South Africa - Weather

Late season harvesting and fieldwork will advance swiftly in most locations

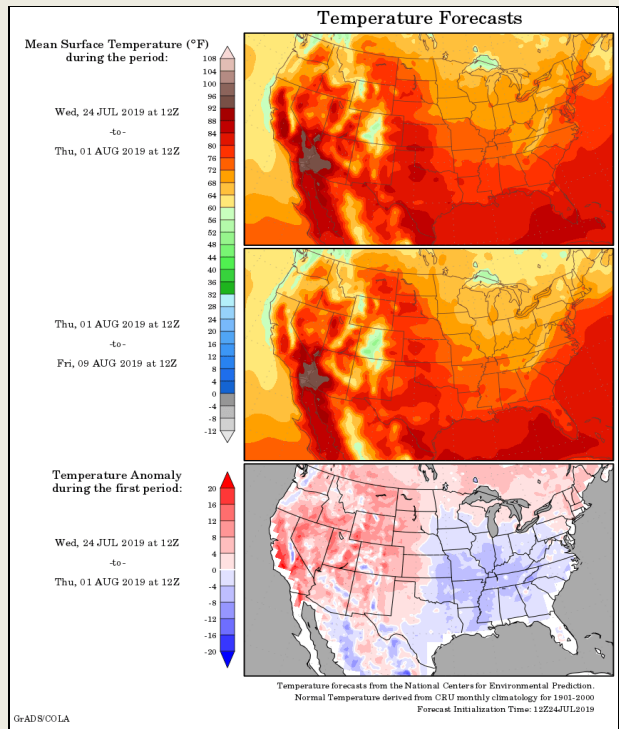
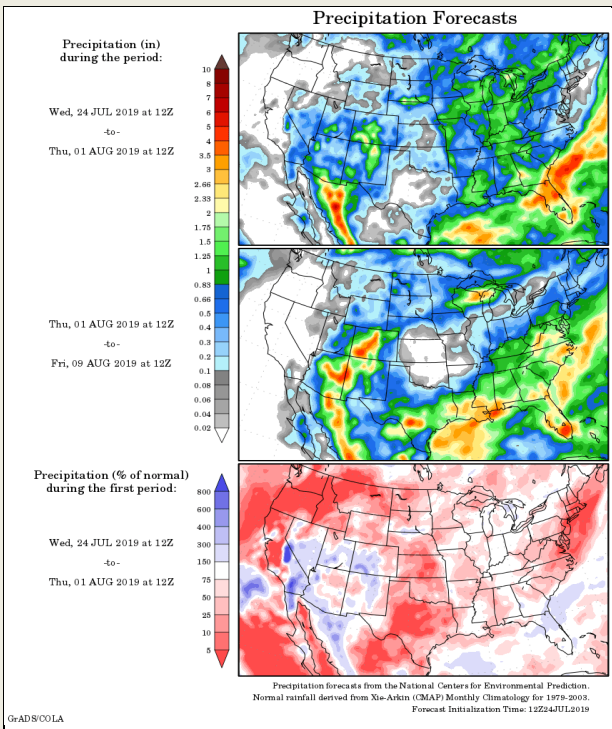
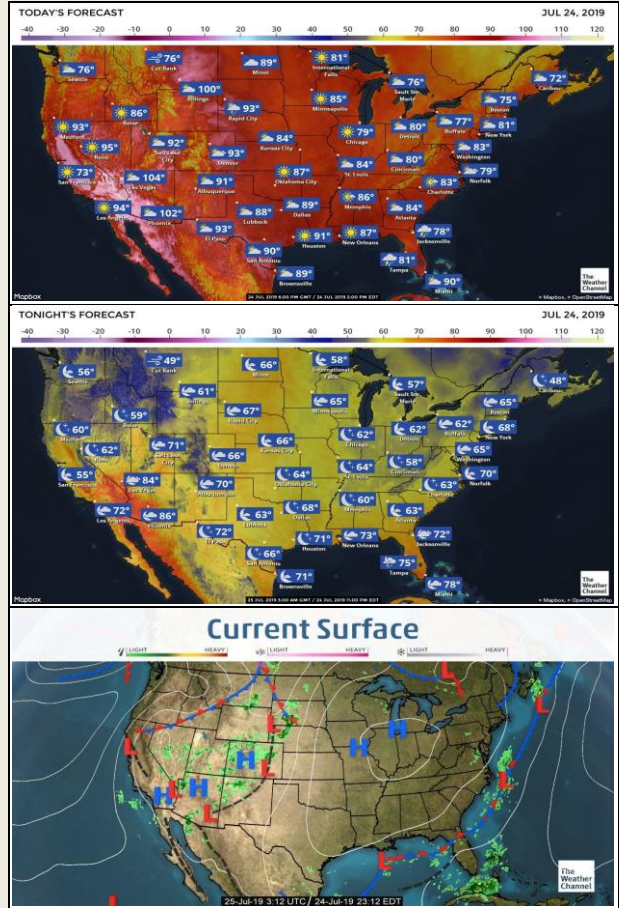
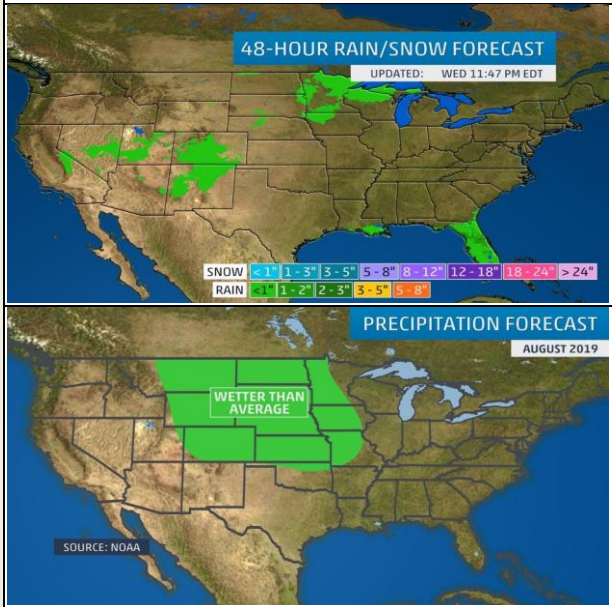
- Free State and neighboring areas will remain dry during the next two weeks
- These areas are normally drier biased this time of year
- Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant during the next two weeks
- Timely rain will be needed this spring once the wheat begins to develop
- Recent rainfall continued to bolster soil moisture for portions of Western Cape's winter wheat areas
- A few areas would still benefit from a boost in rainfall in the coming weeks
- Crop prospects have otherwise improved due to the periods of rain
- Near to above normal temperatures slated for much of South Africa through next Wednesday



