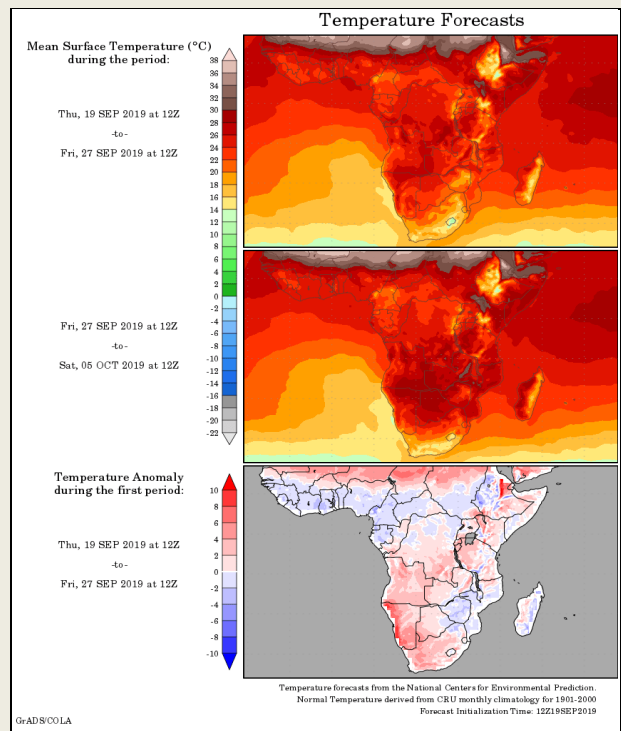
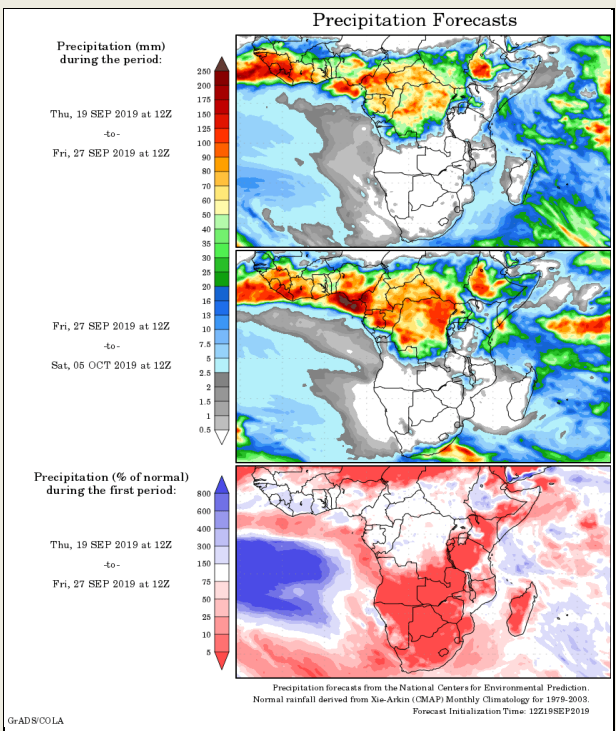
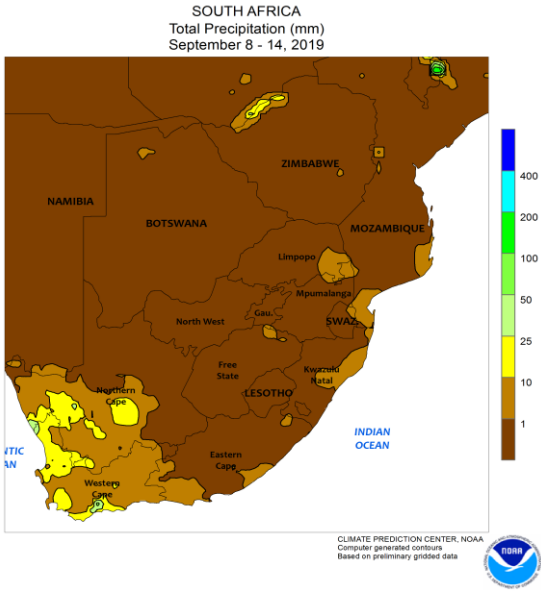
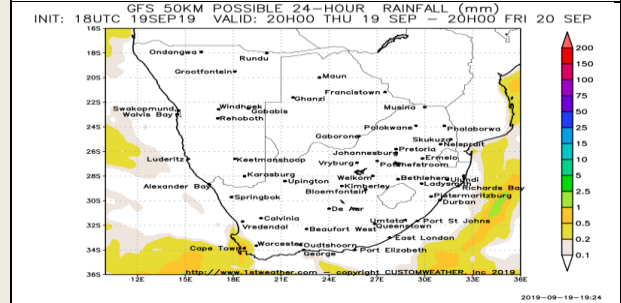
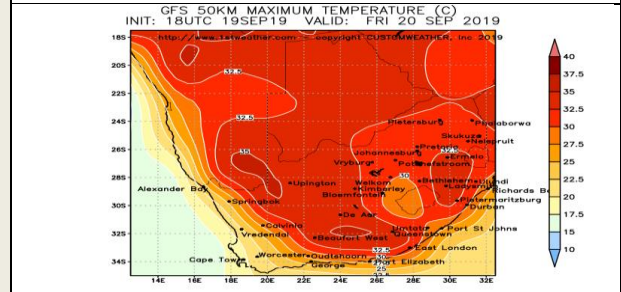
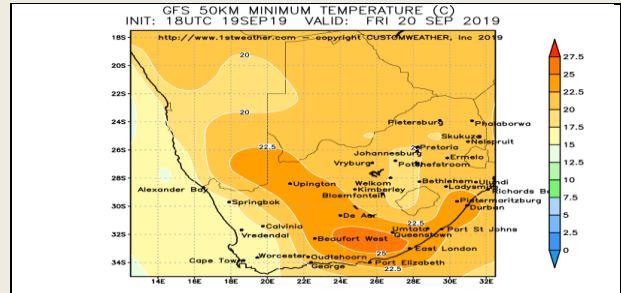




