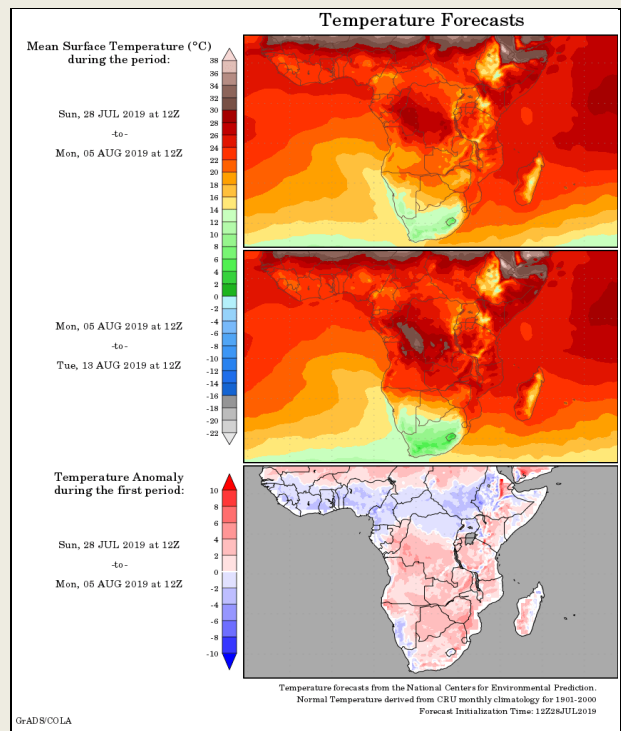
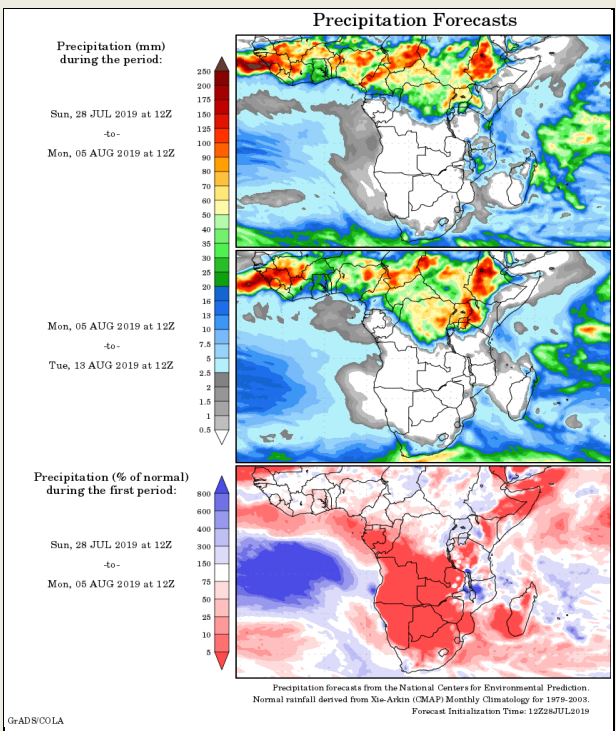
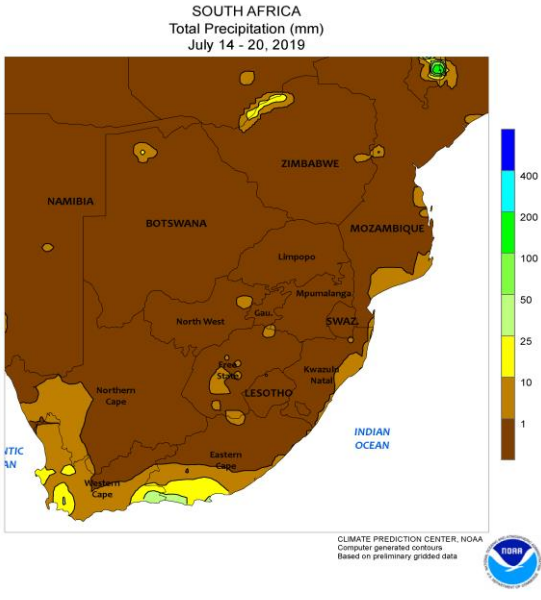
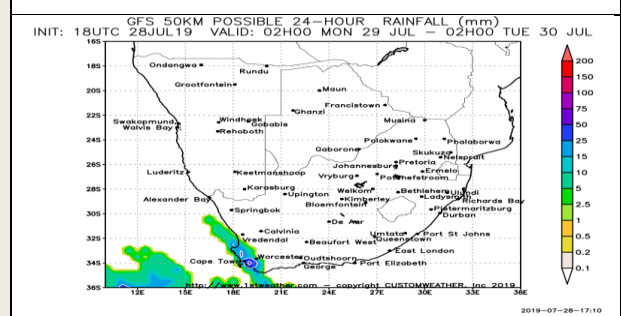
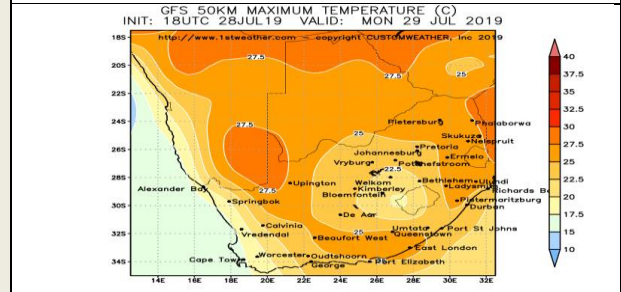
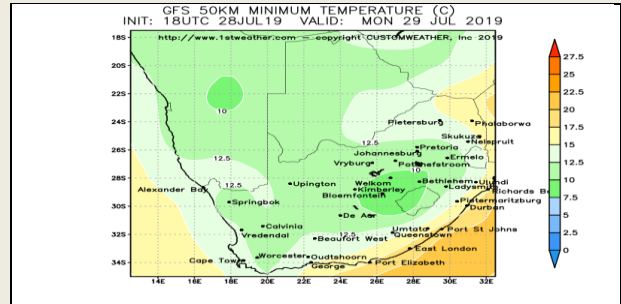




Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

- Any harvesting not yet complete will advance swiftly
- Moisture shortages will persist for Free State and neighboring areas during the next two weeks
- o These areas are normally drier biased this time of year
- o Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant
- o Timely rain will be needed this spring once the wheat begins developing
- Rainfall in Western Cape will generally be too light to impact long-term soil conditions during the next two weeks
- o Most areas will remain dry
- o The winter wheat areas will also need to see timely rain this spring
- Temperatures will be near to above normal through next Friday

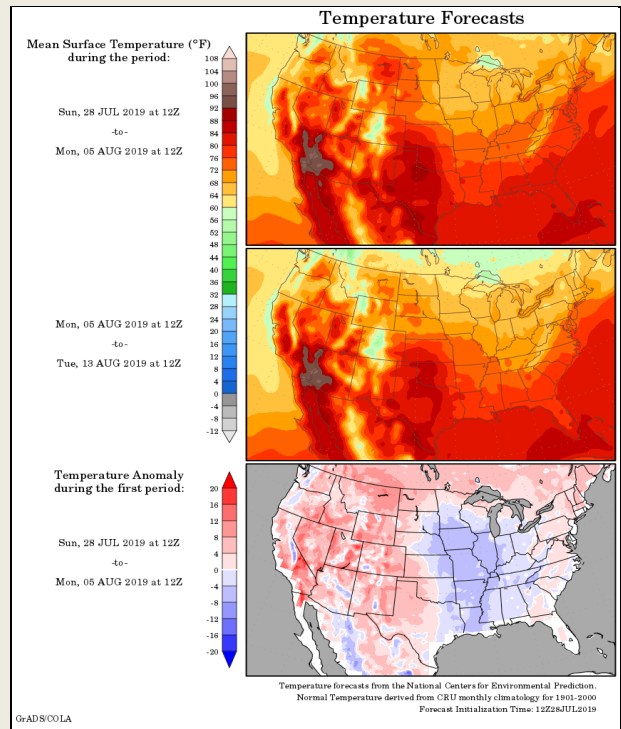
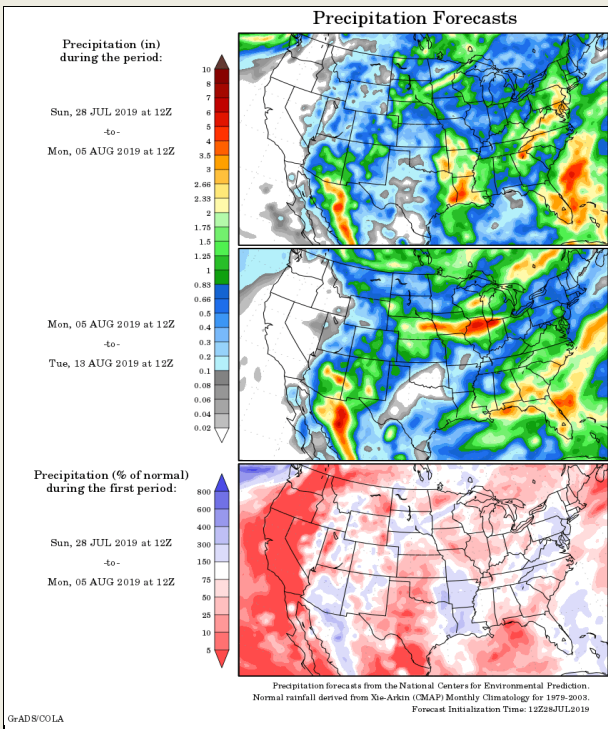
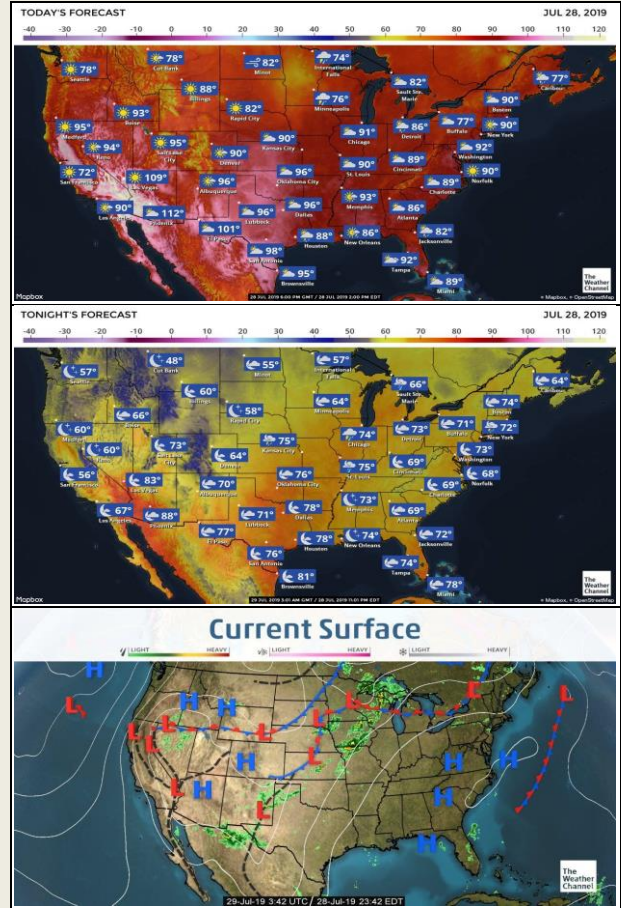
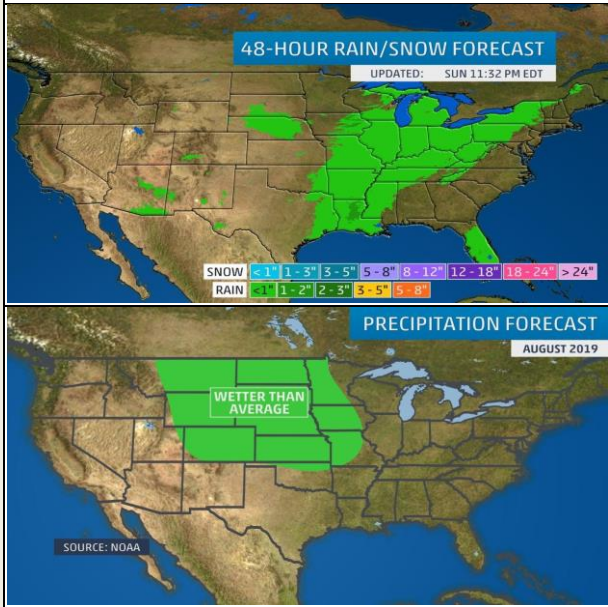


