South Africa - Weather

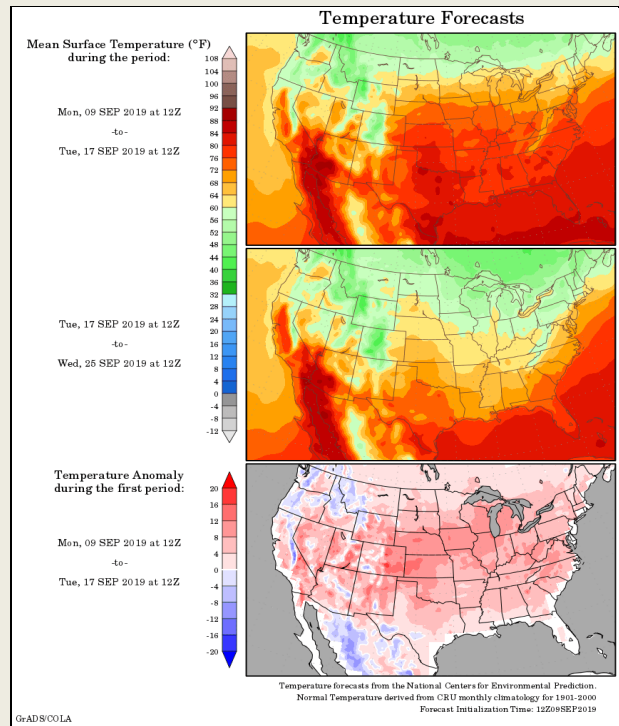
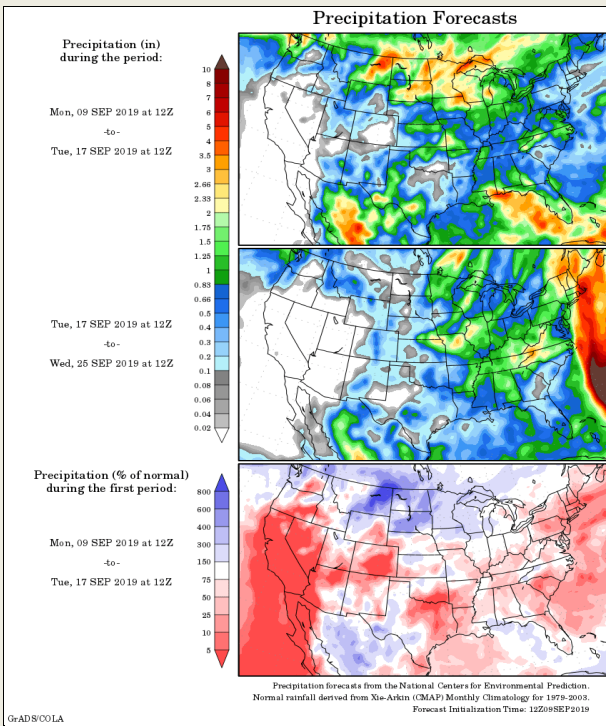
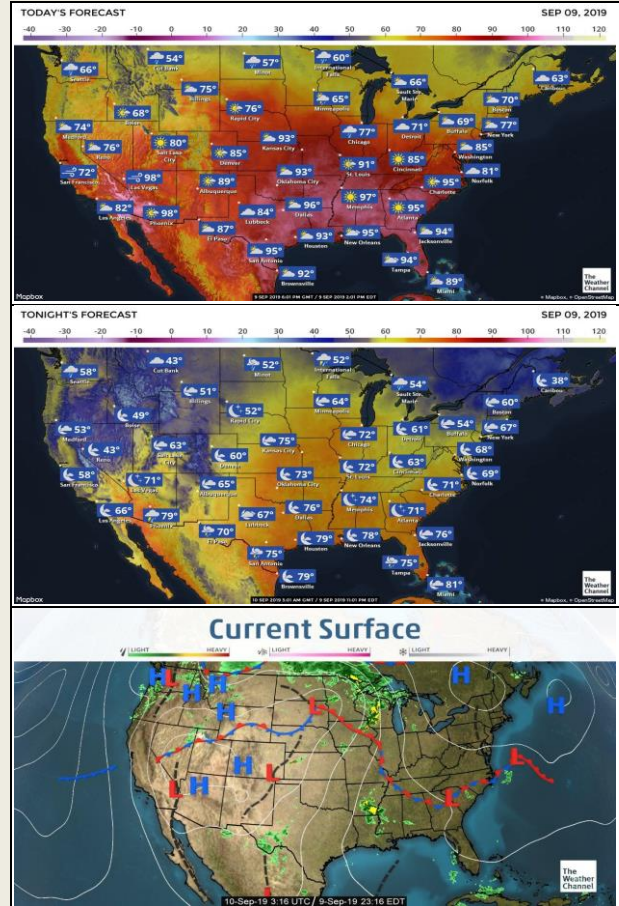
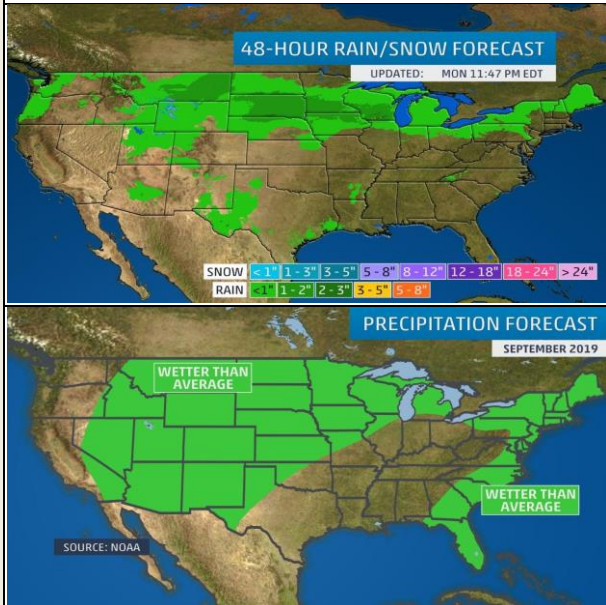
- Very little rain expected for much of South Africa during the next two weeks
- o Brief periods of light precipitation will occur at times, though resulting rainfall will be too light to counter evaporation
- Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- o Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- ▣ The region will need to see more frequent rainfall toward the end of the month and early October to support better wheat growth
- Western Cape will also remain dry for a while
- o Most winter wheat areas need to see greater rainfall to support better development
- Seasonable to seasonably warm weather will evolve in most areas this week
- o Highs will peak to the 70s and 80s most often



