

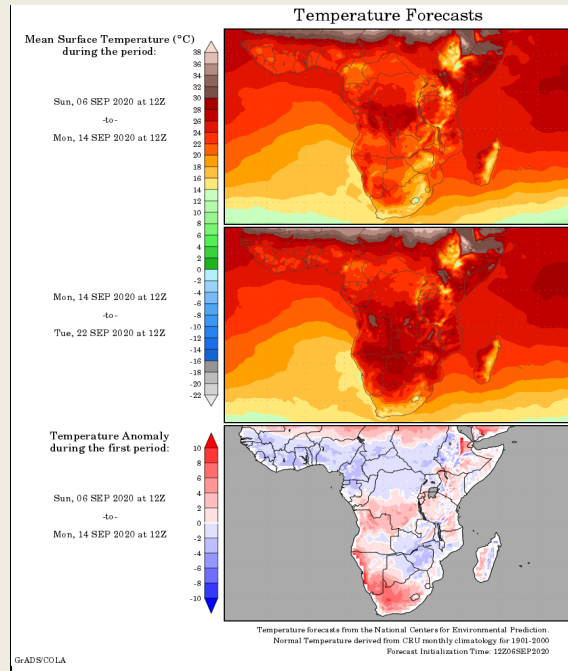
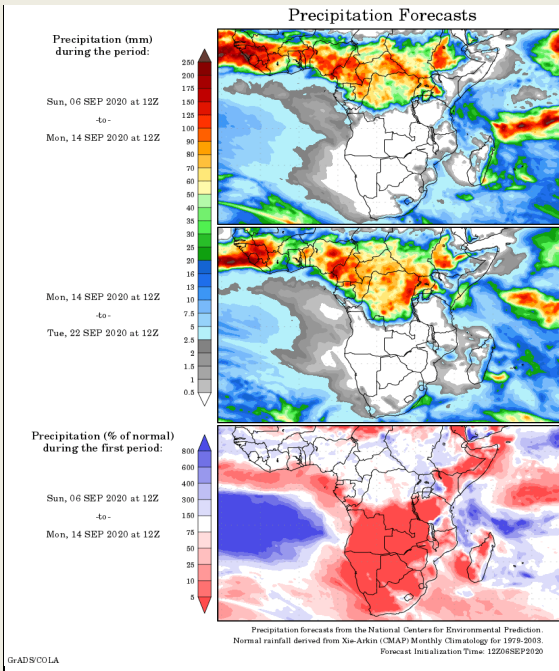
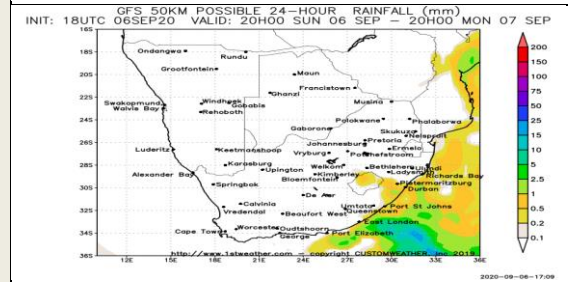
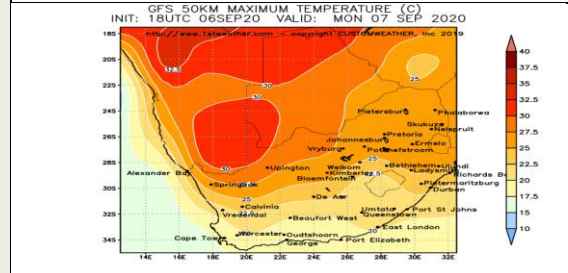
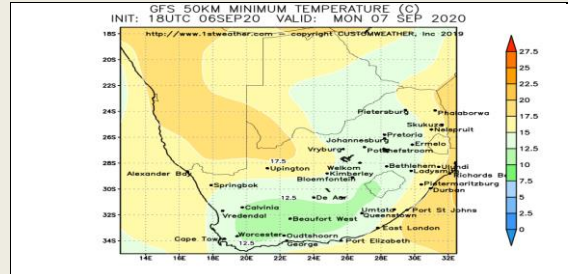
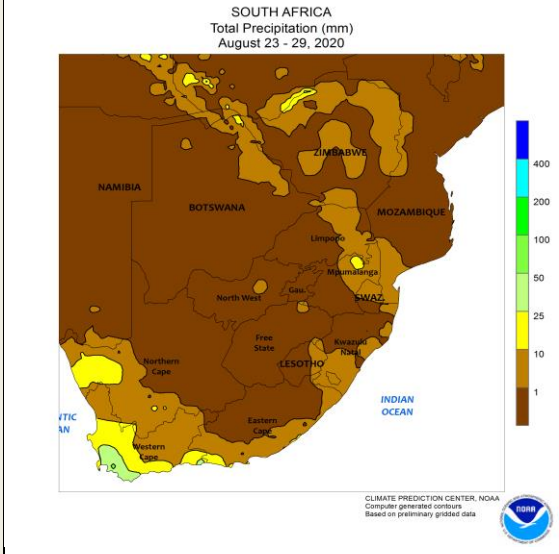


