

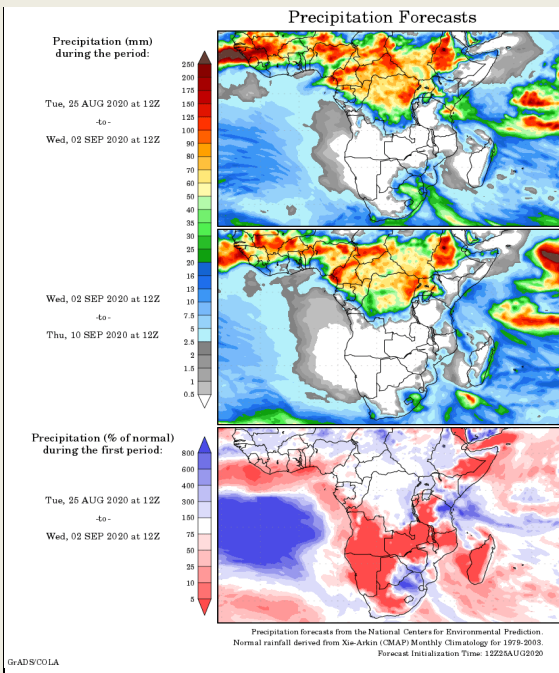
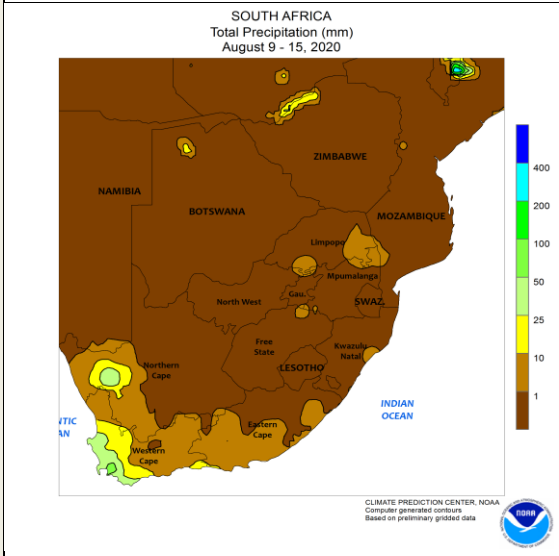


Weather Report

26 August 2020

South Africa - Weather

- Western South Africa will also have opportunities for rain during the next two weeks
- o Precipitation during the coming week will generally be restricted to portions of Western Cape
- o Rainfall will be too light to impact long-term soil conditions, though minor improvements will be possible in southwestern Western Cape
- o Little to no rain is expected in the remaining areas this week
- Western Cape will generally receive enough rain to keep soil moisture near current levels during the next two weeks
- o There will be enough rain and soil moisture to maintain a good environment for winter wheat development
- o The small amount of rain-fed winter wheat in Free State and neighboring areas will be too dry to support aggressive growth in the next two weeks
- o Significant rain is needed to improve the moisture profile and support a better environment for the crops
- o Irrigated crops will develop under more favorable conditions in Free State, Northern Cape, and neighboring areas, though most locations would still welcome a good shot of rain

