South Africa - Weather

Free State and neighboring areas will continue to have a critical shortage of moisture during the next two weeks

- o Any rain that occurs will be rapidly lost to evaporation
- o Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- o Timely rain will still be needed later in October to support better wheat conditions
- Portions of Western Cape will receive enough rain to bolster soil moisture during the next two weeks
- o However, the main winter wheat areas will not receive enough rain to completely reverse the moisture deficits
- o Additional precipitation will be needed to support better winter wheat growth

September 8 - 14, 2019



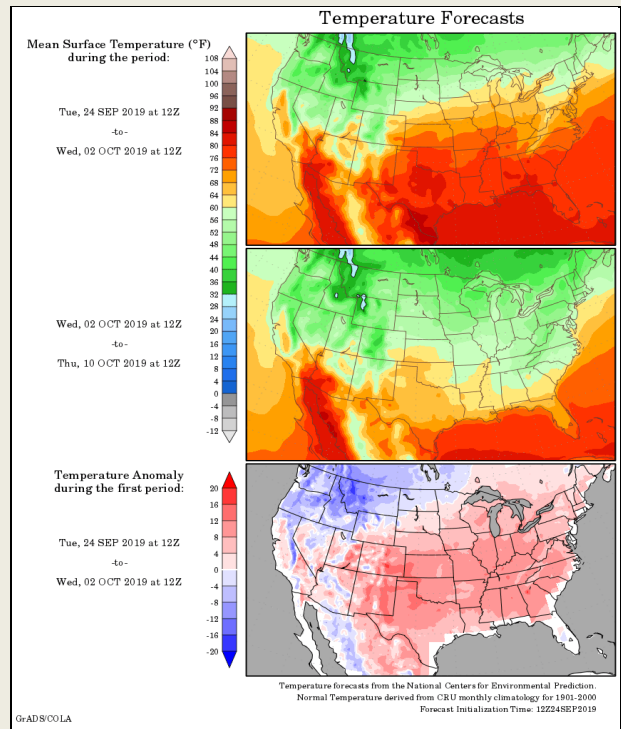
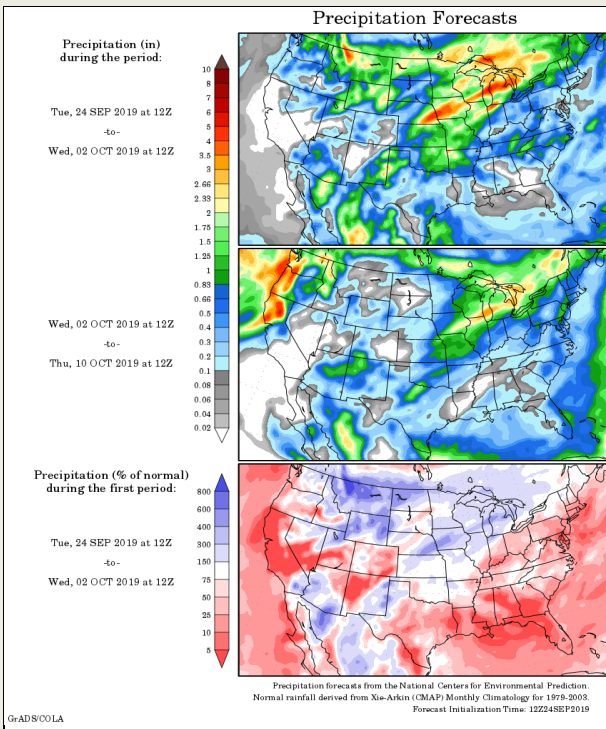
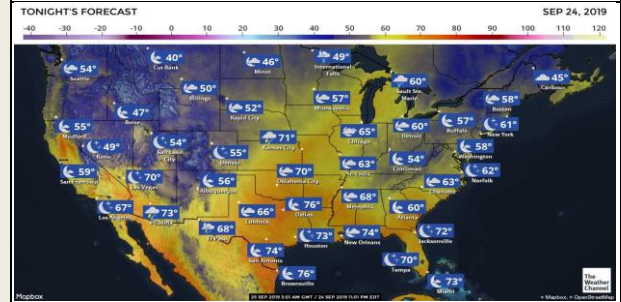
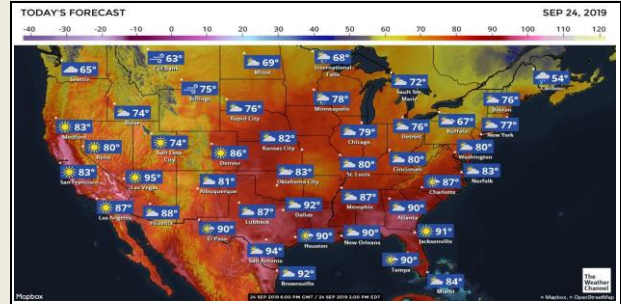
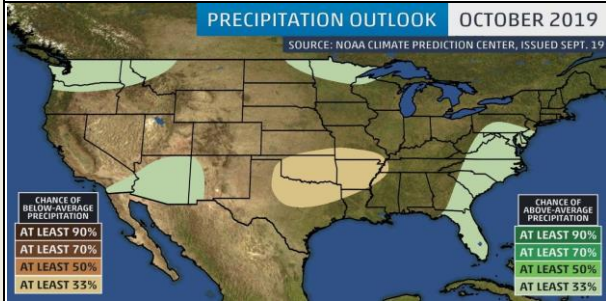
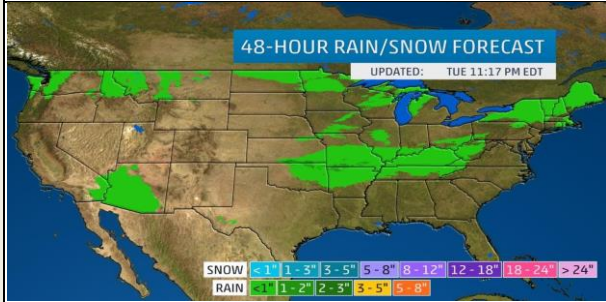
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: An unsettled weather pattern will prevail in parts of the northern and western Corn Belt through the next week with waves of rain expected. Temperatures will be mild to warm, but the wet bias will keep crop maturation rates slow at times. The best drying conditions will be in the lower eastern Midwest.

