South Africa - Weather

Free State and neighboring areas will generally remain too dry to support aggressive winter wheat growth in the coming weeks

- o The rain that does occur will be unable to significantly impact long-term soil conditions
- o Significant rain is still needed to improve the moisture profile and promote aggressive growth
- o However, the environment will remain far from ideal in the coming weeks
- Western Cape will also remain too dry to support aggressive winter wheat development during the next two weeks
- o A general soaking of rain will be needed toward the end of the month
- Most areas will see temperatures remain near to above normal through next Thursday

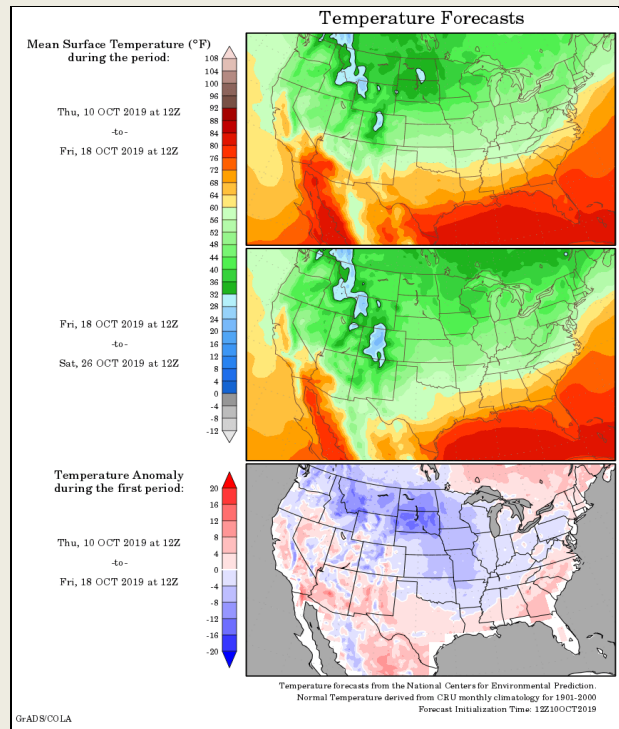
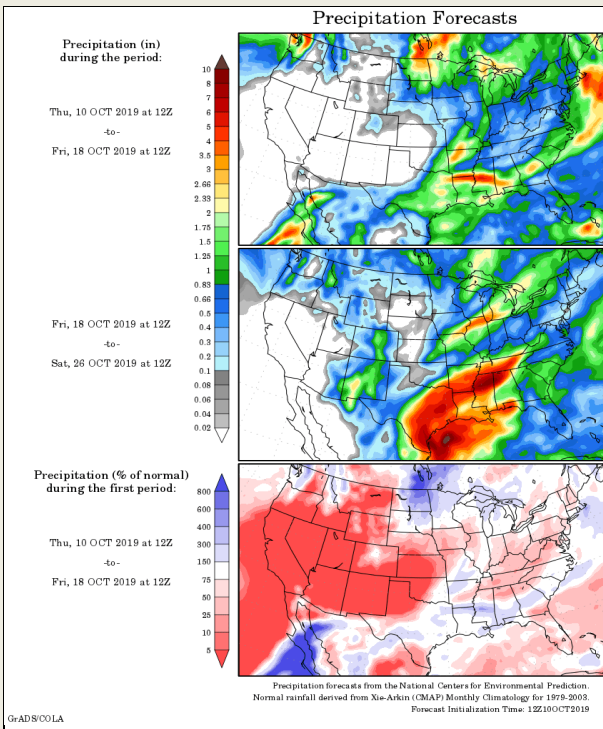
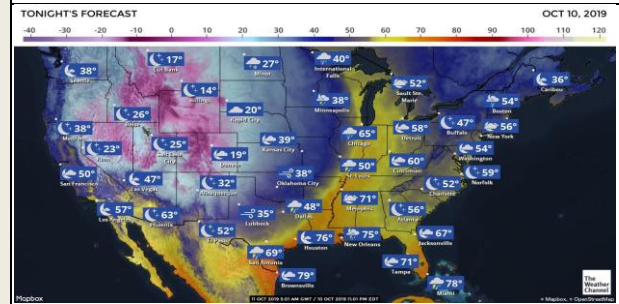
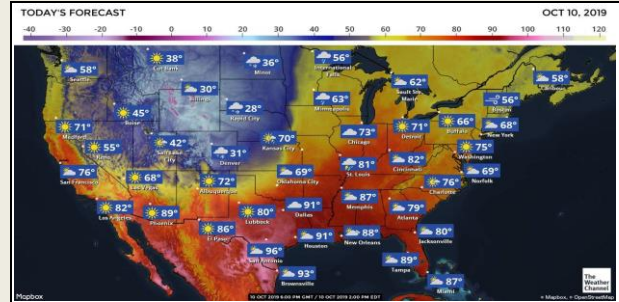
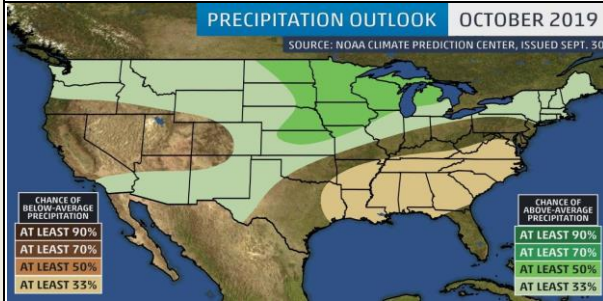


