South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- These areas will need abundant rainfall to support aggressive winter wheat growth later in September
- Rainfall in Western Cape during the next two weeks will generally be too light to counter evaporation
- Significant rain will also be needed in the main winter wheat areas later in September for better winter wheat conditions



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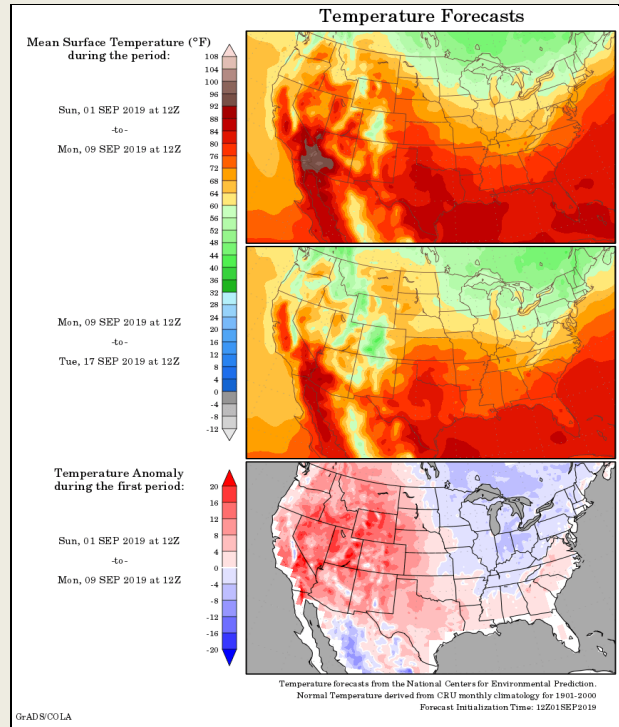
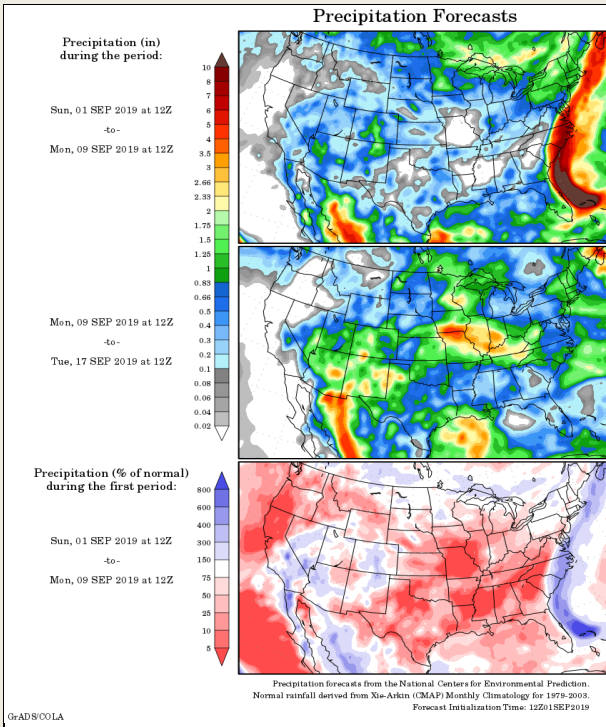
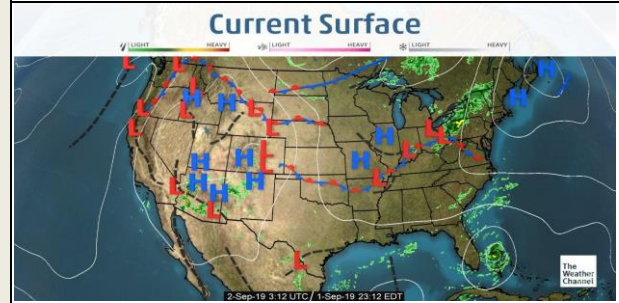
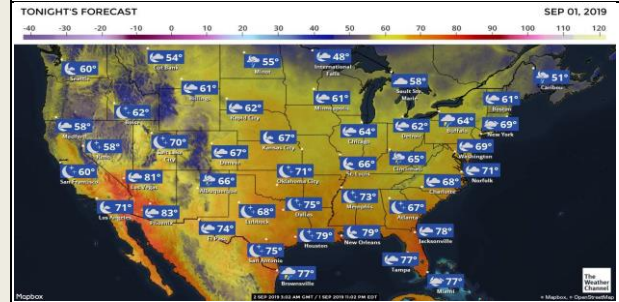
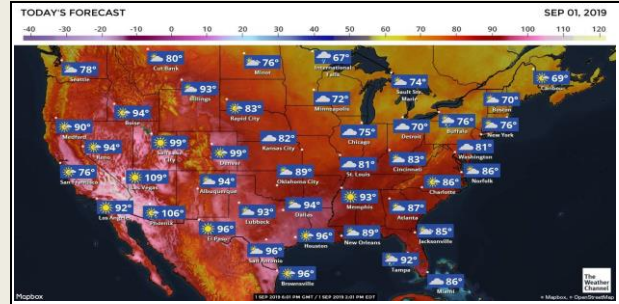
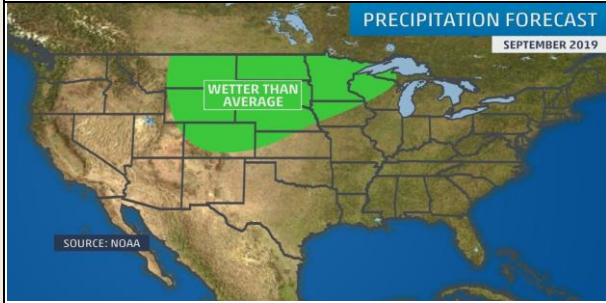
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: No significant changes have been made to the two-week outlook since Thursday and many areas will dry down overall, but soil moisture should remain high enough to support the needs of crops in nearly all of the Midwest.

