

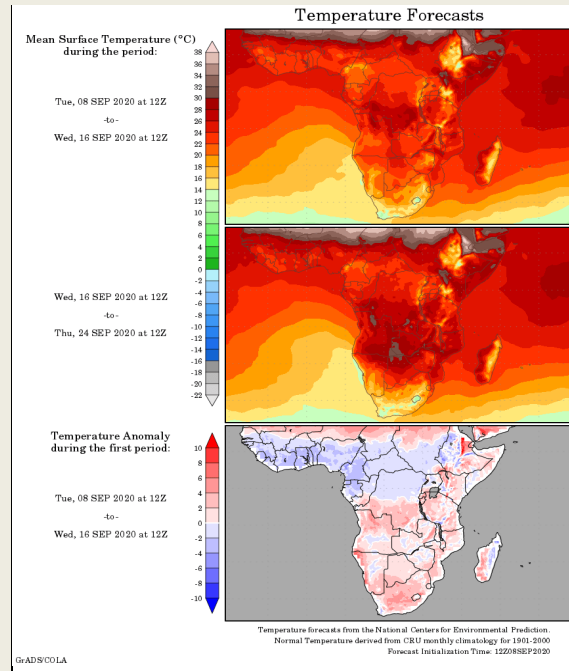
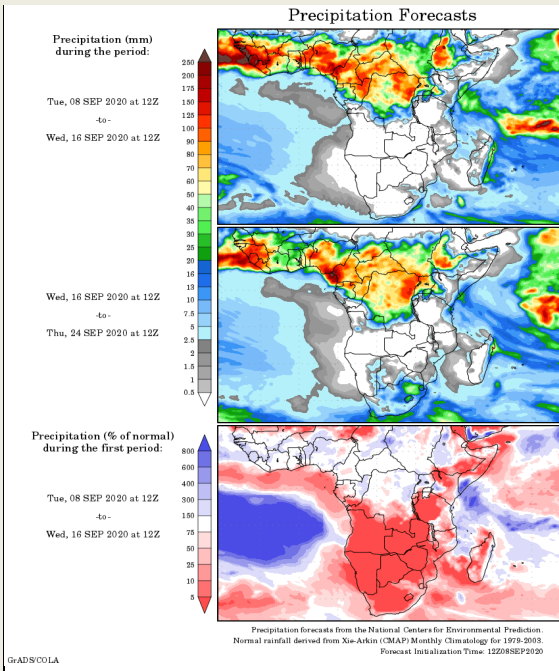
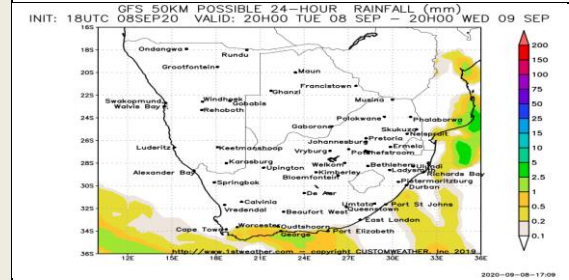
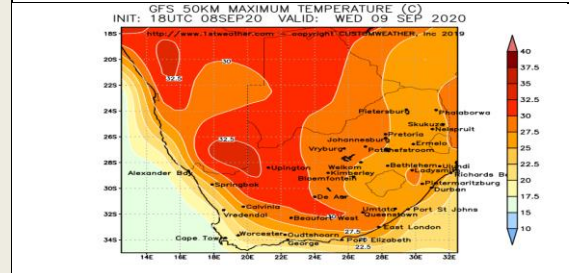
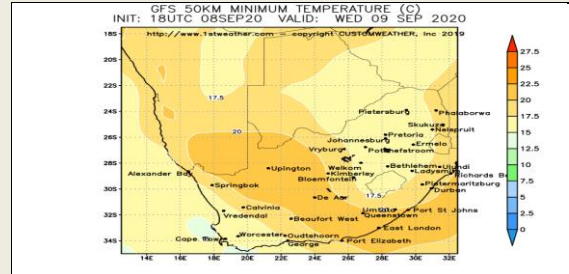
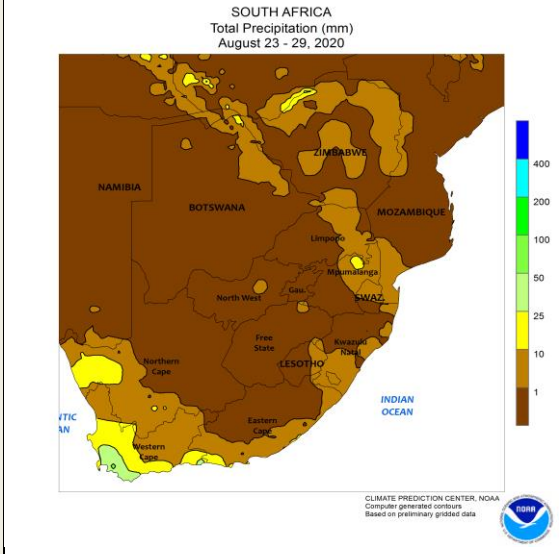