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

- Although the rain will be lost to evaporation, winter wheat conditions will remain favorable for much of Western Cape
- Yields are expected to be good this year due to timely rain over the growing season
- The small amount of rain-fed winter wheat in Free State and neighboring areas will be too dry to support aggressive growth in the next two weeks
- Irrigated crops will develop under more favorable conditions in Free State, Northern Cape, and neighboring areas

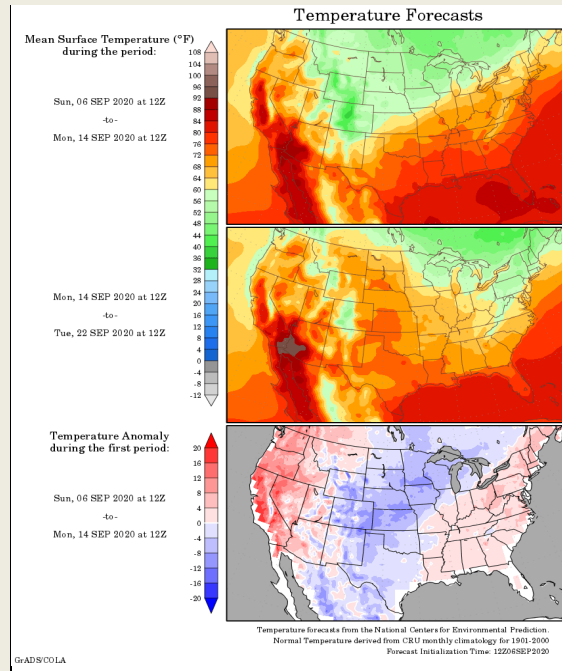
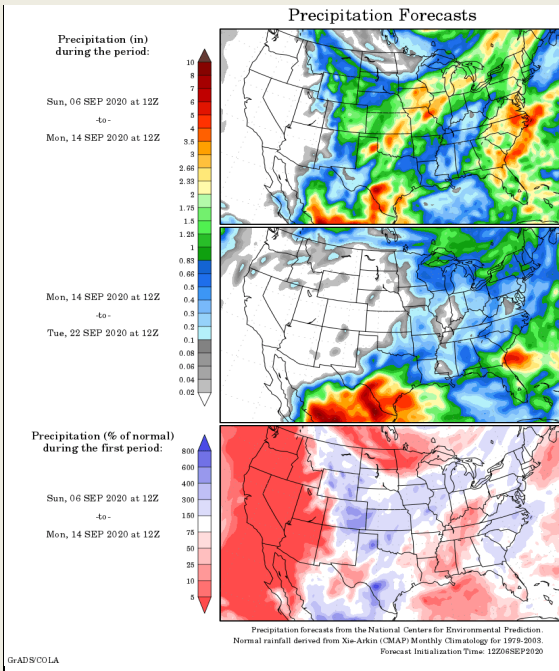
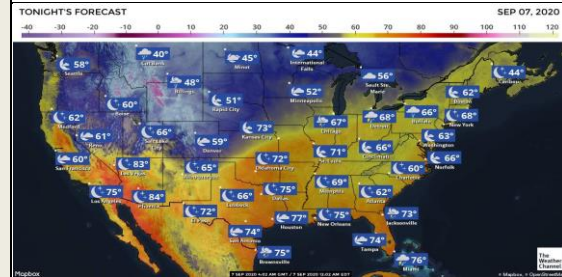
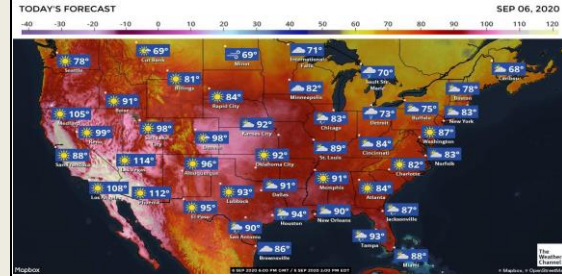
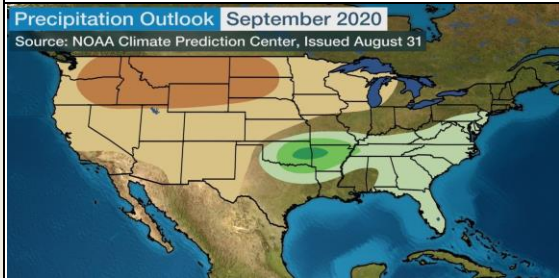

