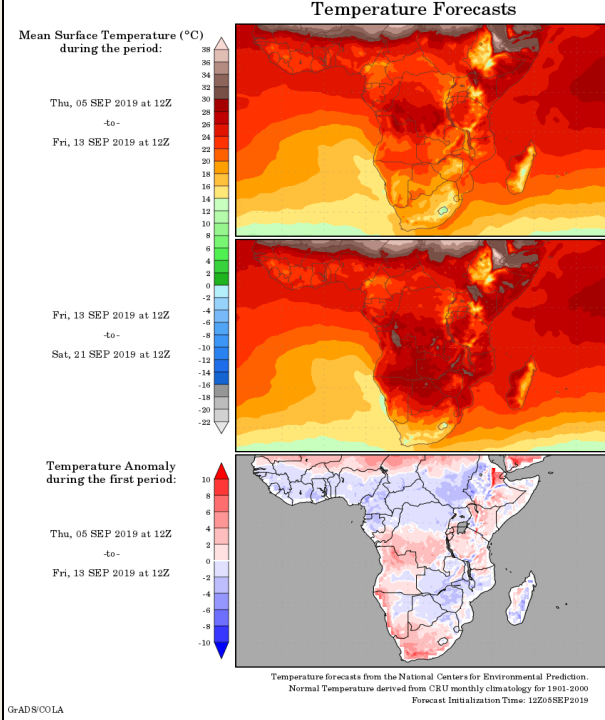
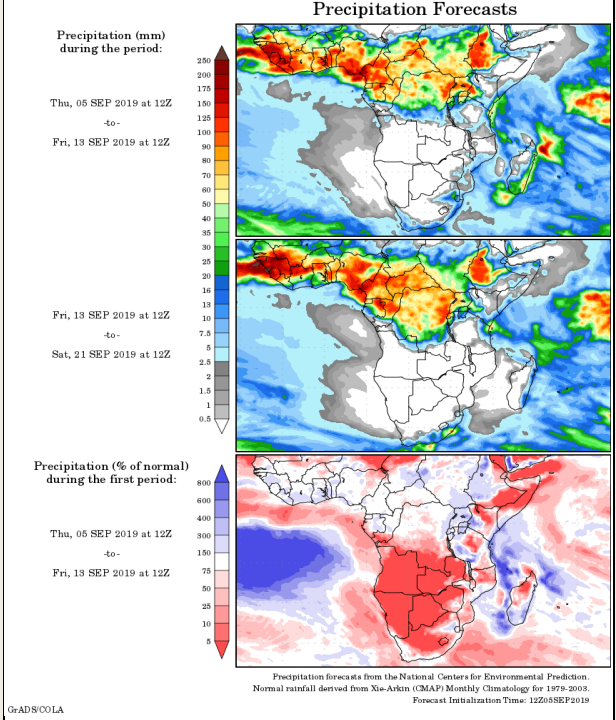
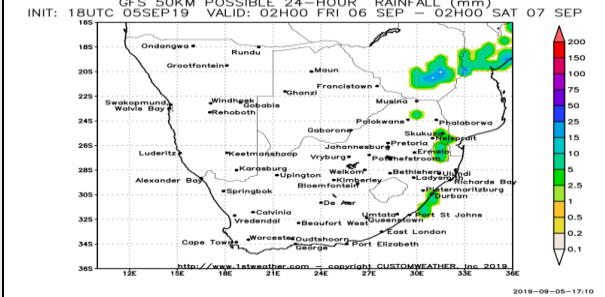
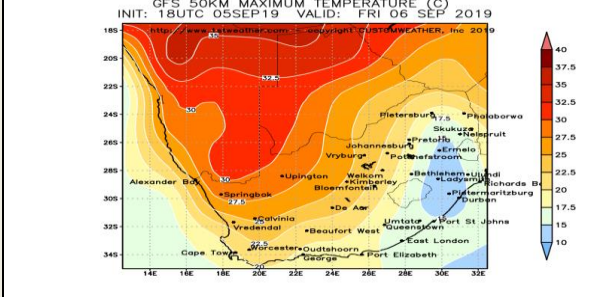
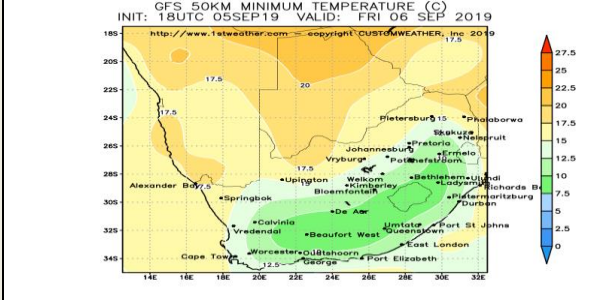
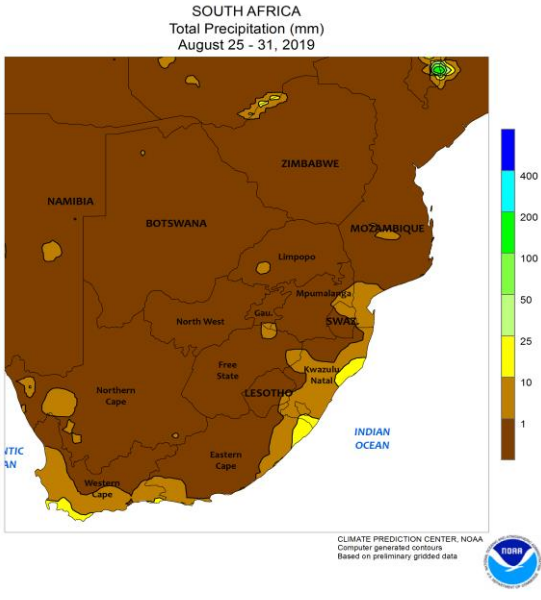




Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will remain critically dry during the next two weeks
- Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
- Abundant rain will be needed later this month into October to reverse the moisture deficits and support aggressive growth
- Western Cape will also remain dry or critically dry in the coming weeks
- Significant rain will also be needed in the main winter wheat areas later in September and early October to improve the outlook for the crops
