South Africa - Weather

- The remaining portions of South Africa will be dry or mostly dry during the next two weeks
- Any harvesting not yet complete will advance swiftly
- Free State and neighboring areas will continue to have critical moisture shortages during the next two weeks
 - o These areas are normally drier biased this time of year
 - o Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant
- Significant rain will be needed this spring to improve growth prospects
- Western Cape will welcome the periods of rain during the next two weeks
 - o However, most areas will remain dry or critically dry
 - o Timely rain will also be needed in most locations to improve winter wheat prospects

July 14 - 20, 2019

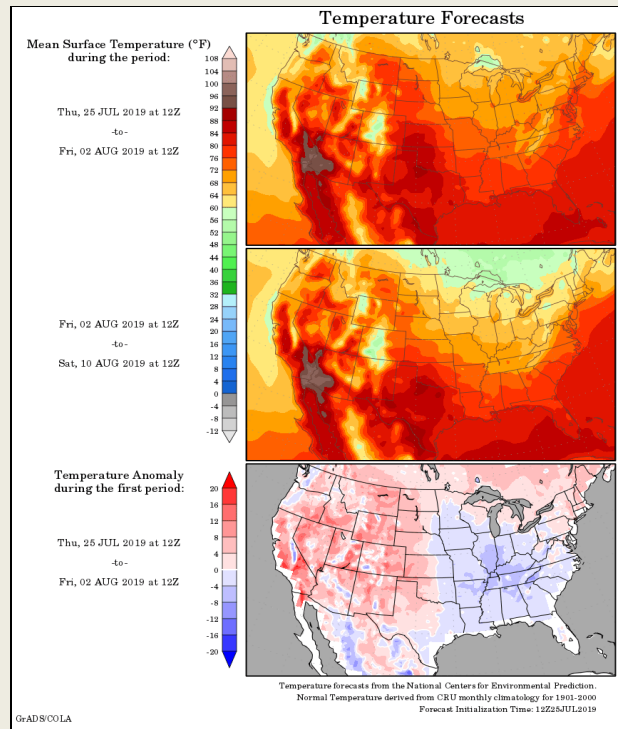
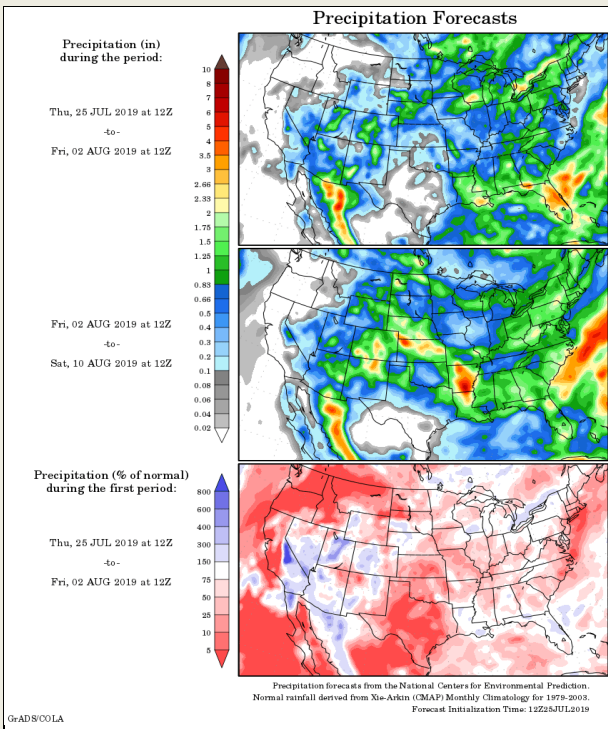
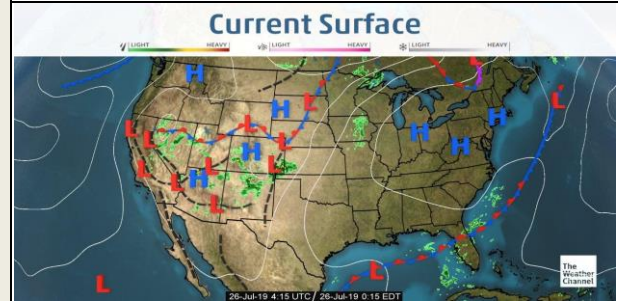
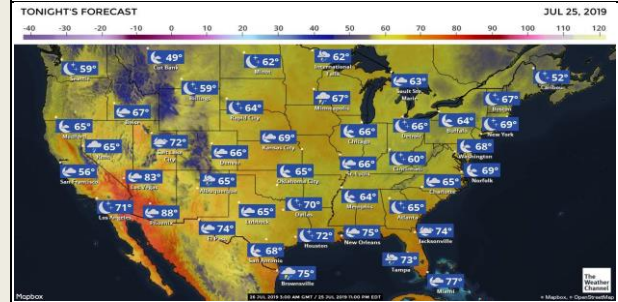
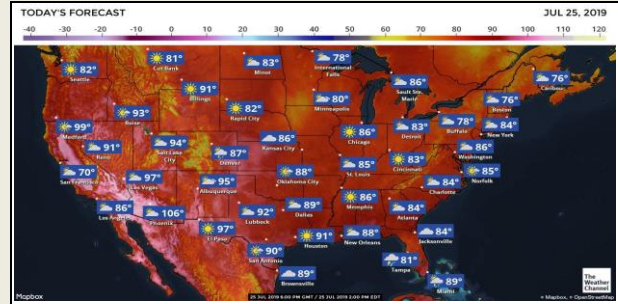
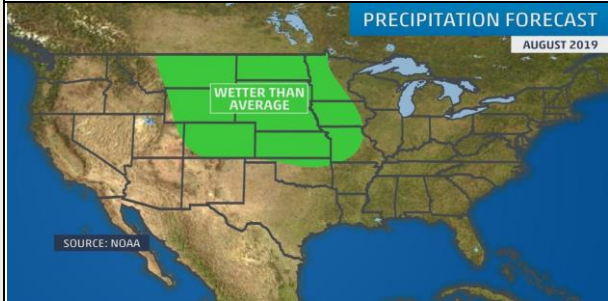