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Two more days of dry weather will occur in much of the Midwest before a wetter weather pattern occurs Saturday through next week in most areas outside of the northwest with the rain beneficial for late soybean development in the wetter areas while the rain will come too late to induce improvements in crop yields in the drier areas from southeastern South Dakota and eastern Nebraska into Iowa. Temperatures will become much cooler than usual next week and a close watch will be made on areas from the eastern Dakotas into Minnesota where there will likely be some frost and possibly a few light freezes.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: D:The Delta will see an overall improving trend for crop maturation and fieldwork through the next two weeks as dry conditions will be most common while the Southeast sees little rain through Monday before rain increases Tuesday into Thursday and an isolated to scattered shower pattern occurs Sep. 11-18. Rain will increase in the Delta and the Southeast Tuesday into Thursday and the moisture will be beneficial for late crop development in some areas after the warm temperatures and drying that precedes it.



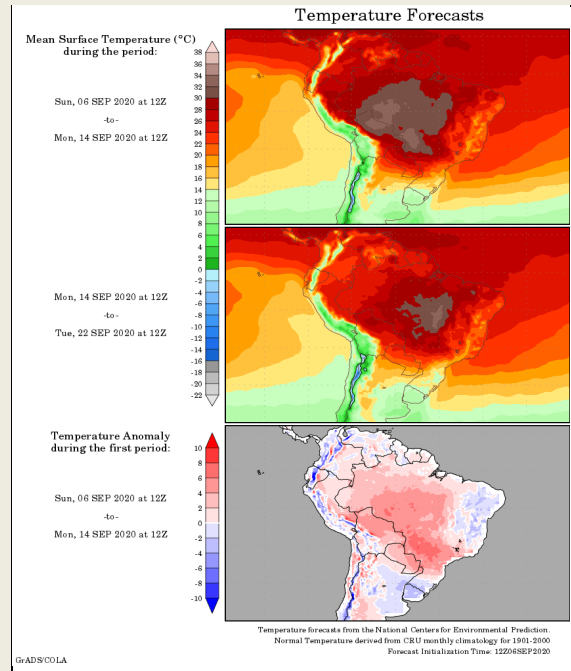
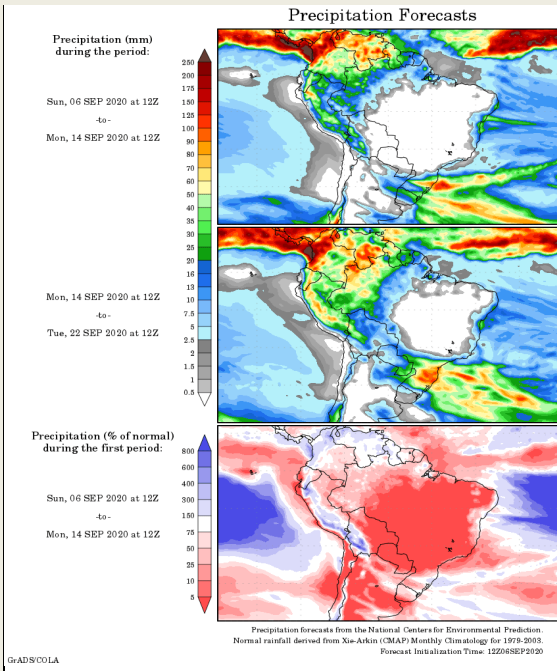
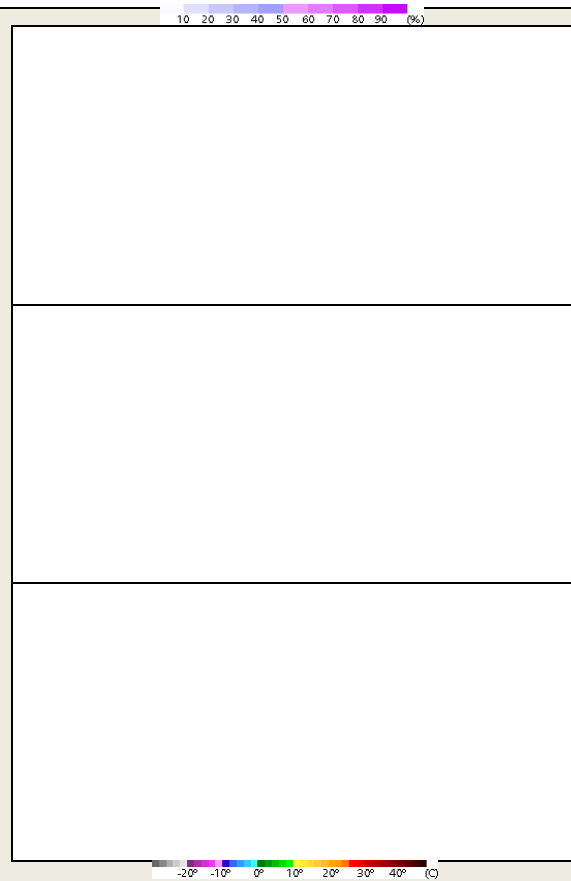
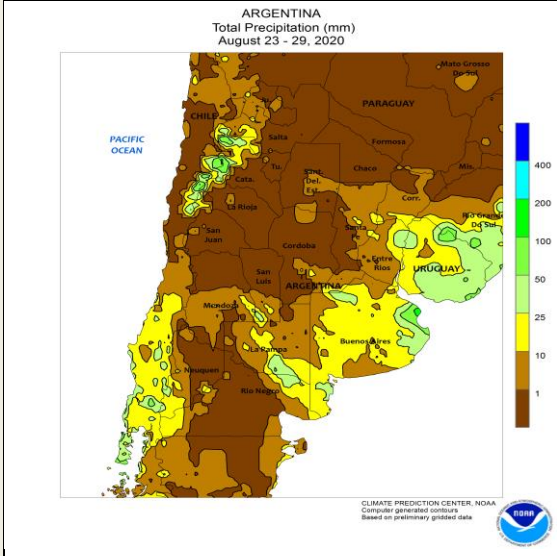

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: A restricted rainfall pattern will continue in much of Brazil and Paraguay through the next two weeks and fieldwork should advance well with a notable exception in far southern Brazil where frequent rain will fall through Wednesday and concerns over wet weather diseases in winter wheat may increase.

ARGENTINA: Little rain is expected through the next two weeks and most of the moisture from rain earlier this week in western Argentina will quickly be lost to evaporation.

- o A few showers will occur on occasion with southern and northeastern Argentina favored for most of the rain.
- o Southern San Luis into central and east-central La Pampa will see an increase in rain Saturday and most of the region will receive 0.05-0.60" and locally more.