- Temperatures will remain near to above normal for much of South Africa through next Thursday

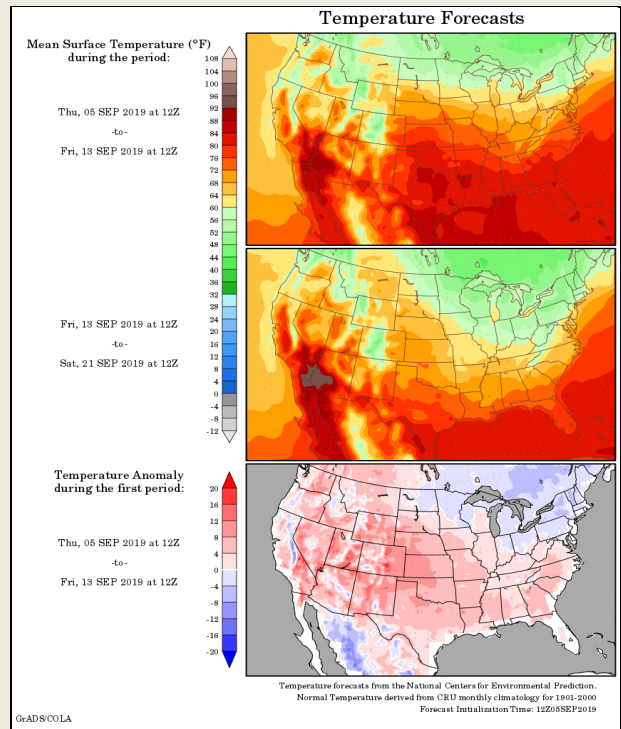
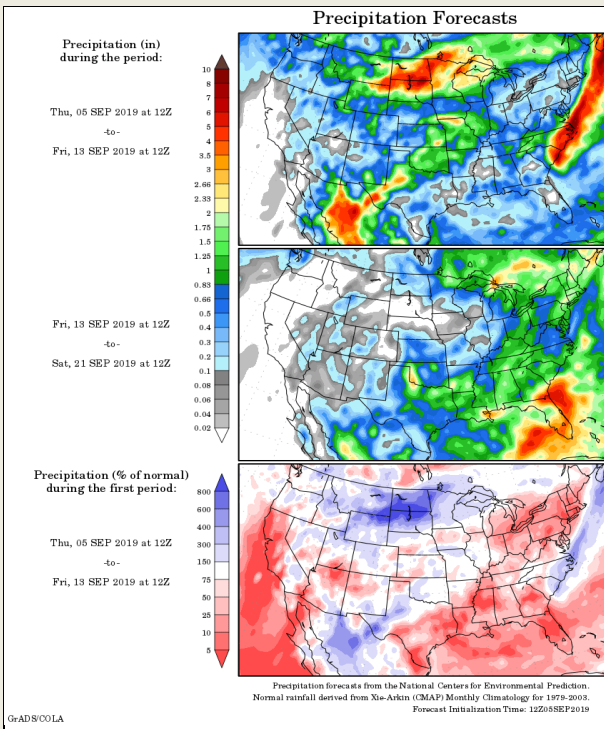
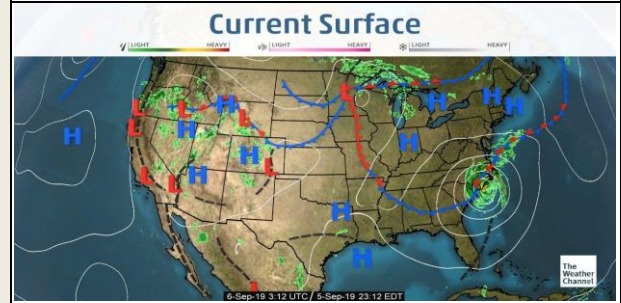
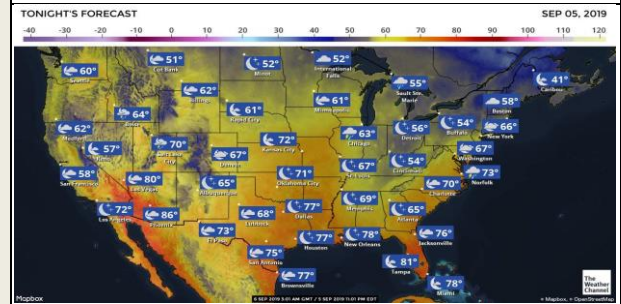
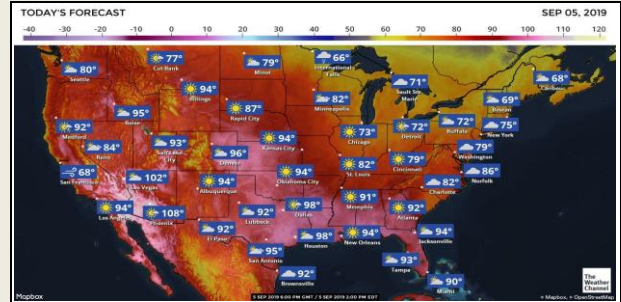
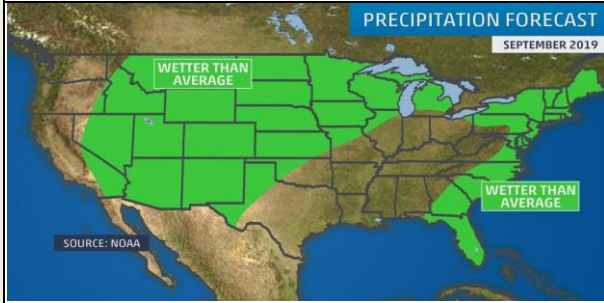
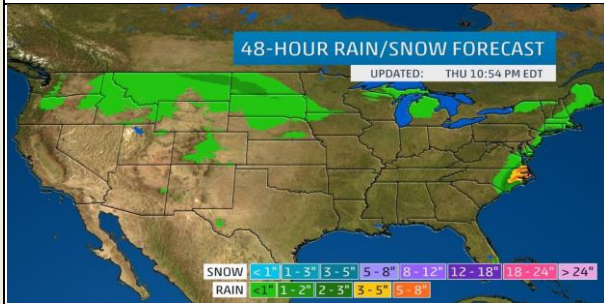

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest will continue to see favorable conditions for developing crops through the next two weeks with at least another week of no crop-threatening cold expected. Although many areas will dry down during the next week, enough soil moisture is in place to support crop development and with rain expected by the middle of the month nearly all locations should have enough soil moisture to support the needs of crops to maturity.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Hurricane Dorian brought rain to coastal areas from northeastern Florida and southeastern Georgia through southern North Carolina Wednesday with winds from the storm not likely strong enough to negatively impact crops outside of areas along the coast. Rainfall totals through 0100 CDT this morning were 0.10 to 1.01 inches with a local total of 2.79 inches near the central South Carolina coast. Hurricane Dorian will move to the northeast from near the central coast of South Carolina today along coastal areas of North Carolina this evening into Friday bringing heavy rain and some flooding to eastern parts of those states.

