South Africa - Weather

- Portions of Free State and neighboring areas will receive enough rain to bolster soil moisture through early next week
- o However, the precipitation will be too light to completely reverse the moisture deficits
- o Winter wheat prospects will likely improve in several areas, though additional rain is needed to completely reverse the moisture deficits
- ▣ Portions of western Free State may not receive enough rain to bring the crops out of dormancy
- Western Cape will remain dry or critically dry during the next two weeks
- o The main winter wheat areas also need a good amount of rain to support better growth prospects



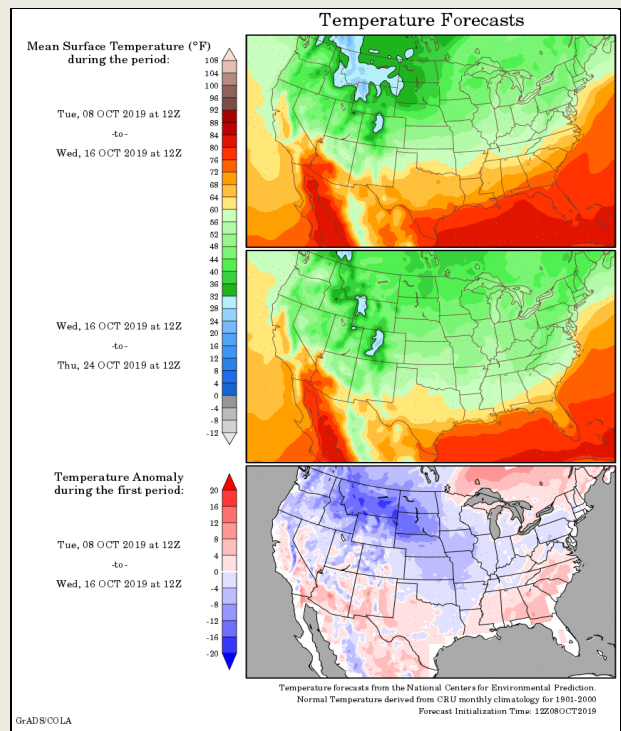
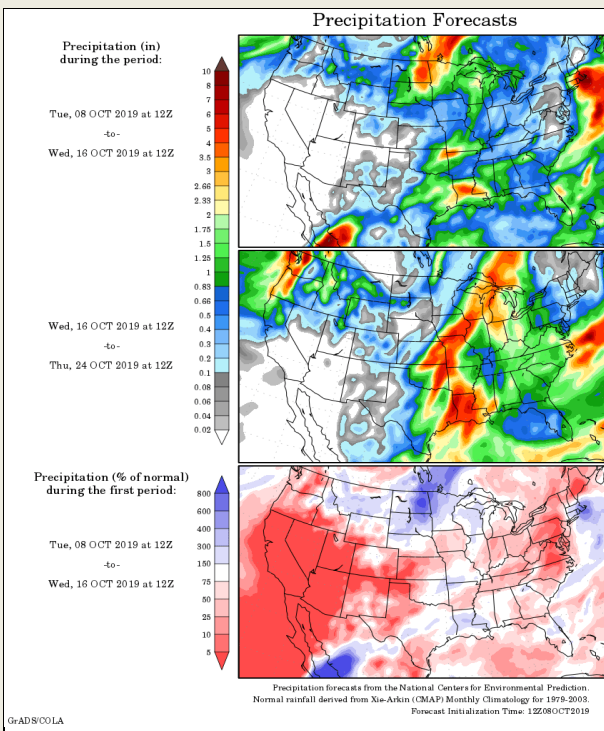
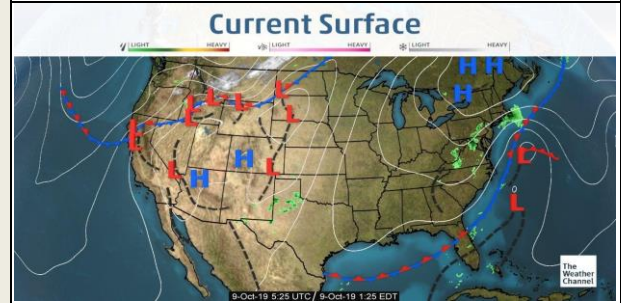
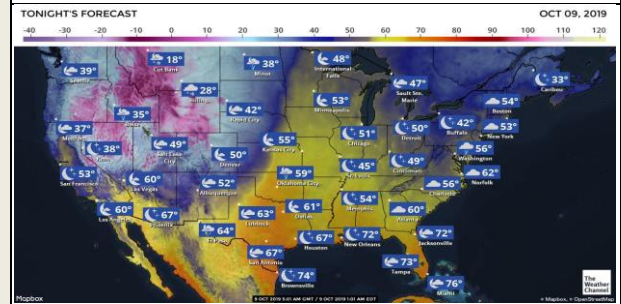
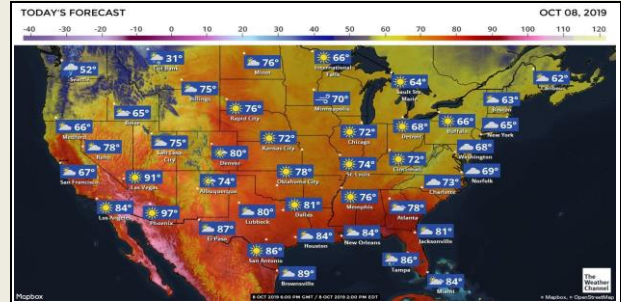
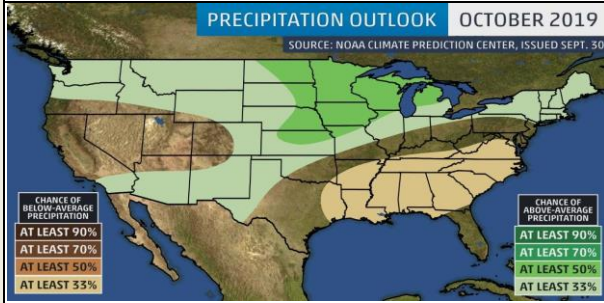
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A few more days of mild temperatures will occur before a powerful storm system late this week brings heavy snow to parts of the far northwestern Corn Belt along with frost and freezing temperatures to western, central, and northern parts of the western Corn Belt with some damage to immature corn likely to result from the cold.

