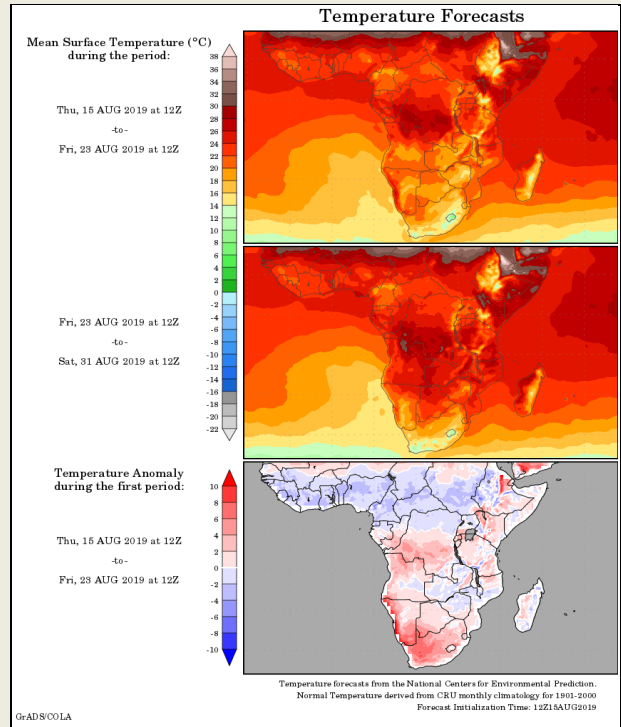
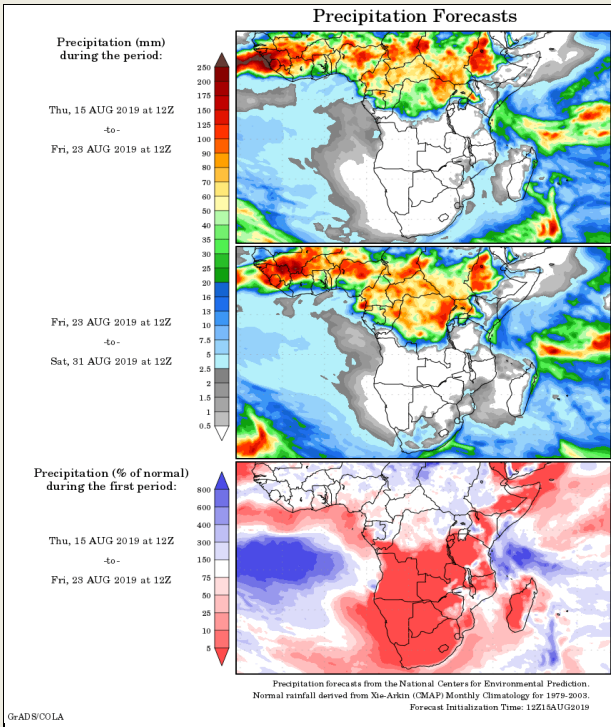
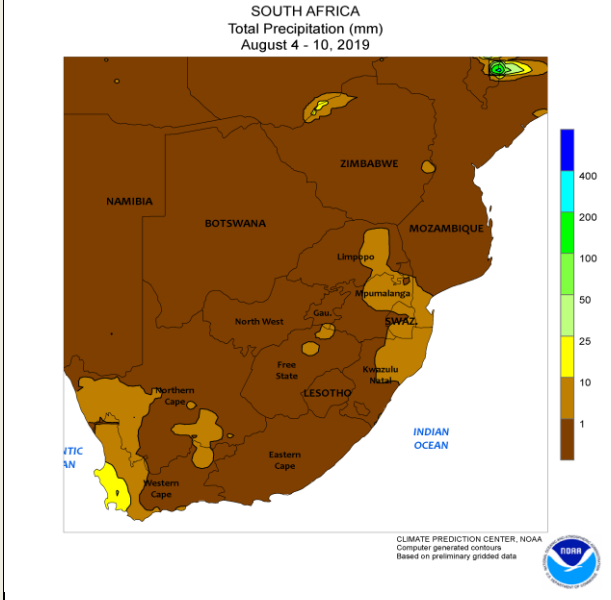
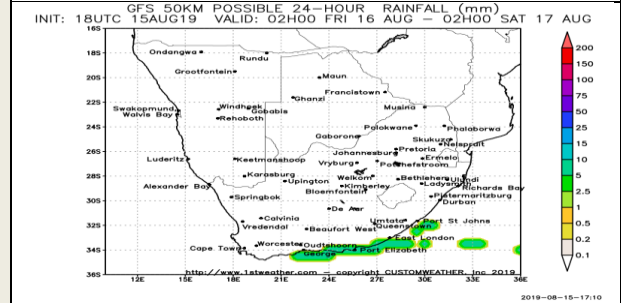
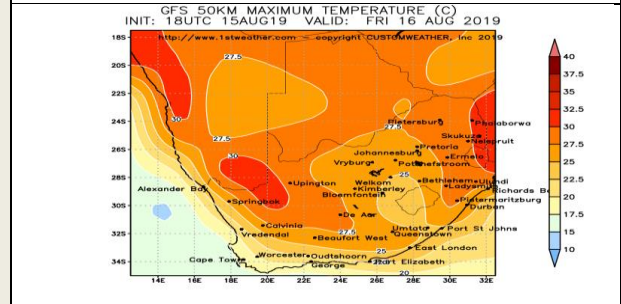
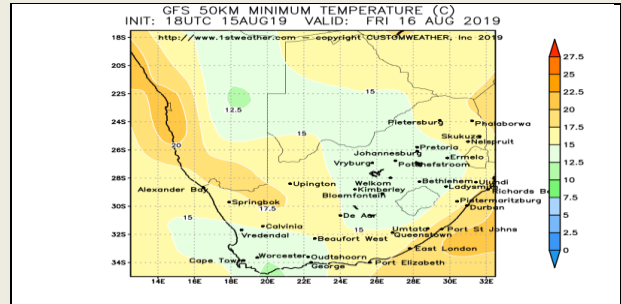




