

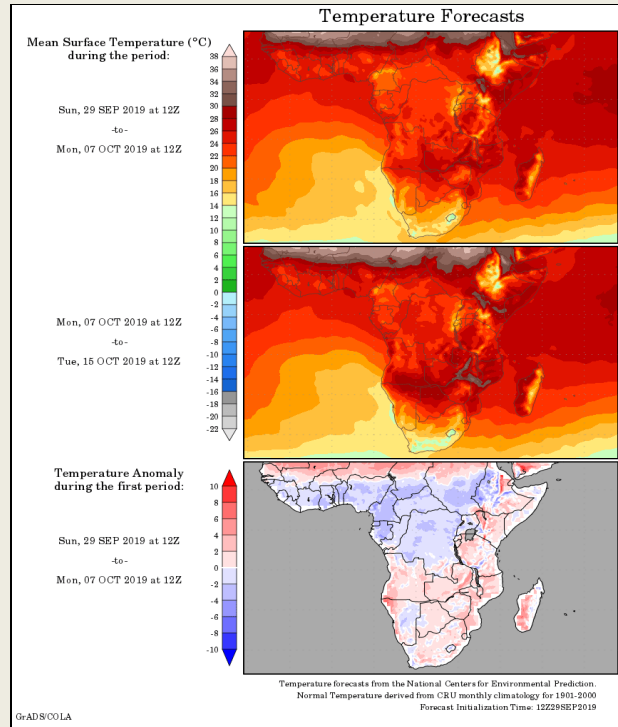
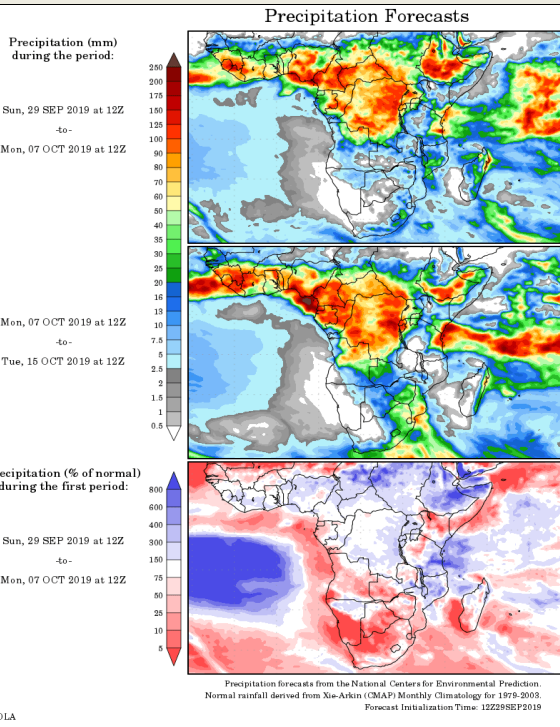
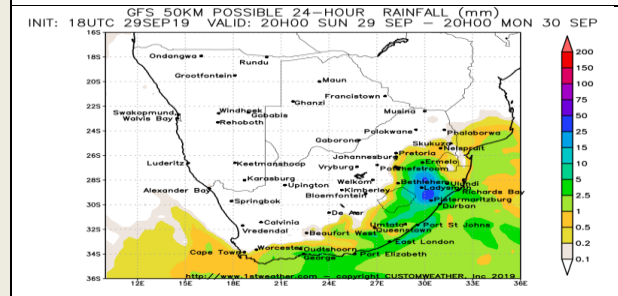
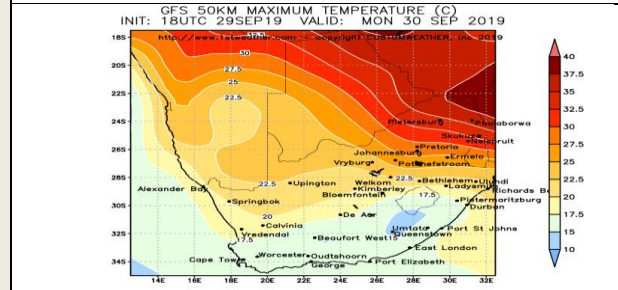
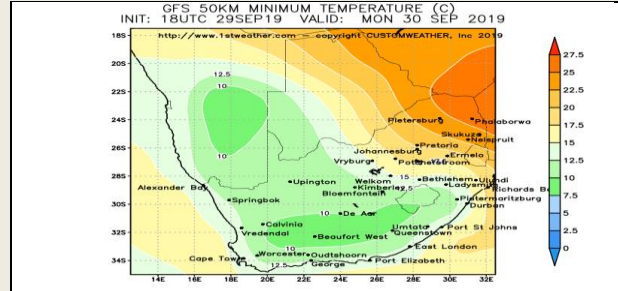
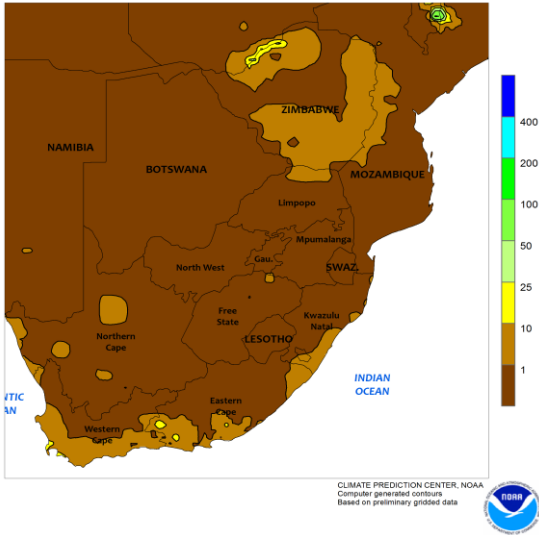