- o Alternating periods of warmer and cooler than usual conditions will occur while some showers of mostly light intensity develop most days during the period.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Hurricane Dorian will bring damaging winds and flooding rain to the interior southern and central Florida Peninsula when it makes landfall early Tuesday before the storm turns to the north and brings high winds and heavy rain to south-central and southeastern Georgia by Wednesday into Thursday.

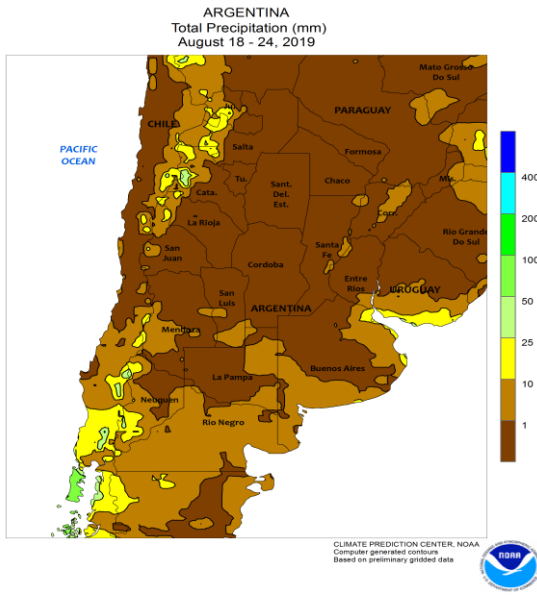
- o Dorian's winds should have weakened enough to minimize the threat to crops by the time it reaches Georgia, but some cotton in the open boll stage in south-central and southeastern Georgia as well as in central and eastern South Carolina and eastern North Carolina may suffer from stringing out or quality declines.