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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Rain during the past weekend and cool temperatures this week has left much of the Midwest with favorable conditions for most crops with a notable exception extending from east-central Iowa to central Illinois to portions of northeastern Missouri where topsoil moisture is short and some crops are likely stressed. A restricted rainfall pattern will be in place into Saturday, but with mild U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a favorable pattern of isolated to scattered showers most days during the next two weeks that will slow drying rates and maintain favorable conditions for crops in most areas. The Mississippi River was below flood stage in the central and northern Delta this morning with minor to moderate flooding in the southern Delta



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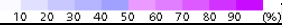
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: A few rounds of rain will occur during the next two weeks in far southern Brazil and Paraguay and fieldwork will be interrupted at times while most other areas see little to no rain and fieldwork should advance swiftly.

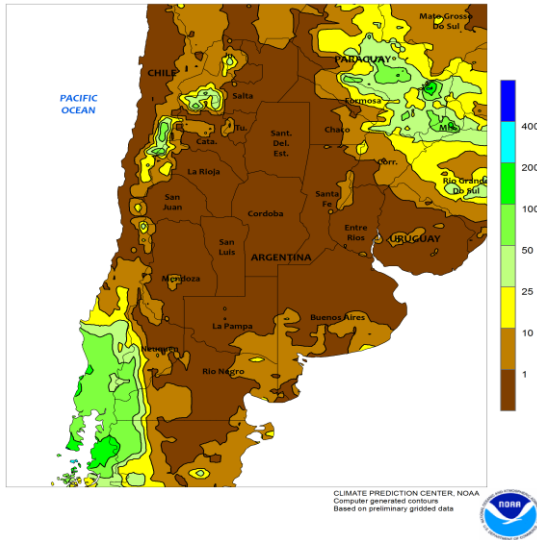
- o Rain will continue into Thursday in the south and Rio Grande do Sul and southwestern Paraguay will receive 0.75-2.50" of rain and locally more and some local flooding may result.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and planting of winter wheat and harvesting of summer crops should advance well overall with some rain and interruptions to fieldwork in the northeast this week.

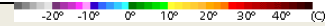
- o Much of western Argentina has short soil moisture and needs rain to improve conditions for winter wheat and little to no rain of significance is expected there for at least the next ten days.