Weather Report
20 September 2019

South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will remain dry in the coming weeks
- Precipitation during the next two weeks will generally be too light to counter evaporation or impact long-term soil conditions
- Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- Significant rain will be needed later in October to improve winter wheat prospects
- Western Cape moisture shortages will prevail as well despite periods of light rain
- The main winter wheat areas will also need more frequent rainfall later in October to support better crop prospects
- Temperatures will trend near to above normal through next Thursday
- Highs through Friday will generally be in the 80s and 90s with pockets in the 70s



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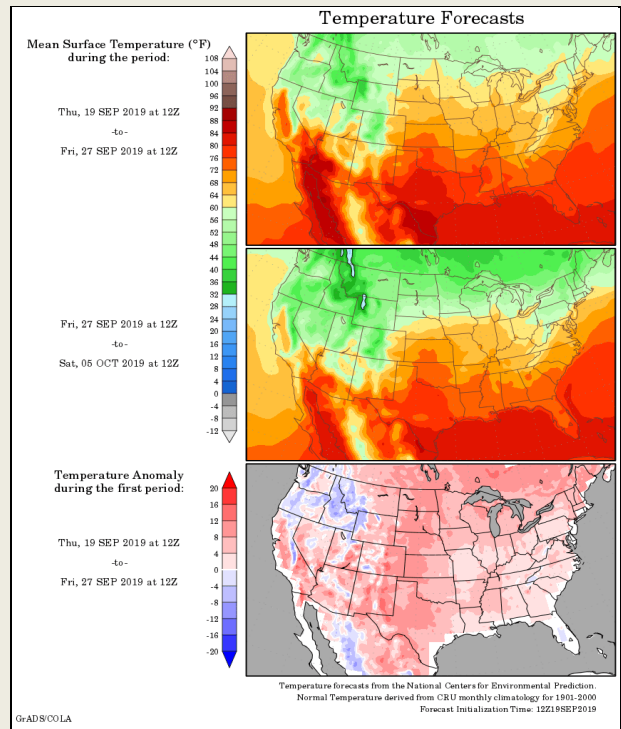
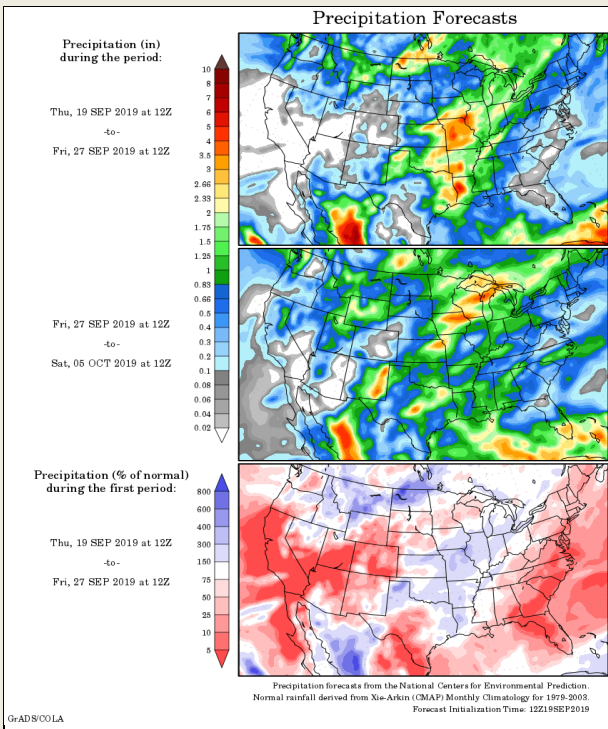
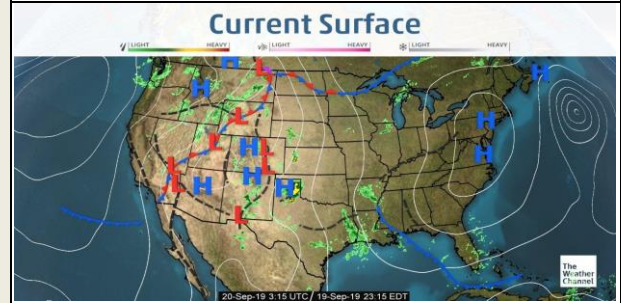
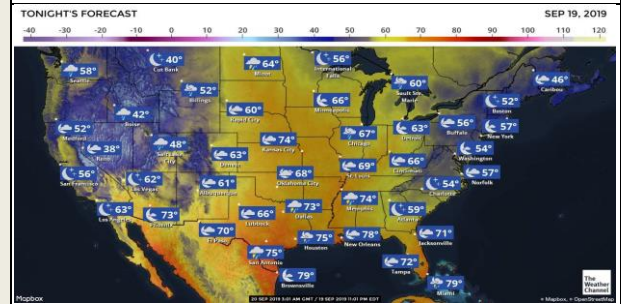
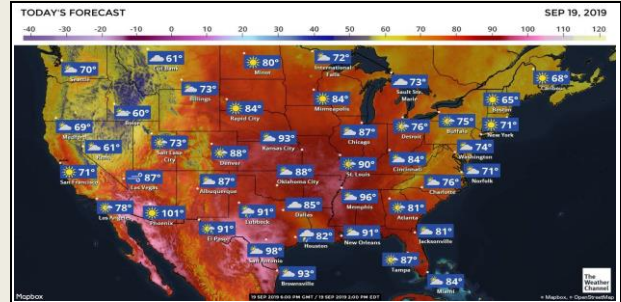
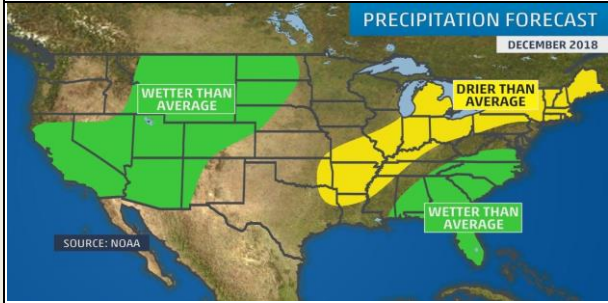
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Another increase in rain has been made to the two-week outlook and early harvesting will advance slower than what was advertised earlier this week, but many of the areas expected to be wettest during the next week have dried down enough that prolonged delays to fieldwork may not occur. The Ohio River Basin will see the best conditions for fieldwork through at least the next week as the soil there has firmed up and will be able to absorb the occasional rounds of mostly light rain without serious delays to fieldwork.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The remnants of Tropical Depression Imelda will bring rain to most of the Delta today into Friday while the remainder of the next two weeks is still expected to feature a rainfall pattern for the Delta and the Southeast allowing for good harvest progress while some immature crops should be stressed by a lack of soil moisture.