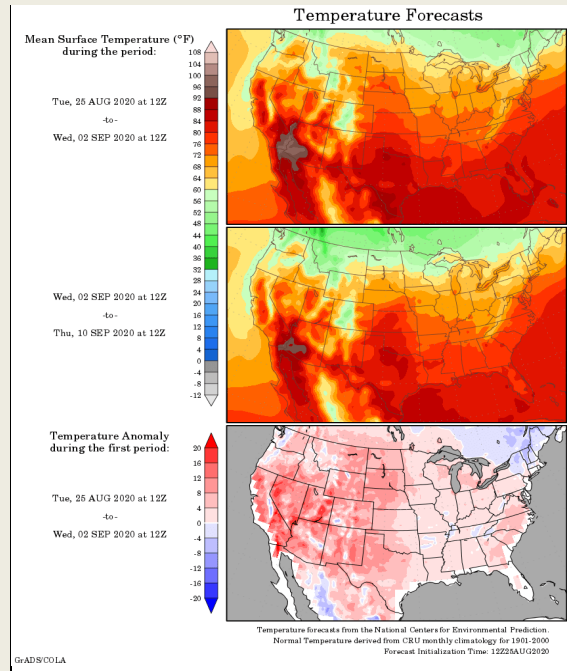
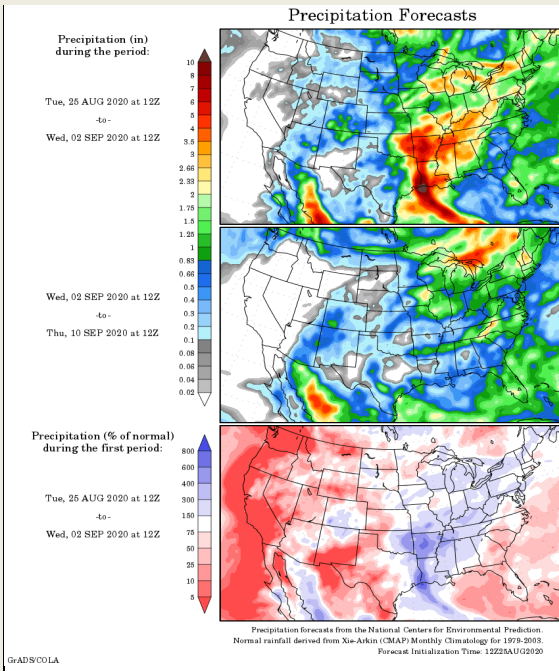
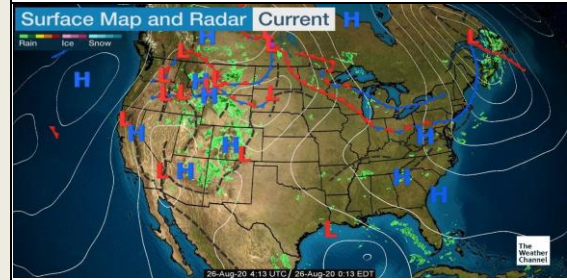
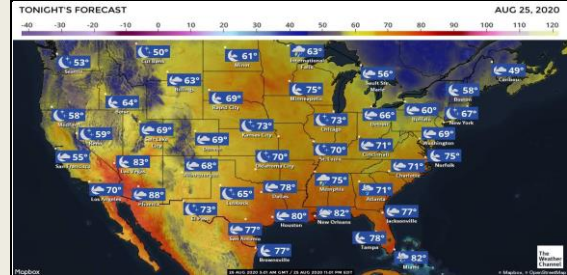
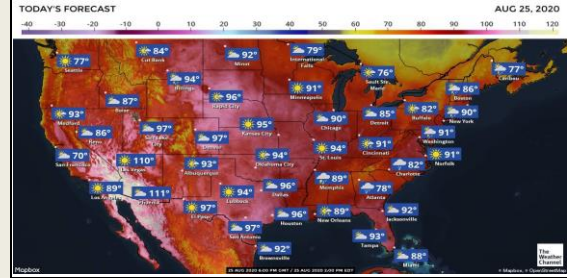
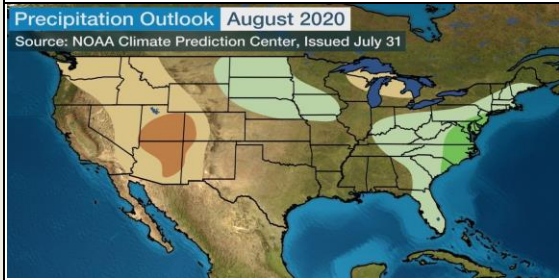


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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A few beneficial, but light, showers will occur in the east today into Wednesday before a welcome increase in rain occurs across a large part of the Midwest Thursday into Saturday bringing relief from dryness and inducing improvements in soybean yield potentials in the driest areas of the eastern Corn Belt. Meanwhile, southeastern South Dakota to eastern Kansas to much of western, central, and southern Iowa will miss out on significant rain through Saturday and the drier parts of that region will see further declines in soybean yields with the crop running out of time for rain and improvements in yields before it reaches maturity. This region will see an increase in rain Sunday into Monday that will allow soybeans to finish out the growing season favorably in the wetter areas while areas from southeastern South Dakota and eastern Nebraska into central Iowa likely see some benefit and improved yields.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Most of Laura's impact on the Delta will be delays to harvesting and improvements in soil moisture for late-developing crops that should induce some improvements in yield potentials, but the rain will come too late for a full restoration of yields.

