
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
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
South Africa - Weather

Western Cape will still have plenty of moisture to maintain aggressive winter wheat growth during the next two weeks despite the drying trend o Yields are expected to be good this year due to timely rain over the growing season o The small amount of rain-fed winter wheat in Free State and neighboring areas will be too dry to support aggressive growth in the next two weeks ② Irrigated crops will develop under more favorable conditions in Free State, Northern Cape, and neighboring areas

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United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: Showers and thunderstorms will continue through Saturday bringing rain to nearly all of the Midwest at one time or another including additional rain in the driest areas from eastern Nebraska into lowa where further improvements in drought conditions will occur before a drier weather pattern occurs Sunday through Sep. 23 allowing crop maturation and harvesting to accelerate.




DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta will see favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting most often through the next two weeks as dry conditions will be most common while the Southeast sees daily rounds of showers through next Wednesday and fieldwork will be slowed before rain becomes less frequent Sep. 17-23.


O Outside of a few light and mostly insignificant showers, the Delta will be mostly dry through Friday

o Outside of a few light and mostly insignificant showers, the Delta will be mostly dry through Fridar before isolated to scattered and mostly light showers occur Saturday through Tuesday and cause minor interruptions to fieldwork with the southern Delta seeing most of the rain.

BRAZIL: Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur in Rio Grande do Sul through