Weather Report
16 August 2019

South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- o Winter wheat will mostly remain dormant or semi-dormant
- o These areas will need to see significant rain in September to improve wheat prospects
- Western Cape will remain dry in the coming weeks
- o Timely rain will be needed this spring for the winter wheat as well
- Temperatures will remain warmer biased in most areas through next Thursday
- o Highs will often be in the 70s and 80s Fahrenheit
- o Many areas in western and southern South Africa will only warm to the upper 50s and 60s at times
- o Pockets in the north will occasionally warm to the 90s as well
- o Overnight lows will be in the 30s and 40s with pockets in interior South Africa cooling to the 20s
- o Several areas near and along the coasts will also only cool to the 50s and 60s



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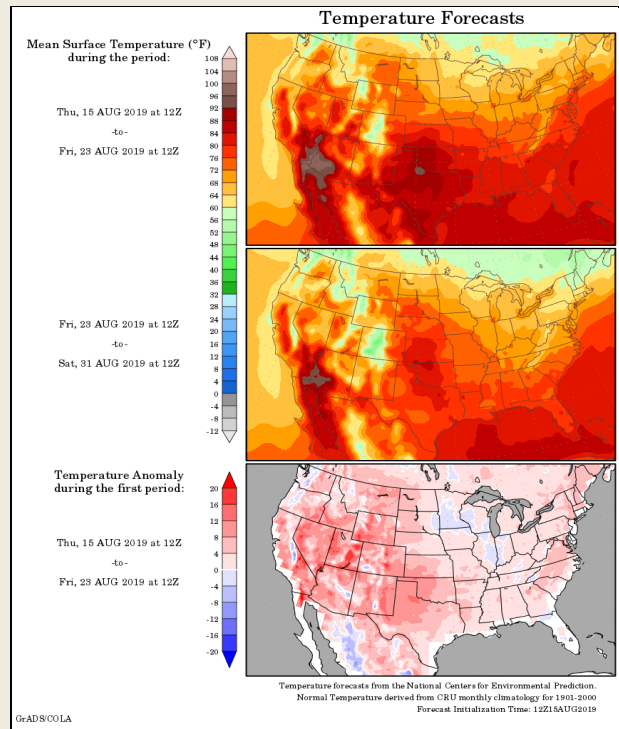