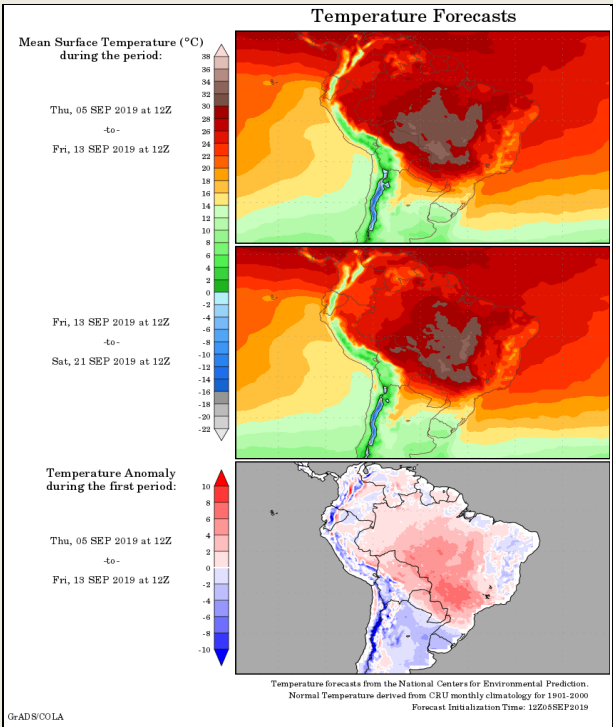
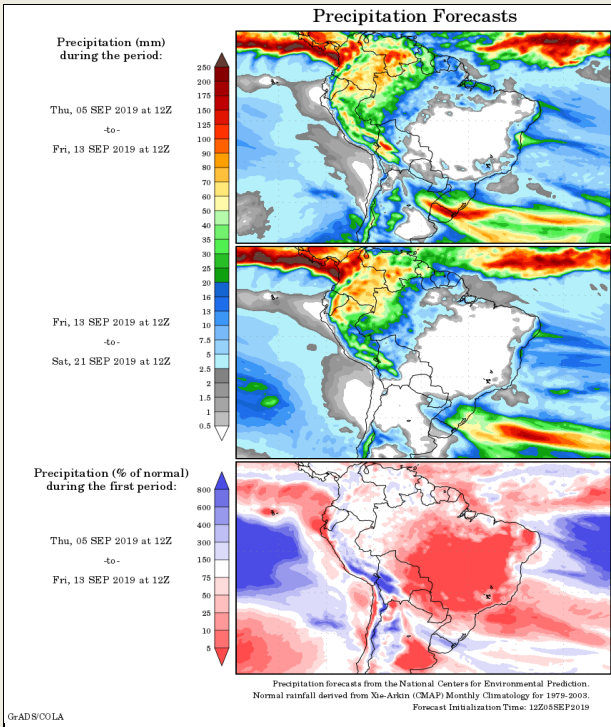
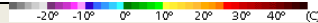
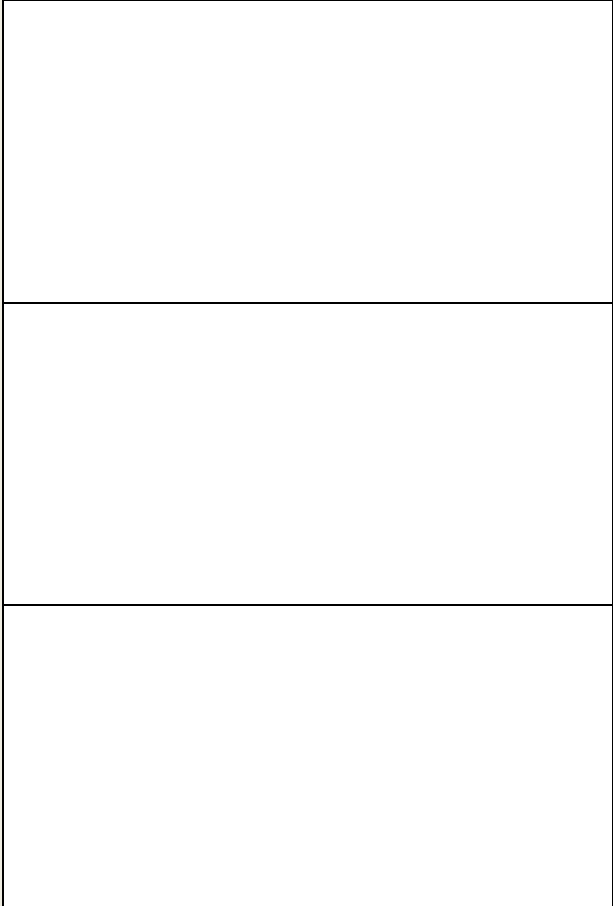
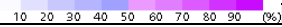
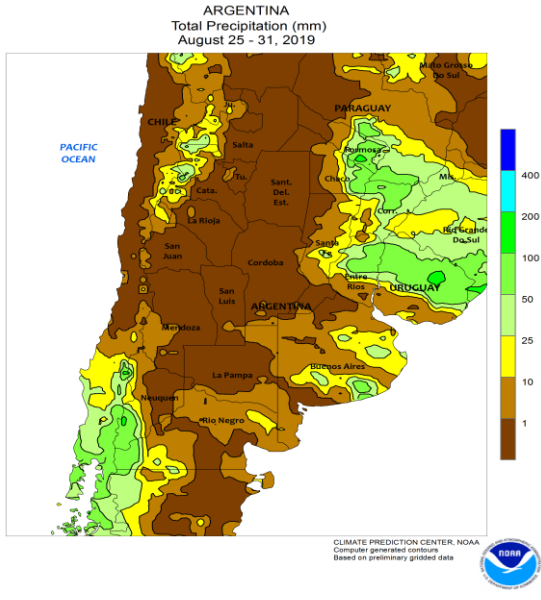

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Little rain of significance is expected through the next ten days to two weeks outside of Rio Grande do Sul and Santa Catarina much of the moisture from rain during the past weekend will soon be lost to evaporation. Greater rain will be needed to induce a more lasting increase in soil moisture to improve conditions for planting.