There is potential for frost and freezes in northwestern Corn Belt next week, but confidence in the intensity of the cold is not very high and the situation will be closely monitored.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Erratically distributed rainfall is expected through the next ten days. The environment will be very good for summer crop maturation and harvesting, although there will be some brief delays when showers evolve. The environment will also be good for some of the late season crops, although rainfall is not likely to be great enough to counter evaporation.



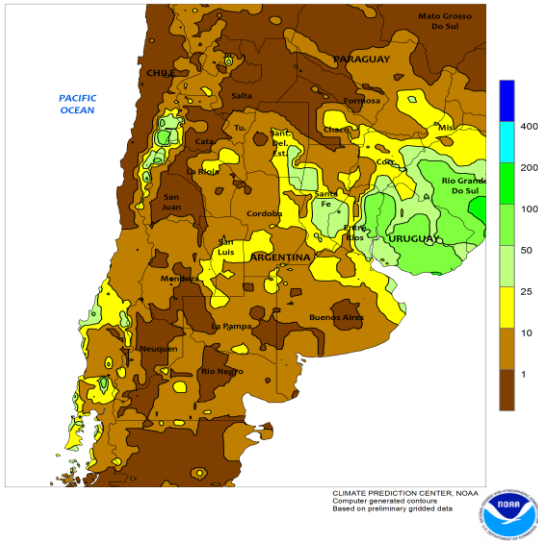
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South America - Weather

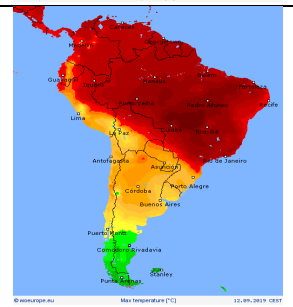
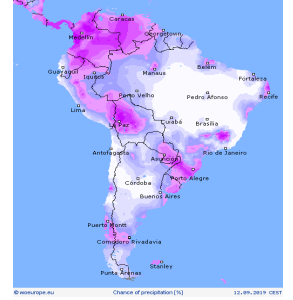
BRAZIL: Much needed rain will fall this week from Paraguay and Mato Grosso do Sul to Minas Gerais, Espírito Santo and Rio de Janeiro tonight into Friday. The moisture will improve corn and soybean planting and establishment conditions across the region, although the greatest rain will be in Sao Paulo and Minas Gerais. Dry and warm weather will return next week and that might support quick drying, but follow up moisture will be needed soon to support quick germination and emergence. Showers in center west this week will begin to moisten up the topsoil, but the precipitation will be a little too erratic and light to seriously change crop and field conditions. The moisture will "prime the atmospheric rain pump" so that greater rain can fall a little later in the season.

ARGENTINA: Dry weather will dominate western and northern Argentina this week raising more concern about the condition of winter wheat which is stressed because of dryness. The environment will also delay the onset of cotton, corn and sunseed planting. Rain that evolves next week in Buenos Aires could relax the concern, but more rain will be needed.

