# South Africa - Weather

A band of showers will advance over Natal and neighboring areas later in the work week

- o These areas will receive a trace to 2.00 inches of rain with locally greater amounts from this event
- o Most other production areas will receive little to no rain during the coming week
- o Any precipitation that does occur will be too light to counter evaporation
- o South Africa will generally be drier biased September 11 – 17
- o Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- o Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- o Abundant rain will be needed later this month and early October to support better winter wheat prospects
- o Western Cape will also remain dry in the coming weeks
- o Significant rain will also be needed in the main winter wheat areas later in September to improve the outlook for aggressive development

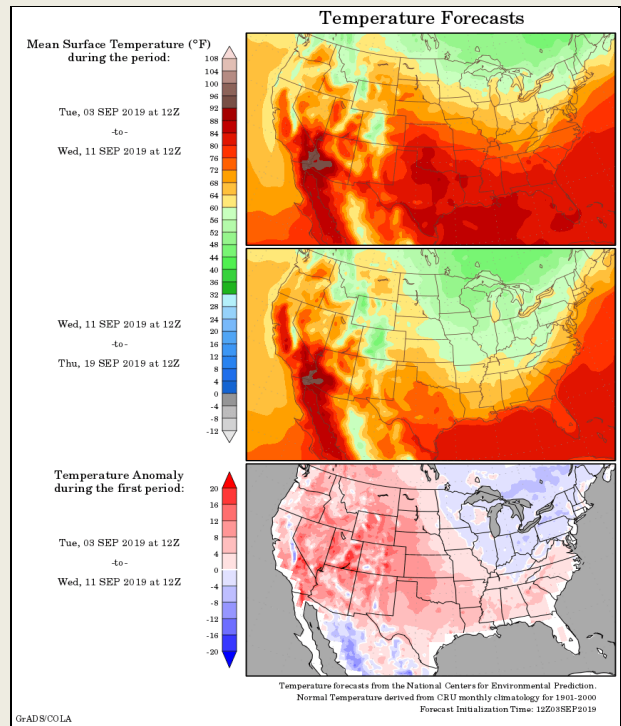
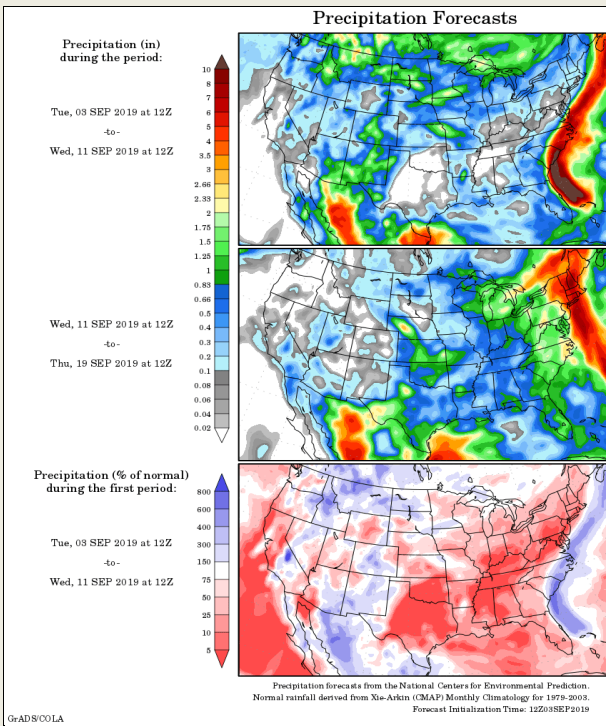
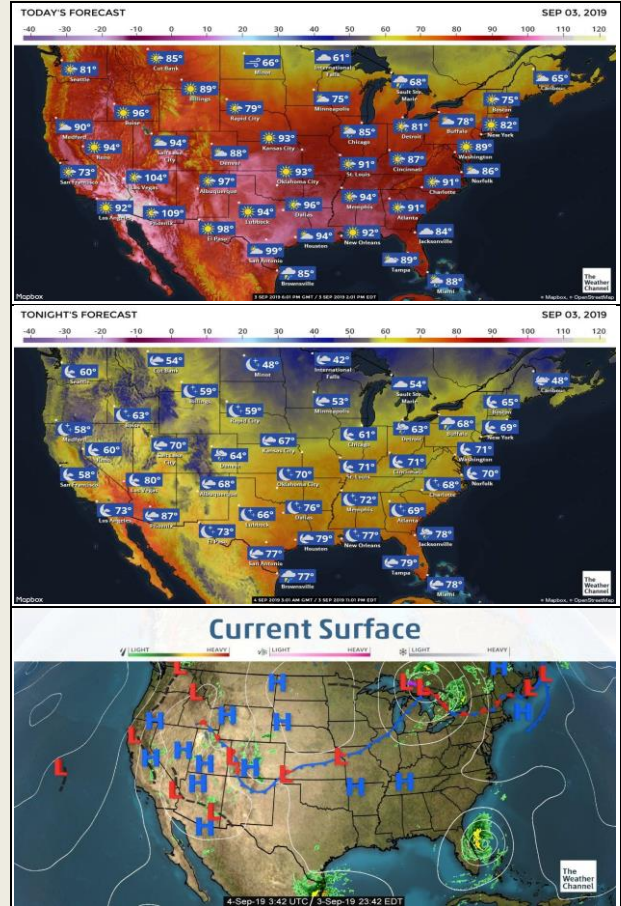
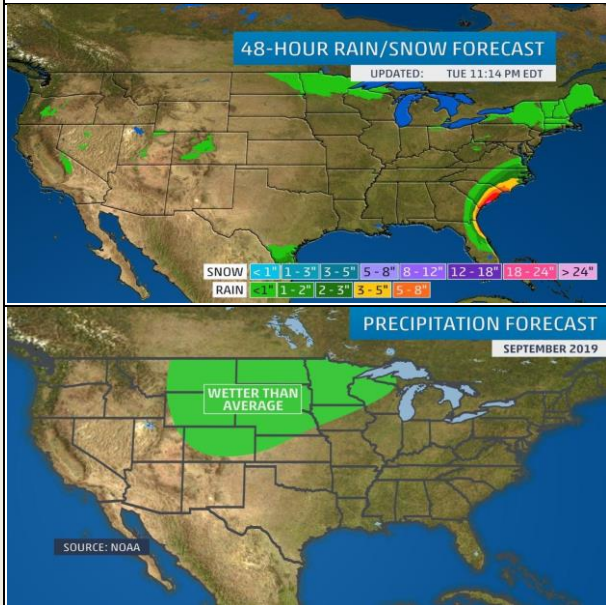

