

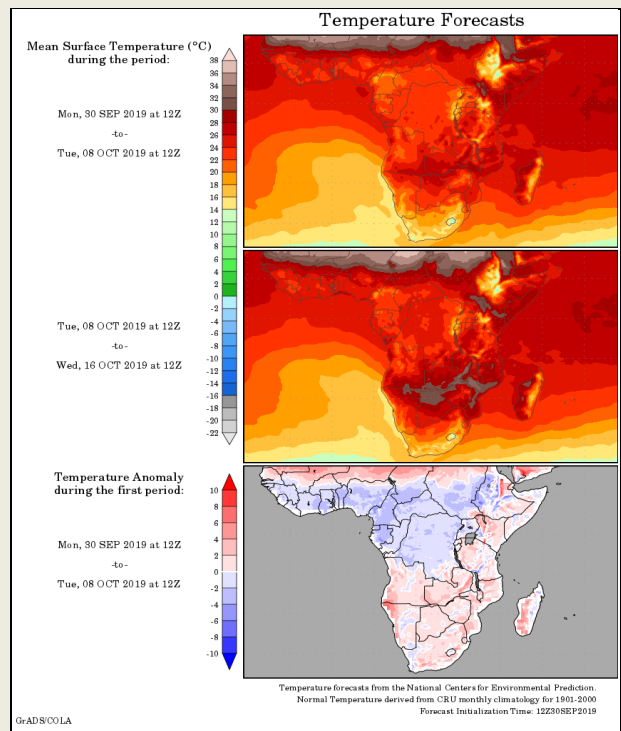
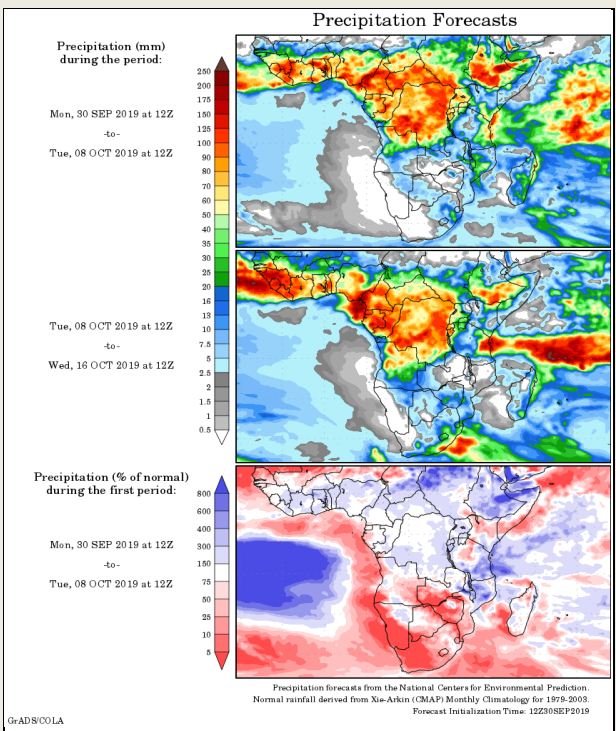
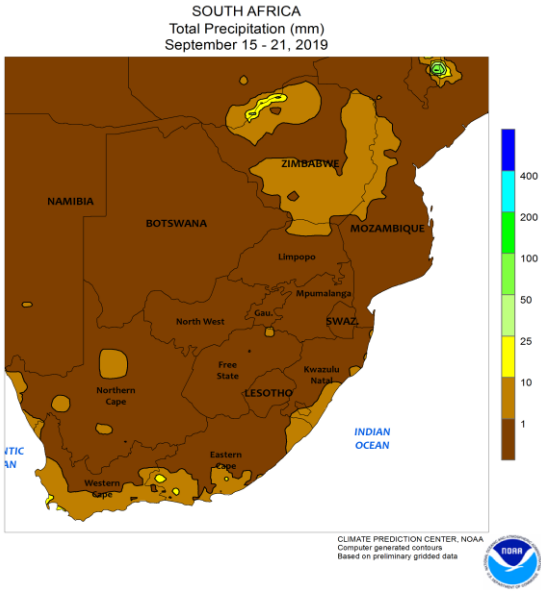
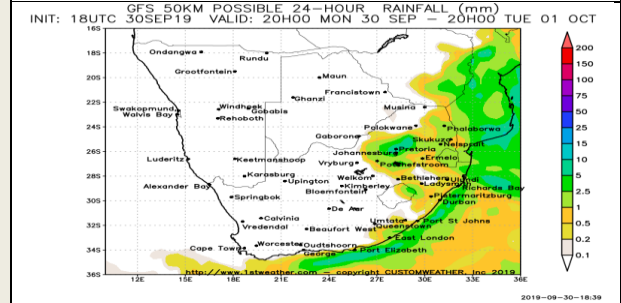
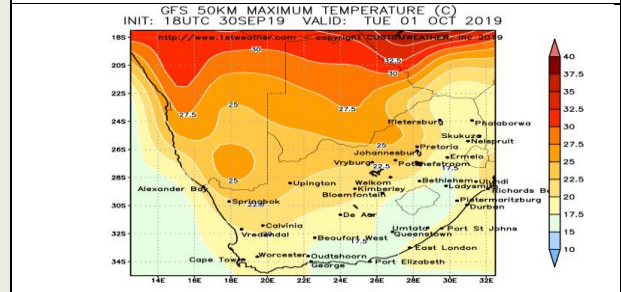
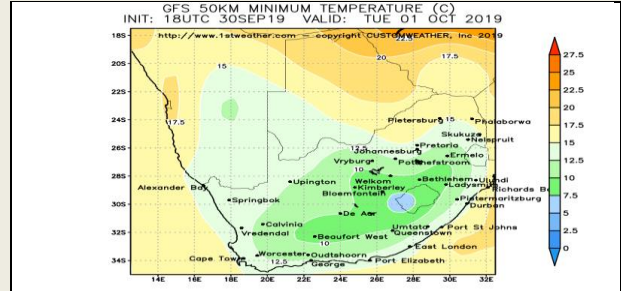


