

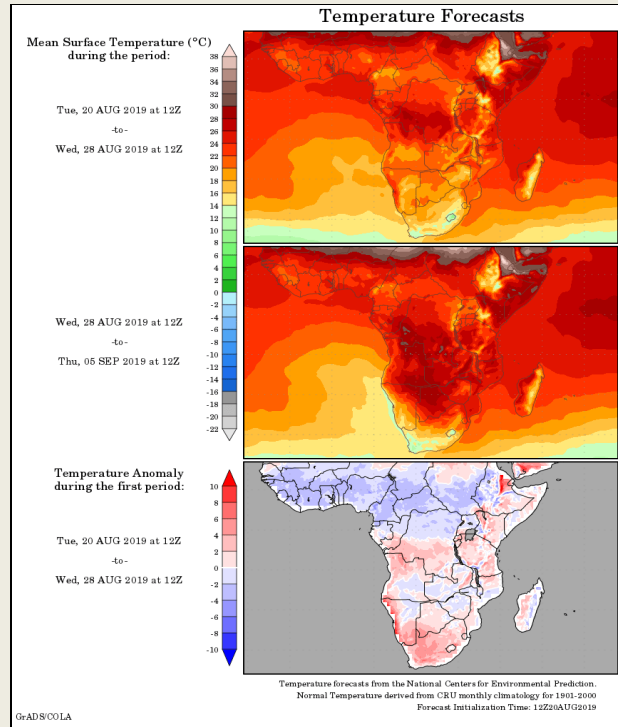
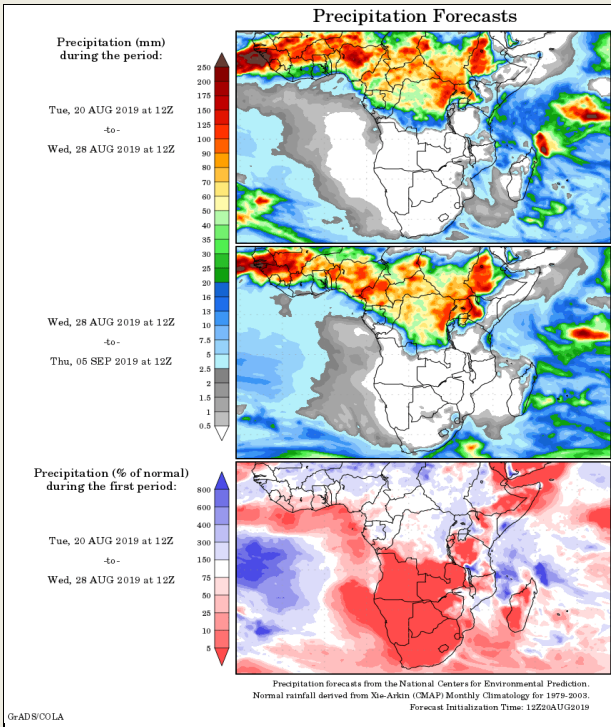
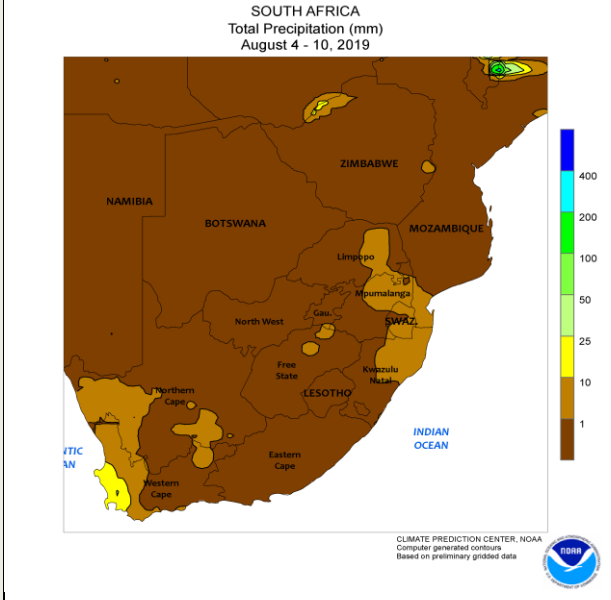
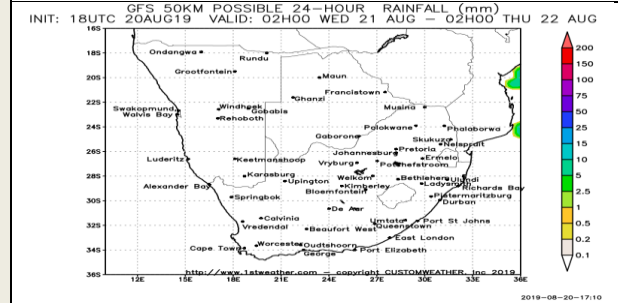
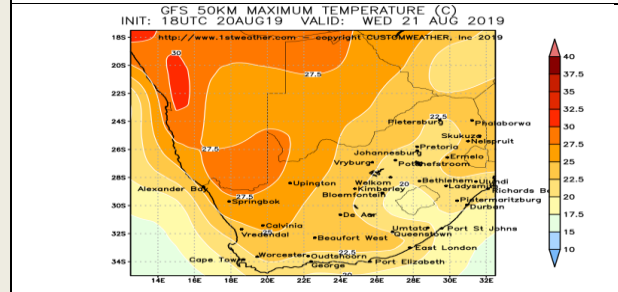
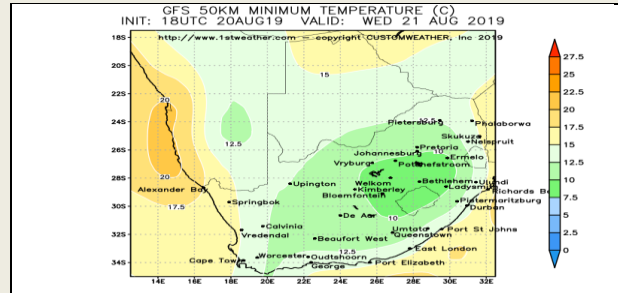