# United States of America - Weather

**U.S. MIDWEST:** Much of the Midwest will continue to see favorable conditions for developing crops through the next two weeks with at least another week of no crop-threatening cold expected. Although many areas will dry down during the next week to ten days, enough soil moisture is in place to support crop development and with rain expected by the middle of the month nearly all locations should have enough soil moisture to support the needs of crops to maturity.

**U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:** Hurricane Dorian will move northward and from the Bahamas to near the coast of North Carolina by Friday bringing heavy rain and some flooding to areas from northeastern Florida and southeastern Georgia into the eastern Carolinas with most of the crop-damaging winds limited to areas near coastal parts of the Carolinas.

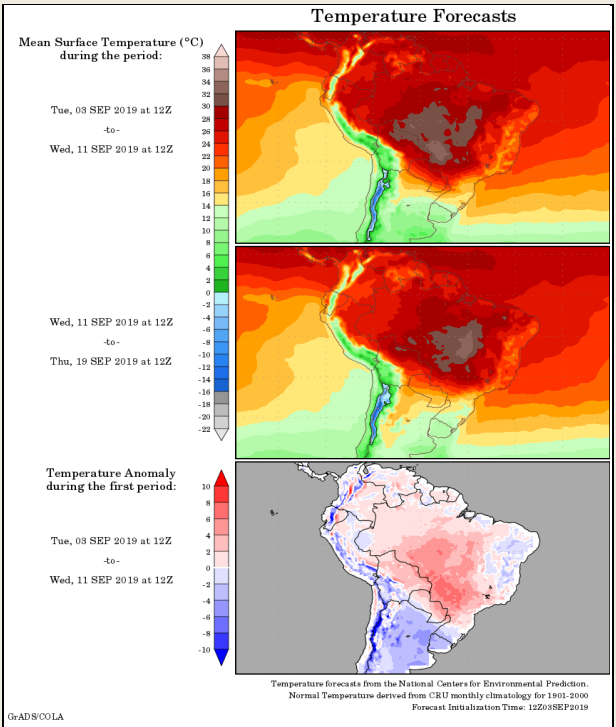
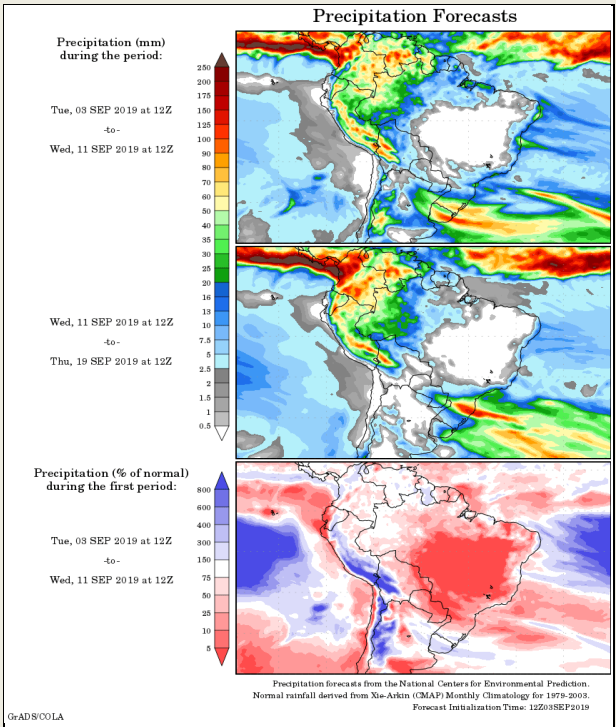
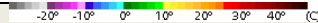
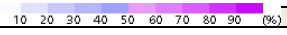
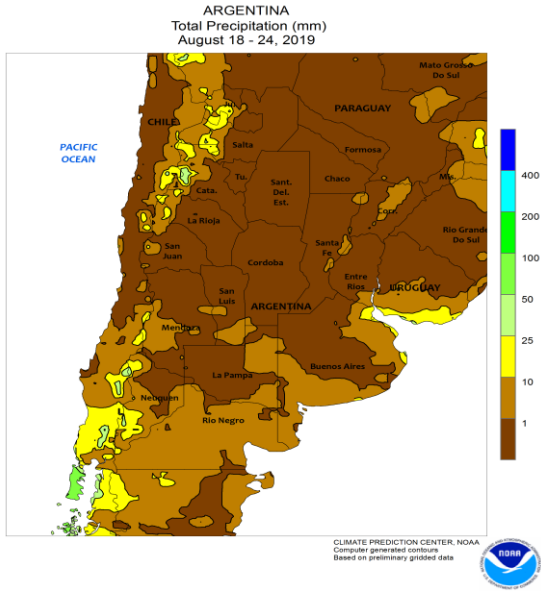

## Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Restricted precipitation and drying will continue to impact portions of Europe this week.

- Little to no rainfall will occur over Spain and France as well as Greece into east Bulgaria and southeast Romania and dryness concerns will prevail
- Meanwhile, rounds of precipitation will eventually occur elsewhere in Europe this week.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and drying will impact western and east-central Australia during the next ten days to two weeks. Drying in east-central Australia through most of New South Wales and interior southeast South Australia will continue to increase the need for a generalized rain event later this month to bolster soil moisture conditions for spring and summer planting. The dryness has negatively impacted winter crop production. Meanwhile, greater rain will be needed in Western Australia, especially locations that received light rain this weekend.
