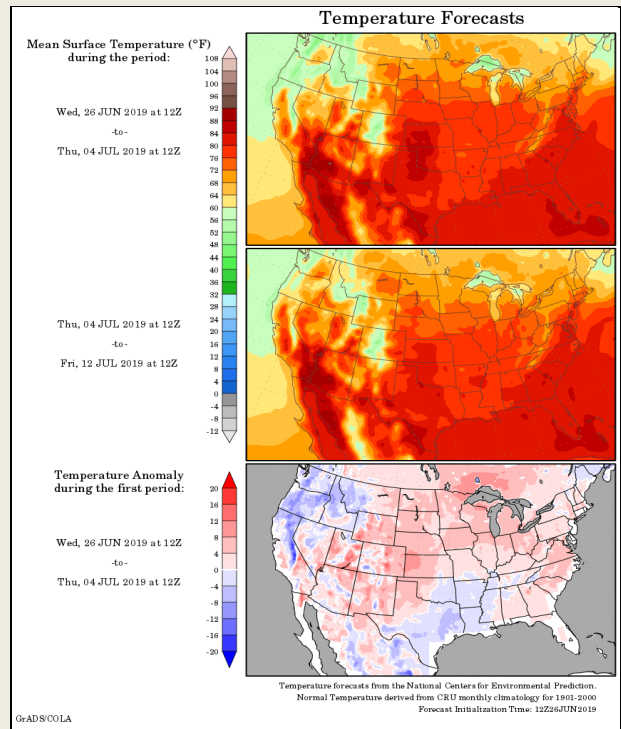
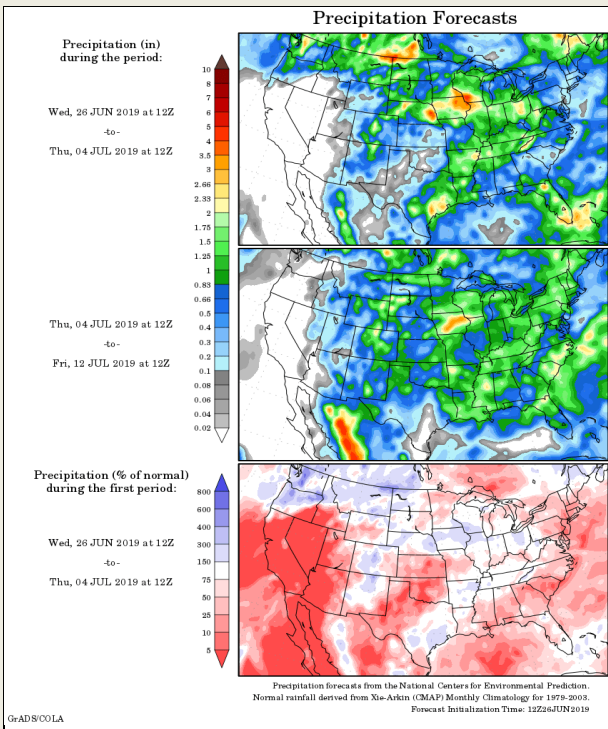
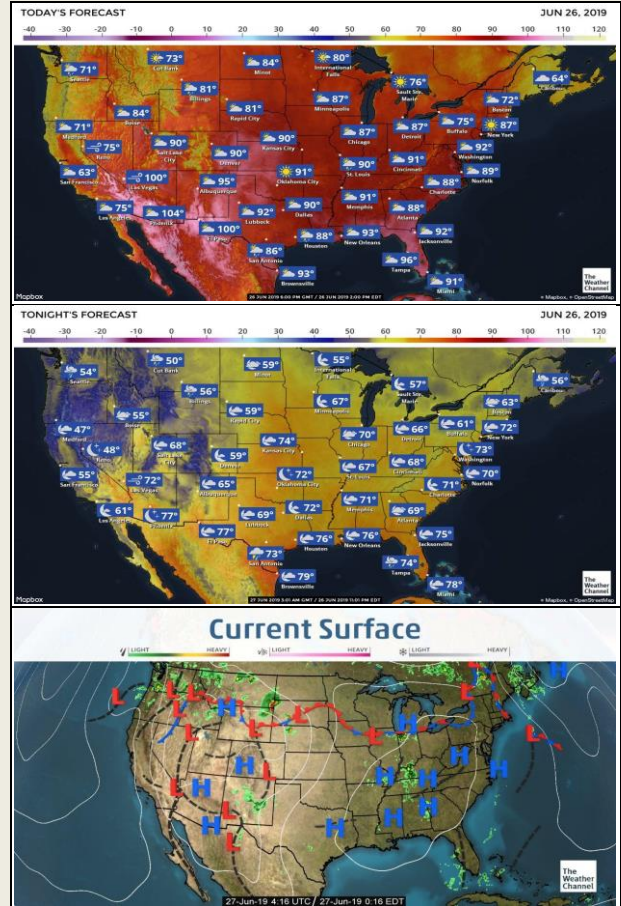
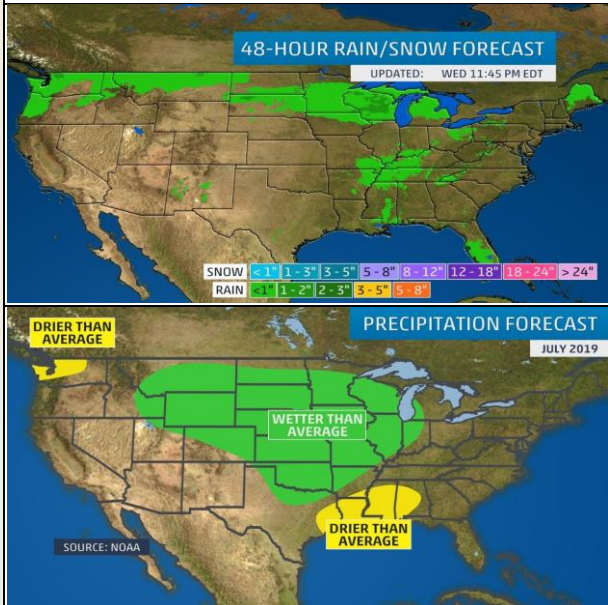


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see seasonably warmer temperatures and regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks that will induce improvements in crop conditions and development rates. Many areas will not see rain often or heavy enough to prevent net drying and areas that are excessively wet will benefit from the drying.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Today's two-week forecast is a little drier for the Delta and the Southeast than what was advertised earlier this week and some increase in crop may occur in parts of the Southeast that did not see significant increases in soil moisture earlier this month. Most of the region has enough soil moisture to support the needs of crops during the next two weeks and the regular rounds of isolated to scattered showers will help slow drying rates. As long as rain returns soon conditions for crops will remain favorable, but if dryness persists too deep into July crop stress will quickly expand.