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- Winter wheat will generally remain dormant or semi-dormant, though several areas could warm enough to bring some of the wheat out of dormancy
- Most areas will be too dry to support any sort of aggressive development
- Timely rain will be needed later in September
- Western Cape will also remain dry or critically dry in the coming weeks
- The main winter wheat areas need to see significant rain as well in September

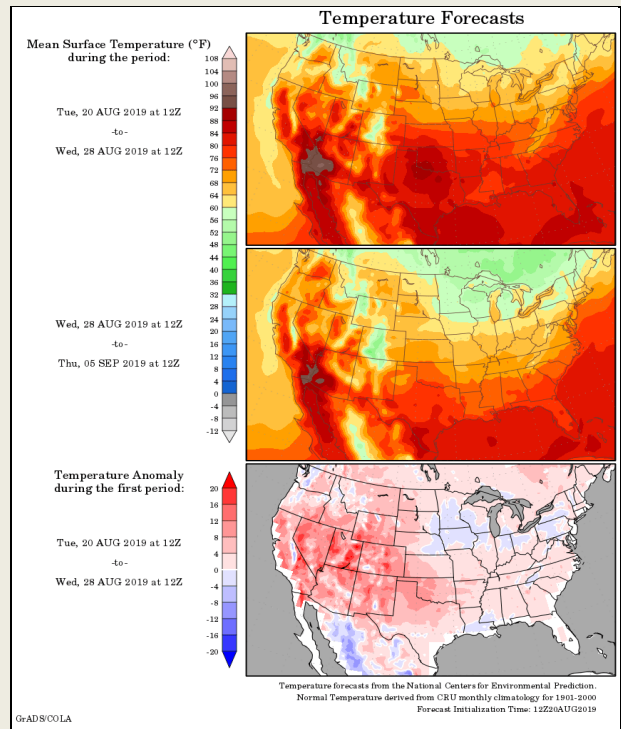
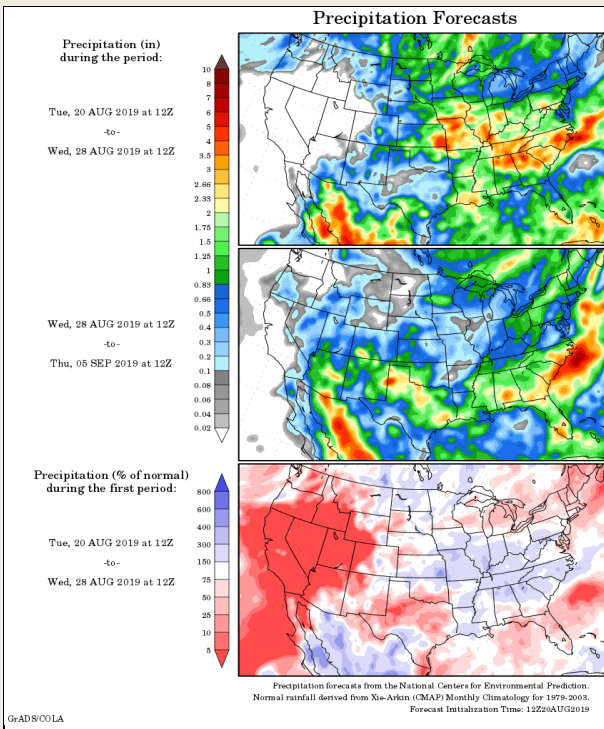
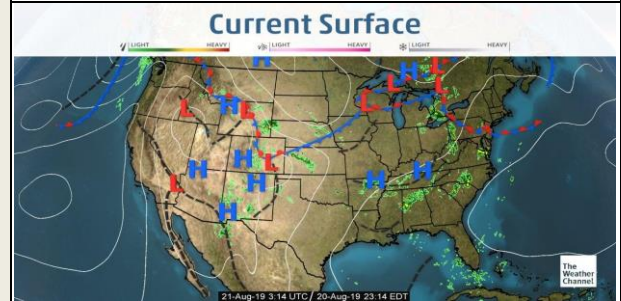
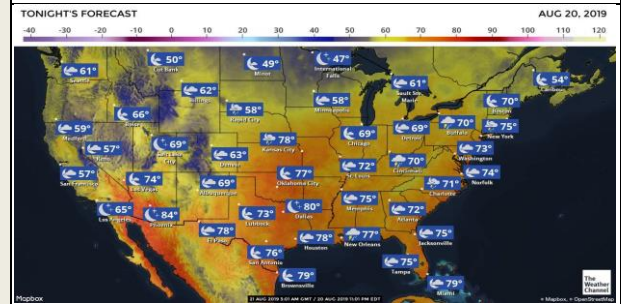
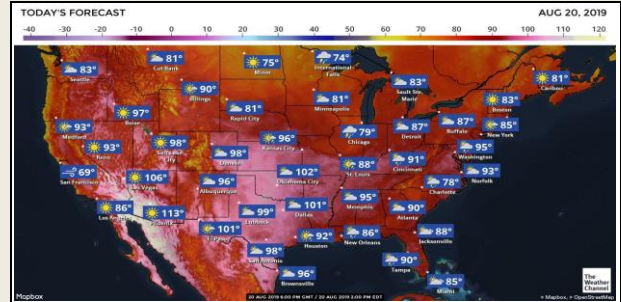
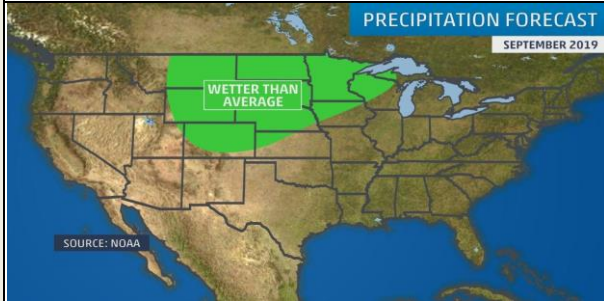
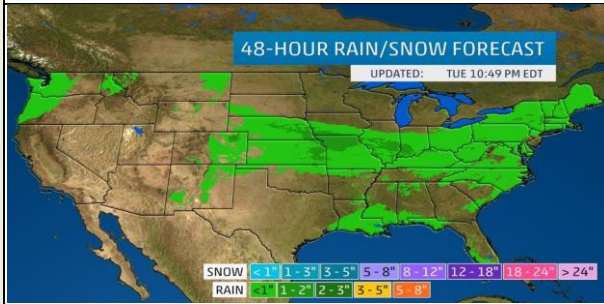
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The two-week outlook has not changed much since Monday and nearly all of the Midwest should receive enough rain to support the needs of crops through the period. Rain Monday into this morning from Iowa into northern Illinois will help to ensure that region has enough soil moisture to support the needs of crops through the next two weeks and the driest region during the period will extend from northern Indiana into Michigan and northern Ohio.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur during the next two weeks in the Delta and the Southeast and although some areas will dry down overall, enough rain should fall to prevent serious dryness from evolving.

o The Delta into central and northern Alabama will be driest overall and this region will need a boost in rain soon.

o Some of the remaining dry areas from southern Alabama into central South Carolina will benefit from rain today.

