
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Two significant storm systems will bring nearly widespread precipitation and interruptions to the Midwest this week with some Upper Midwest locations seeing enough snow that delays to fieldwork may become prolonged.


o The first storm system will occur Tuesday with areas from east-central Nebraska to east-central South Dakota through central and southeastern Minnesota and northern Wisconsin seeing 4 to 9 inches of snow and locally more.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta will see two more rounds of rain during the next week while the southeastern states see one round of rain with drier weather and an improving trend for fieldwork expected Dec. 2-9.

o The first round of rain will occur Tuesday with areas from the Delta through northern Alabama seeing 0.15-0.75" of rain and locally more.



Precipitation Forecasts





Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: The increase in moisture will impact Albania, Macedonia, south Serbia, Greece, Bulgaria

and into south Romania. The moisture will be welcome and will help improve conditions for winter crop establishment, but follow up moisture will still be needed to relieve long term dryness. AUSTRALIA: The moisture will be welcome this coming week. With that said the best rainfall will occur in areas too far east for many crops in the Great Dividing Range into coastal areas excepting a few of the easternmost production areas of cotton, corn, sorghum and other crops.