Weather Report

01 October 2019

South Africa - Weather

- Free State and neighboring areas will not receive enough rain this week to significantly bolster soil moisture
 - Rain during the second week could otherwise help alleviate some of the dryness in eastern sections of Free State
 - Winter wheat will remain dormant or semi-dormant in most locations
 - More widespread and significant rain will be needed later in October to support ideal wheat conditions
 - Western Cape will otherwise dry down during the next two weeks
 - Rainfall over the weekend was too light to significantly improve the moisture profile in most winter wheat areas

- Timely rain will be needed later this month to improve winter wheat prospects

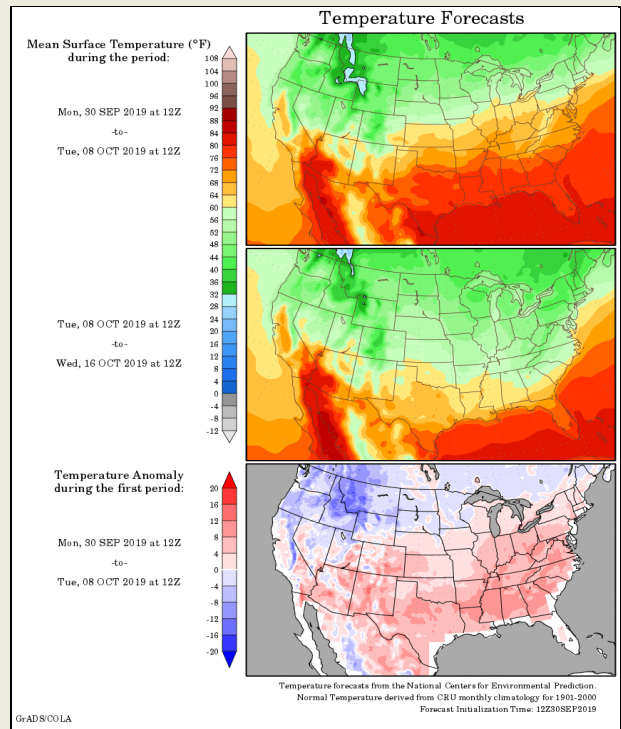
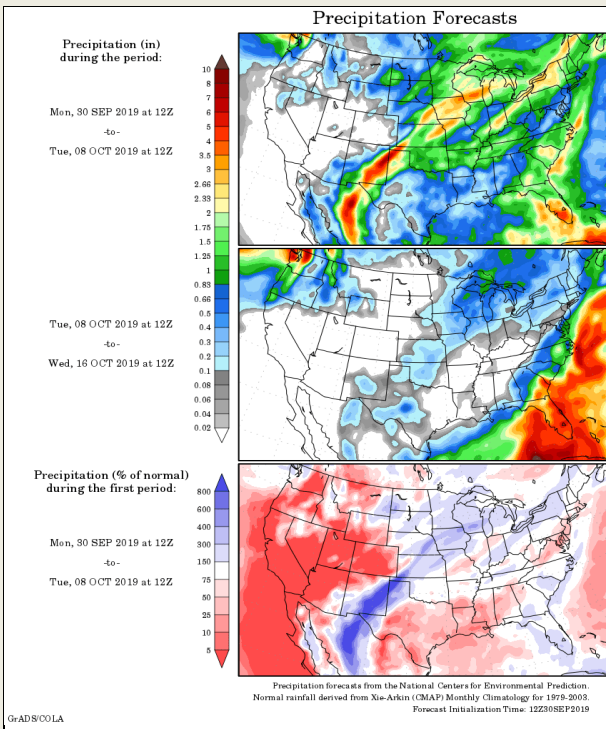
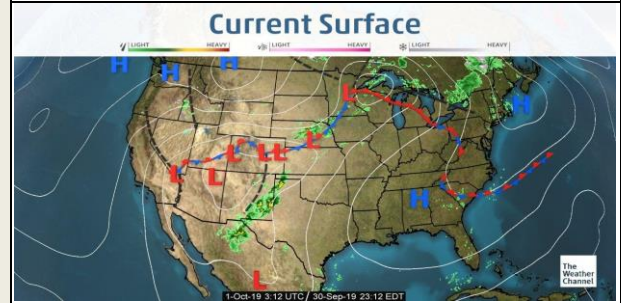
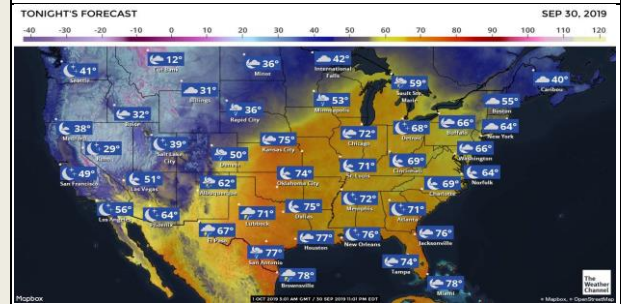
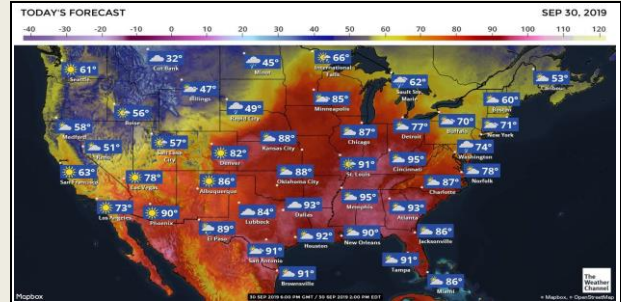
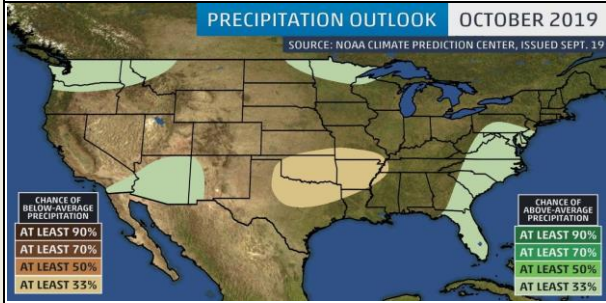
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Much of the Midwest outside of the Ohio River Basin will see additional rain by Wednesday before rain falls on the lower and eastern Midwest Friday into next Monday with a period of drier weather and improving conditions for fieldwork occurring in the west Oct. 7-14 and in the east Oct. 8-14.

o Rain by Wednesday will be greatest from eastern Nebraska to Wisconsin where totals will be 0.75-2.50" and locally more with parts of eastern Kansas to west-central Illinois seeing similar totals while rain to the northwest is lighter.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will continue to see mostly favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting during the next two weeks, but the region will be wetter than what has occurred recently and the moisture will be beneficial for winter wheat planting.

o Outside of some light showers that will be poorly distributed, little rain is expected through Saturday in much of the region.