o Rainfall totals through Friday in the Delta will be 0.10-0.60" most often with locally greater amounts and little rain in the far north.

o The rain will temporarily ease stress to immature crops.



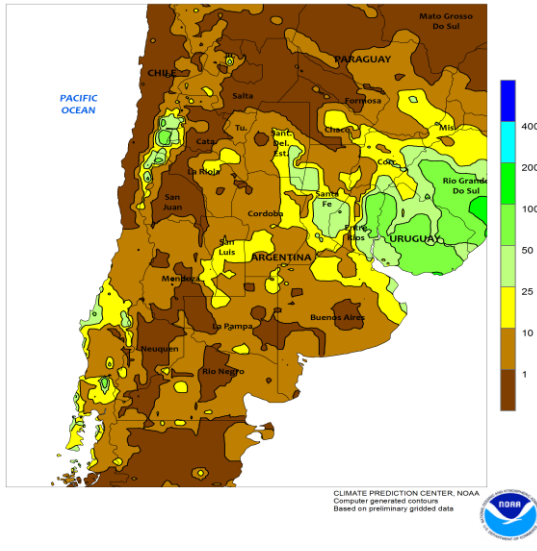
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South America - Weather

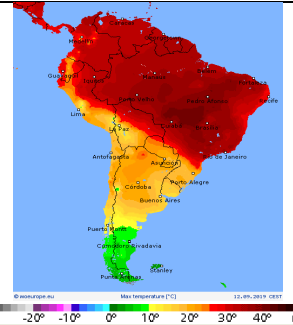
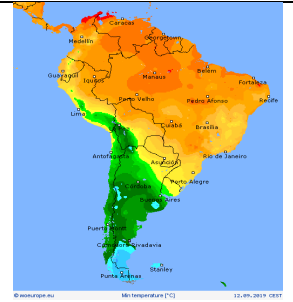
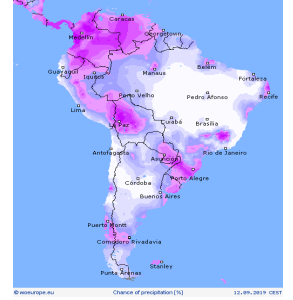
BRAZIL: The Sep. 27-Oct. 3 period will feature increasing showers in many areas, especially the north, but rain will be mostly poorly organized and outside of some locally strong storms most areas will still need greater rain to improve conditions for summer crop planting.

ARGENTINA: A restricted rainfall pattern will remain in place through at least the next ten days and greater rain is needed in many areas to improve conditions for summer crop planting while wheat in western Argentina remains in need of rain to improve conditions for development. Mostly dry conditions will occur through the next week before showers increase Sep. 27-28 with much of the resulting rain too light to have a significant impact on soil conditions.