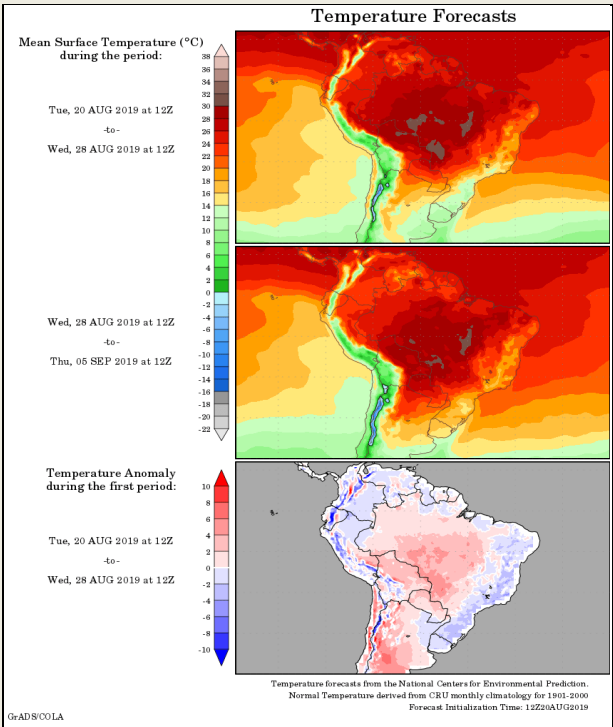
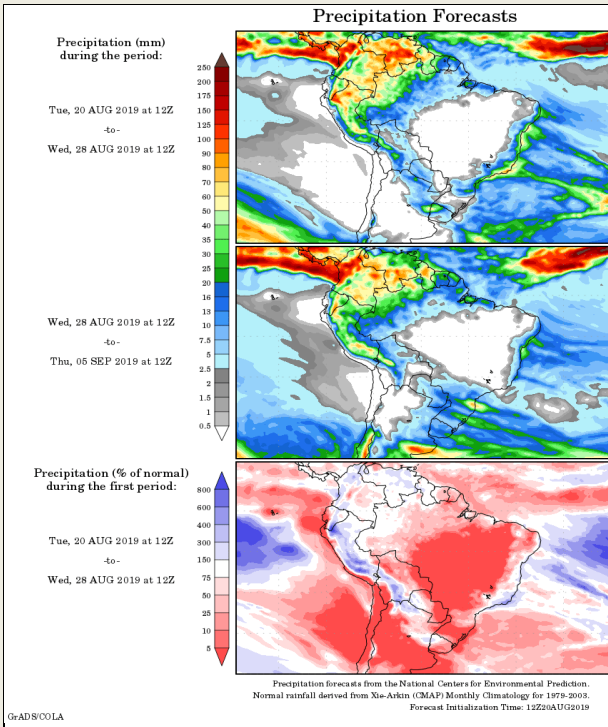
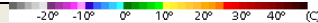
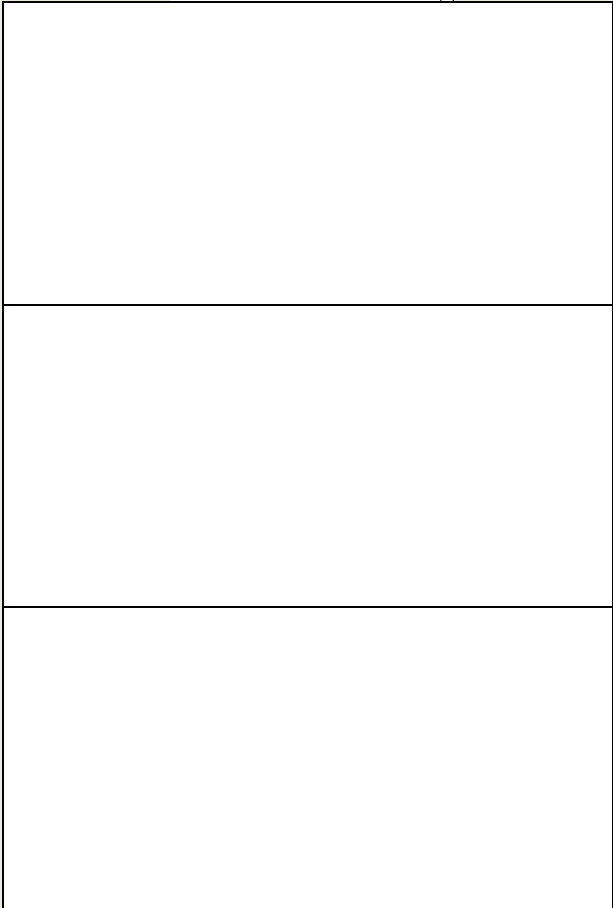
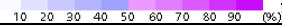
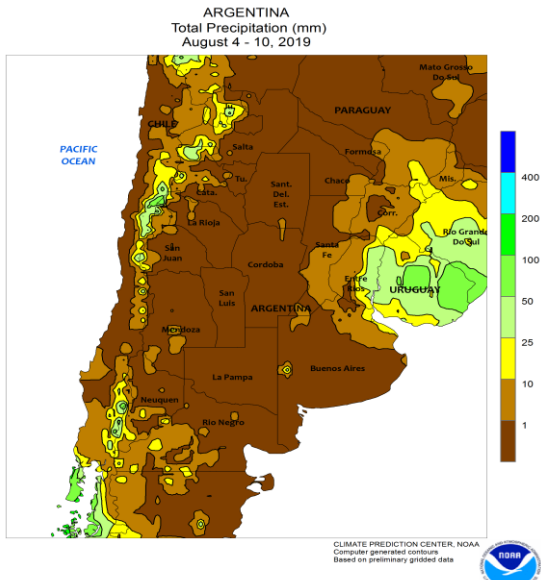
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: A restricted rainfall pattern continue most often during the next two weeks and greater rain will be needed soon to improve conditions for early planting.

