

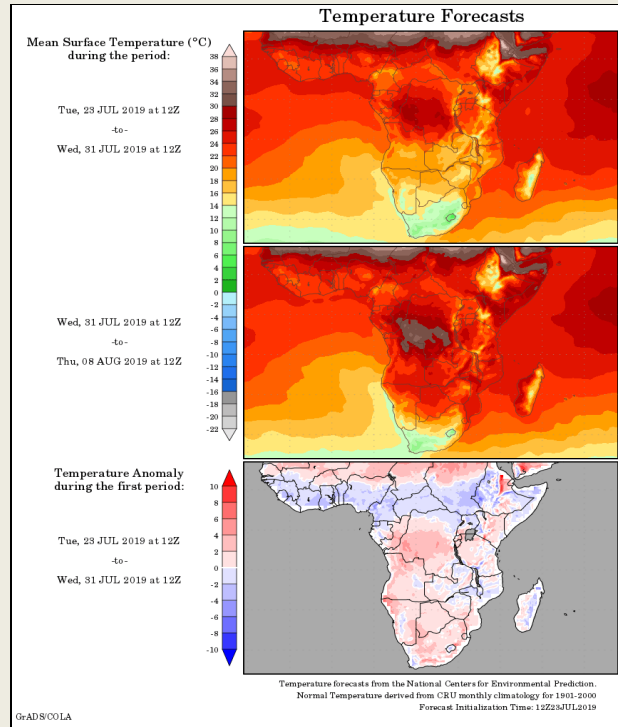
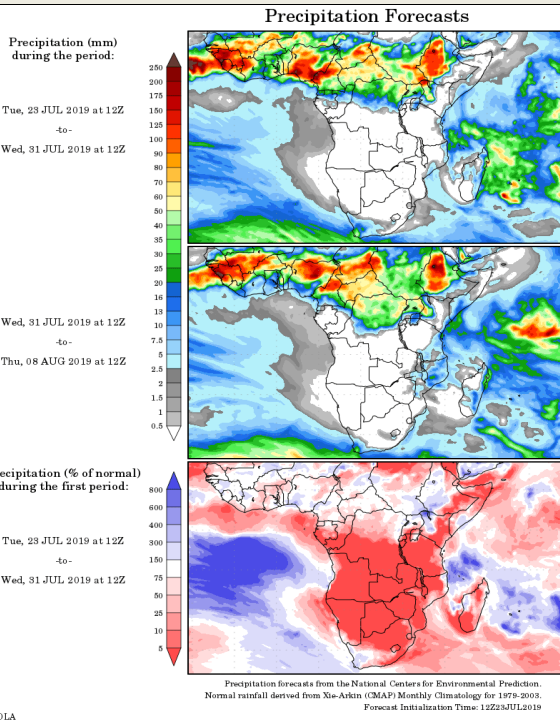
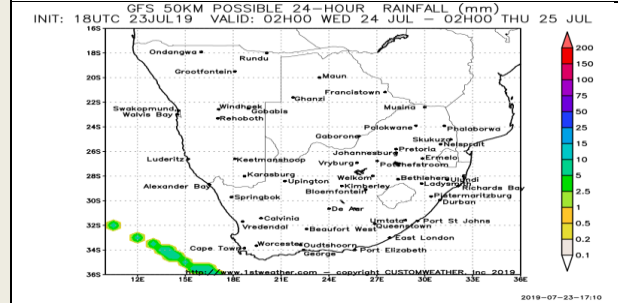
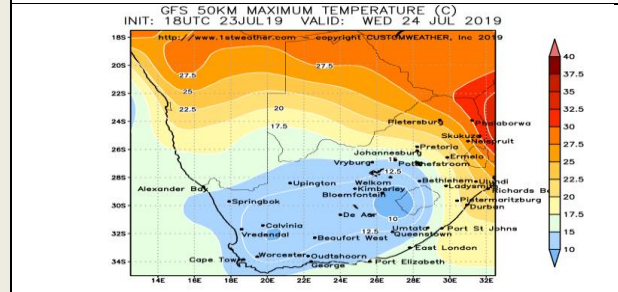
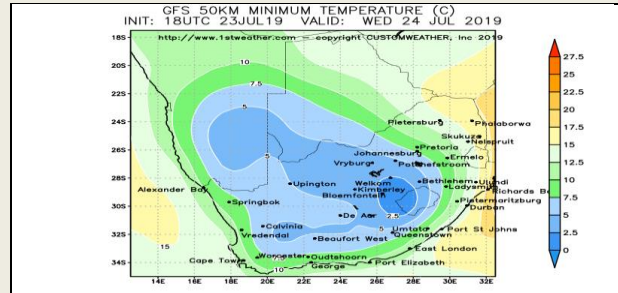
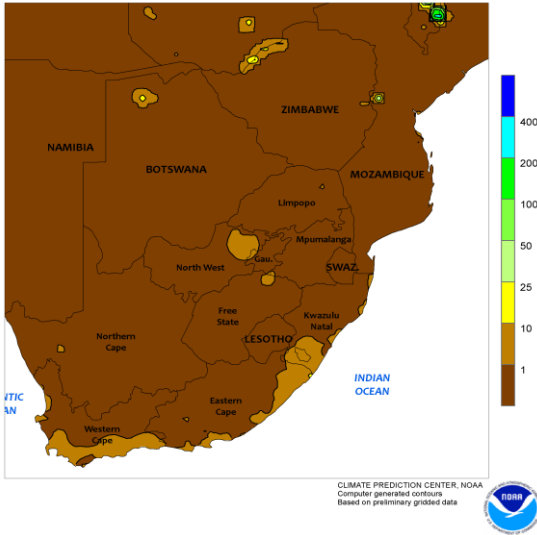