Weather Report

09 September 2020

South Africa - Weather

- Eastern South Africa will generally be drier biased during the coming week
- o Brief periods of light rain will occur, though any rain that does occur will be rapidly lost to evaporation
- o Soil moisture will remain short to critically short
- o Significant rain is needed to reverse the moisture deficits
- Western South Africa will also be drier biased through early next week
- o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation
- Western Cape will still have plenty of moisture to maintain aggressive winter wheat growth during the next two weeks despite the drying trend
- o Yields are expected to be good this year due to timely rain over the growing season
- o The small amount of rain-fed winter wheat in Free State and neighboring areas will be too dry to support aggressive growth in the next two weeks
- o Irrigated crops will develop under more favorable conditions in Free State, Northern Cape, and neighboring areas



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United States of America - Weather

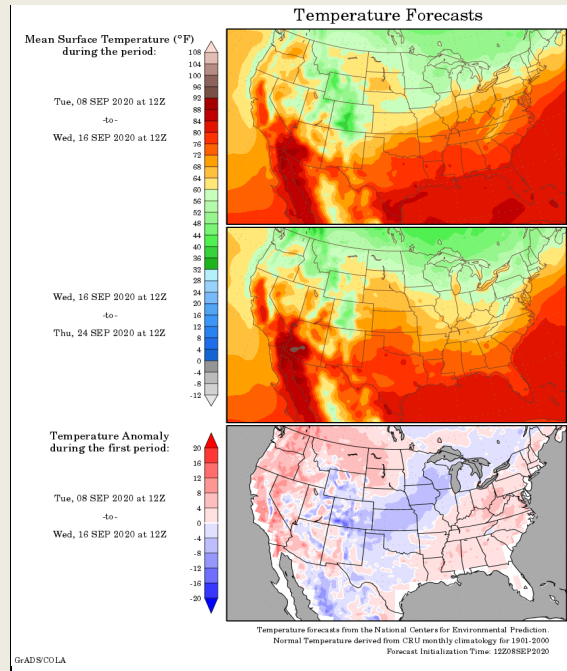
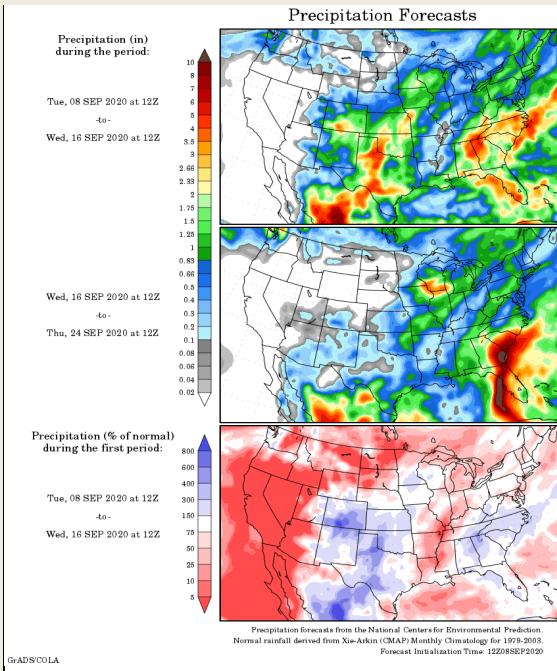
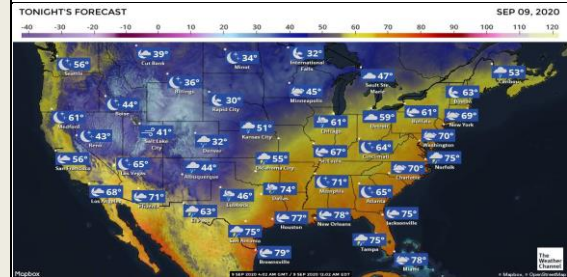
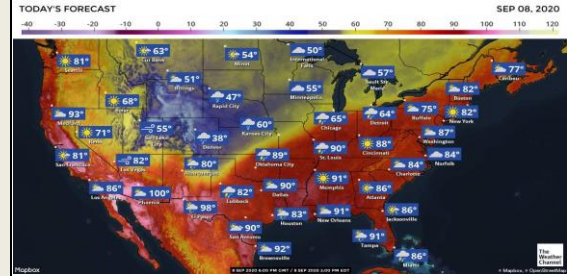
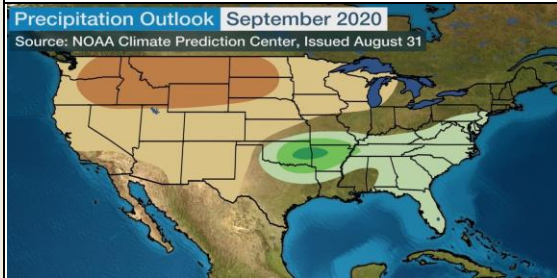
U.S. MIDWEST: Showers and thunderstorms will occur through Saturday bringing rain to nearly all of the Midwest at one time or another including the driest areas from eastern Nebraska into Iowa where drought conditions will improve before a drier weather pattern occurs Sunday through Sep. 22 allowing crop maturation and harvesting to accelerate.