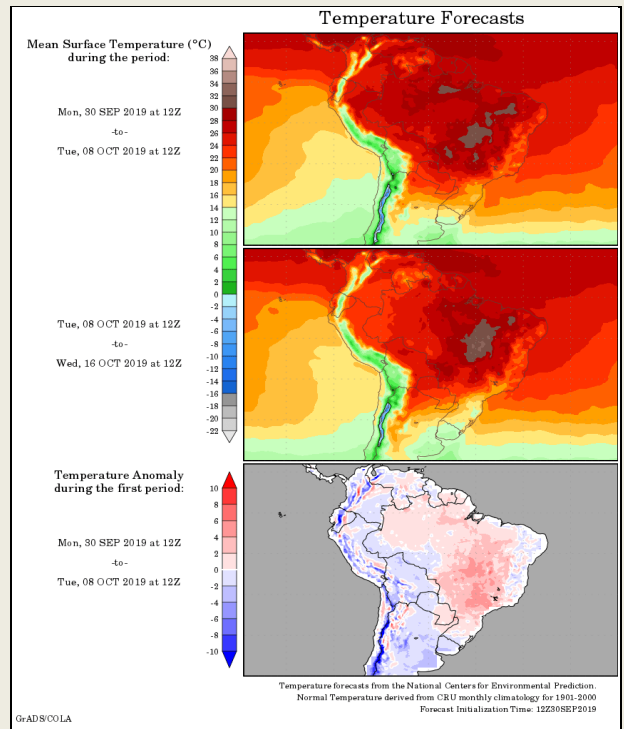
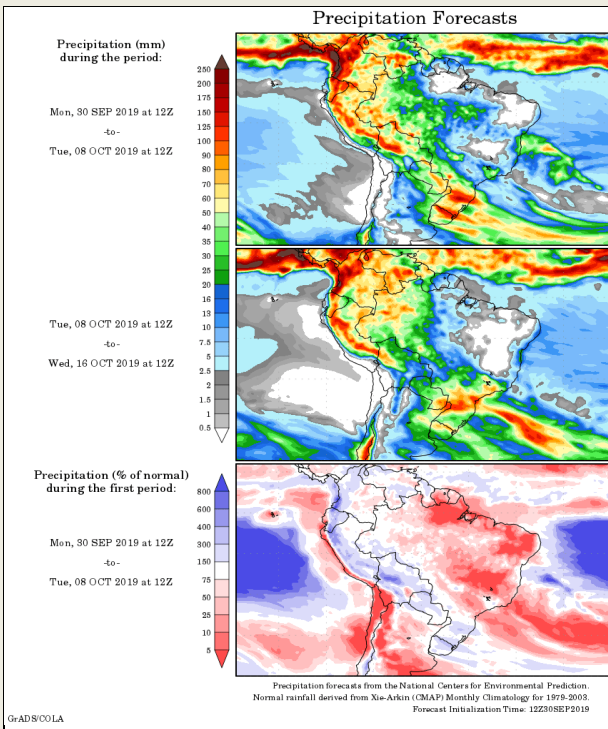
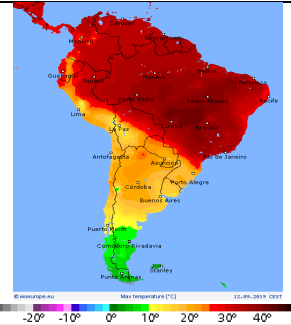
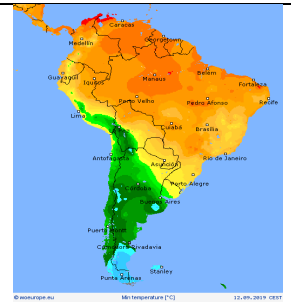
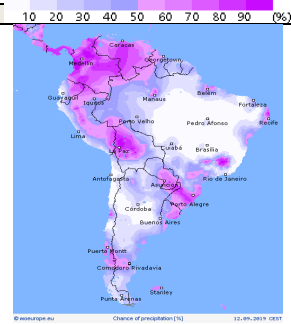
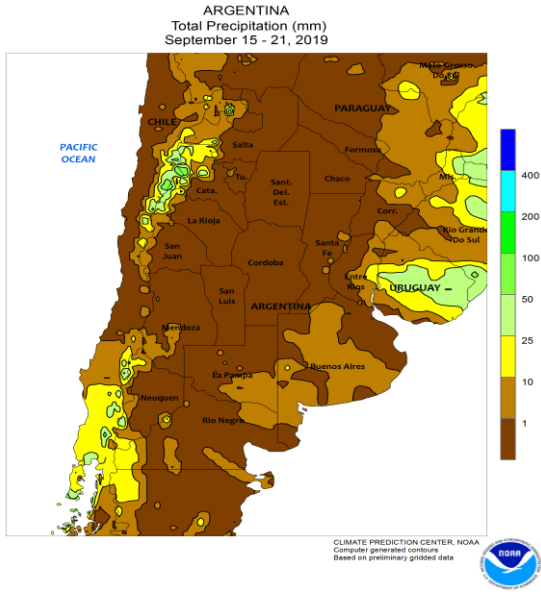

