South Africa - Weather

Areas near and along South Africa's coastlines will see a mix of light rain and sunshine during the next two weeks

- Moisture totals by next Thursday morning will range from a trace to 0.75 inch and locally greater amounts in Eastern Cape and Natal
- Areas further inland will otherwise remain in a dry or mostly dry mode during the next two weeks
- Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- A significant boost in rain will be needed later in September to improve winter wheat prospects
- Rainfall in Western Cape during the next two weeks will be too light to significantly improve the moisture profile
- Significant rain will also be needed in the main winter wheat areas later in September for better winter wheat conditions

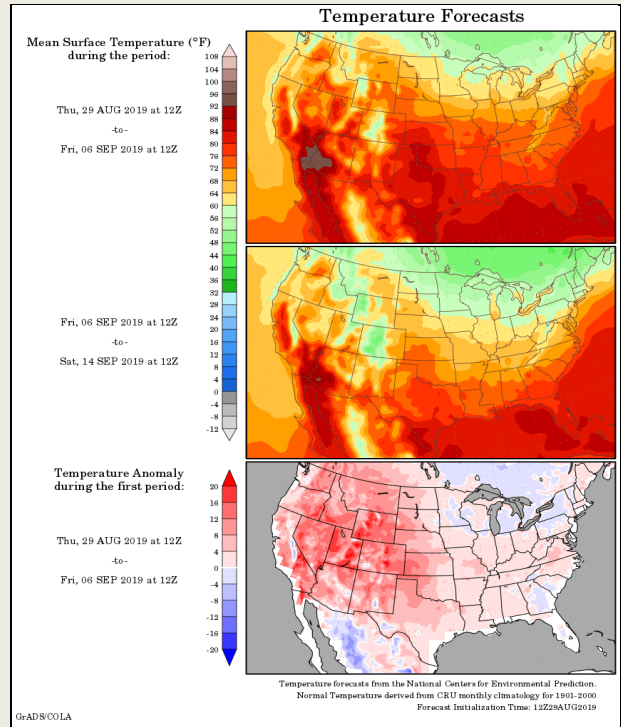
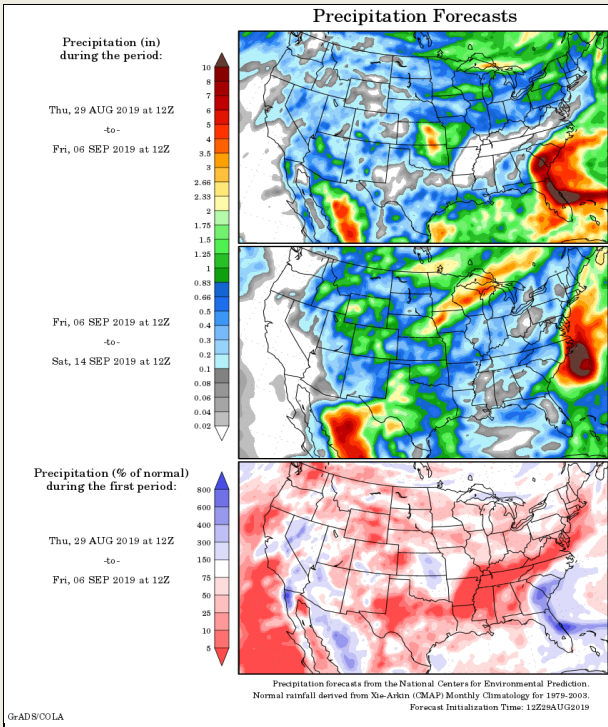
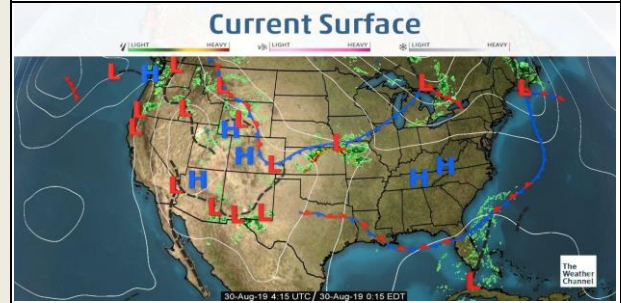
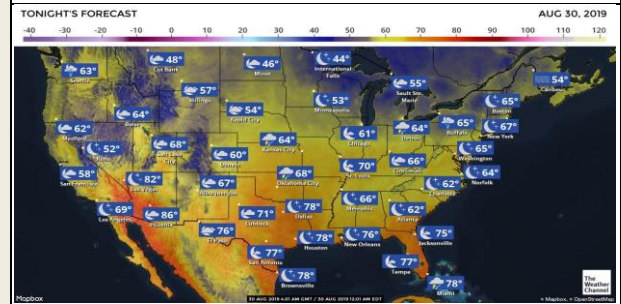
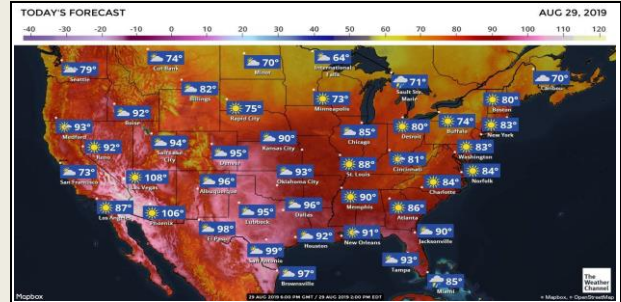
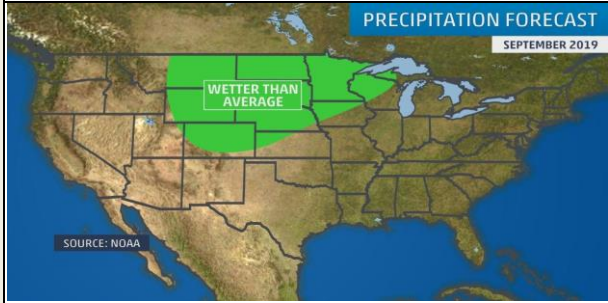
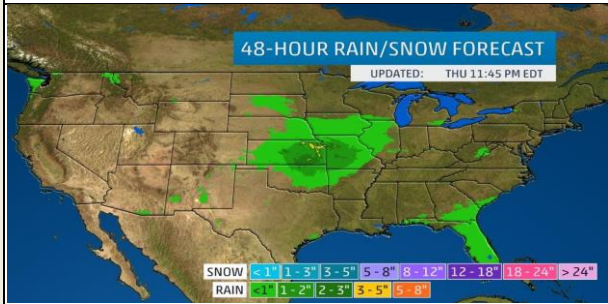
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The two-week outlook has not changed much since Wednesday and many areas will dry down overall, but soil moisture should remain high enough to support the needs of crops in nearly all of the Midwest.