**Weather Report**  
**24 July 2019**

South Africa - Weather

- Other portions of South Africa will be dry
- Very little rain slated for much of the country July 31 – August 6
- Dry or critically dry conditions will persist for Free State and neighboring areas during the next two weeks
  - o The winter wheat in these areas will remain dormant or semi-dormant
  - o These areas will need to see significant rain this spring to improve winter wheat growth prospects
- Portions of Western Cape will receive enough rain during the coming week to bolster soil moisture
- o Additional rain will still be needed to completely reverse the moisture deficits in some of the driest areas

July 7 - 13, 2019



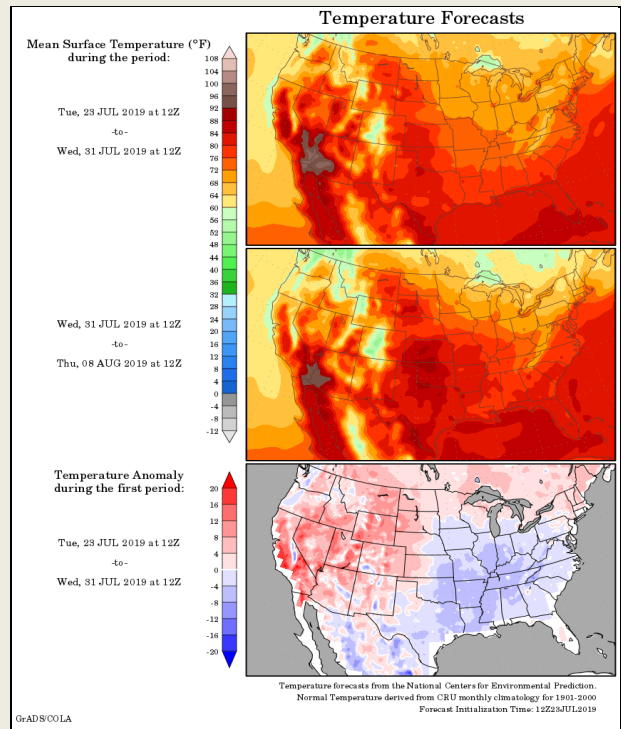
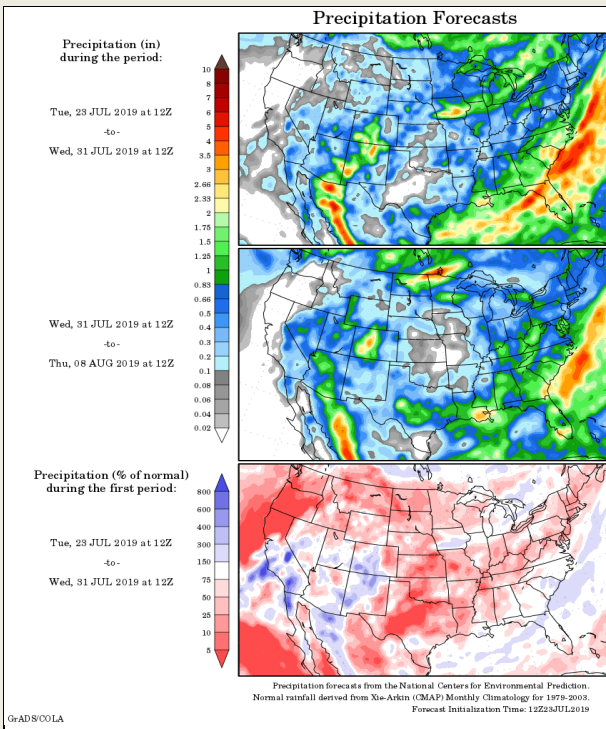
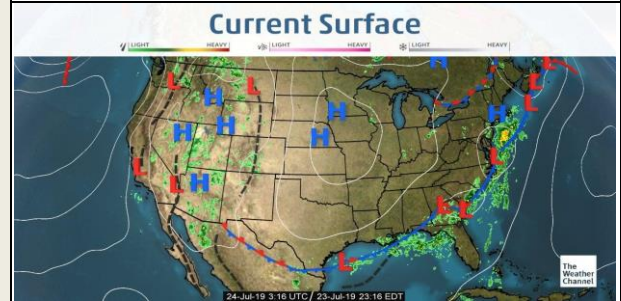
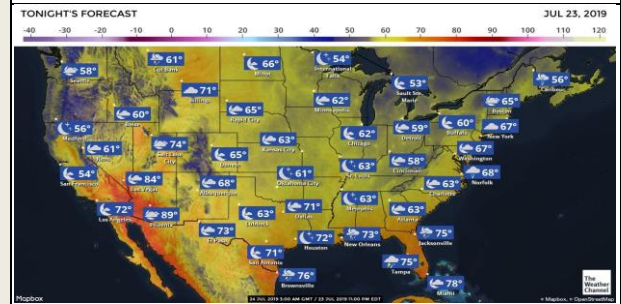
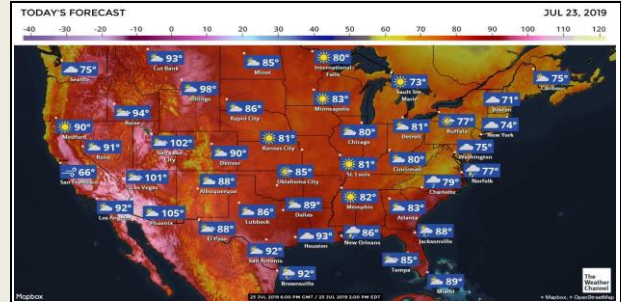