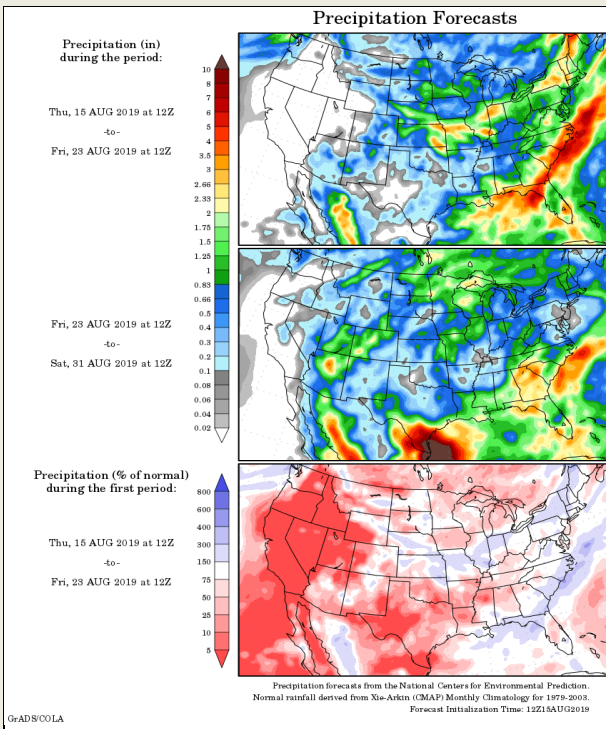
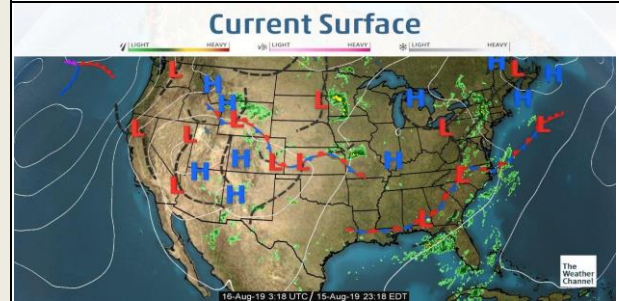
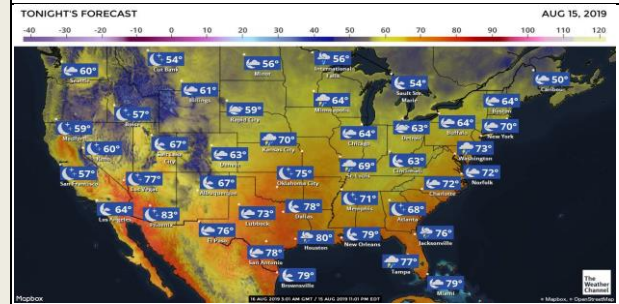
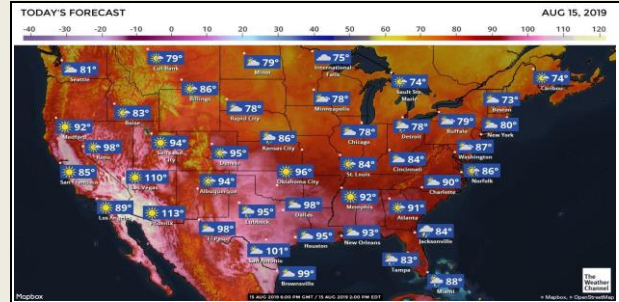
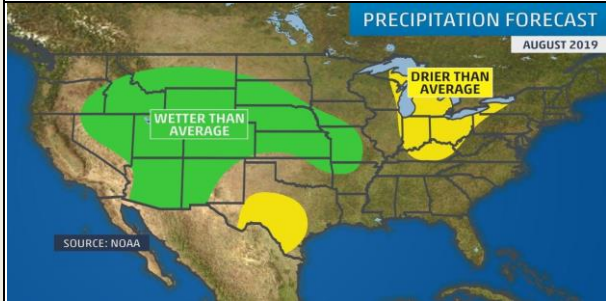
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Despite some pockets of notable drying during the next two weeks in lower Midwest and northwestern Corn Belt, most areas will continue to have adequate soil moisture to support crop development through the period.

o Multiple rounds of timely rain are expected, and although rain will be light in some areas, a lack of excessive heat will help to conserve soil moisture and allow crops to avoid becoming seriously stressed.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The two-week outlook has not change much since Wednesday and much of the Delta and the Southeast will receive enough rain to favorably support the needs of crops through the period.