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The bottom line to the two-week outlook has not changed since late last week and much of Brazil is in need of rain to improve conditions for summer crop planting and a gradual improving trend is expected through the next two weeks in the west while more significant rain falls on the south. Rain during the next week will be greatest from southern Paraguay into Santa Catarina, southern Parana, and Rio Grande do Sul where most areas will receive 1.0-3.0" and locally more through this weekend.

ARGENTINA: Eastern Argentina will see timely rain today into Wednesday, but outside of that event, a restricted rainfall pattern will remain in place most often through the next ten days and much of the remainder of the country will be left in need of greater rain to improve conditions for winter wheat and summer crop planting.

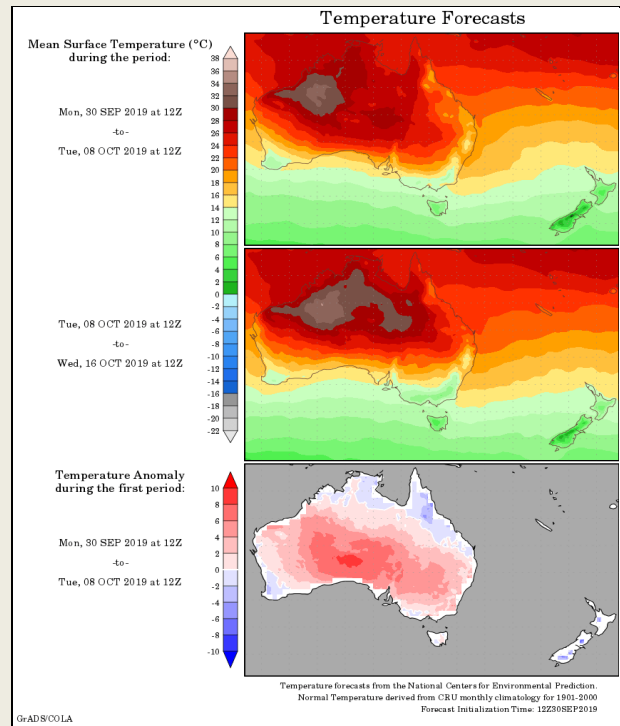
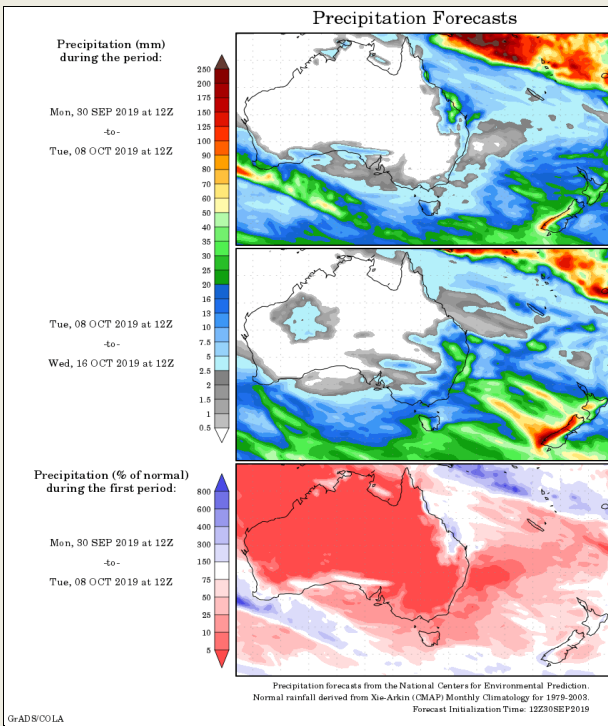
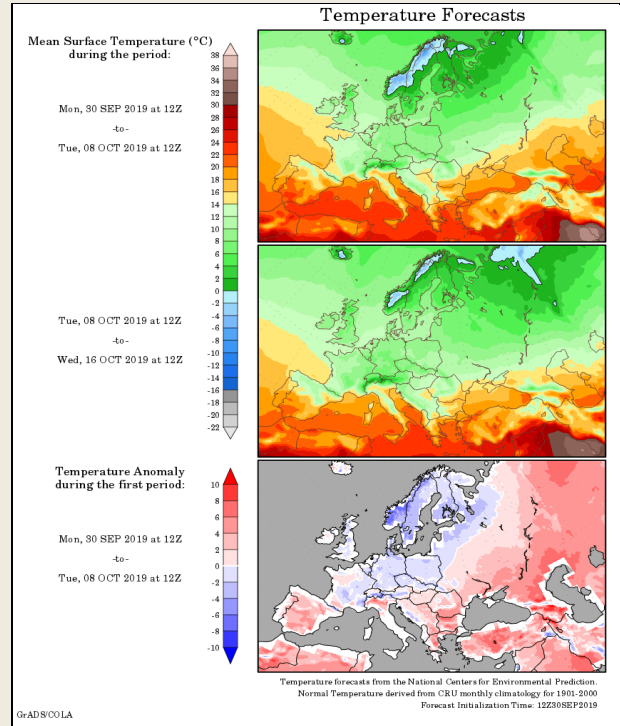
