





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
South Africa - Weather

 Portions of Western Cape will be too dry to support ideal late season winter wheat growth o Maturation and harvesting will continue with few disruptions in the coming weeks o Minor quality reductions possible this year due to dryness over the growing season
Free State's winter wheat areas do not have a pressing need for moisture
Crops are generally maturing or ready for harvest, though some of the later planted crops may still be growing o Maturation and harvesting will likely be sluggish in the eastern half of the region during the next two weeks @ Minor quality reductions possible in the wettest areas @ Western Free State harvesting will advance with few disruptions
The moisture profile will slowly improve for the eastern half of South Africa during the next two

I he moisture profile will slowly improve for the eastern half of South Africa during the next two weeks o Planting and establishment conditions for summer crops will gradually improve o However, many areas will not receive enough rain to completely fix the moisture deficits o Timely rain will still be needed later in November to maintain good summer coarse grain, oilseed, and cotton prospects Northern Cape and western sections of Free State and North West will need to see better rainfall later this month to support better planting and establishment







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United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The two-week outlook for the Midwest has not changed much since late last week and steadily improving conditions for crop maturation and harvesting will occur as precipitation will be infrequent and mostly light.


o Conditions for fieldwork will be slow to improve in the wettest areas as colder than normal temperatures will remain in place most often and drying rates will be slowed.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast are still expected to see a mostly restricted

precipitation pattern during the next two weeks and conditions for crop maturation and harvesting will continue to improve.

o Dry weather will be most common with a few light showers on occasion and the only round of organized precipitation during the next week will occur Wednesday night into Friday.

Mon, 04 NOV 2019 at 12Z



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
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Some improving moisture conditions in recent weeks has already begun to induce good wheat, barley and rapeseed stands, but additional moisture during the next couple of weeks should only continue to improve conditions. Increased moisture will continue over western Europe the next couple of weeks. Frequent rounds of precipitation will continue over northern portions of the Iberian Peninsula, France and the U.K. into Italy, western Germany into south Scandinavia this week.

AUSTRALIA: Mostly dry weather will return to east Australia this coming week providing favorable conditions for fieldwork and planting after the recent rain. o The only exception in east-central Australia will be a few lingering showers in eastern Queensland and northeast New South Wales early this week.





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