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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Soil moisture and weather conditions will remain largely favorable for the late developing corn and soybean crops throughout the Midwest. There is need for warm temperatures over the next few weeks and some timely rainfall to ensure crops finish development as quickly as possible prior to any frost or freeze threat. There is no viable risk of frost damage in the next ten days. **U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** Net drying is expected in the Delta during much of the coming week to ten days. The environment will be very good for early season crop maturation and harvesting especially since temperatures will be warm through most of the forecast period. Some of the late season crops may have a growing need for rain and the situation will be closely monitored as the drier biased condition prevail.



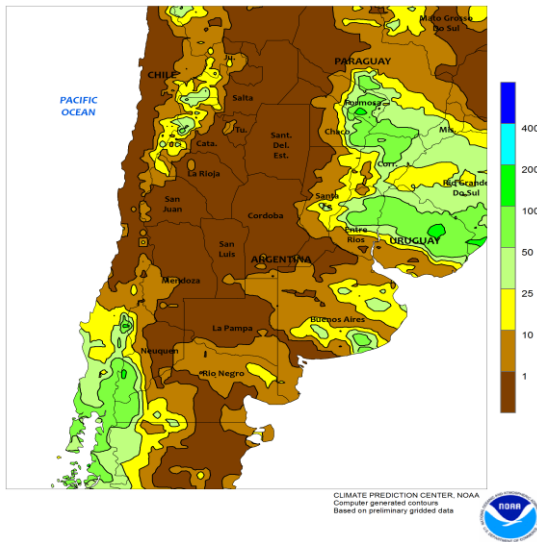
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Concern about limited rainfall in center west and center south crop areas will slowly grow as the next two weeks pass and little rain of significance occurs in key crop areas. Some delay in early season planting of corn and soybeans will be possible, although there will still be plenty of time for better weather to evolve later this month. Rain in far southern Brazil will be good for winter wheat. Excessive pre-monsoonal heat in the north will draw greater attention to the region until significant rain falls.