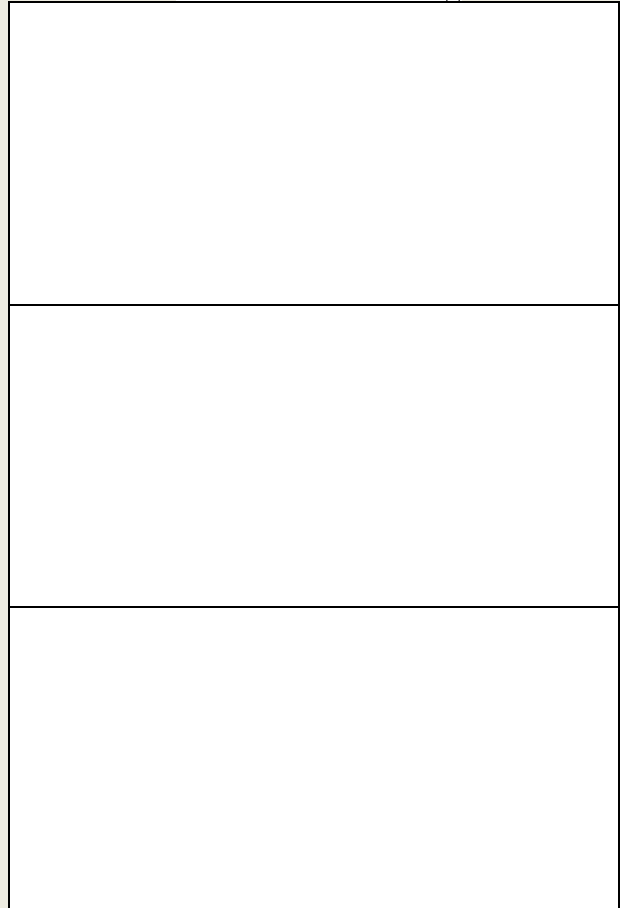
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South America - Weather

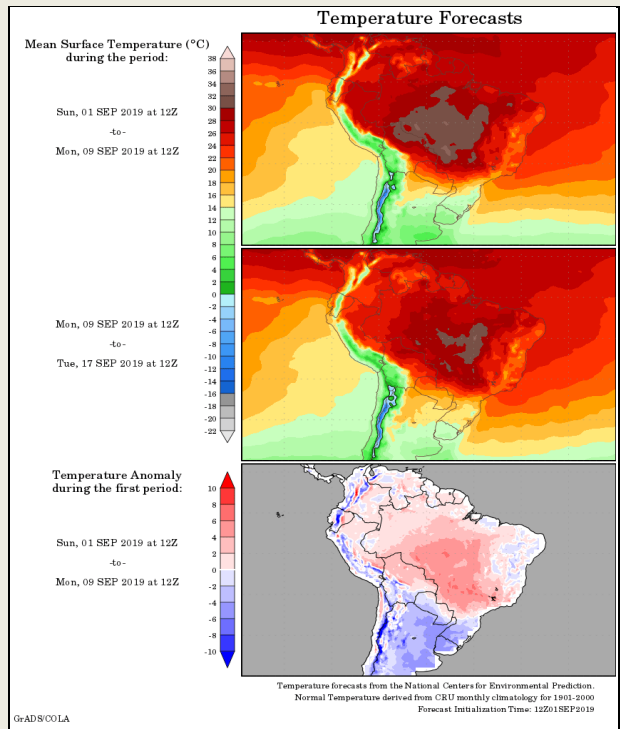
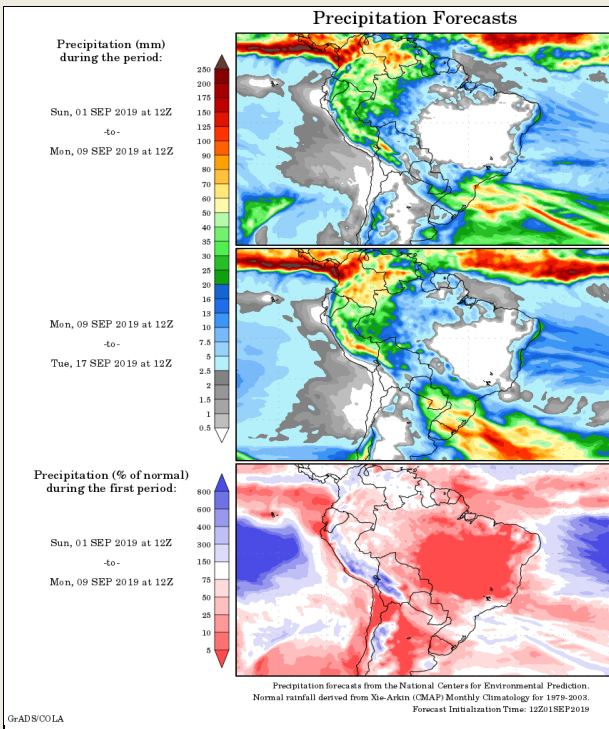
BRAZIL: A boost in rain is still expected in Parana this weekend into next week where at least temporary increases in soil moisture and conditions for planting will occur in parts of the region, but rainfall totals have been reduced for the state since Thursday's forecast.
o Rain will fall today into Sunday from central and southern Paraguay and southern Mato Grosso do Sul into Parana, Santa Catarina, and Rio Grande do Sul.
ARGENTINA: Argentina will continue to see a restricted rainfall pattern most often through the next two weeks and western Argentina will remain in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat.

