South Africa - Weather

The eastern half of South Africa will generally receive enough rain in coming weeks to keep soil moisture near current levels

- o Minor improvements to topsoil moisture will be possible in the areas that receive the most rain
- o Crop development conditions will be generally favorable for Natal and Mpumalanga due to the rain and adequate soil moisture
- o Portions of Limpopo will continue to struggle with dryness at times
- o The periods of rain will be unable to completely reverse the moisture deficits
- o Crop development conditions will be mostly favorable, though growth may be slowed in the driest areas

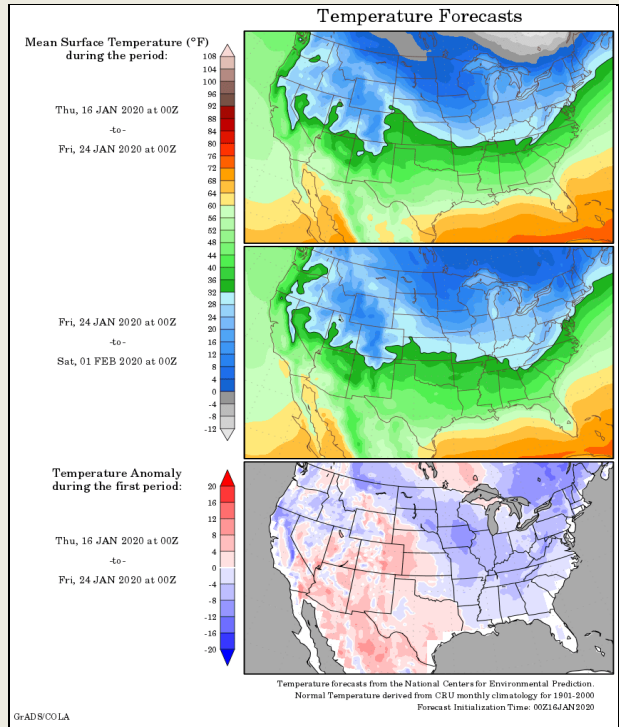
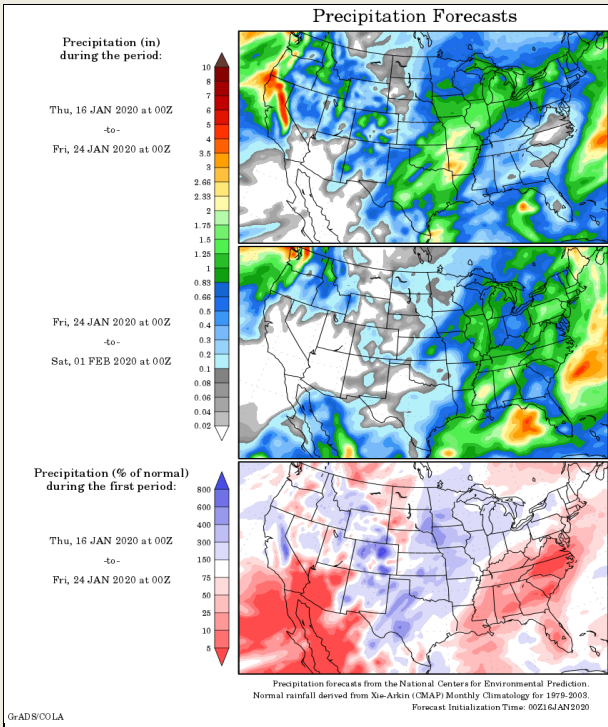
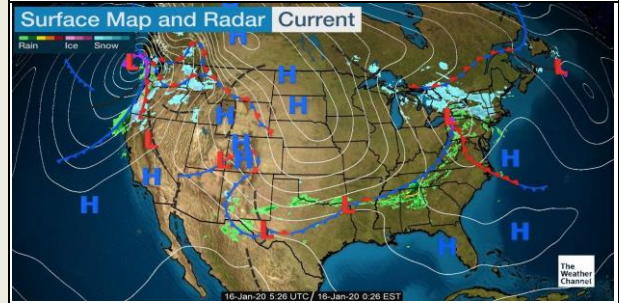
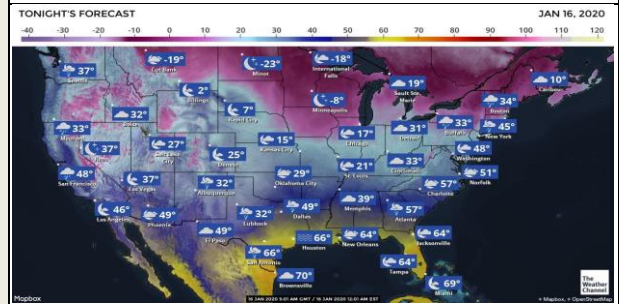
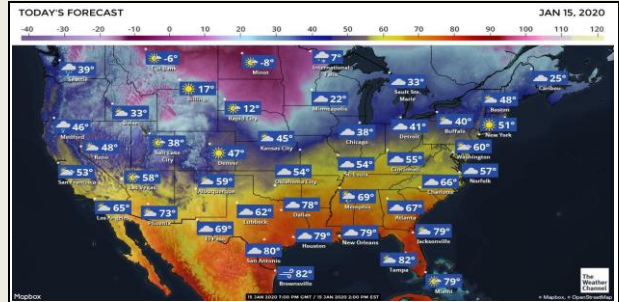
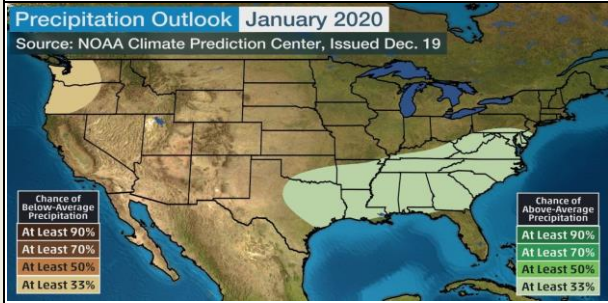