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: An important increase in rain will occur Saturday evening into Tuesday with little follow up rain into the first week of August. The rain will be critical for crops from east-central Iowa to central Illinois while the rain will be important in many other areas after the drying that will precede and follow the rain.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Today's forecast is drier overall for the Delta and the Southeast will during the next two weeks and parts of the region will need an increase in rain in early August to maintain favorable soil conditions. The southern Delta to northern Florida and southern Georgia to southcentral and southeastern Virginia will be wettest and crop conditions should be mostly favorable in this region.



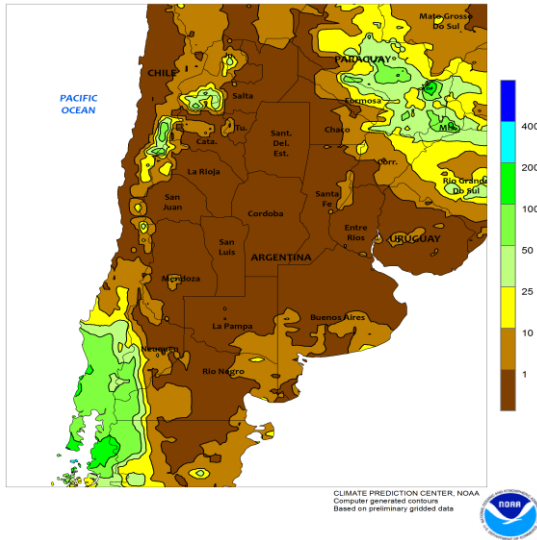
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Occasional rounds of rain will occur during the next two weeks in far southern Brazil and fieldwork will be interrupted at times while most other areas see little to no rain and fieldwork should advance swiftly.
o Rain will continue today in the south and Rio Grande do Sul and south Paraguay will receive 0.30-1.0" of rain and locally more with lighter rain into portions of Parana.