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will dry down during the next two weeks, but much of the region still has enough soil moisture to support most crops with a notable exception extending from east-central Iowa to central Illinois where topsoil moisture is short and some crops are likely stressed. A restricted rainfall pattern will remain in place through much of the next two weeks, but with no excessive heat for at least another ten days and most areas seeing at least two rounds of showers most crops should have adequate soil moisture for crop development.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: A little more rain has been removed from the forecast for Southeast since Thursday and a larger part of the region will dry down significantly during the next ten days to two weeks and will need an increase in rain in early August to maintain favorable soil conditions. Rain during the next ten days will be greatest in the southern Delta and also in the Carolinas and southern Virginia and crop conditions should be mostly favorable in this region.



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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Occasional rounds of rain will occur during the next two weeks in far southern Brazil and fieldwork will be interrupted at times while most other areas see little to no rain and fieldwork should advance swiftly.

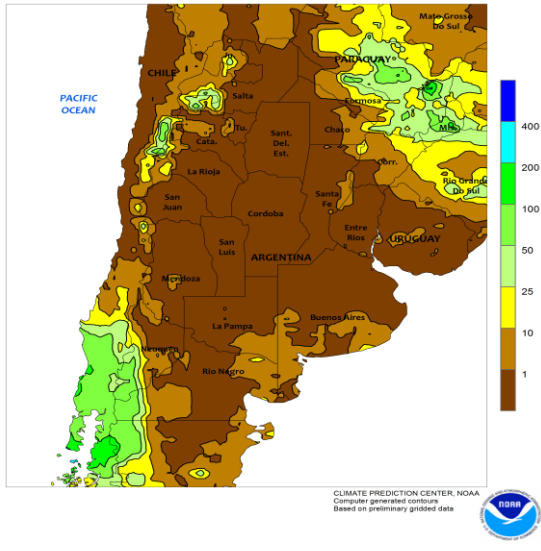
- o Light showers will linger in southern Brazil into Sunday with more organized showers in far southern Brazil Monday when Rio Grande do Sul sees a few hundredths of an of rain to 0.50" and locally more.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and planting of winter wheat and harvesting of summer crops should advance well overall.

- o Much of western Argentina has short soil moisture and needs rain to improve conditions for winter wheat and little to no rain of significance is expected there for at least the next ten days.

Light showers will increase Wednesday into Thursday in western and portions of southern Argentina, but rain is not likely to be great enough to induce more than a brief increase in soil moisture.