o Southeastern Missouri into southern Illinois will be driest through Saturday and some of that region will be left dry.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta will see favorable conditions for crop maturation and harvesting most often through the next two weeks as dry conditions will be most common while the Southeast sees an increase in showers starting Wednesday that will continue through Sep. 17 before drier conditions occur Sep. 18-22.

o The Delta will be mostly dry through Thursday before isolated to scattered and mostly light showers occur Friday through Sunday and cause minor interruptions to fieldwork.

o Rain will increase Monday into Wednesday of next week and the central and southern Delta will receive 0.35-1.25" of rain and locally more with lighter rain in the northern Delta where a few areas may stay dry.



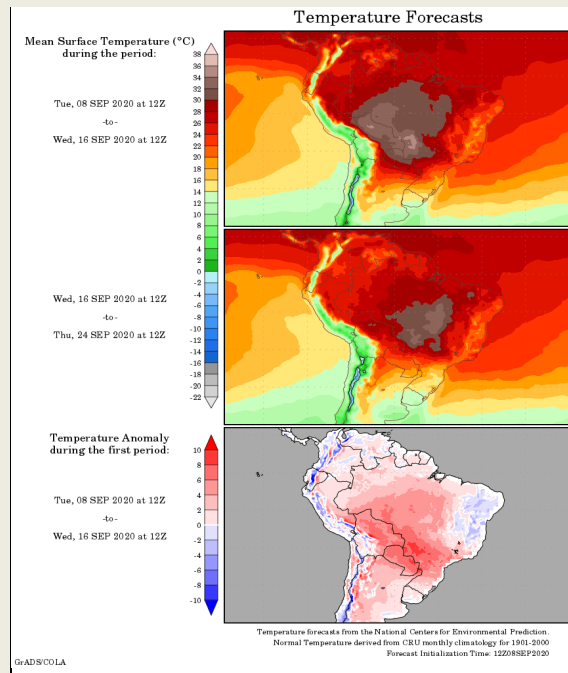
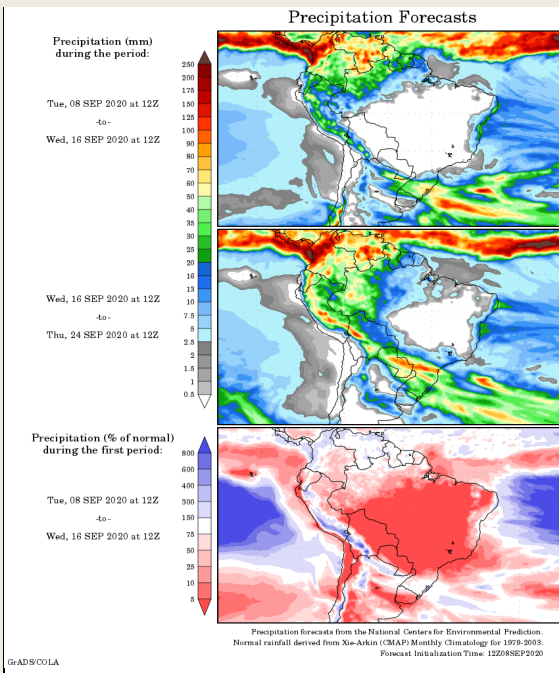
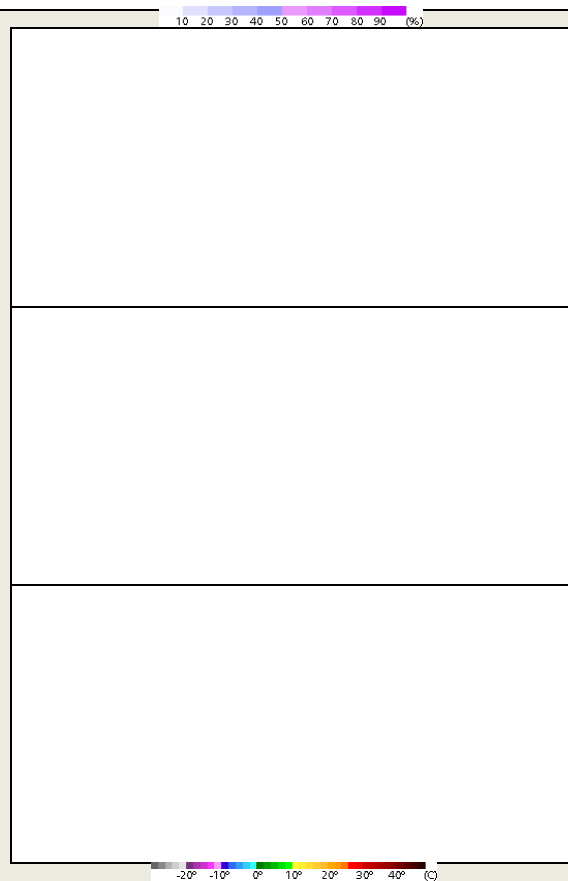
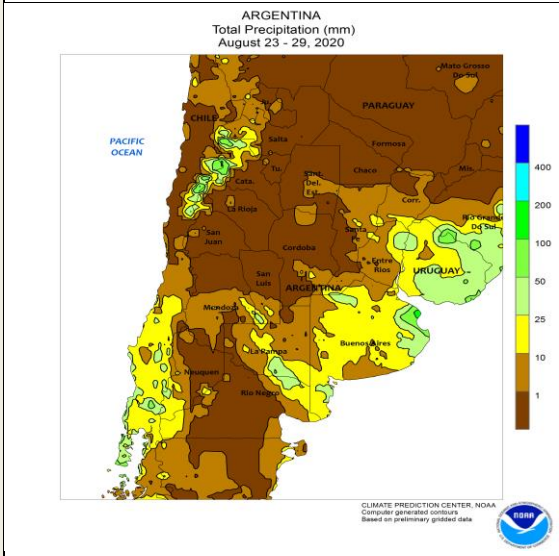
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Daily rounds of showers and thunderstorms will occur in Rio Grande do Sul through Wednesday of next week with some rain extending into Santa Catarina and southern Paraguay on occasion and concerns over winter wheat quality declines may increase. Meanwhile, outside of some showers in eastern Bahia, the remainder of Brazil will see little to no rain of significance through Wednesday, Sep. 16 before scattered showers develop most days from central and northern Paraguay to Parana and portions of Sao Paulo Sep. 17-22.

ARGENTINA: Outside of north-central and northeastern Argentina, much of the country will see little to no rain of significance through the next two weeks and greater rain will be needed in many areas to induce improvements in soil moisture for summer crop planting as well as for winter wheat development.

o Light showers will occur today into Thursday in central and southern Buenos Aires where rainfall totals will be up to 0.50" and locally more.



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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