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A powerful storm system will bring heavy snow to parts of the far northwestern Corn Belt Thursday into Saturday along with frost and freezing temperatures to western, central, and northern parts of the western Corn Belt with some damage to immature corn likely to result from the cold.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see mostly favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting through the next two weeks with occasional rounds of showers that should not bring enough rain to cause serious disruptions to fieldwork or cause significant quality declines to crops.



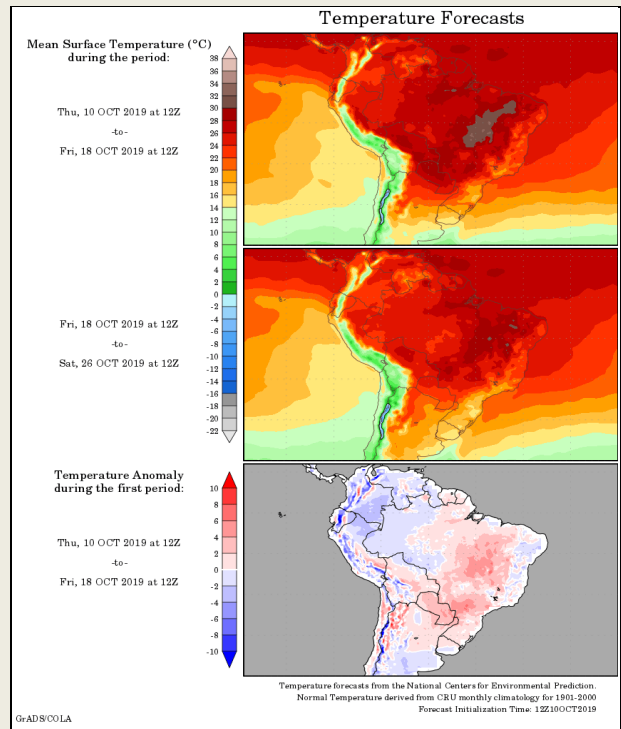
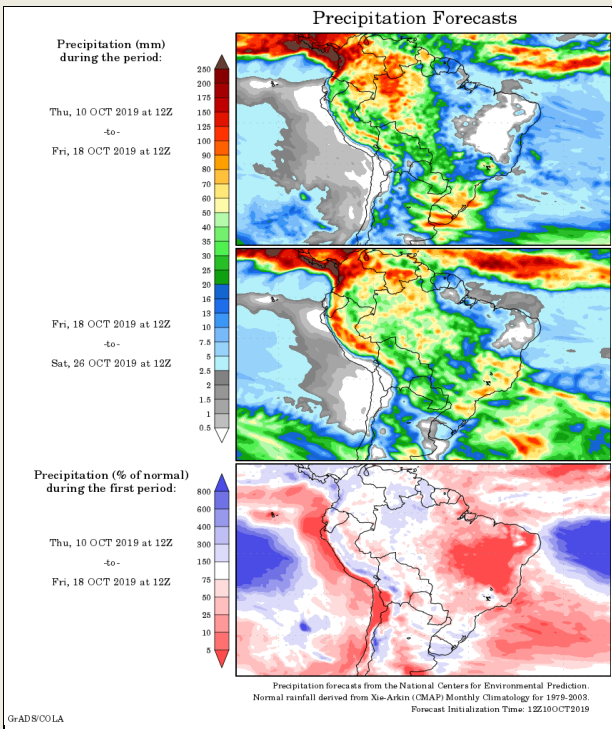
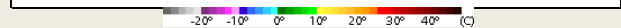
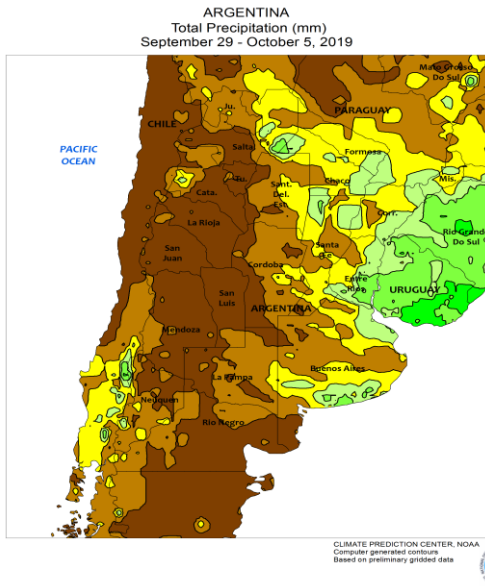
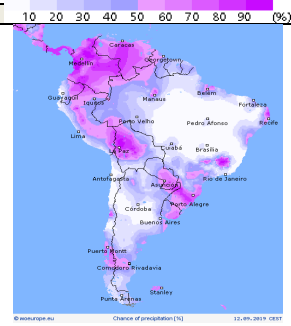
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The two-week outlook has not changed much since Wednesday and some areas will see improving conditions for planting while many other areas will not receive enough rain to improve soil moisture enough to favorably support planting and establishment of summer crops.