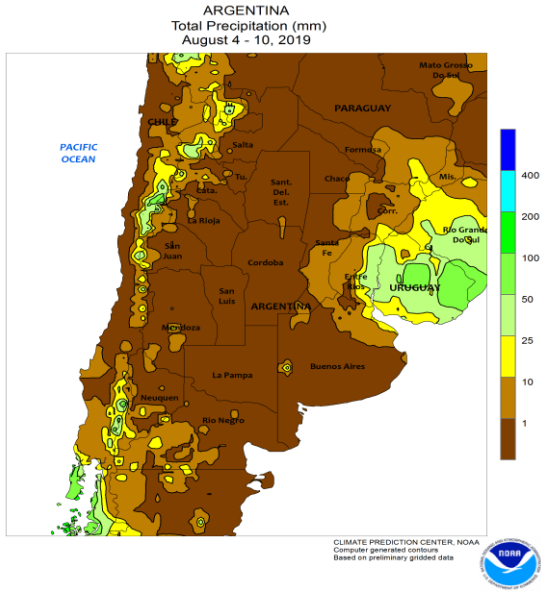
o Some pockets of drying will occur, but there should be enough timely rain and existing soil moisture to prevent excessive dryness during the next two weeks.



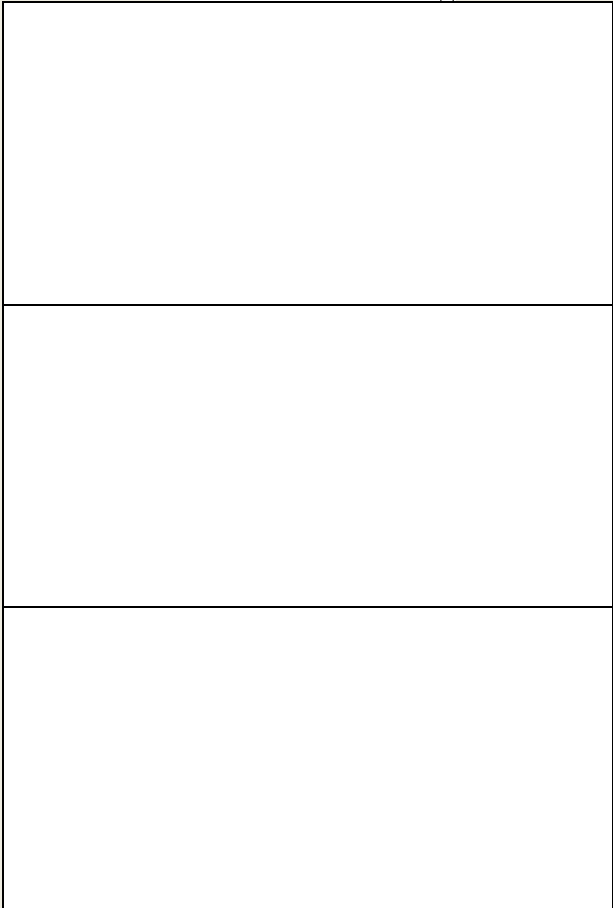
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South America - Weather