- o Light showers will occur on occasion in southern Brazil and northeastern Brazil with some rain as far north as southern Minas Gerais this week.
- o Showers will occur into Wednesday from portions of eastern Sao Paulo into southern Minas Gerais with most areas seeing less than 0.20" of rain while parts of far southern Minas Gerais see up to 0.75" and locally more.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and rain is needed in western Argentina to improve conditions for winter wheat.

- o Some showers will occur on occasion during the next two weeks with most of those showers occurring outside of western Argentina where a further depletion of soil moisture is expected.



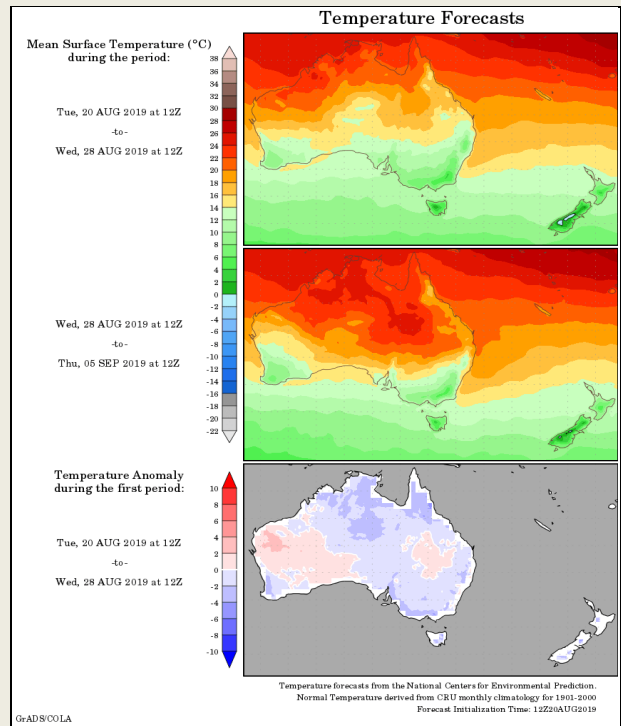
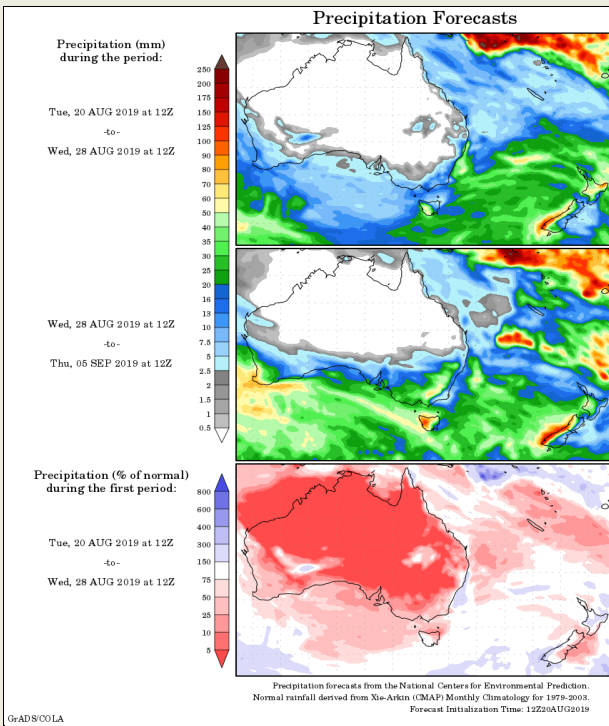
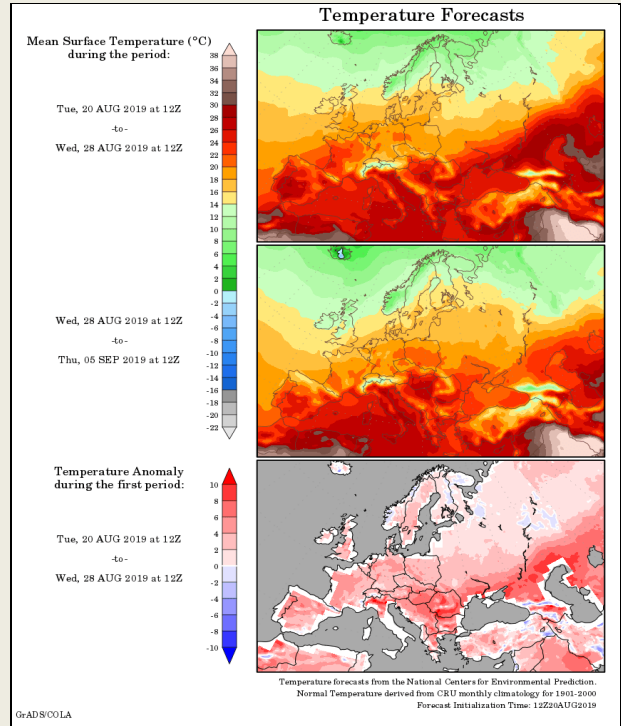
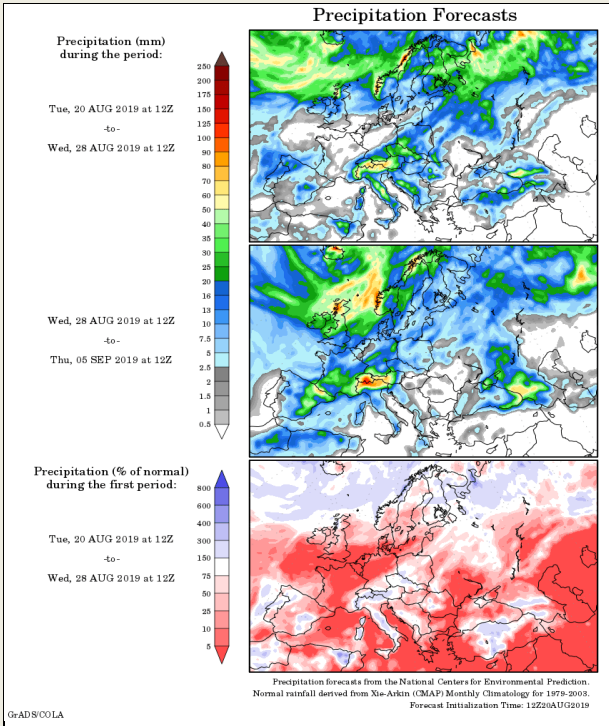

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: • Otherwise, restricted precipitation will occur throughout most of the Europe the remainder of the coming week. The drying will continue to raise concern over portions of France, especially locations that have missed recent rainfall, as well as the Balkan Nations where long term drying is present.

AUSTRALIA: Drying will continue over east-central Australia for at least the next ten days to two weeks and most locations will remain completely dry for at least the next six to seven days. Northern winter crop production areas have struggled due to dryness. Concern over serious deficits in long term water supply will prevail and greater rainfall will be needed.

o Scattered rain chances are expected to return to northeast New South Wales and southeast Queensland August 27-29 and restricted precipitation will return the remainder of the outlook ending September 2.