ARGENTINA: • Southwestern Argentina will see some rain next Thursday and enough rain may fall to at least temporarily ease stress to winter wheat with greater rain needed to induce lasting increase in soil moisture.

- o Confidence is low for this event and the period will be closely monitored.
- Occasional rounds of showers will occur Oct. 18-24 with northern areas favored for the greatest rain and most west-central and southwestern areas left in need of greater rain to improve soil moisture.

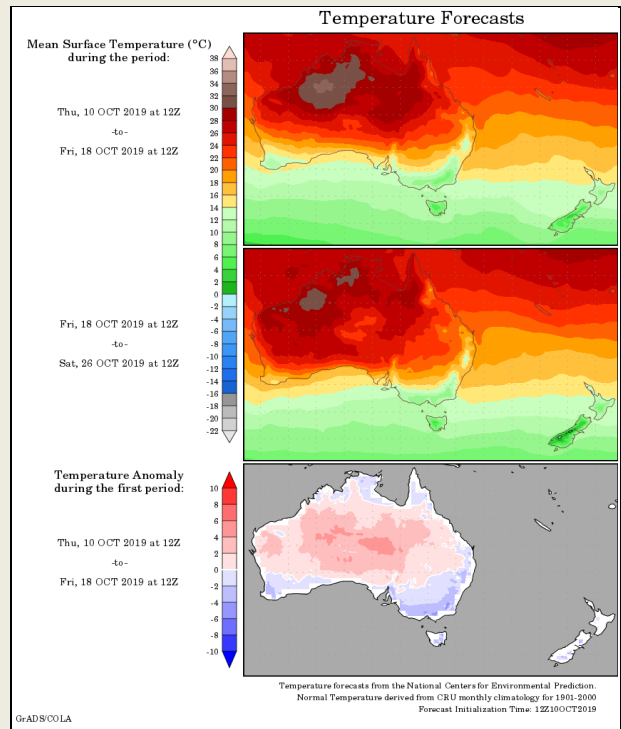
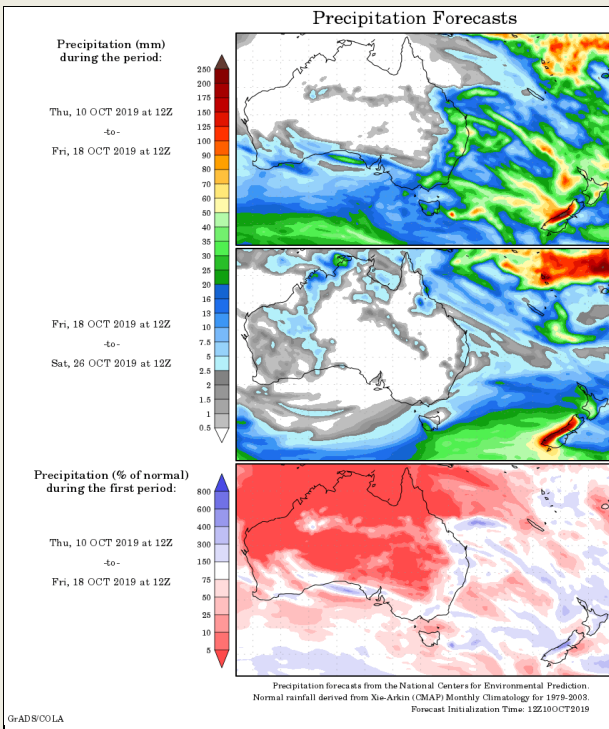
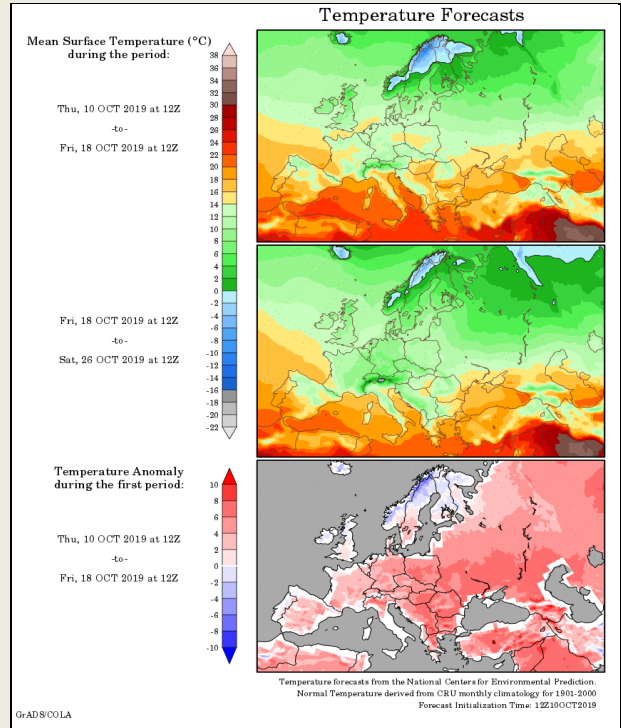
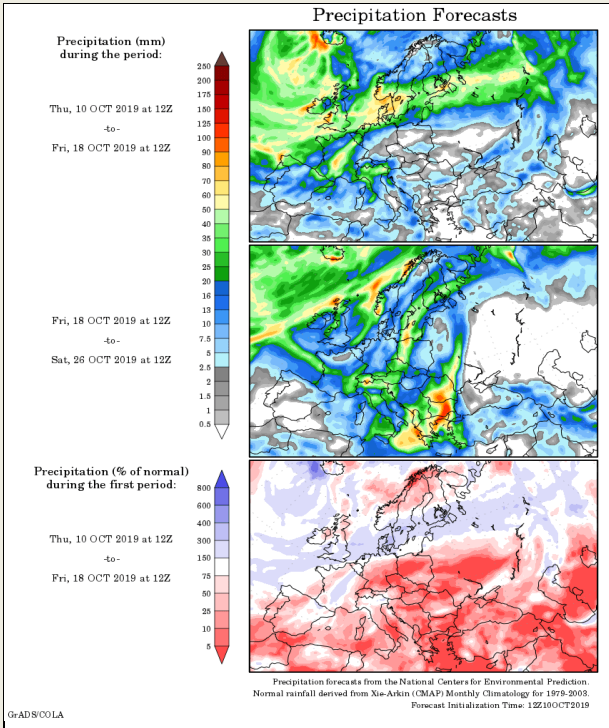


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will occur from the U.K., France through north Italy, Germany, the Czech Republic, Austria into Poland as well as Scandinavia this week. The greatest moisture will occur from parts of France and the U.K. into the Netherlands and Scandinavia where totals will range from 0.75 to 1.50 inches and local totals exceeding 2.00 inches.

AUSTRALIA: Rainfall will increase over east New South Wales and east Queensland today into Saturday. The greatest precipitation will occur Friday. However, greater rainfall will still be needed in east-central Australia and beneficial moisture will be limited to coastal areas back into parts of Darling Downs, Queensland and a few interior northeast New South Wales locations. Erratic showers will evolve prior to the greatest rainfall Thursday and linger into the weekend. Any moisture is welcome, but a greater soaking and follow up moisture will still be needed to improve long term dryness in many locations.



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
