
South Africa - Weather

Winter wheat, barley and canola will remain semi-dormant throughout the next two weeks. Crops were adequately established this season and are poised to perform normally if timely rainfall evolves in mid- to late-September and October. Seasonably dry conditions until that time will keep crops dormant or semi-dormant.


United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Despite some pockets of notable drying during the next two weeks in the eastern Corn Belt, most areas will continue to have adequate soil moisture to support crop development through the period. Multiple rounds of timely rain are expected, and although much of the rain will be light, a lack of excessive heat will help to conserve soil moisture and allow crops to avoid becoming seriously stressed.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Much of the Delta and the Southeast will receive enough rain to favorably support the needs of crops through the next two weeks.


o A few pockets of dryness may evolve, but there should be enough timely rain and existing soil moisture to prevent excessive dryness during the next two weeks.

☐ The northern Delta and portions of northern Alabama will be driest overall and the rainfall distribution will need to be monitored.




South America - Weather


BRAZIL: A restricted rainfall pattern remains in place most often during the next two weeks and greater rain will be needed soon to improve conditions for early planting.


o Light showers will occur on occasion in southern Brazil with rain of significance rarely falling north of Santa Catarina while portions of northeastern Brazil also see light showers on occasion. The next round of organized showers for southern Brazil will occur Sunday into Tuesday with northeastern Rio Grande do Sul to eastern Santa Catarina and eastern Parana seeing most of the significant rain where amounts will be 0.25-1.0° and locally more.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and rain is needed in western Argentina to improve conditions for winter wheat. o Eastern Argentina will see a few light showers on occasion during the next two weeks while western Argentina stays mostly dry and sees a further depletion of soil moisture.


o The greatest moisture will occur over north France and south U.K. into Scandinavia Saturday into Sunday as another cold front pushes through the region.


Moisture totals by this time next week will range from 0.30 to 1.00 inch and local totals varying from 1.00 to 2.50 inches


AUSTRALIA: Drying will continue over east-central Australia for at least the next ten days to two weeks.


The lack of moisture will maintain long term dryness and unirrigated northern winter crop production areas have struggled due to the dryness.

Winter crops in southern Australia will remain semi-dormant for the next week to ten days leaving plant moisture demand a bit low.