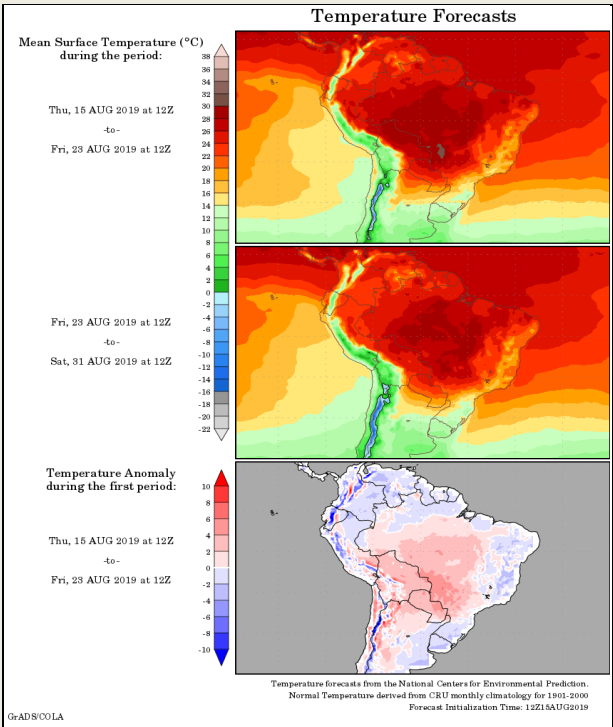
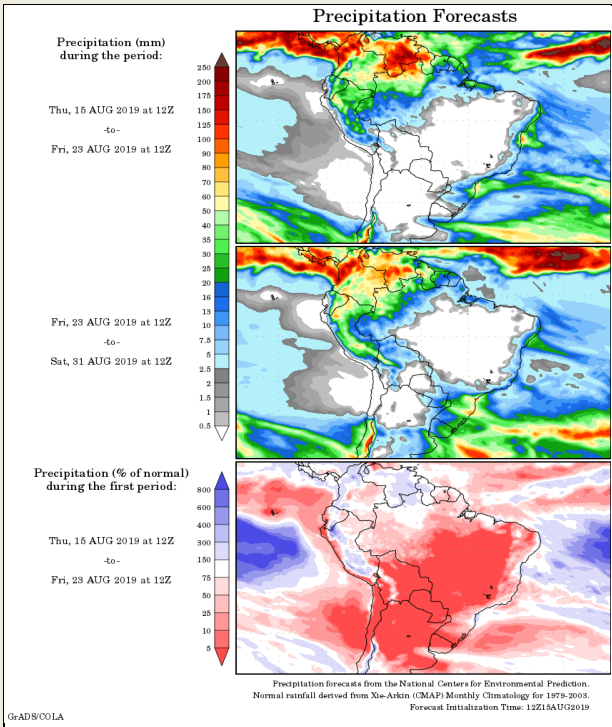
BRAZIL: A restricted rainfall pattern remains in place most often during the next two weeks and greater rain will be needed soon to improve conditions for early planting.
 o Light showers will occur on occasion in southern Brazil with rain of significance rarely falling north of Santa Catarina while portions of northeastern Brazil also see light showers on occasion.
ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and rain is needed in western Argentina to improve conditions for winter wheat.
 o Eastern Argentina will see a few light showers on occasion during the next two weeks while western Argentina stays mostly dry and sees a further depletion of soil moisture.

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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: The most frequent and greatest precipitation will occur over the U.K., northern France, Belgium, the Netherlands into Scandinavia this week. A near daily chance of showers will occur.

