
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
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
South Africa - Weather


Net drying through the weekend will promote unlimited fieldwork including the planting of many crops in areas where rain was sufficient for germination. Next week's weather will trend a little wetter with a daily occurrence of showers and thunderstorms that should lead to improved topsoil moisture. Most of the rain will be erratic, however, benefiting some crop areas much more than others.

Wheat harvesting will advance around the brief bouts of rainfall during the next two weeks. No serious threat of grain quality declines is expected.









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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Two significant storm systems will bring nearly widespread precipitation and interruptions fieldwork to the Midwest this week with some Upper Midwest locations seeing enough snow that delays to fieldwork may become prolonged.


o The first storm system will occur today and areas from east-central Nebraska to east-central South Dakota through central and southeastern Minnesota and northern Wisconsin will see 5 to 11 inches of snow and locally more.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta will see two more rounds of rain during the next week while the southeastern states see one round of rain with drier weather and an improving trend for fieldwork expected Monday through Dec. 10.

o The first round of rain will occur today with areas from the Delta through northern Alabama seeing 0.15-0.50" of rain and locally more.









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
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
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South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks, including some of the driest areas in northeast, and as long as rain falls as advertised nearly all of Brazil and Paraguay will be left with favorable soil conditions. O The driest area from western Bahia into northern Minas Gerais will see an increase in rain starting Friday while centra into most of eastern Bahia will miss out on significant rain during the next two weeks and unirrigated crops should see poor conditions for development. ARGENTINA: Argentina will see a drier weather pattern through the next two weeks that will allow for



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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: The increase in moisture will impact Albania, Macedonia, south Serbia, Greece, Bulgari


and into south Romania. The moisture will be welcome and will help improve conditions for winter crop establishment, but follow up moisture will still be needed to relieve long term dryness.

AUSTRALIA: The moisture will be welcome this coming week. With that said the best rainfall will occur in areas too far east for many crops in the Great Dividing Range into coastal areas excepting a few of the easternmost production areas of cotton, corn, sorghum and other crops.









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
