

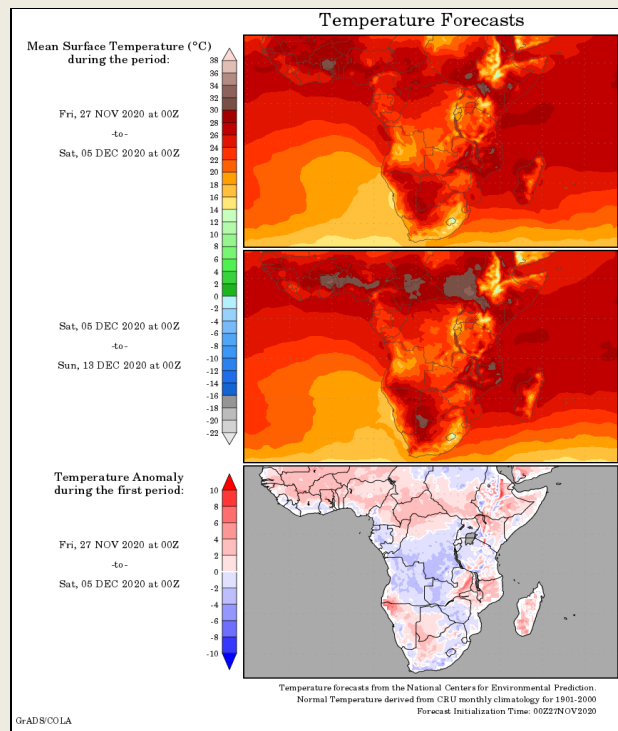
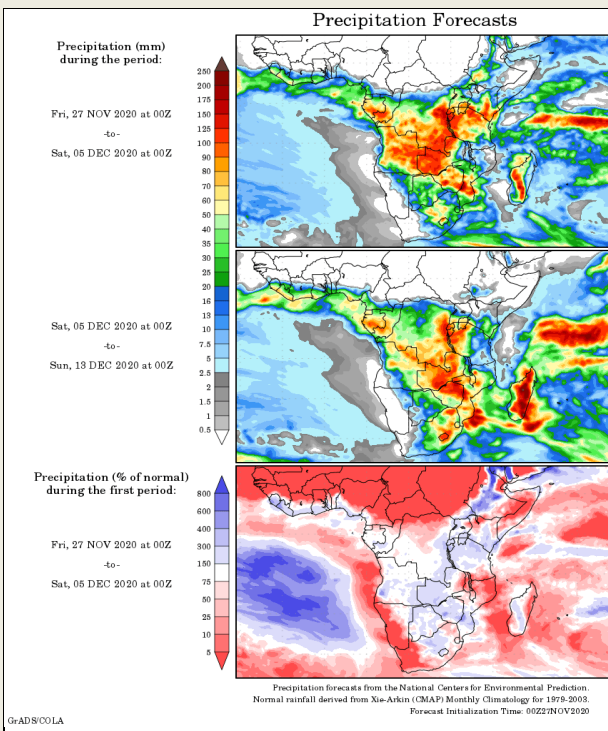
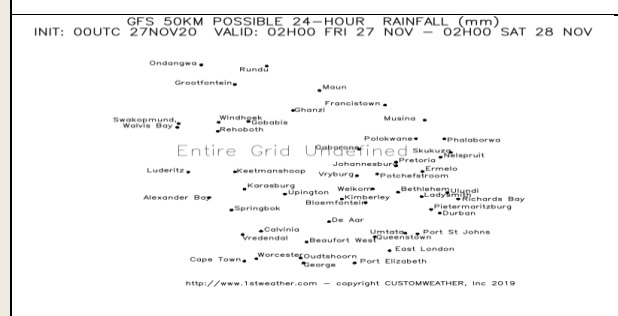
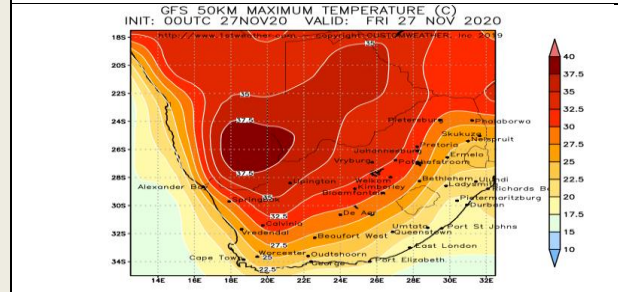
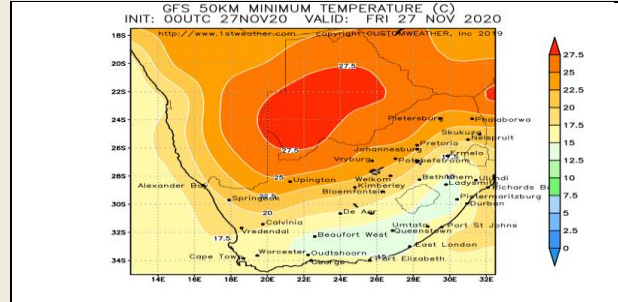
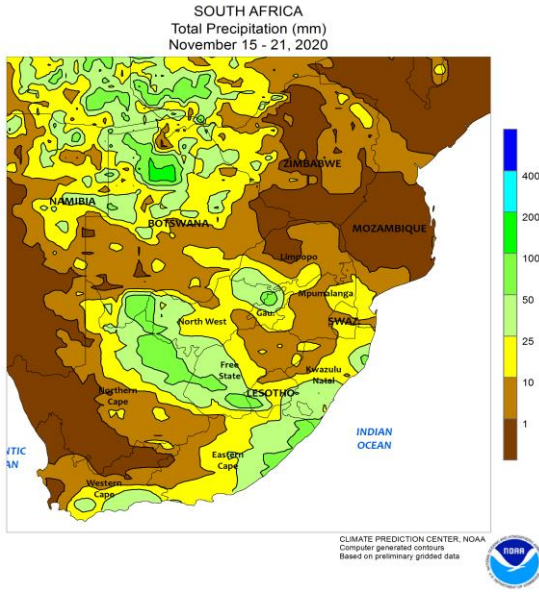