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Another strong storm system will move across the Midwest Thursday night into Saturday bringing enough rain to cause increase flooding in the lower and eastern Midwest before a welcome period of drier weather occurs Sunday into Jan. 28 allowing flood conditions to improve. Little significant precipitation is expected Sunday through Jan. 29 and flood conditions will steadily improve.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Heavy rain and some flooding occurred from the southern Delta into southern Alabama Tuesday with a large part of the remainder of the southeastern states seeing light to moderate rain. The Delta and the Southeast will see additional rounds of showers and thunderstorms today, Friday, and Saturday and flooding will increase in some areas from the Delta into Georgia and northern Florida with the rain not likely heavy enough to cause widespread increases in flooding.

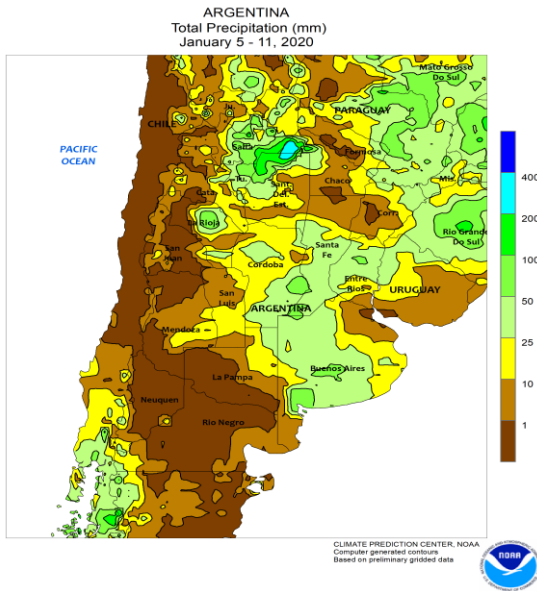


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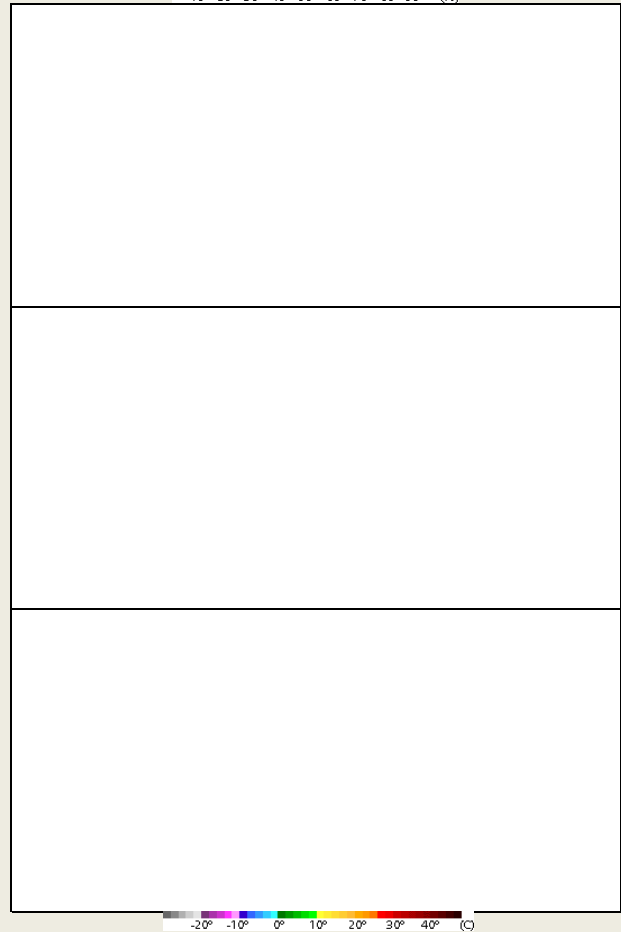