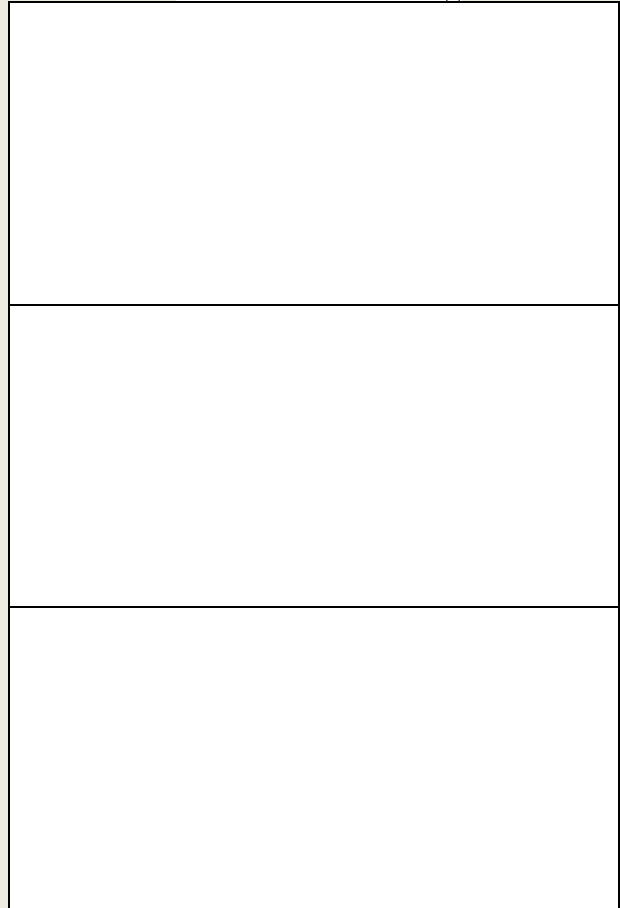
ARGENTINA: Rain is still needed throughout western Argentina where soil moisture is too low to support wheat development when consistently warm temperatures begin to occur. The region needs moisture to induce better crop establishment prior to aggressive spring growth. Moisture is also needed to support early corn and sunseed planting and establishment. Fieldwork will be left on hold until significant rain falls from Buenos Aires and La Pampa northward to Santiago del Estero.