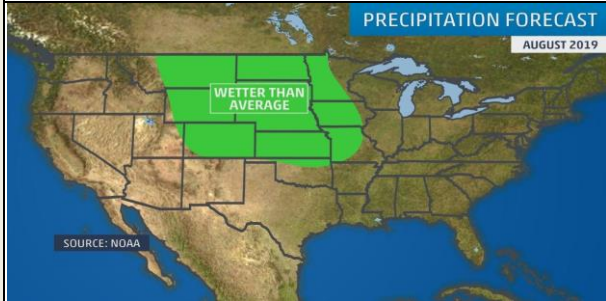
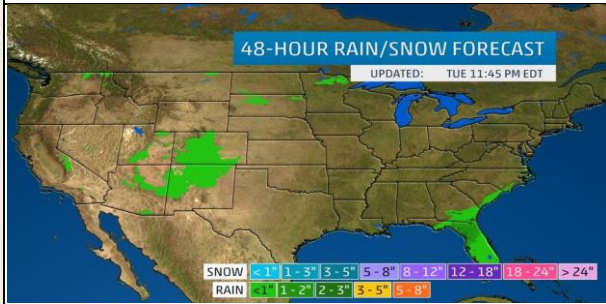
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# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** Rain during the past weekend and cool temperatures this week has left much of the Midwest with favorable conditions for most crops with a notable exception extending from east-central Iowa to central Illinois to portions of northeastern Missouri where topsoil moisture is short and some crops are likely stressed.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** The Delta and the Southeast will see a favorable pattern of isolated to scattered showers most days during the next two weeks that will slow drying rates and maintain favorable conditions for crops in most areas.

o Some areas will dry down overall, but with the timely showers expected and adequate subsoil moisture in place, most crops should continue to develop favorably.