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Much of Brazil was dry Tuesday with a few northern and southern areas seeing mostly light rain. Rio Grande do Sul will see another beneficial increase in rain today into Thursday and enough rain is expected to keep the soil moist enough to support the needs of crops during a period of drier weather Friday through Jan. 29. Showers and thunderstorms will be infrequent and light through Sunday from central to eastern Bahia, northeastern Minas Gerais, and Espirito Santo before a needed increase in rain occurs Monday through the following weekend.

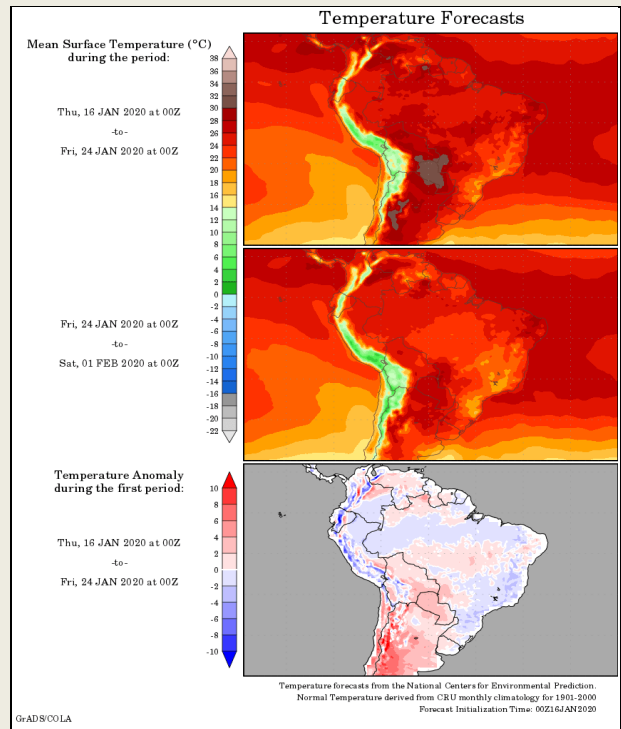
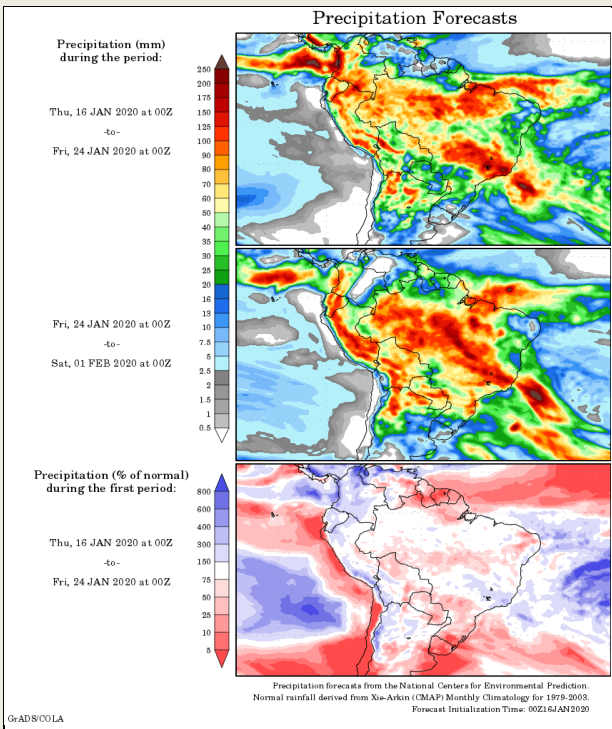
ARGENTINA: Another round of beneficial rain fell on portions of southern and central Argentina Tuesday. Additional rain through Thursday in central and northern Argentina should leave nearly all of the country with favorable soil conditions before southeastern Argentina sees at least a week of drying that may cause rising levels of crop stress in parts of central and southern Buenos Aires. Another timely round of rain will occur Jan. 23-24 and rain will be important in parts of southeastern Argentina that missed out on significant rain this week.