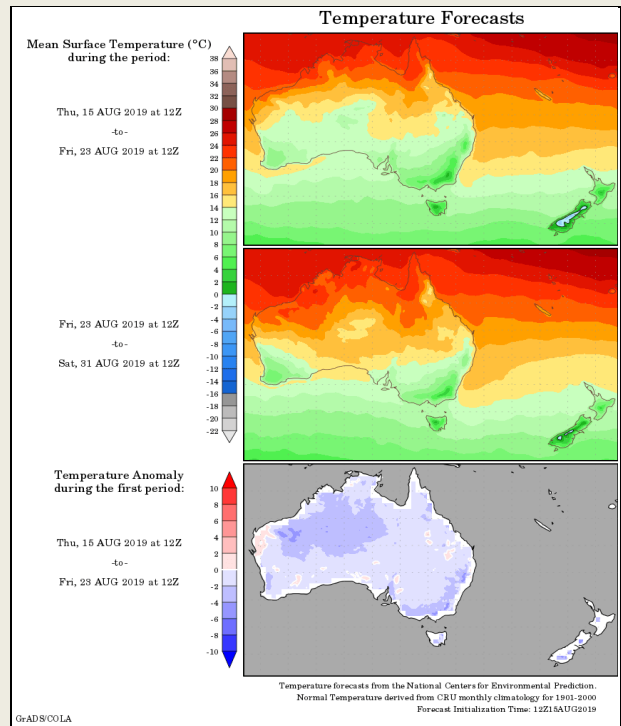
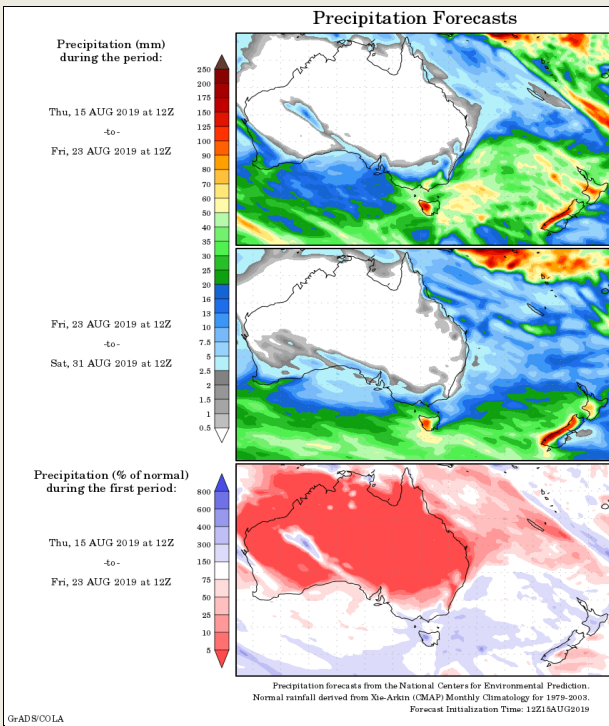
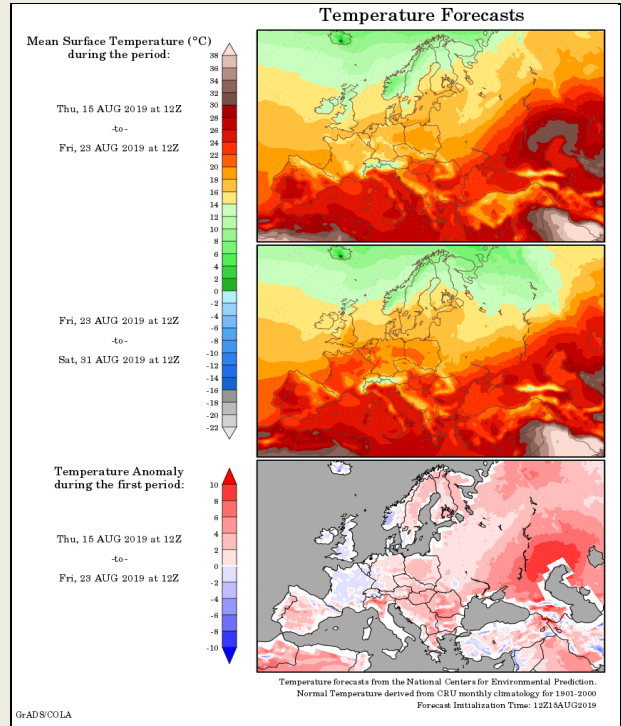
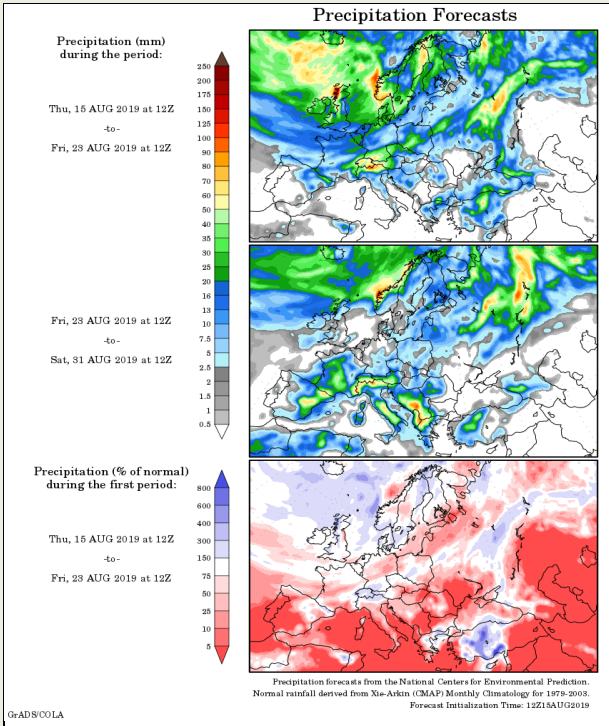
o The greatest moisture will occur over north France and south U.K. into Scandinavia Saturday into Sunday as another cold front pushes through the region.

o Moisture totals by this time next week will range from 0.30 to 1.00 inch and local totals varying from 1.00 to 2.50 inches

AUSTRALIA: Drying will continue over east-central Australia for at least the next ten days to two weeks and most locations will remain completely dry.

o The lack of moisture will maintain long term dryness and unirrigated northern winter crop production areas have struggled due to the dryness. Serious deficits in long term water supply is present in east-central Australia and greater rainfall will need to return eventually this spring or production issues will continue into summer production in east-central Australia.

• Winter crops in southern Australia will remain semi-dormant for the next week to ten days leaving plant moisture demand a bit low.



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