Weather Report
30 September 2019

South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will remain dry through the end of next week despite periods of rain
- o Precipitation during the second week could help improve the moisture profile if the forecast models verify
- o Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- o However, development could begin in the second week due to the boost in rain
- Portions of Western Cape will receive enough rain to bolster soil moisture during the next two weeks
- o However, the main winter wheat areas will not receive enough rain to completely reverse the moisture deficits
- o Additional precipitation will be needed to support better winter wheat growth

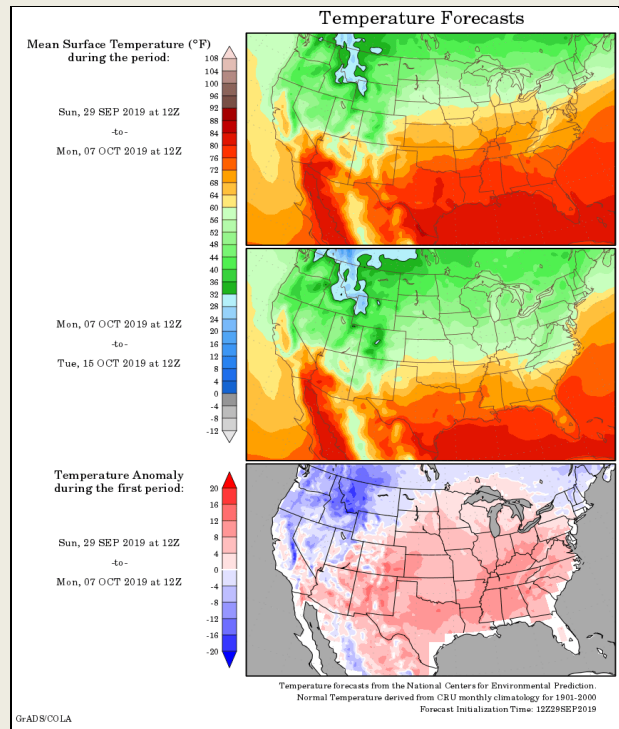
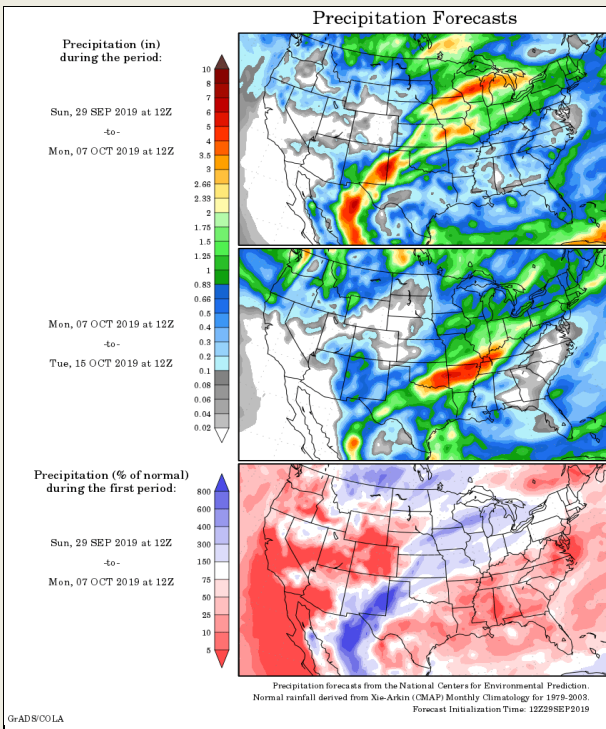
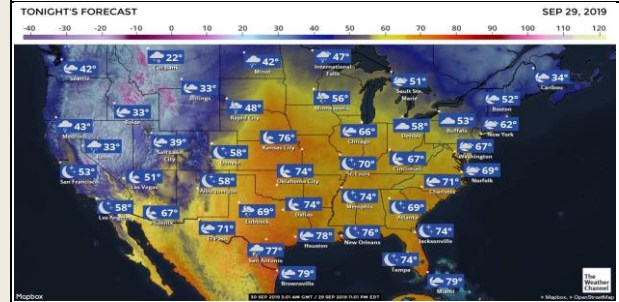
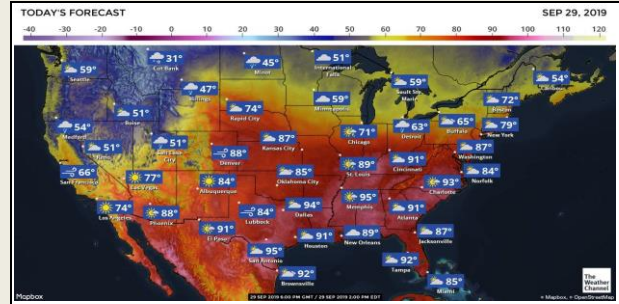
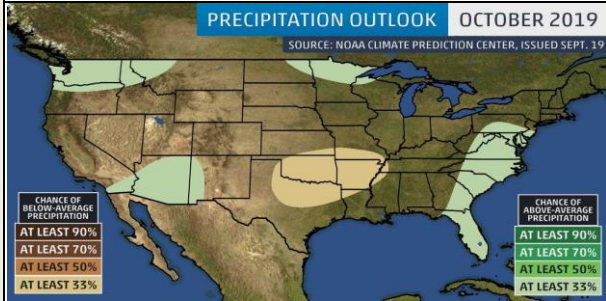