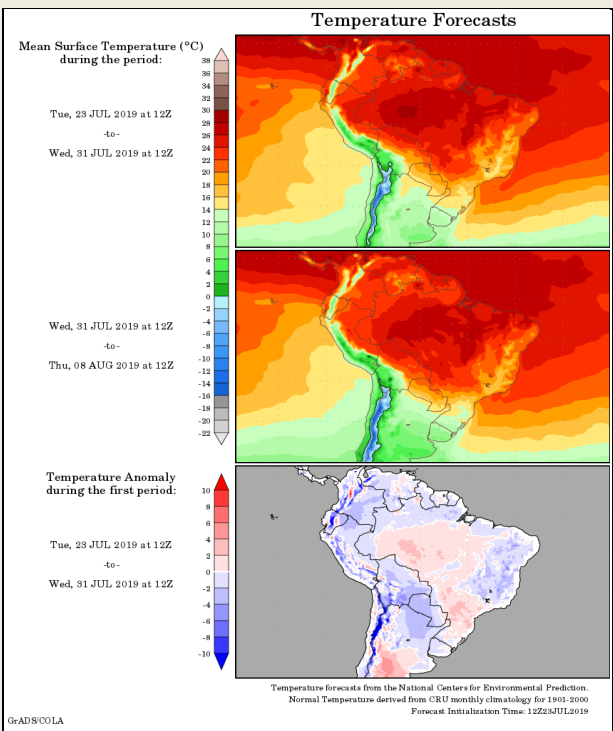
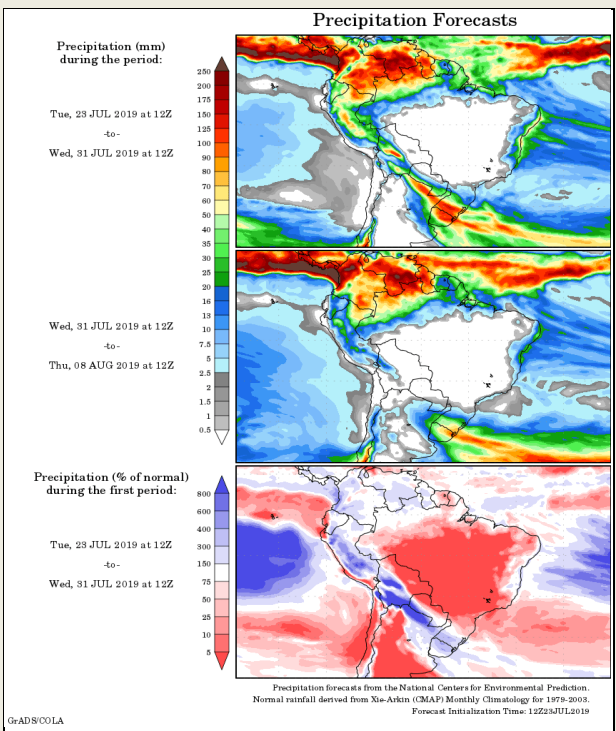
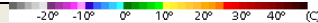
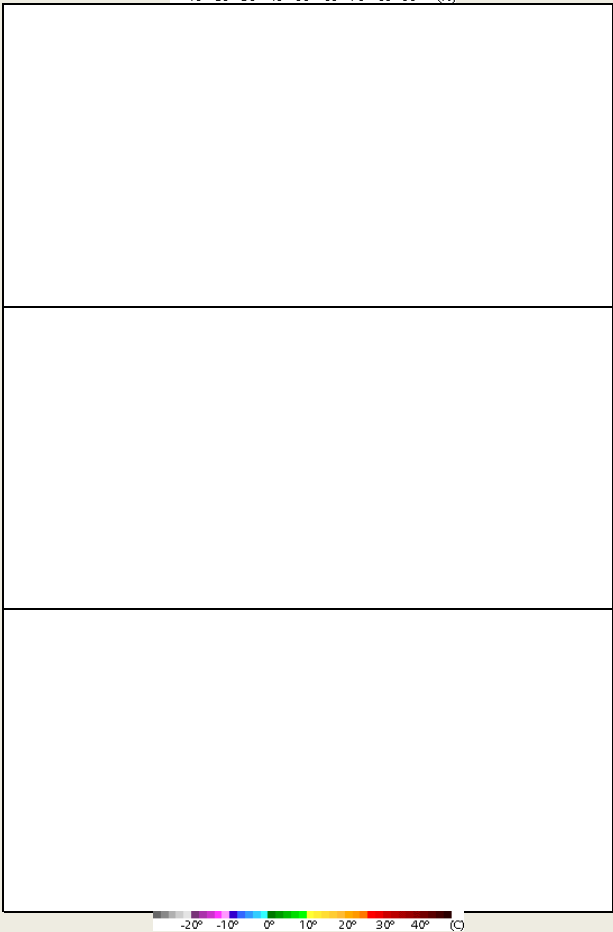
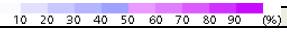
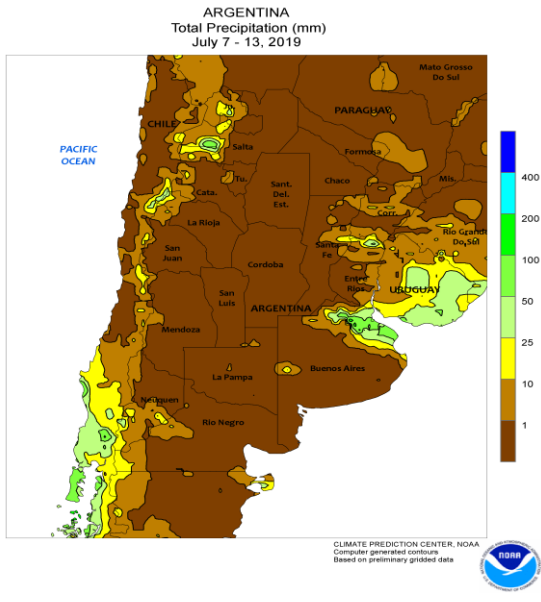


