Free State's winter wheat areas may receive enough rain during the next two weeks to slow or delay naturation and harvesting, most notably in the east


Minor quality reductions possible in the wettest areas as well




Planting is already behind normal due to the lack of rain in October, but most producers should have time to get the rest of the crop in the ground in the coming weeks


o Overall, summer coarse grain, oilseed, and cotton establishment and growth prospects will be

Northern Cape and western sections of Free State and North West will other remain too dry to support favorable planting and establishment Concerns for production losses will increase









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
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
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
#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: No significant changes have been made to the two-week outlook since late last week and good harvest progress should occur around the two rounds of precipitation expected. The first round of precipitation will occur Wednesday into Friday with the lower Midwest wettest and nearly all of the Midwest seeing at least some precipitation.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see good harvest progress overall through the next two weeks with some temporary interruptions for rain events Thursday into Saturda and Nov. 26-27. Each round of rain will slow fieldwork with the rain not likely heavy enough to cause more than temporary interruptions.









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#### South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain will continue daily across northern Brazil through this weekend leaving many areas with favorable soil conditions with exceptions in portions of Bahia and parts of north-central Minas Gerais while Paraguay and southern Brazil see little rain and good planting progress. Mato Grosso through Golas and western Bahia to most of Minas Gerais, Espirito Santo, and the southeastern corner of Bahia will see 1.0-2.50" of rain with local totals over 3.0" of rain through Sunday.

ARGENTINA: Another round of timely rain will occur Friday into next Monday with Sunday and Monday wettest and enough rain should fall to increase soil moisture to favorable levels at least temporarily. Early indications suggest rain will be nearly widespread rain will fall fraidy into next Monday and if another round of rain Nov. 29-Dec. 1 occurs as advertised conditions for crops should be mostly favorable.

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
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
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
# Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Moist conditions will continue to occur over Western Europe during the coming week. The moisture will impact the Iberian Peninsula through France, the U.K., into the Netherlands into south Scandinavia as wel as Italy into south Austria, Slovenia and eastern Adriatic Sea nations this week. The moisture will be greatest and most beneficial in portions of the Italian Peninsula into south Austria, Slovenia and coastal Croatia and Rossnia and flooring concerns will remain

AUSTRALIA: Another week of drying will impact most of Australia. Long term dryness concerns remain over east-central Australia and significant follow up moisture will still be needed to relieve drought and support cotton, corn, sorghum and other summer crops despite the beneficial increase in moisture earlier this month.









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