August 25 - 31, 2019



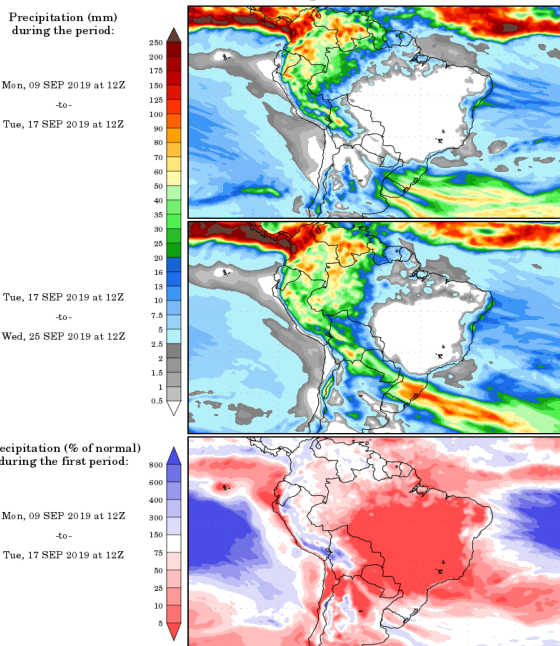

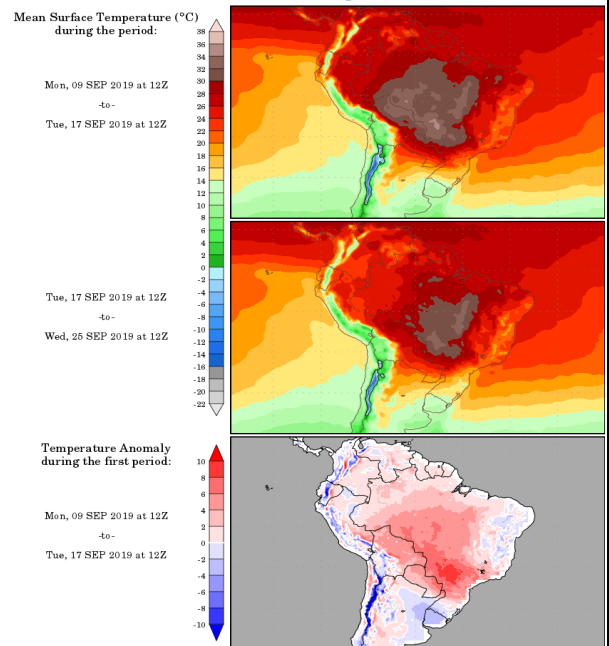

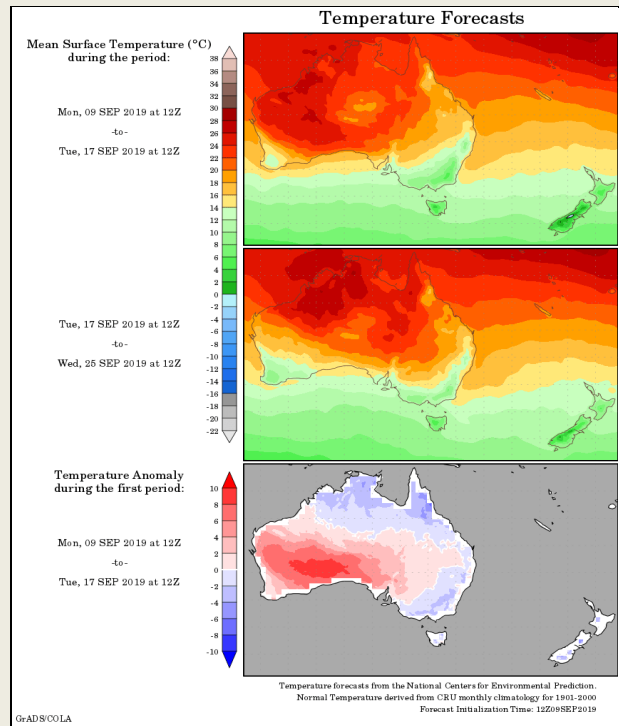
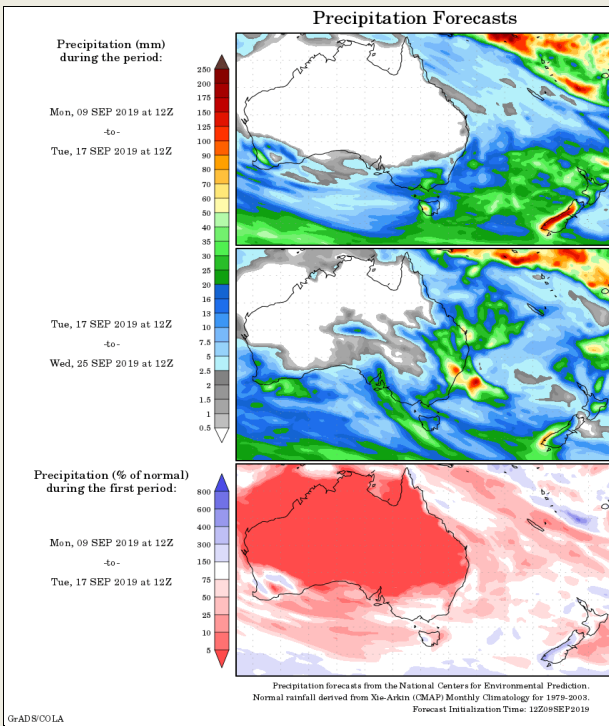
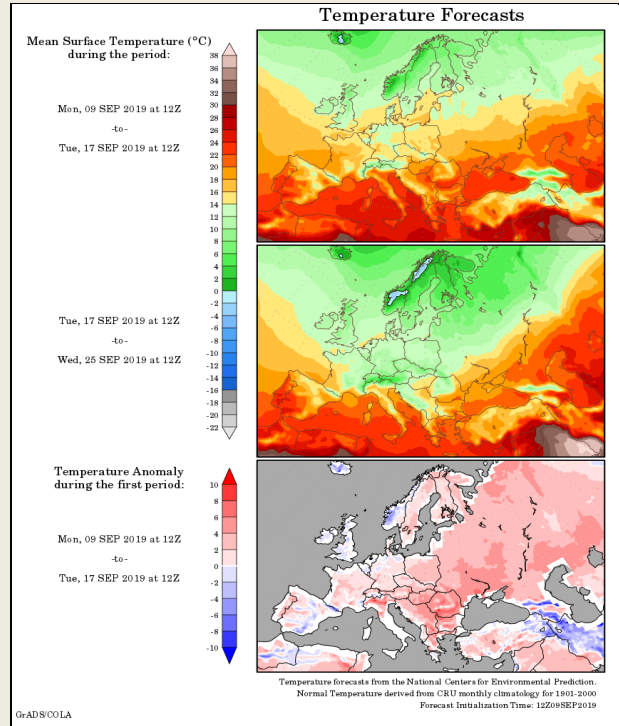
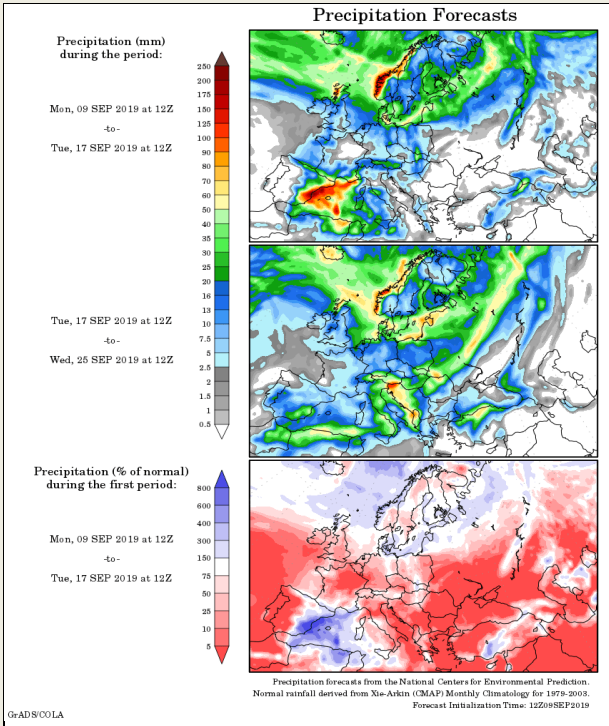
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Restricted precipitation and drying will occur over most of Europe the next seven to ten days. Dryness concerns will continue to raise concern over winter planting in the Balkan Nations and central into northern France.

o The only exception will be the Mediterranean Region of southeast Spain into south France and northwest Italy where increased precipitation will occur.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation will occur throughout Australia the next ten days to two weeks. Interior south-central into East-central Australia drought is not likely to change and winter crop development will remain poor and a reduction in cotton, sorghum, corn, sunseed and other crops will be possible if drought prevails into October.



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