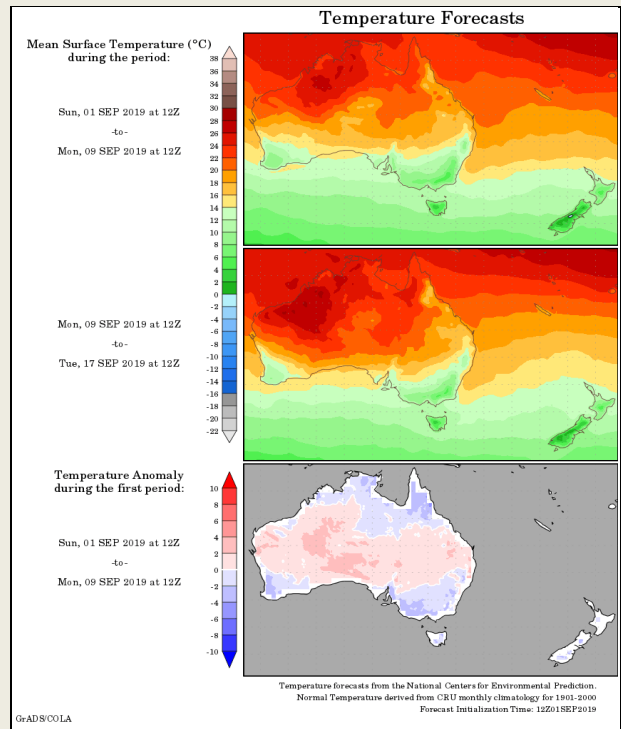
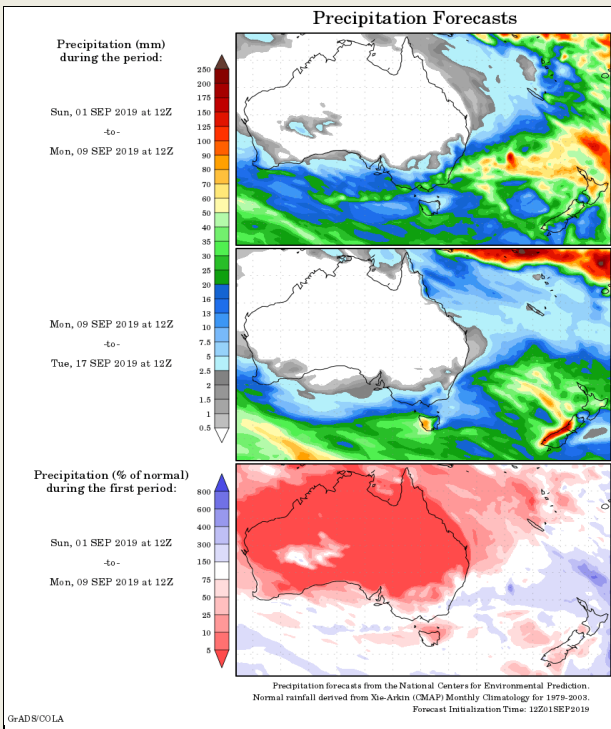
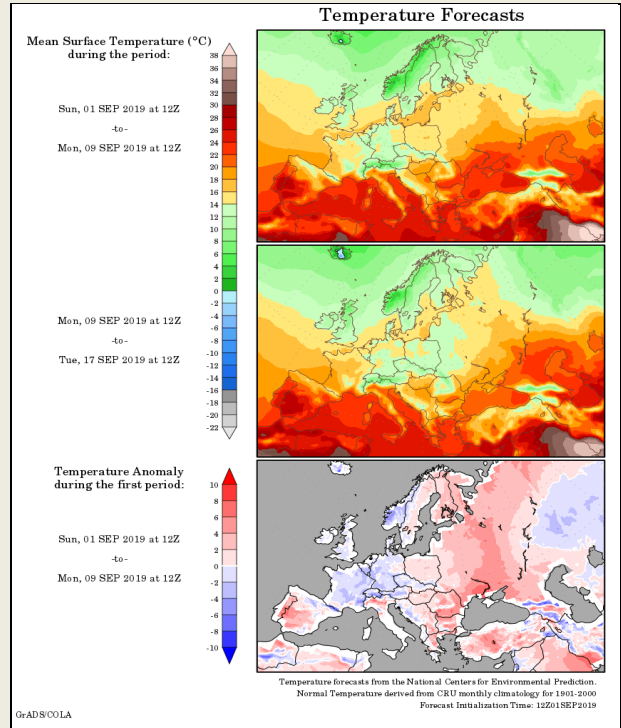
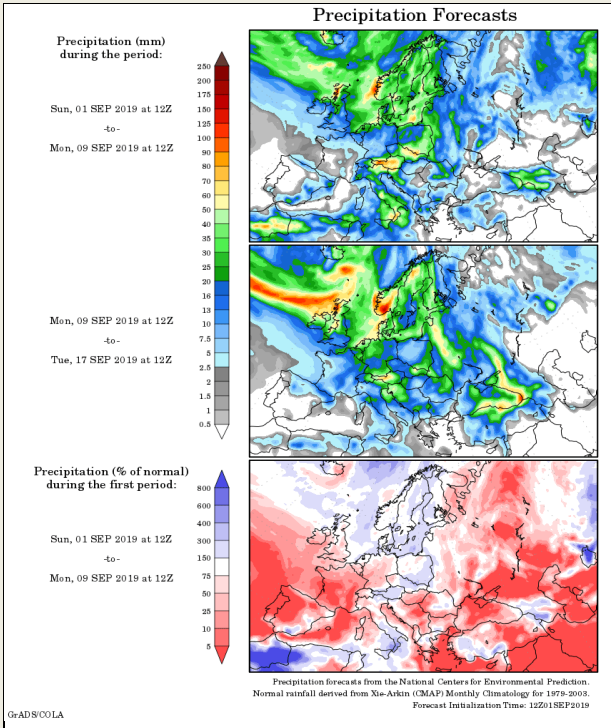
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Two areas of precipitation will be significant during the coming week. The first region is from northeast Spain, Italy, Switzerland, south Germany, Austria, Slovenia and Croatia through Slovakia, the Czech Republic and Poland. The second region is northern portions of the U.K. into southwest Norway

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation will impact eastern Australia this week. Drying will continue in east-central Australia through most of New South Wales and interior southeast South Australia where greater rain is needed to bolster soil moisture for planting of spring and summer crops. The dryness has negatively impacted winter crop production.

o Rain showers and thunderstorms will linger along the central to northeast coast of New South Wales today into Saturday.



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