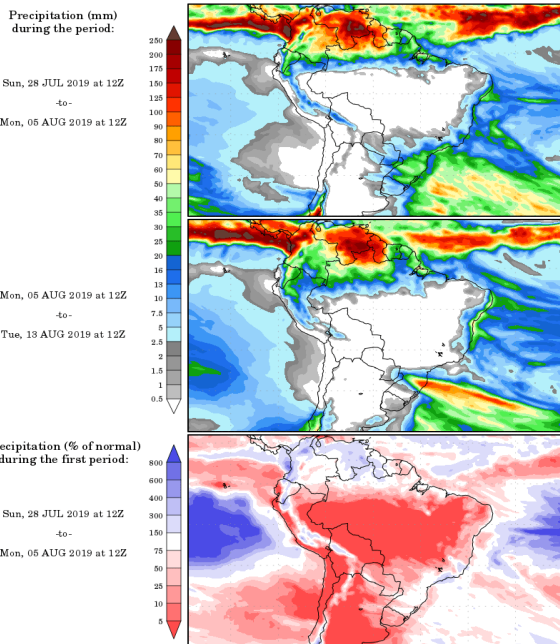
ARGENTINA

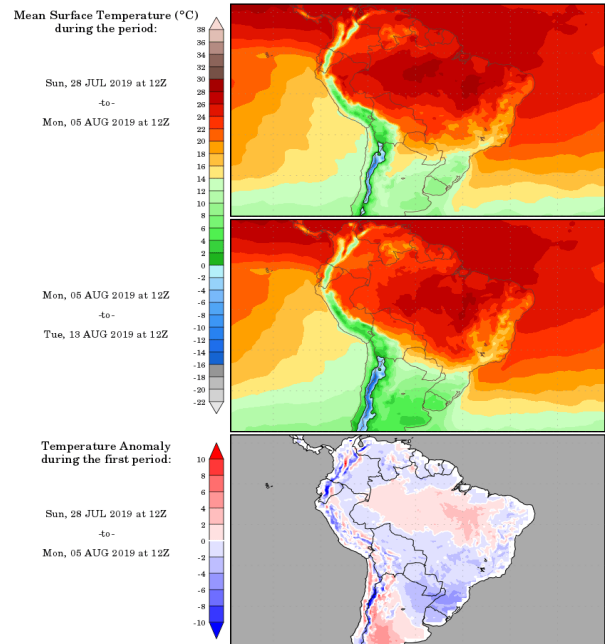

Temperature Forecasts



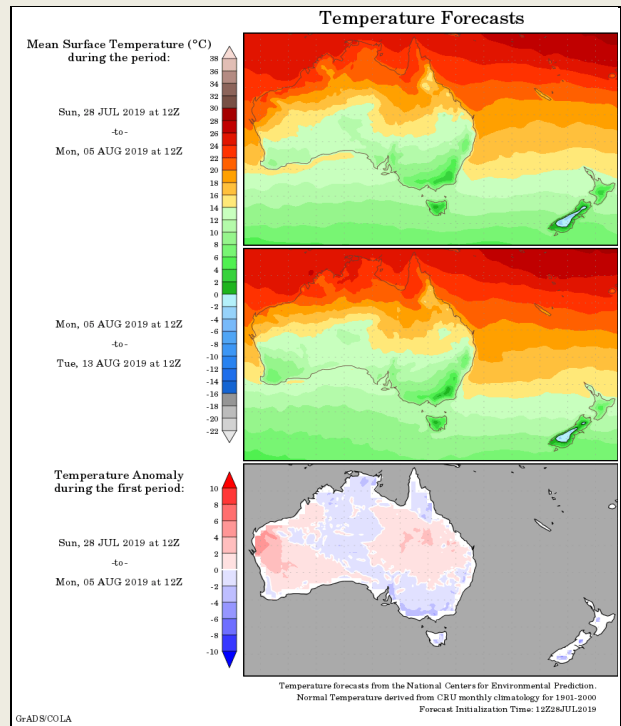
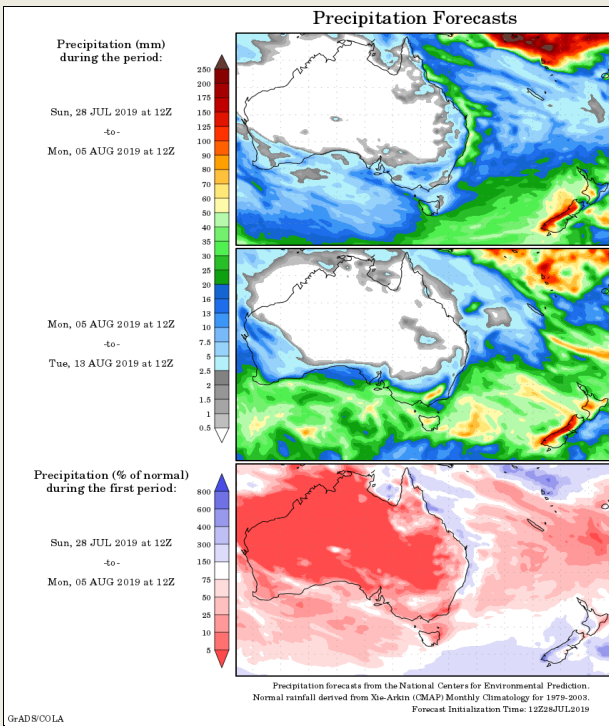
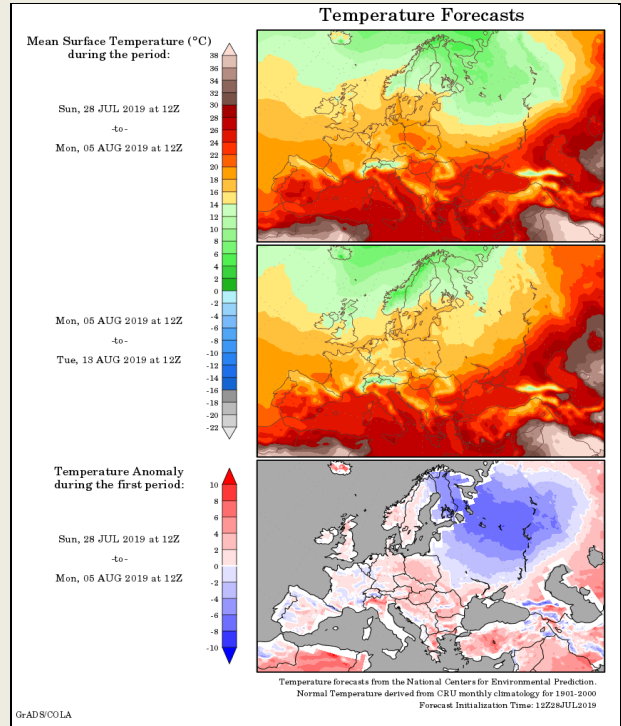
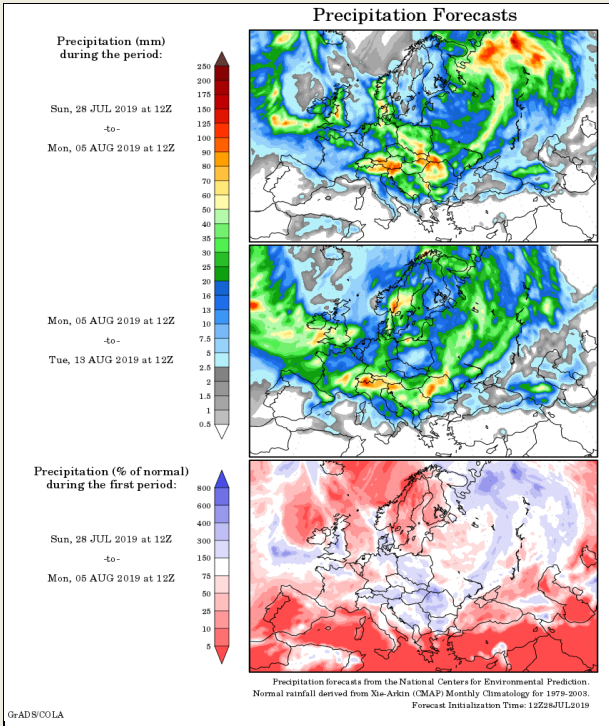
Temperature forecasts from the National Centers for Environmental Prediction.

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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Relief to the recent heatwave will progress from west to east across Europe today through the weekend. Some warmth will continue in east Europe into early next week, but temperatures will not be as extreme as recent heat in the west and rain will increase over eastern Europe as well. The most significant relief will occur in central France and southeast U.K. into west and south Germany and north Italy where cooler temperatures and a good soaking of rain will occur. Many locations will still need follow up rain, especially in France where drying has occurred most of this month.

AUSTRALIA: Drought stricken areas in Queensland and northern New South Wales are expected to receive no "significant" precipitation for at least the next two weeks and wheat, barley and canola production will continue to struggle. Erratic showers may increase during the middle of next workweek, but daily moisture totals will be no more than 0.30 inch most often and greater rain will still be needed. In the meantime, periodic rounds of precipitation will occur over southern portions of the nation the next couple of weeks. The moisture will help maintain the best conditions for crops throughout southern portions of the nation, especially Victoria and immediate surrounding locations.



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