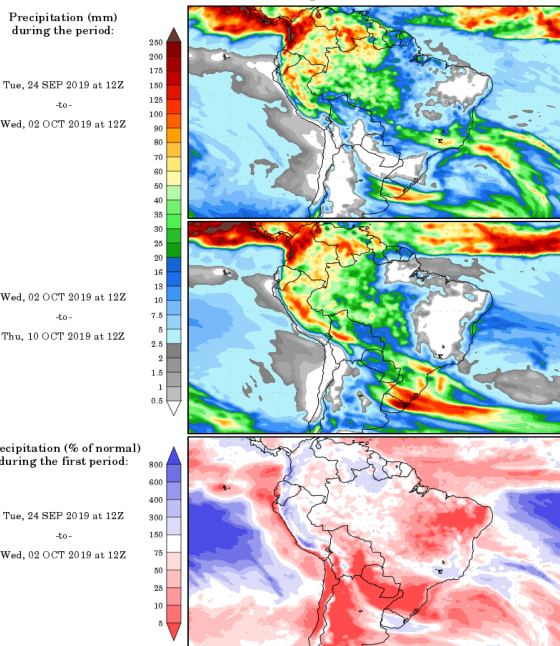
ARGENTINA

September 8 - 14, 2019



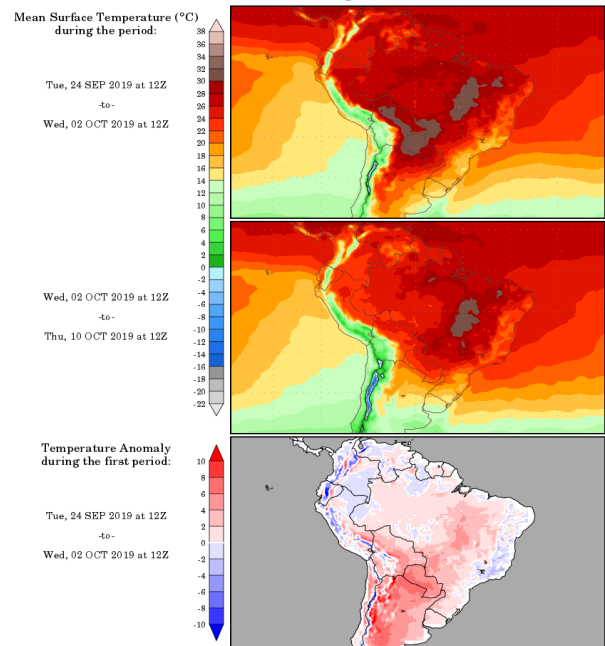

Temperature Forecasts

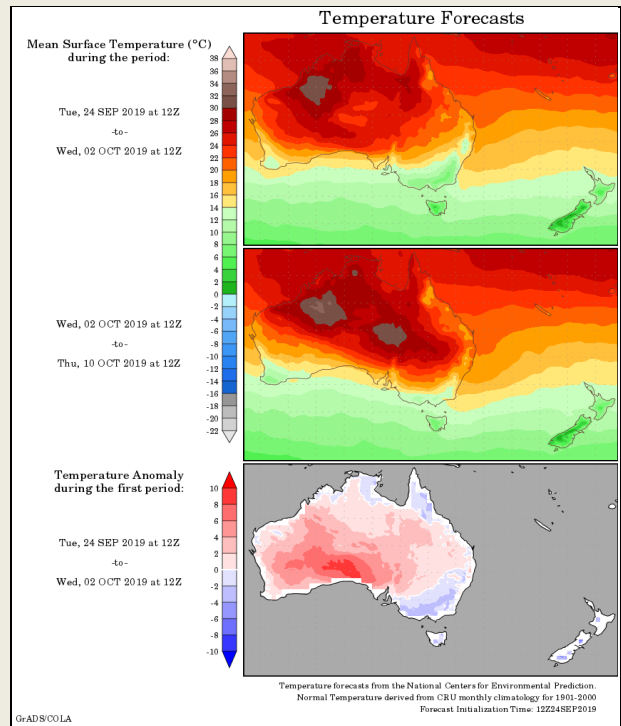
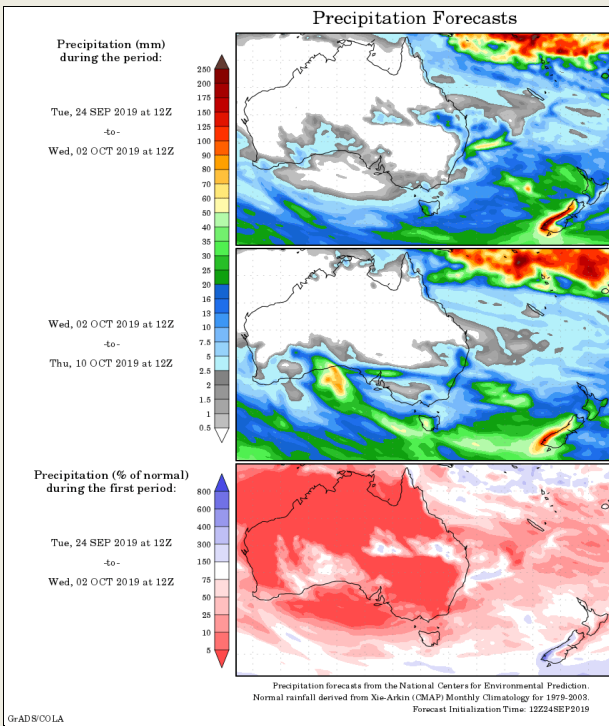
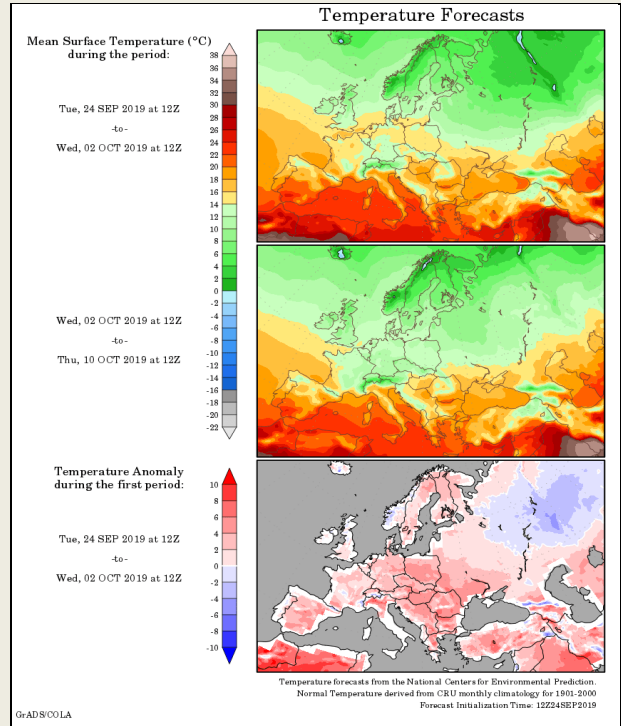
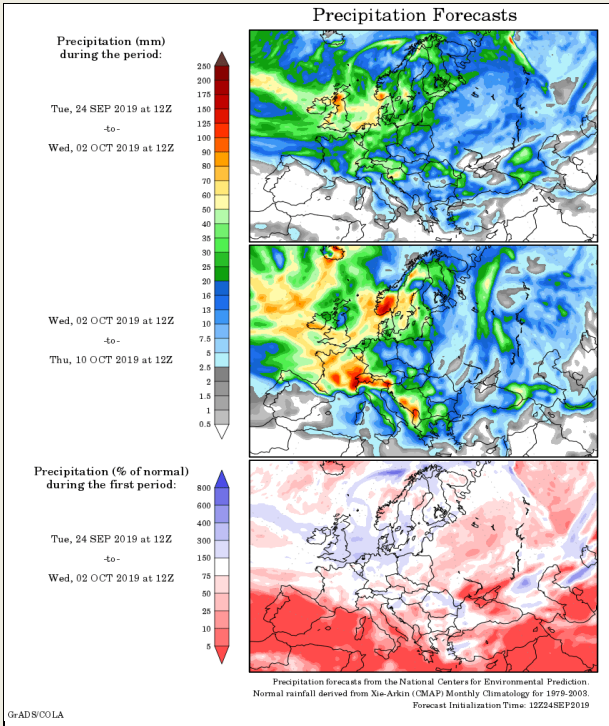


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Improving precipitation will occur over north and central France into Germany as well as the U.K. into Scandinavia this week. The moisture will be beneficial and will bolster soil moisture conditions for winter crop planting and establishment in France and immediate surrounding areas in Belgium, the Netherlands, west Germany and southeast U.K.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and drought will continue over most of western and central New South Wales into Queensland the next ten days to two weeks. Winter crop development will remain poor and a reduction in cotton, sorghum, corn and other crops will be possible if drought prevails into October.



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