o Alternating periods of warmer and cooler than usual conditions will occur while some showers of mostly light intensity develop most days during the period.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Hurricane Dorian will continue to be monitored as it moves towards Florida and strengthens during the next several days while likely becoming a major hurricane.

Dorian's most significant impact will be from heavy rain and strong winds along the storm's path while Dorian and a weak disturbance in the Gulf of Mexico will reduce the moisture feed into the Delta and the Southeast greatly reducing rain in areas not impacted by Dorian during the next ten days.



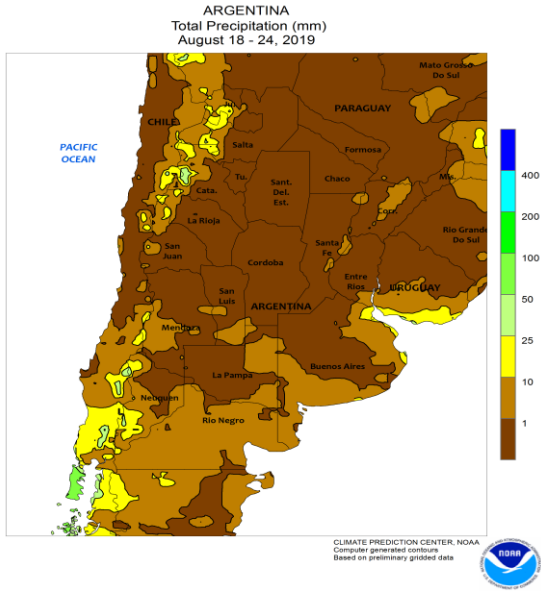

South America - Weather

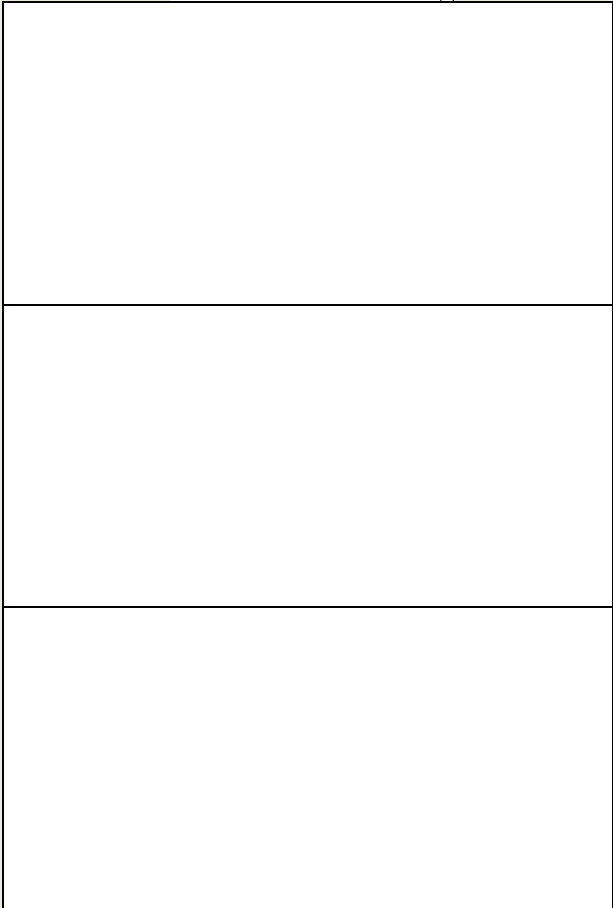
BRAZIL: A boost in rain is still expected in Parana this weekend into next week where at least temporary increases in soil moisture and conditions for planting will occur in parts of the region.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and western Argentina will remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.