o Freezes will expand from the far northwestern Corn Belt Thursday morning to most areas from the eastern Dakotas to northeastern Kansas through south-central and northern Iowa and northwestern Wisconsin by this weekend.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see mostly favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting through the next two weeks with occasional rounds of showers that should not bring enough rain to cause serious disruptions to fieldwork or cause significant quality declines to crops.

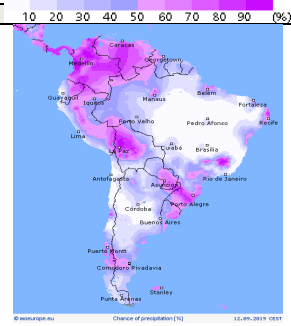


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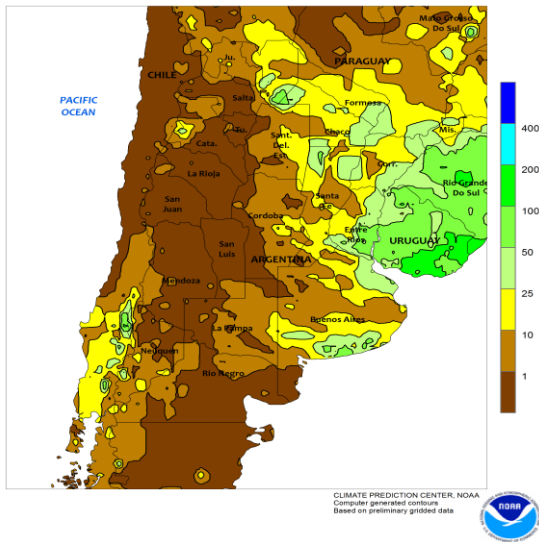
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: An overall improving trend for planting is still expected during the next week, but rain will be infrequent and light in some areas where greater rain will be needed to increase soil moisture enough to allow planting and summer crop establishment to occur.
 o The driest areas through the next week will extend from central and northern Goias to Bahia and central and northern Minas Gerais where most areas will be dry with some rain in coastal areas.

ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina will see little rain of significance through Thursday leaving many areas in need of rain to improve conditions for summer crop planting and winter wheat development.
 o Some light shower activity will occur across Argentina and the moisture will be welcome, but likely too light and poorly distributed to have much of an impact on soil conditions.



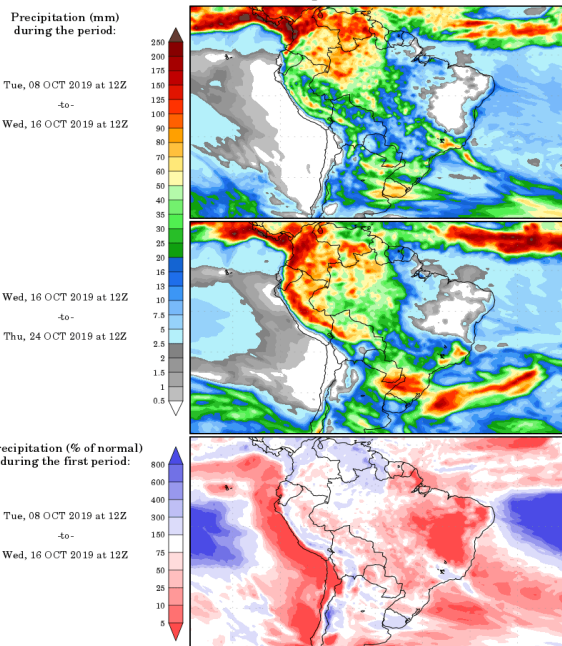
ARGENTINA

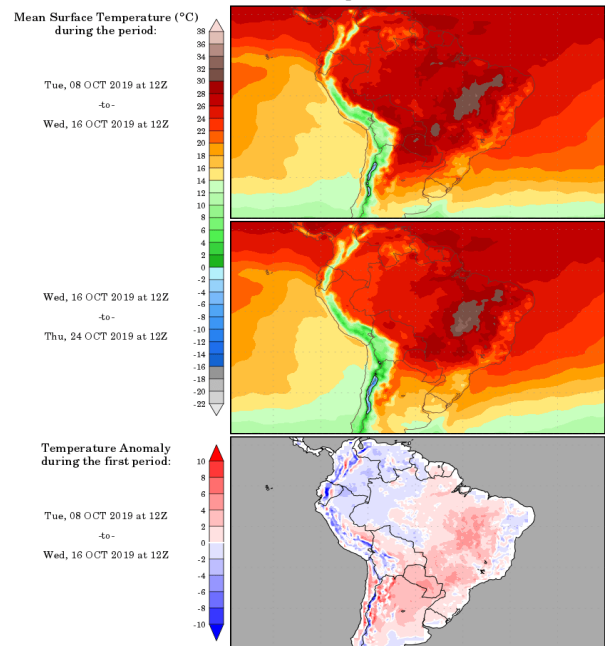
Precipitation Forecasts

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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: The drier conditions will allow for planting of winter crops to advance; however, many locations continue to experience long term dryness and a greater soaking of moisture is needed to provide the best environment for winter crop establishment. Conditions will be favorable for any unharvested summer crops.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and drought will continue over interior South Australia into interior New South Wales and interior Queensland the next ten days to two weeks. Winter crop development will remain poor and stress will continue to grow and production potentials of cotton, sorghum, corn and other crops are declining in western production areas of east Australia.



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