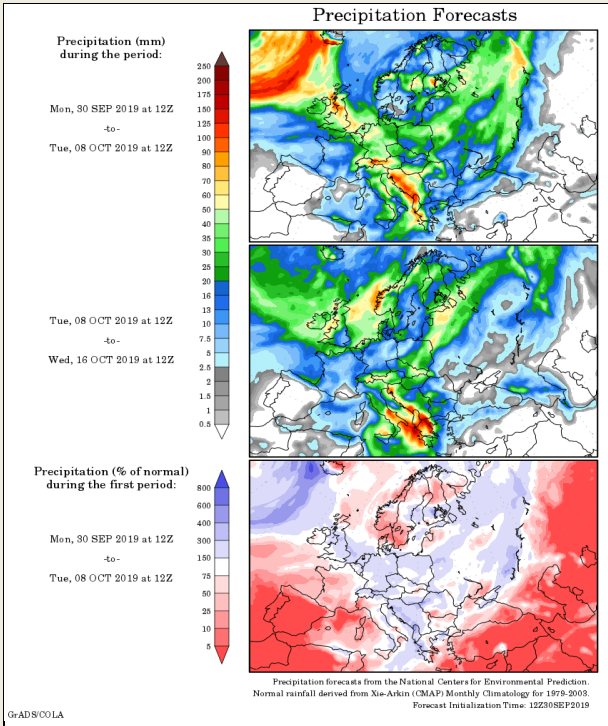
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: • Improving precipitation will occur over north and central France into Germany and north Poland as well as the U.K. into Scandinavia this week. The moisture will be beneficial and will bolster soil moisture conditions for winter crop planting and establishment in northern and east France and immediate surrounding areas into Germany.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and drought will continue over most of New South Wales into Queensland the next ten days to two weeks. Winter crop development will remain poor and stress will continue to grow and production potentials of cotton, sorghum, corn and other crops are declining in some areas.

o Light and erratic rain showers will occur over southeast Queensland and northeast New South Wales early this week.

o Most of the moisture will be too erratic and light to provide relief to dryness and concern over soil and crop moisture will continue over the region