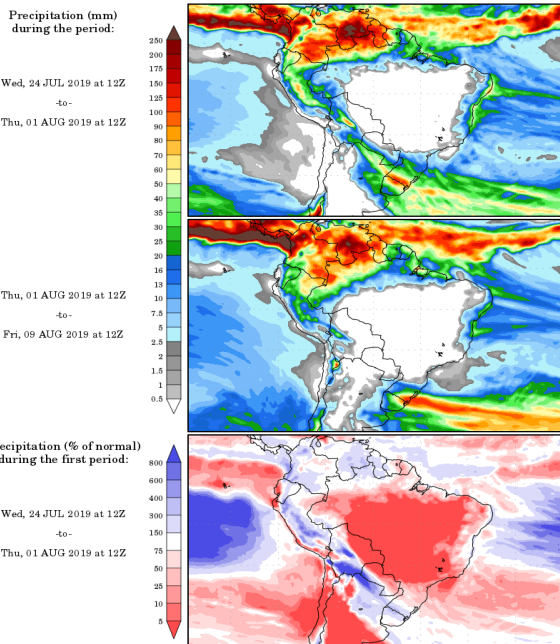
ARGENTINA

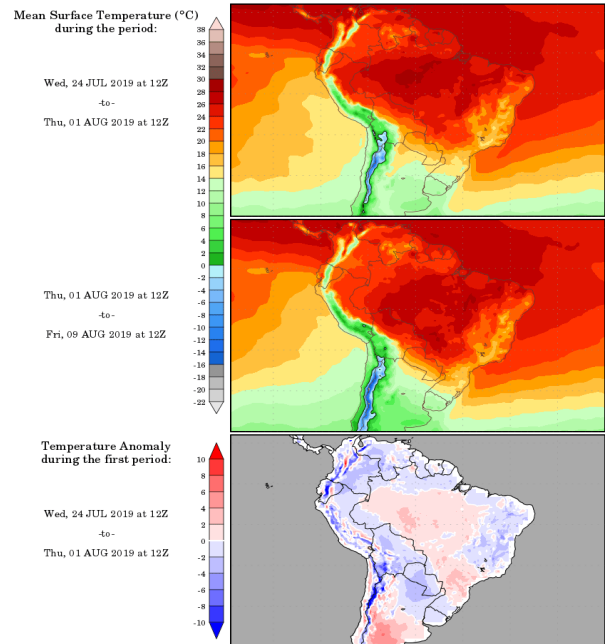
Precipitation Forecasts

Forecast Initialization Time: 12Z24JUL2019

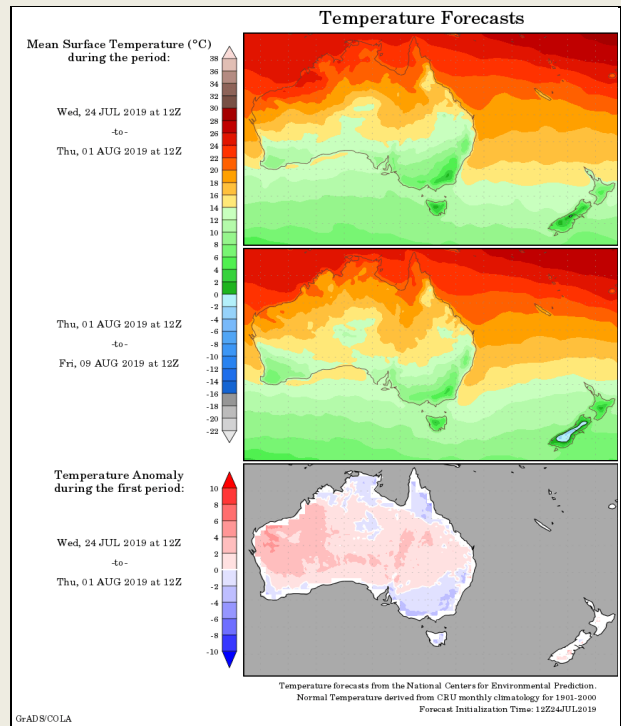
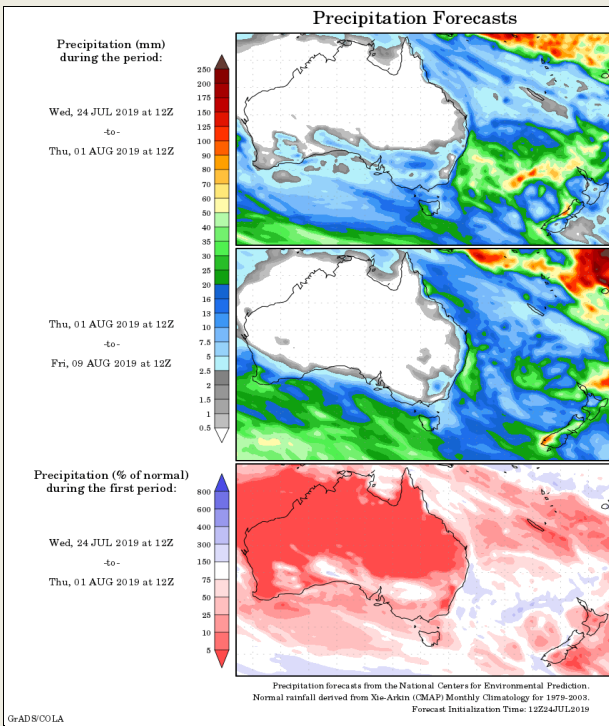
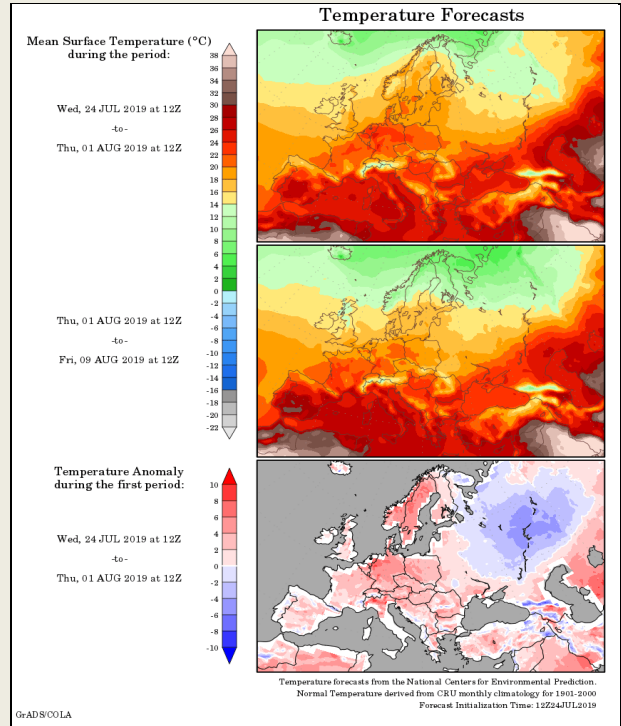
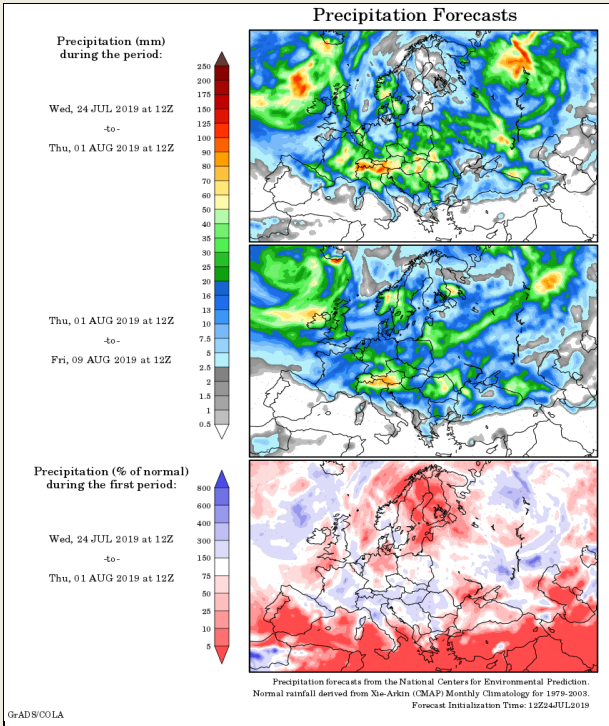
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Another heat wave and drying conditions will continue over western and into central Europe this week. Concern over crop moisture stress will increase especially for unirrigated crops in France where dryness has been centralized the past few weeks.

AUSTRALIA: Drought stricken areas in Queensland and northern New South Wales are expected to receive no "significant" precipitation for at least the next two weeks and wheat, barley and canola production will continue to struggle. Erratic showers may increase during the latter half of this week, but daily moisture totals will be no more than 0.30 inch most often and greater rain will still be needed. Another potential increase in showers may occur late next week, but confidence in the moisture is low and resulting moisture is expected to be light and erratic.



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