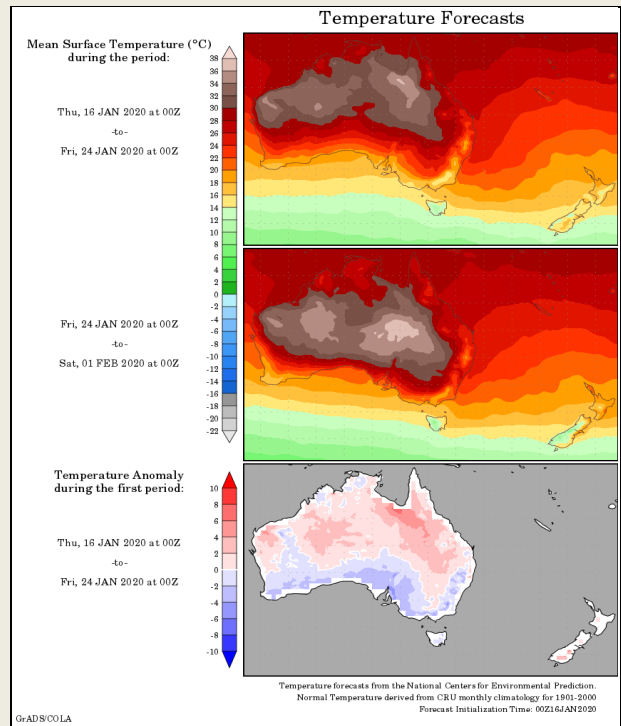
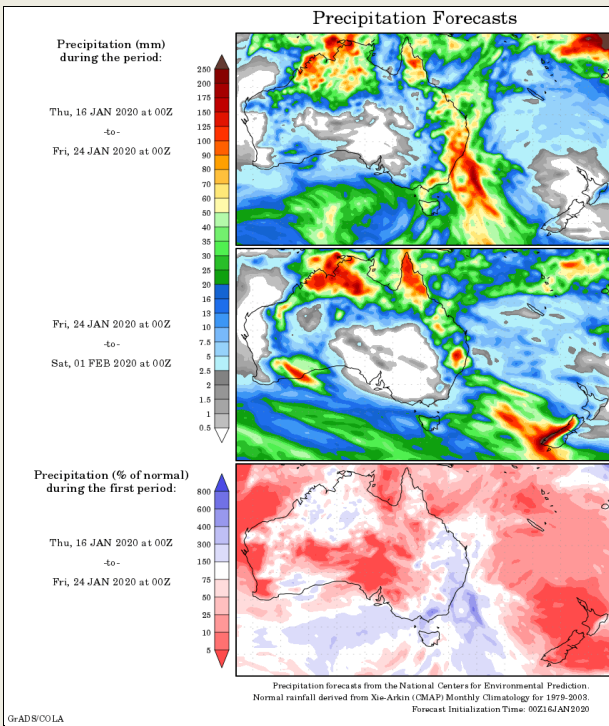
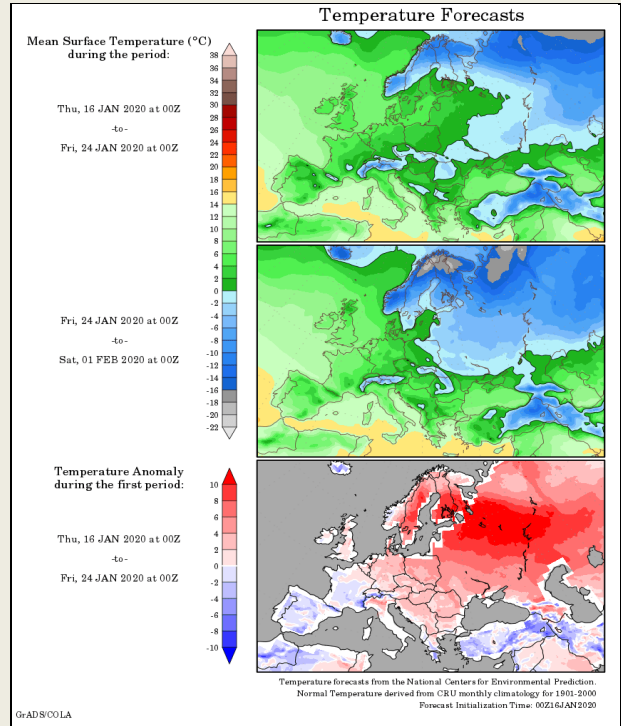
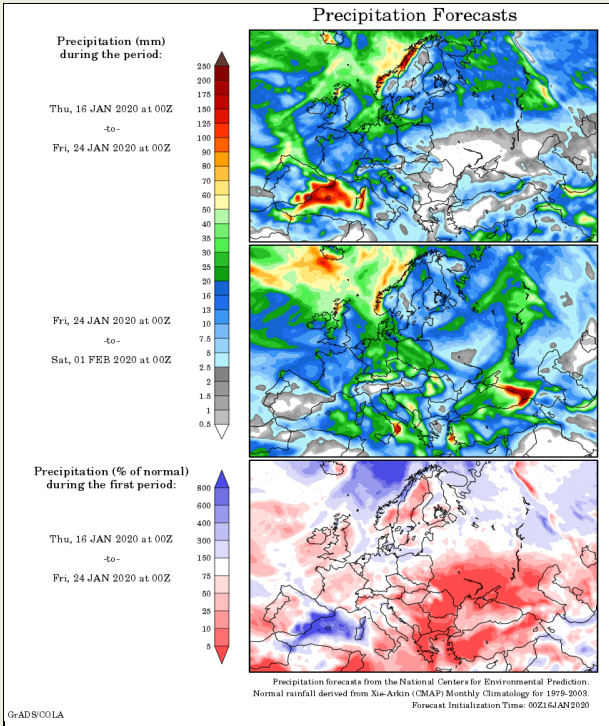


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Drier than usual conditions will prevail over Eastern Europe this week. Minimal to no moisture will occur from northeast Germany and Poland through Slovakia, Hungary and the Balkan Nations. Rounds of precipitation will continue over the northwest portion of the Iberian Peninsula and northwest France and the south U.K. through south Scandinavia this week.

AUSTRALIA: Showers and thunderstorms will increase this coming week. Widespread moisture will benefit very dry areas and help put down some of the fires burning out of control in eastern portions of Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland. The moisture will moisten topsoil, but will not end drought and crops and soil will still need much more follow up rain. With that said interior western portions of Queensland, New South Wales and northwest Victoria will receive more erratic rainfall and pockets of drying will remain in the topsoil.



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