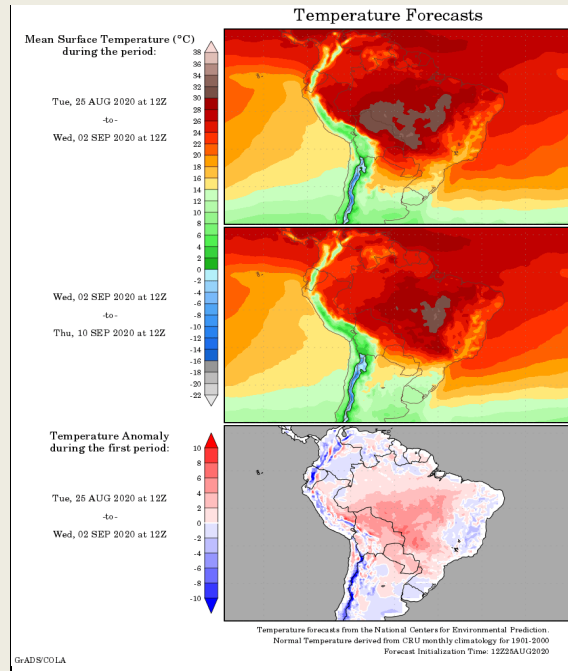
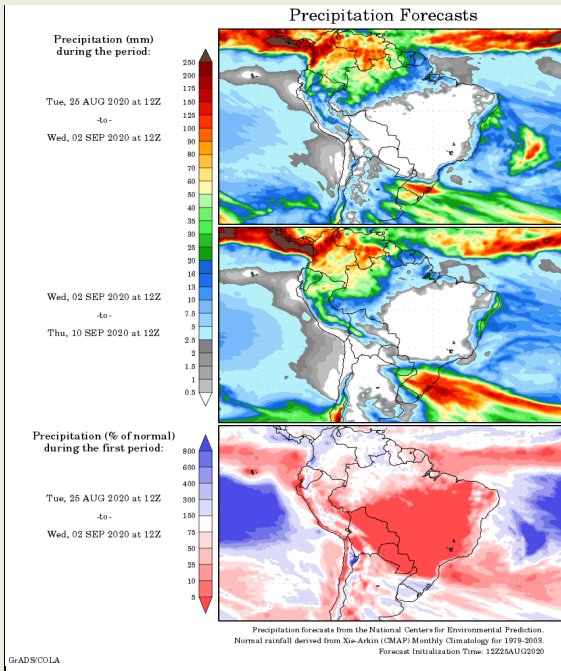
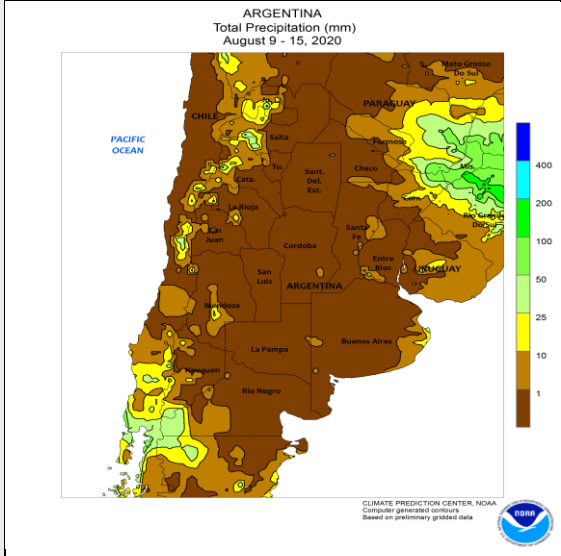


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Frost and freezing temperatures will impact portions of Rio Grande do Sul, Santa Catarina, and southern Parana Friday and Saturday mornings and winter wheat may be damaged in a few areas while some early planted corn may also be negatively impacted with major losses not likely for either crop. Showers and thunderstorms will continue in a part of Paraguay and portions of southern Brazil through Friday causing interruptions to fieldwork while inducing further increases in soil moisture that will be beneficial for corn planting, once the soil dries down enough for fieldwork to occur.

ARGENTINA: Several more days of dry weather will occur across Argentina before a welcome increase in rain occurs Tuesday into next Thursday in a large part of the country with the rain beneficial for winter wheat as well as for the coming summer crop planting season. Little additional rain of significance is expected during the next two weeks and without follow-up rain most of the moisture from rain next week will quickly be lost to evaporation.