ARGENTINA: Portions of Santiago del Estero will benefit from rain Sunday into Tuesday while most of the remainder of Argentina will not receive enough rain to have much of an impact on soil moisture leaving much of western Argentina in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat. Some light showers will occur in northeastern Argentina Friday into Saturday before rain increases Sunday into Tuesday.

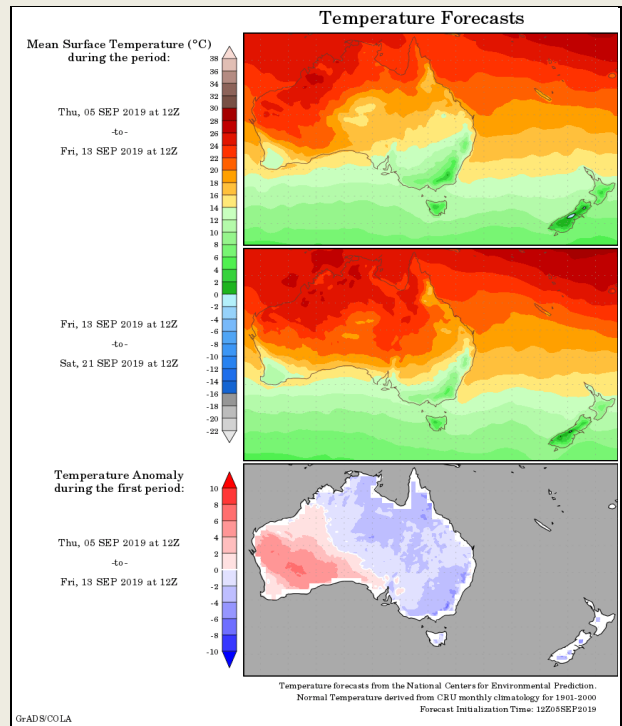
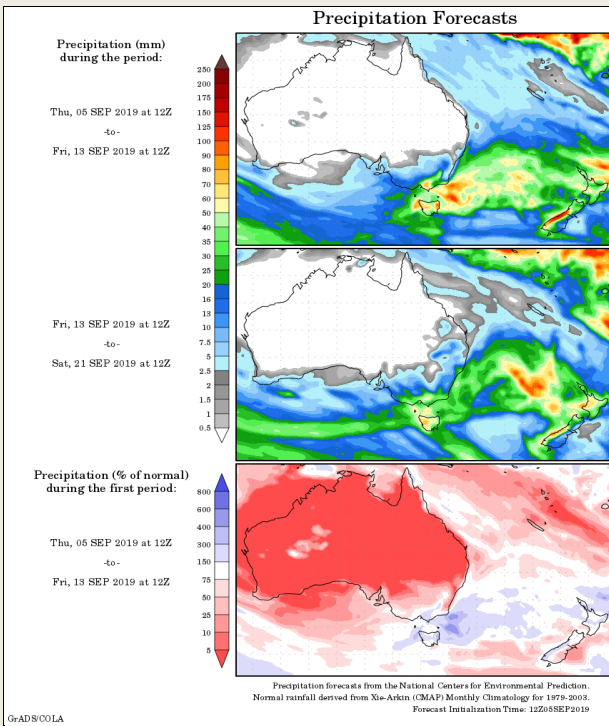
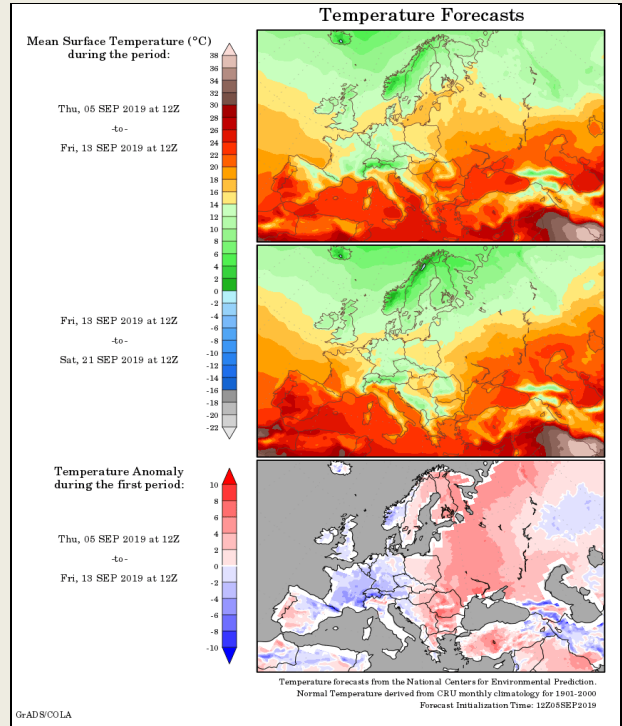
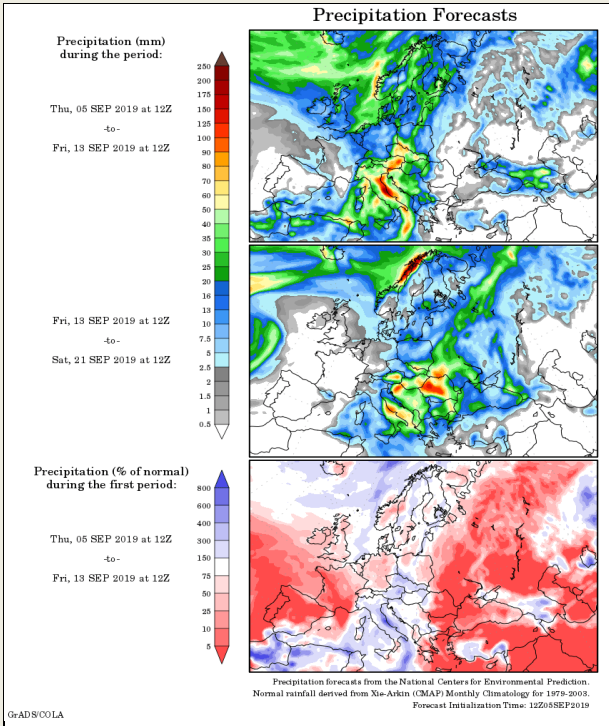
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Restricted precipitation and drying will continue to impact portions of Europe this week.

• Little to no rainfall will occur over Spain and France as well as Greece into east Bulgaria and southeast Romania and dryness concerns will prevail

• Meanwhile, rounds of precipitation will eventually occur elsewhere in Europe this week.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and drying will impact east-central and western portions of Australia the next ten days to two weeks. East-central Australia drought is not likely to change and winter crop development will remain poor and a reduction in cotton, sorghum, corn, sensed and other crops will be possible if drought prevails into October. Meanwhile, the break in rain will allow fieldwork to progress in Western Australia, although some greater moisture would still be welcome in northern production areas.