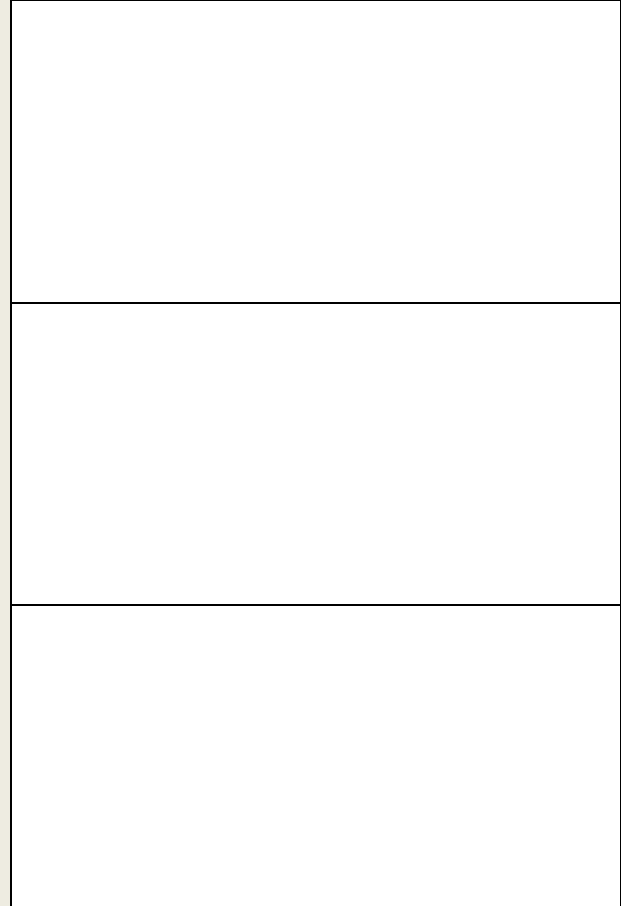
ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and planting of winter wheat and harvesting of summer crops should advance well overall with additional rain and interruptions to fieldwork in the east today.