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# South America - Weather

**BRAZIL:** Outside of a few light showers, mostly dry weather will occur into Sunday before rain returns to southern Brazil and Paraguay Monday into Thursday.  
 o Harvesting should advance well in much of the country with temporary interruptions expected to result from the rain event mentioned above.

**ARGENTINA:** Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and planting of winter wheat and harvesting of summer crops should advance well overall with some rain and interruptions to fieldwork in the northeast this week. Much of western Argentina has short soil moisture and needs rain to improve conditions for winter wheat and little to no rain of significance is expected there for at least the next ten days.

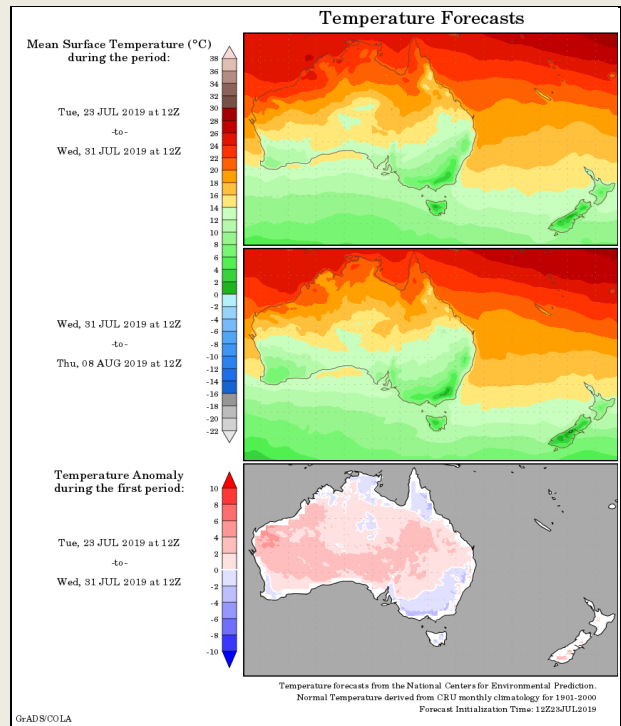
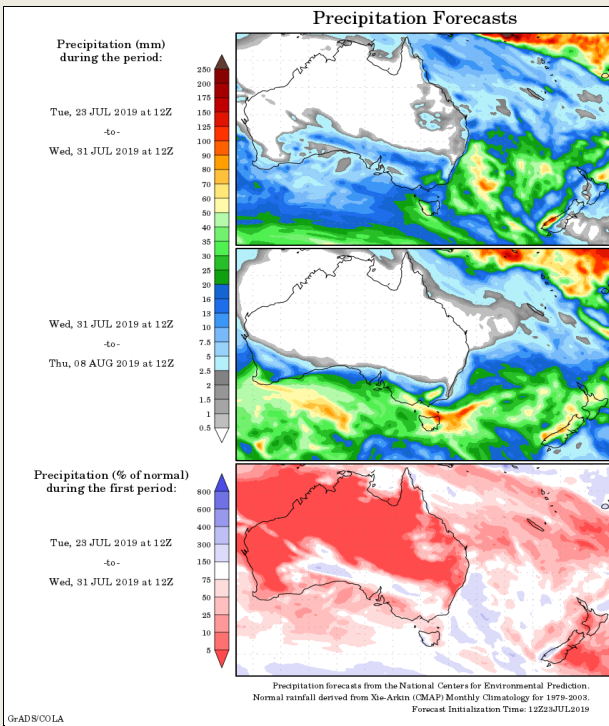
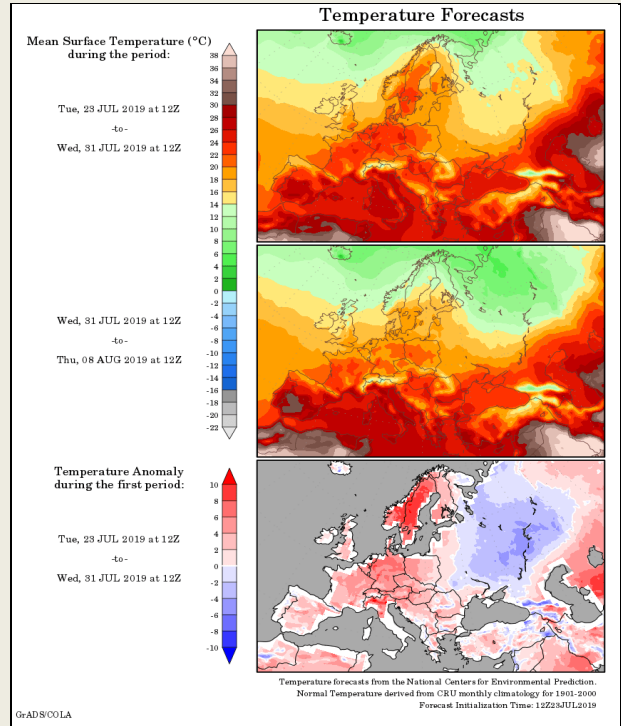
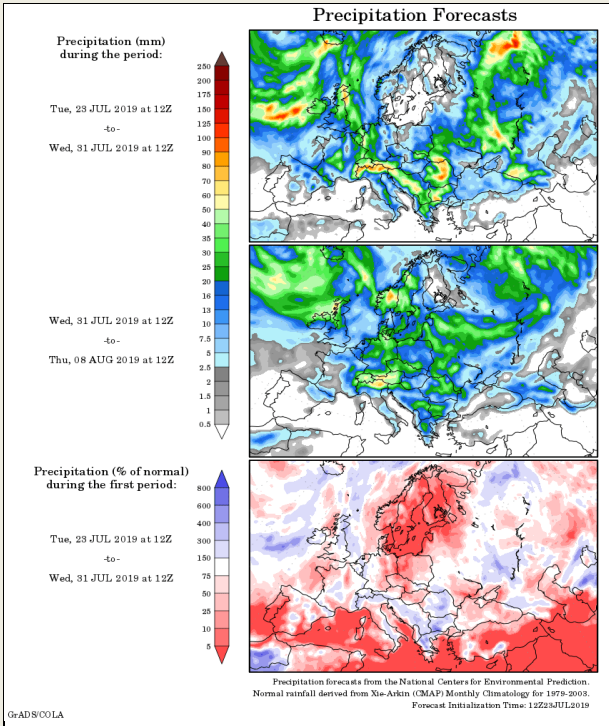


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## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

**EUROPE:** Another heat wave and drying conditions will evolve over western and into central Europe this week. Concern over crop moisture stress will increase as heat returns to the continent, especially in France where soil moisture conditions are currently quite dry. Spring Cereals should be too far advanced to be hurt additionally from the coming heat, but concern over unirrigated corn, sunseed and soybeans will rise. Soft wheat has performed fairly well this year missing out on most of the heat and dryness and favorable harvest conditions will prevail this week

**AUSTRALIA:** Drought stricken areas in Queensland and northern New South Wales are expected to receive no "significant" precipitation for at least the next two weeks and wheat, barley and canola production will continue to struggle. Erratic showers may increase during the latter half of this week, but daily moisture totals will be no more than 0.30 inch most often and greater rain will still be needed.



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