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Frost and a few light freezes will occur in eastern North Dakota and northwestern Minnesota Saturday with a more potent round of cooling possible during the middle to late part of next week.

o Frost and freezes Saturday morning should not have a large impact on the region, but corn and possibly some soybeans are still immature in some areas and damage to the crop may occur in the pockets where temperatures are coldest.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The two-week outlook still favors crop maturation and harvesting across the Delta and the Southeast as a restricted rainfall pattern will remain in place while some immature crops suffer from a lack of soil moisture.

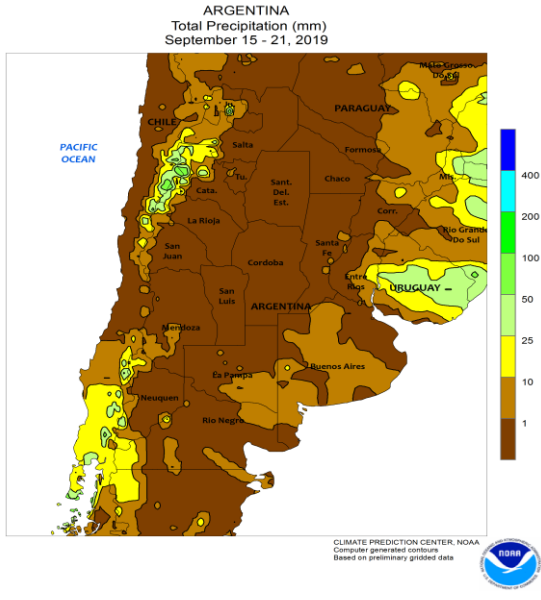
o A few showers will occur on occasion and the resulting rain will be welcome where crops are immature, but many areas will not receive enough rain to have a significant impact on soil moisture or conditions for fieldwork.