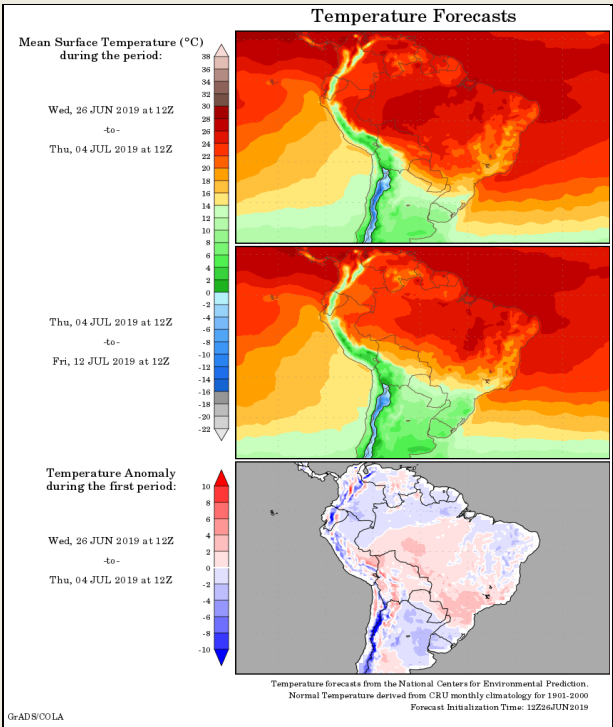
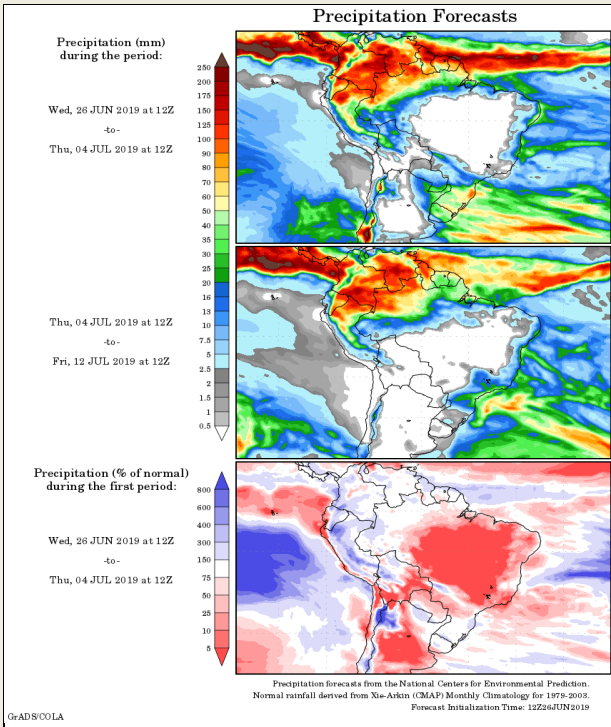
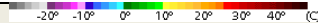
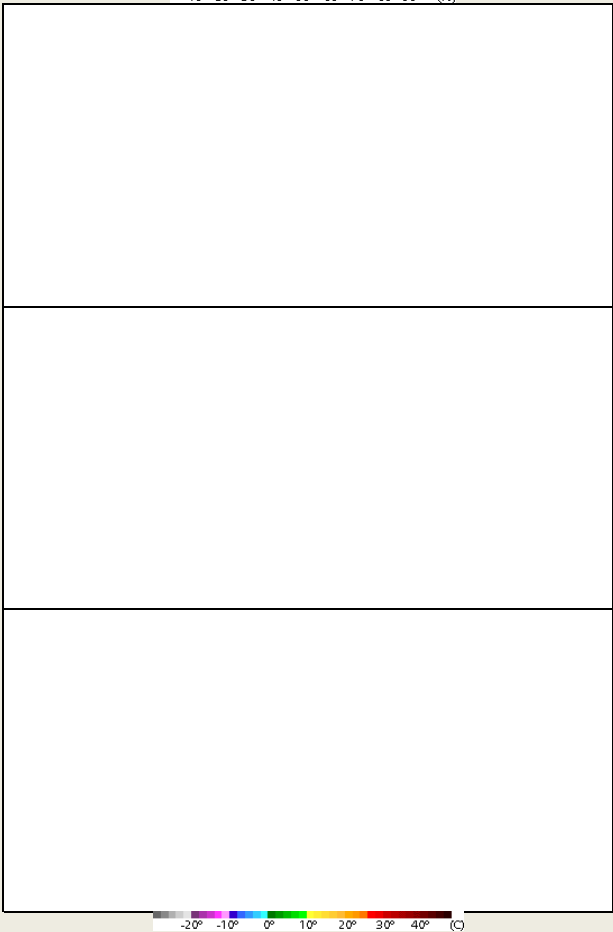
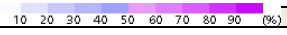
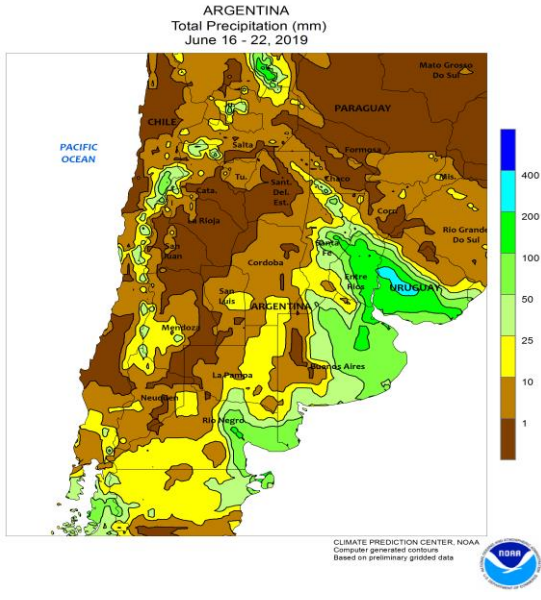


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The weather pattern in Brazil and Paraguay not change much through the next two weeks and a restricted rainfall pattern will be in place most often with a few rounds of showers and thunderstorms in the south and regular rounds of showers in the northeast near the coast.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and planting of winter wheat and harvesting of