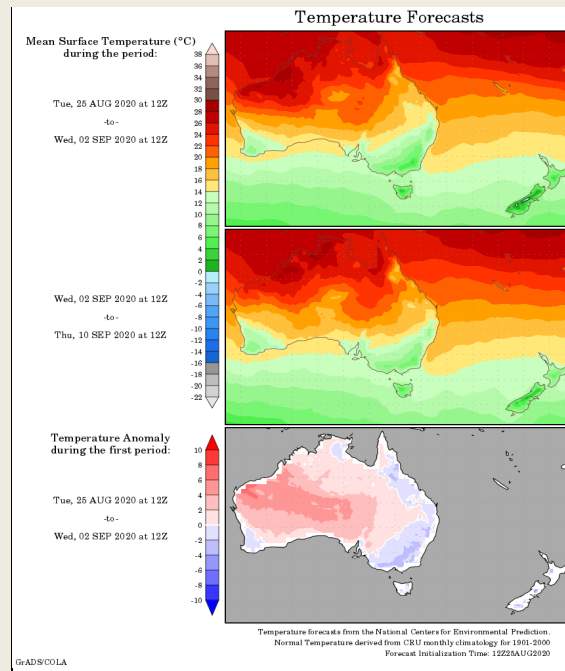
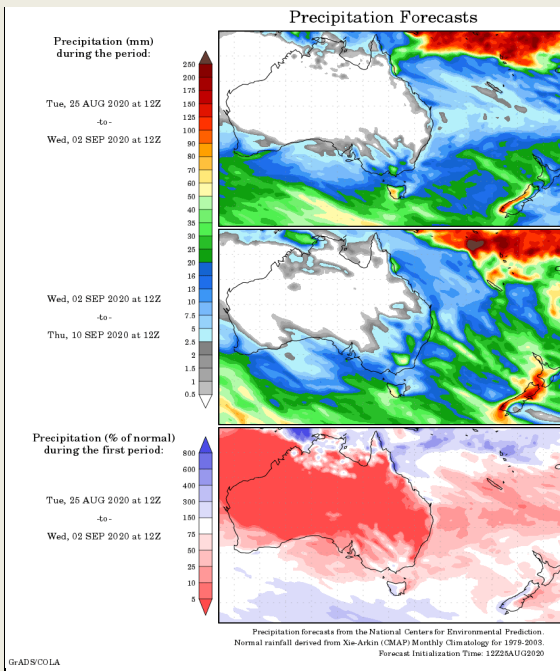
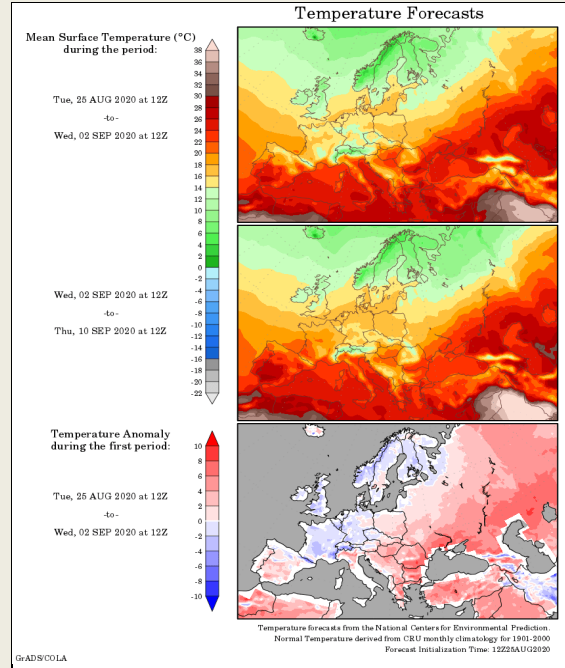
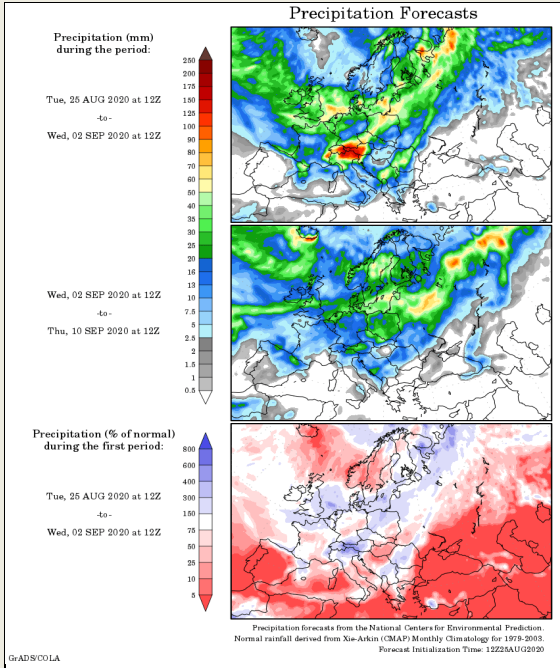
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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Periodic rounds of rain will occur throughout Europe this week. With that said, rainfall in central to southern France, the Iberian Peninsula, southern Italy as well as Greece into eastern Bulgaria and southeastern Romania will be brief and erratic. Net drying will occur in each of these areas and crop moisture stress will continue until greater rain occurs.

AUSTRALIA: Precipitation will be greatest over Victoria during the coming week. Most other locations will remain dry. Rain is needed in Queensland immediately to support reproduction that is expected to begin in early September, but no such rain will occur for at least the next week to ten days.

o Moisture totals will be greatest in coastal areas into the Great Dividing Range in Victoria where amounts will exceed 0.75 inch. Otherwise, moisture totals will be no more than 0.45 inch in the remainder of Victoria by this time next week.



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