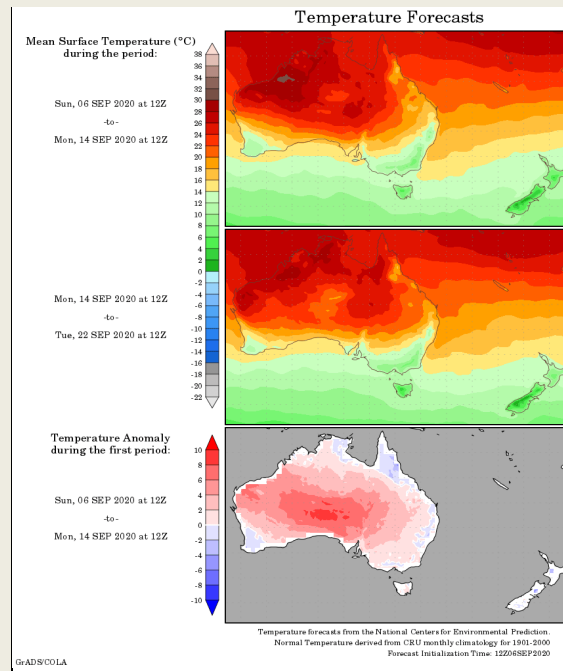
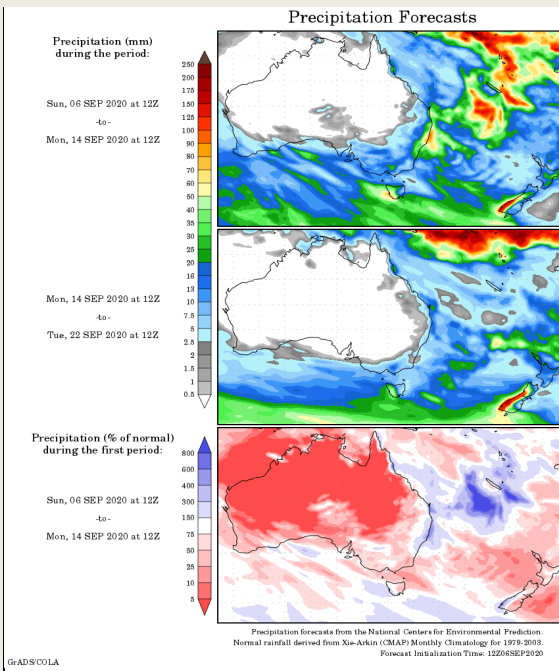
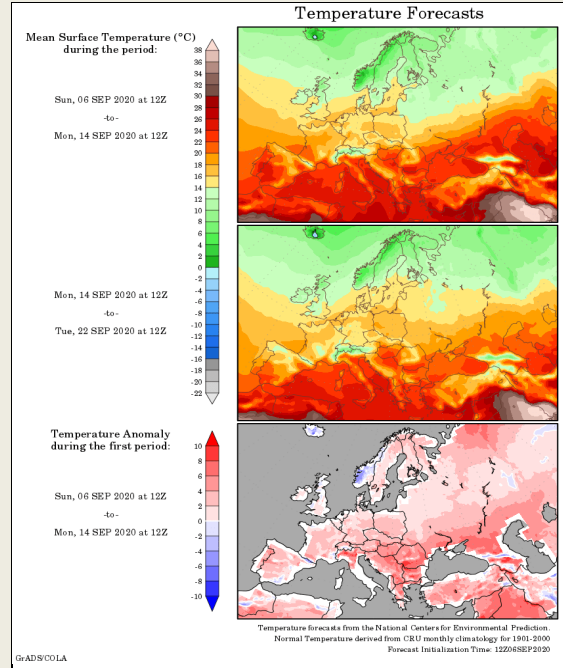
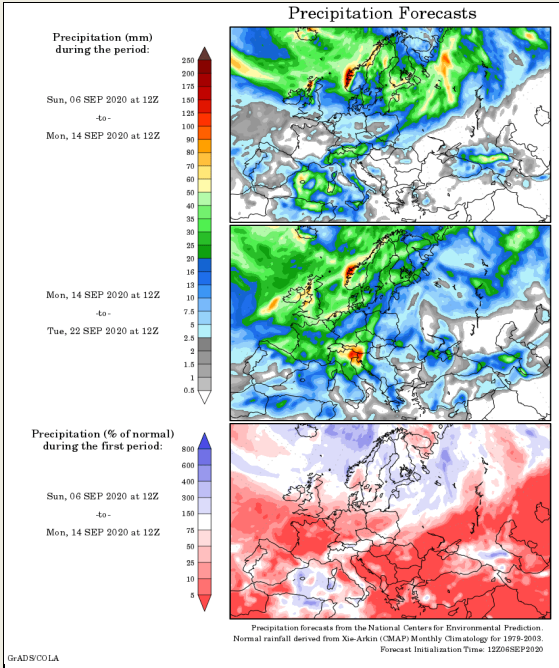

EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will occur from the northern U.K. and the North Sea Region through the Netherlands, northern Germany, southern Scandinavia into the Baltic Sea Region and northern Poland this week.

o Precipitation will linger over the Alps Region the remainder of this week as well.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation will prevail over Australia the coming ten days to two weeks. Rain is needed in Queensland immediately to support reproduction that should be starting, but any rain will be confined to southeastern portions of the state and will be erratic and light.