summer crops should advance well overall. The drier areas in southwestern Argentina remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.

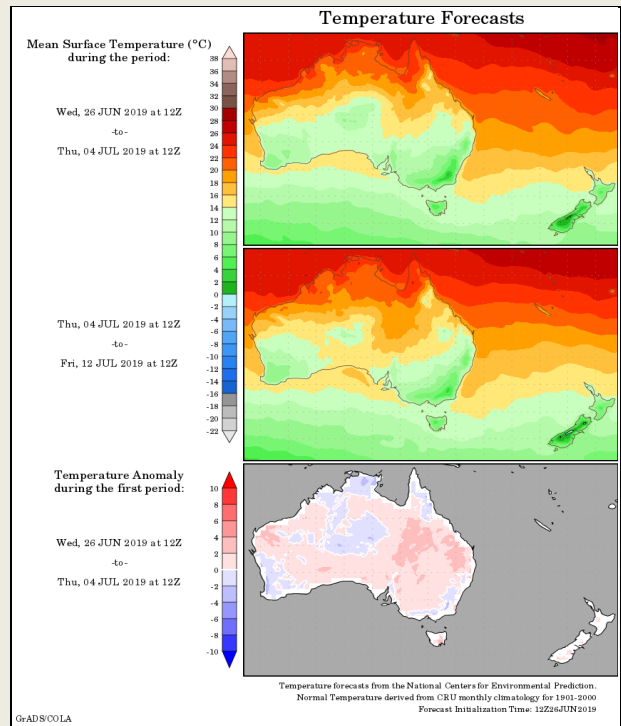
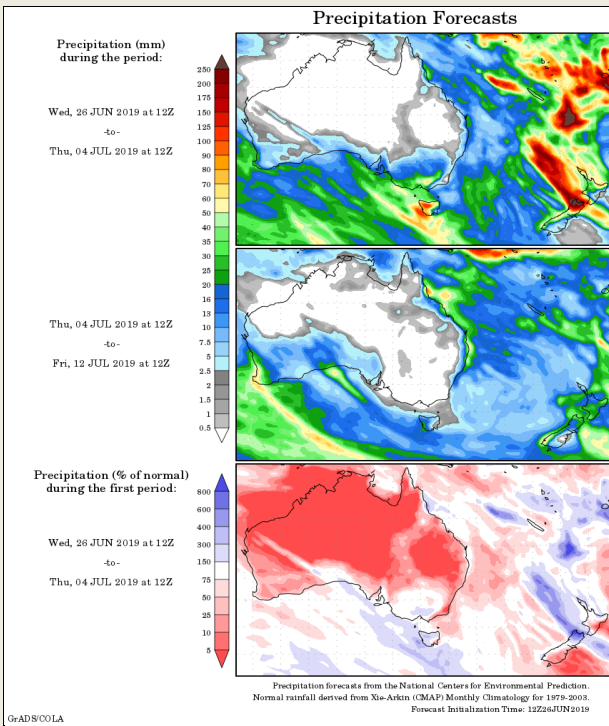
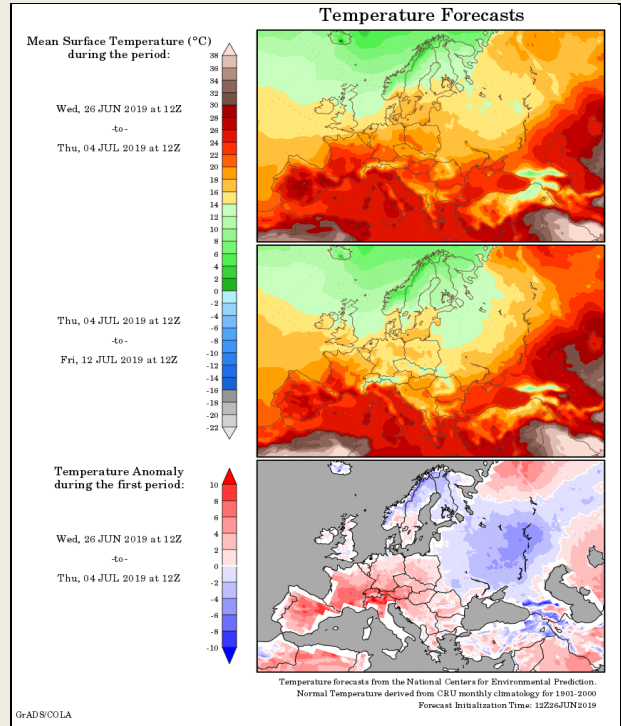
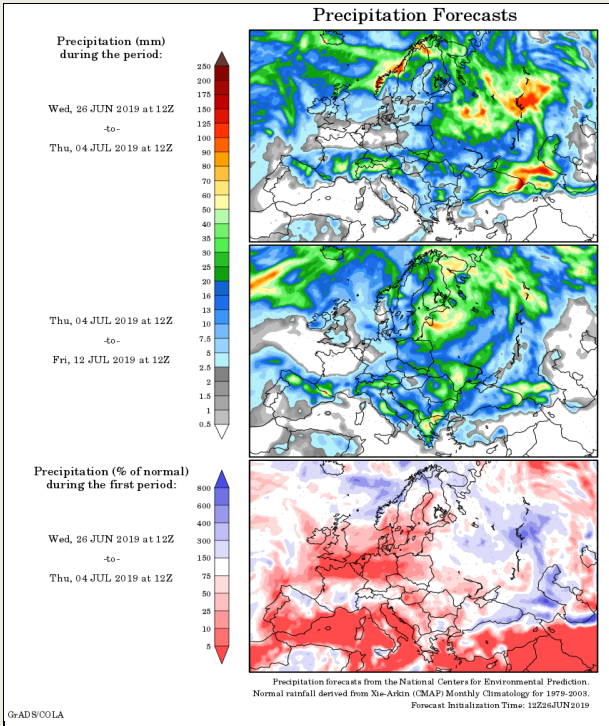


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Restricted precipitation and hot temperatures will occur throughout Europe into Sunday. Crop moisture stress will increase in portions of France through Germany and Poland into south Scandinavia this week. Daily highs will vary in the upper 80s and 90s most often with extremes just exceeding 100 Fahrenheit this week. The hottest conditions will occur over west-central France Tuesday into Saturday when highs will vary in the 90s and exceed 100 Fahrenheit most often. Some showers will occur in eastern Europe.

AUSTRALIA: Precipitation will continue to impact Western Australia and the southeast corner of the nation this week. The moisture will continue to support improvements in soil moisture and crop conditions in Western Australia, but the best conditions will continue in the southeast corner of the nation. Warmer than usual temperatures will occur this week excepting the southwest and southeast corners of the nation.



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