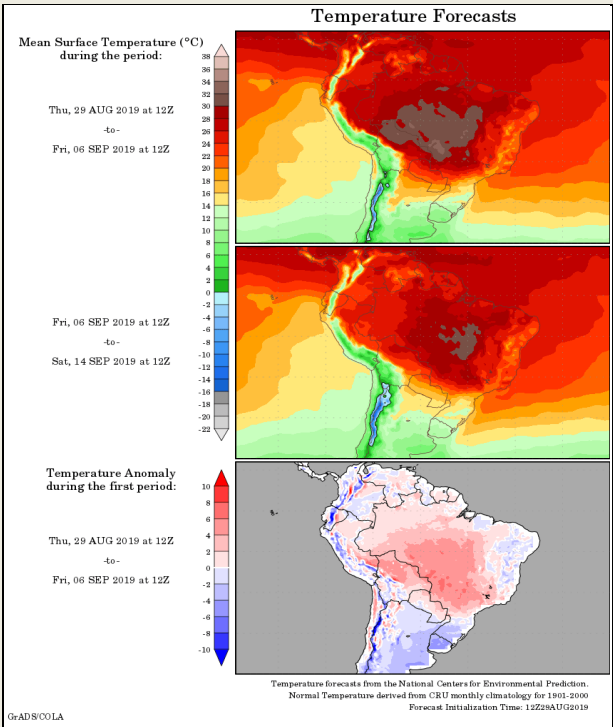
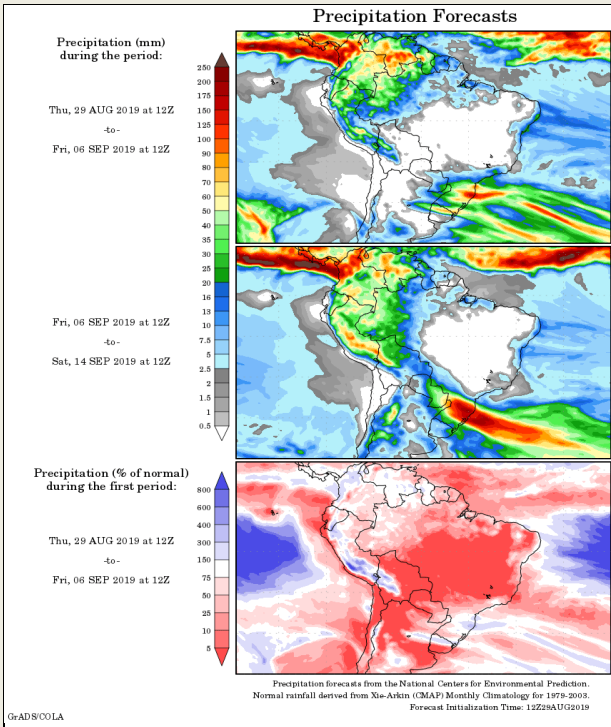
o Some showers will occur on occasion with most of those showers occurring outside of western Argentina where a further depletion of soil moisture is expected.

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Two areas of precipitation will be significant during the coming week. The first region is from northeast Spain, Italy, Switzerland, south Germany, Austria, Slovenia and Croatia through Slovakia, the Czech Republic and Poland. The second region is northern portions of the U.K. and Scandinavia.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation will occur in eastern Australia during the coming week. Drying will continue in east-central Australia through most of New South Wales and interior southeast South Australia where greater rain is needed to bolster soil moisture for planting of spring and summer crops. The dryness has negatively impacted winter crop production.

o Rain showers and thunderstorms will impact areas in northeast New South Wales and southeast Queensland through Saturday.