July 14 - 20, 2019



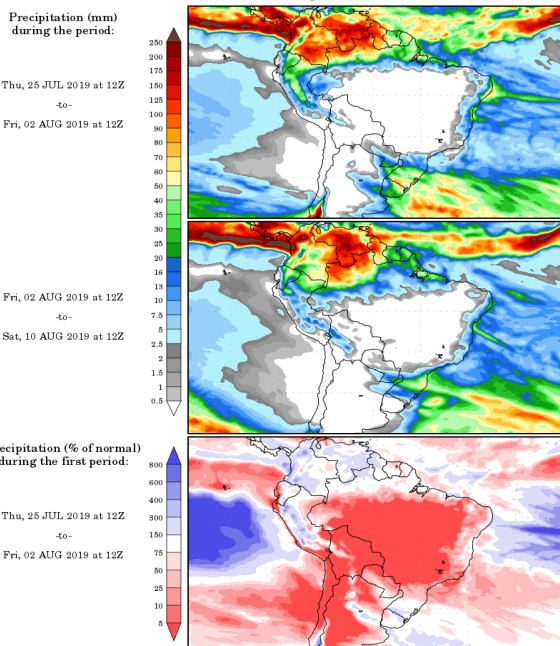

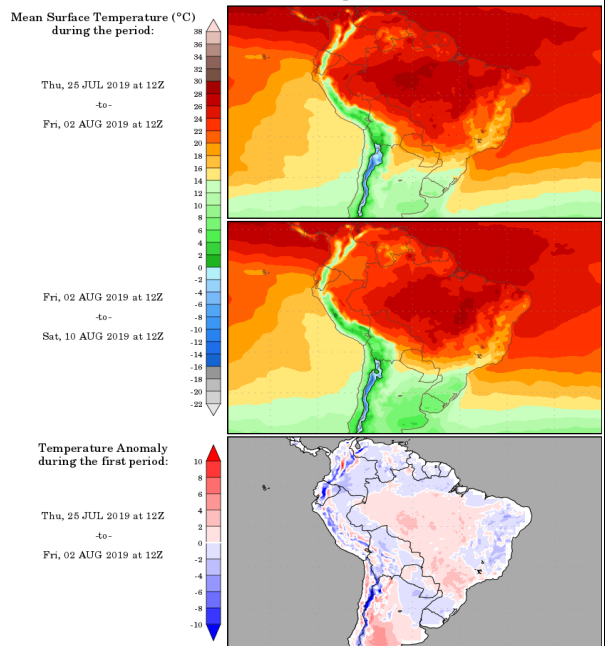

Temperature Forecasts



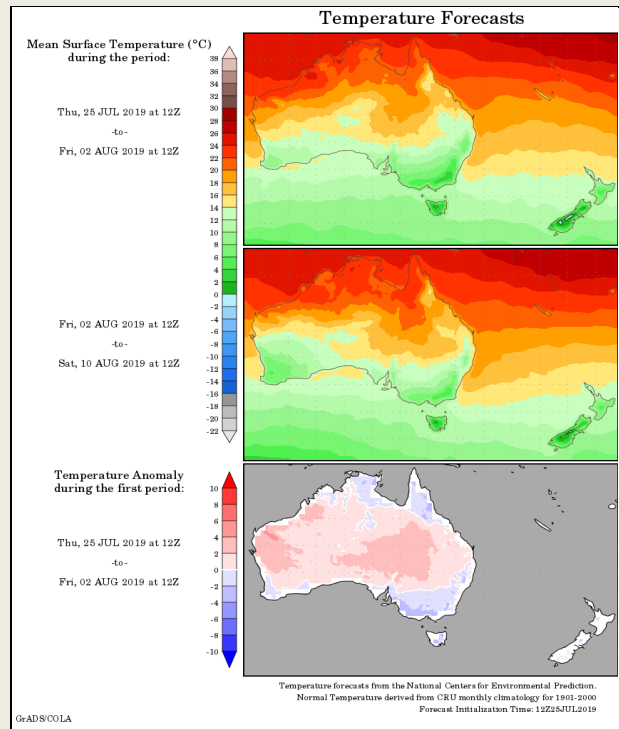
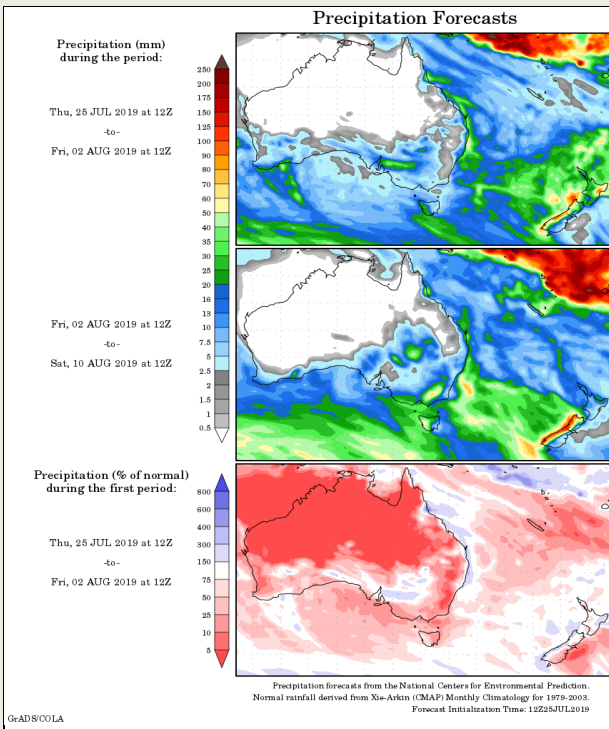
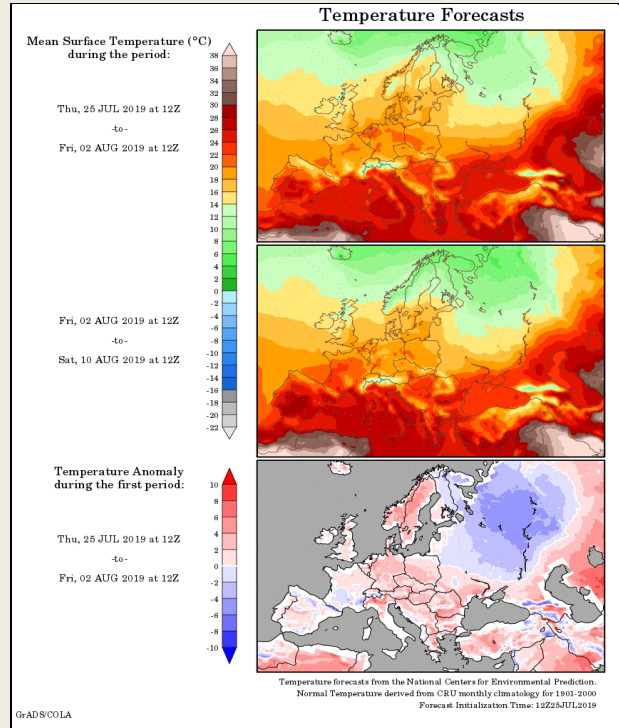
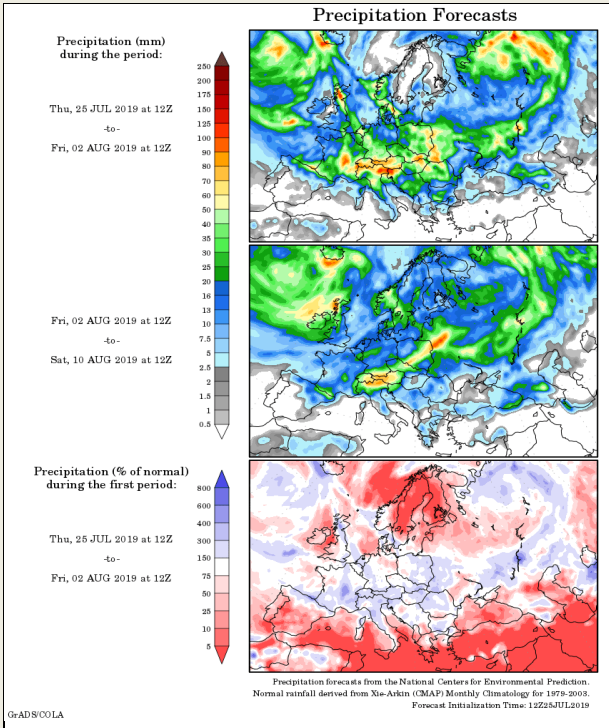

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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: The heat wave will continue to impact Europe today with the hottest temperatures of the week peaking over France and immediate surrounding locations. The heat wave will begin to break down in the west Friday into the weekend. Above normal temperatures will linger in eastern portions of the continent into early next week. Concern over crop moisture stress will increase especially for unirrigated crops in France where dryness has been centralized the past few weeks.

AUSTRALIA: Drought stricken areas in Queensland and northern New South Wales are expected to receive no "significant" precipitation for at least the next two weeks and wheat, barley and canola production will continue to struggle. Erratic showers may increase Tuesday into next Friday, but daily moisture totals will be no more than 0.30 inch most often and greater rain will still be needed.



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