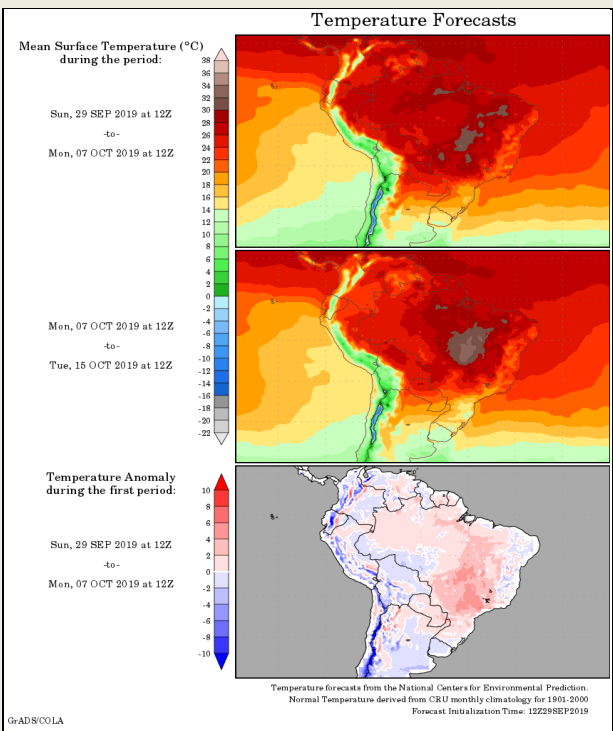
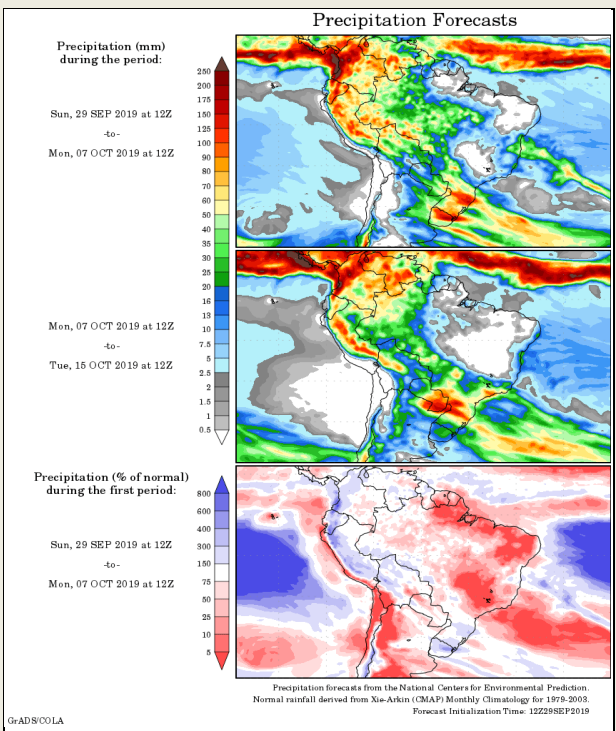
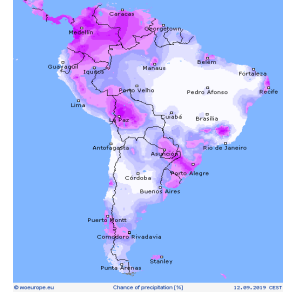

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Much of Brazil still needs rain to improve conditions for summer crop planting and a gradual improving trend is expected to continue through the next two weeks.
o Regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur in Mato Grosso and Mato Grosso do Sul and although much of the rain will be light, some pockets of greater rain and improving conditions for planting will occur.
ARGENTINA: Eastern Argentina will see some timely rain Sunday into Wednesday, but outside of that event, a restricted rainfall pattern will remain in place most often through the next two weeks and much of the country will be left in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat and summer crop planting.

EUROPE: • Improving precipitation will occur over north and central France into Germany and north Poland as well as the U.K. into Scandinavia this week. The moisture will be beneficial and will bolster soil moisture conditions for winter crop planting and establishment in northern and east France and immediate surrounding areas into Germany.

AUSTRALIA: Light rain showers returned to southeast Queensland and northeast New South Wales Thursday into this morning. However, drying prevailed over most of east-central Australia and greater rain is needed to end drought conditions in many locations.