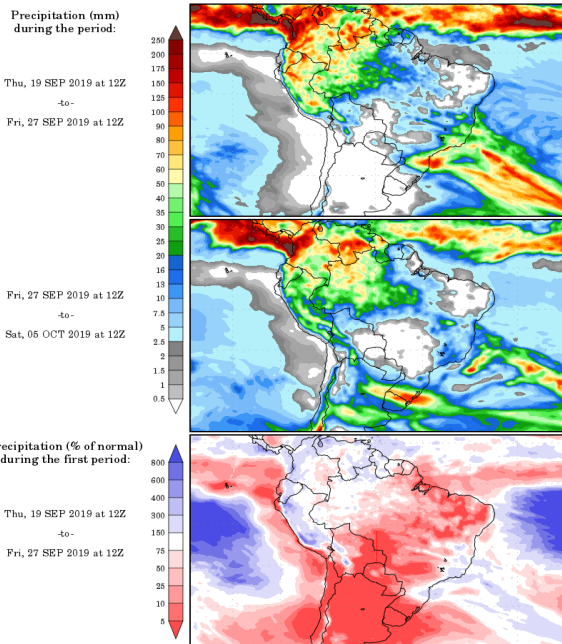
ARGENTINA

September 8 - 14, 2019



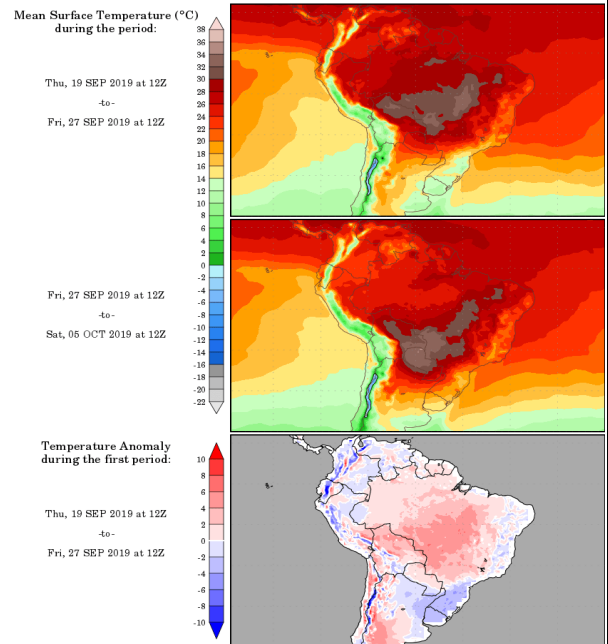

Temperature Forecasts

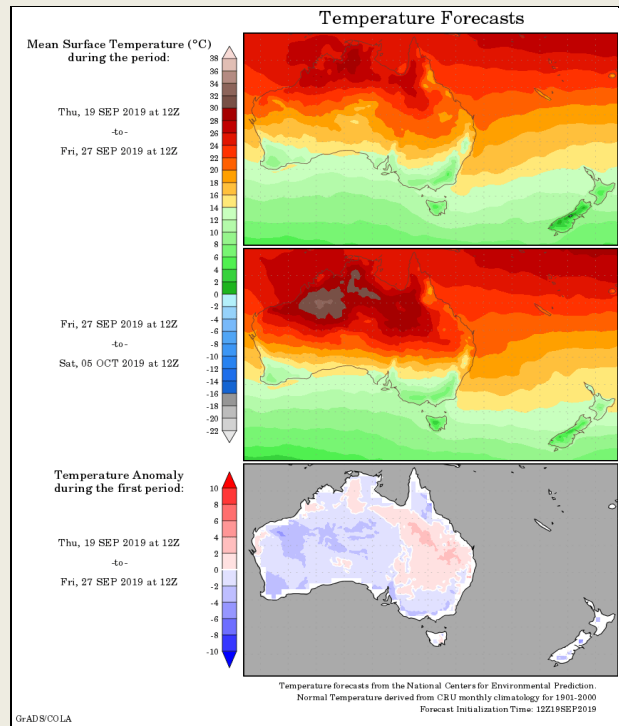
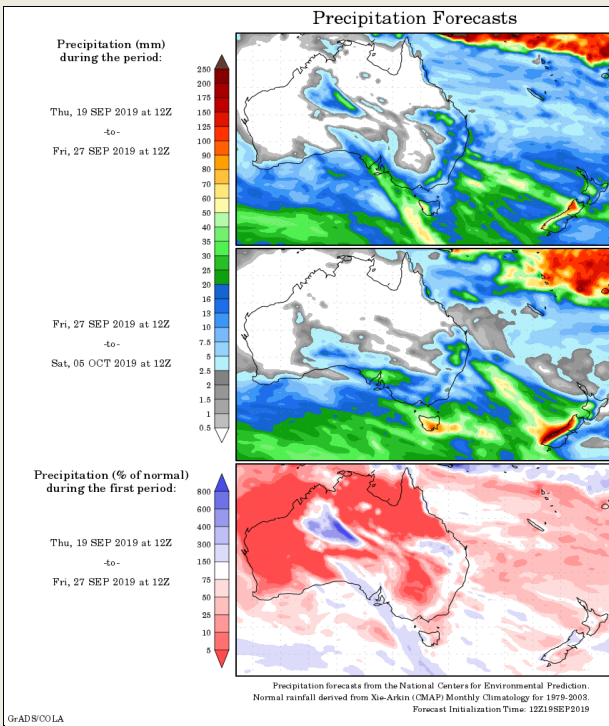
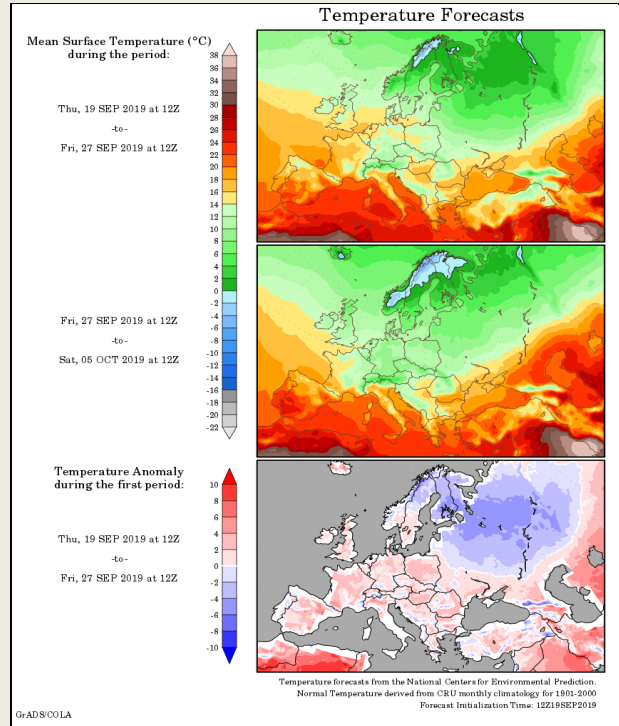
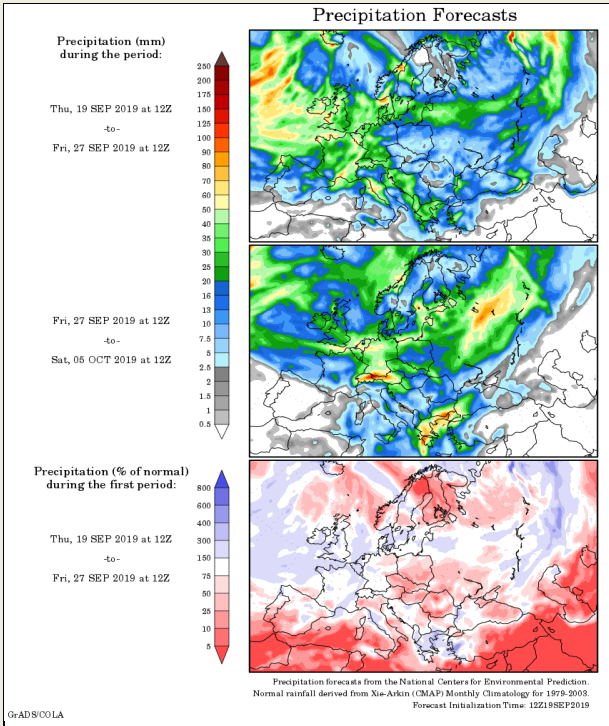


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Restricted precipitation and drying will continue over most of Europe through Saturday. Drying will promote fieldwork most often. However, concern over dryness will continue to delay winter planting and establishment in France as well as the Balkan Nations where conditions have been quite dry.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and drought will continue over most of western and central New South Wales into Queensland through Tuesday. Any rain will be brief and erratic and a widespread soaking will still be needed. Winter crop development will remain poor and a reduction in cotton, sorghum, corn and other crops will be possible if drought prevails into October.



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