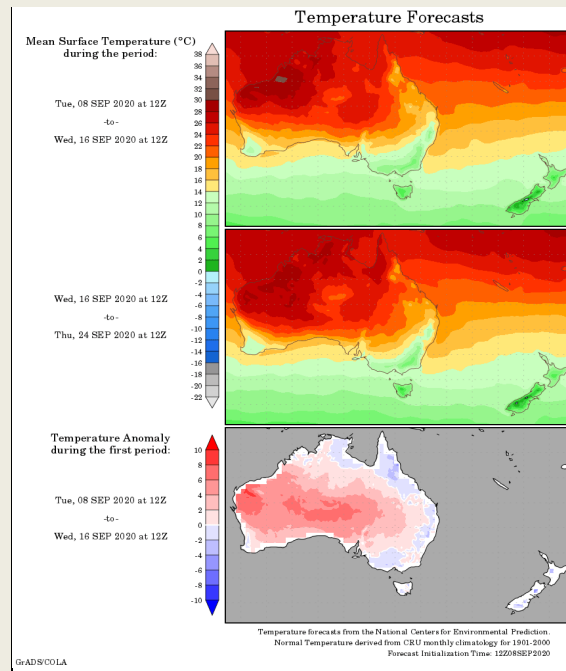
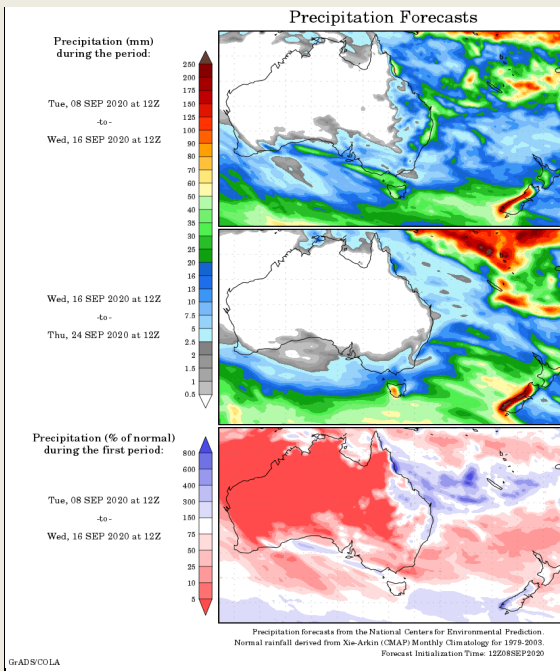
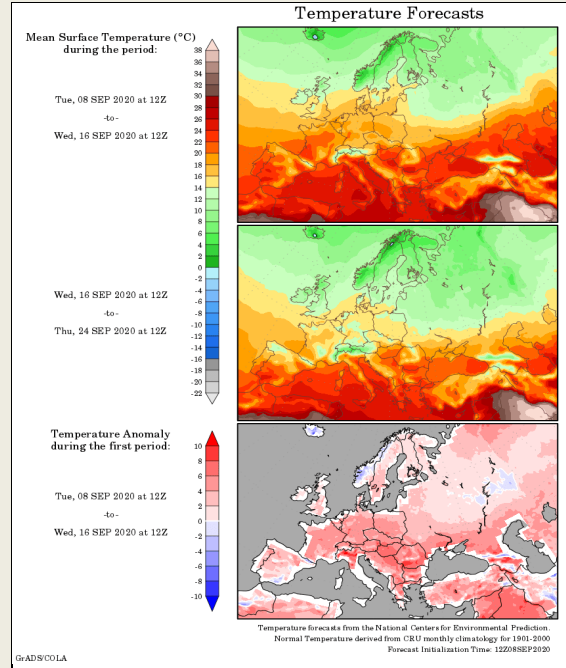
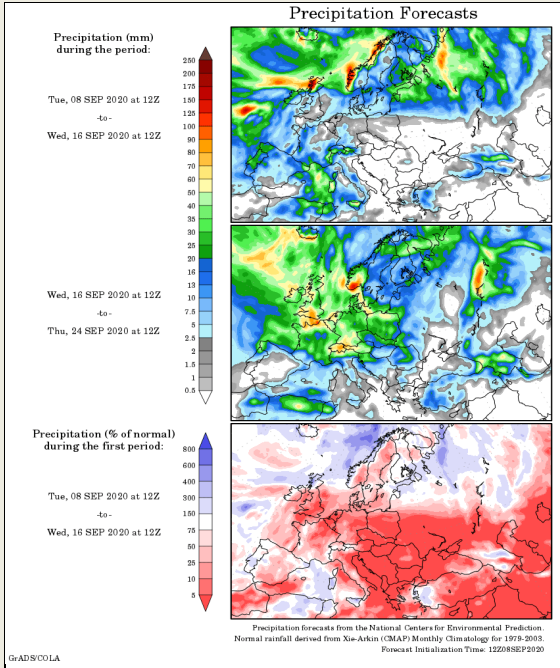
EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will occur from the northern U.K. and the North Sea Region through the Netherlands, northern Germany, southern Scandinavia into the Baltic Sea Region and northern Poland this week.

o Precipitation will linger over the Alps Region the remainder of this week as well.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation will prevail over Australia's winter crop regions during the next ten days. Rain is needed in Queensland immediately to support reproduction that should be starting, but any rain will be confined to southeastern portions of the state and will be erratic and light.

o Conditions will not be completely dry, but rain that does occur will be light and erratic most often and have little change to soil moisture.

o Rain in northeastern New South Wales and southeastern Queensland will be greatest Wednesday into Thursday this week.



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