Weather Report

27 November 2020

South Africa - Weather

Sufficient rain is expected over the next two weeks to bolster soil moisture and support summer grain, cotton and oilseed planting, emergence and establishment. The outlook for production this year is very good and as long as rain falls periodically this late spring and summer that potential should be met. Winter crop harvesting will advance around the precipitation with net drying likely in the west. Highly varying amounts of rain will occur over this coming week, but nearly all areas east of Northern Cape will get rain at one time or another

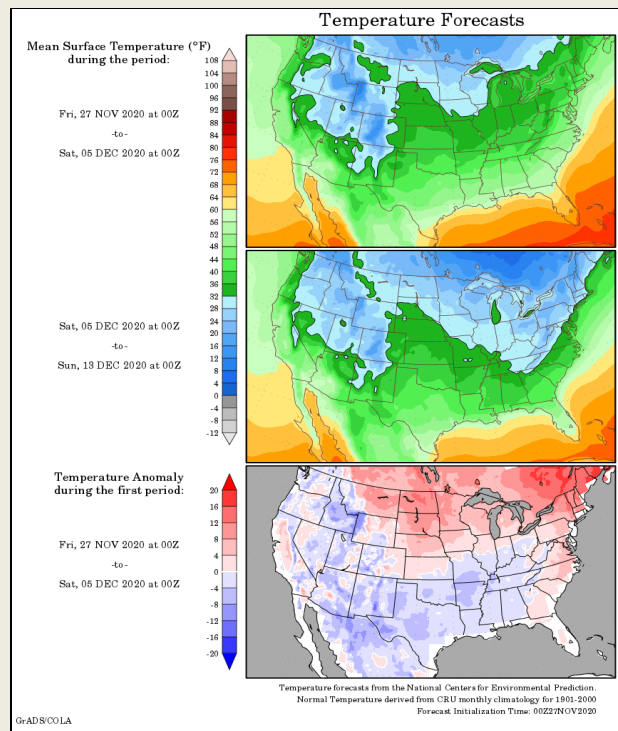
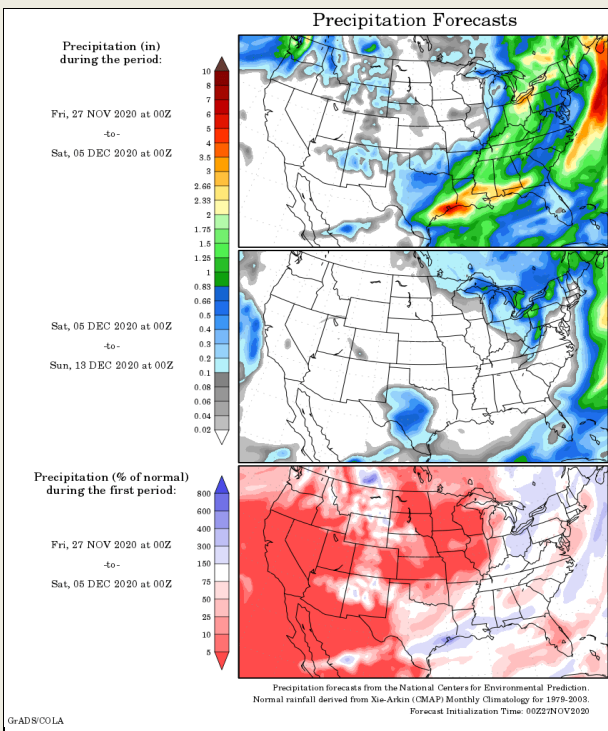
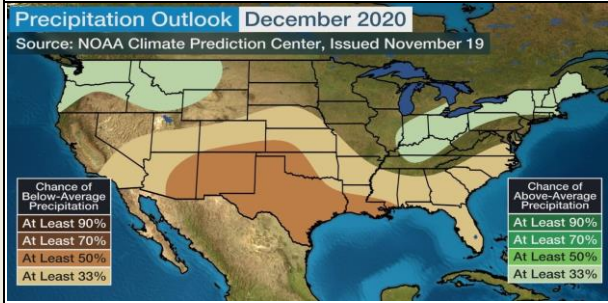
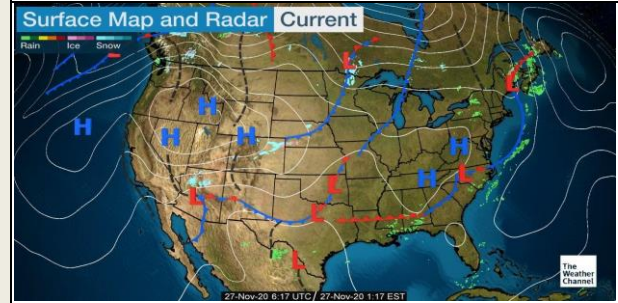
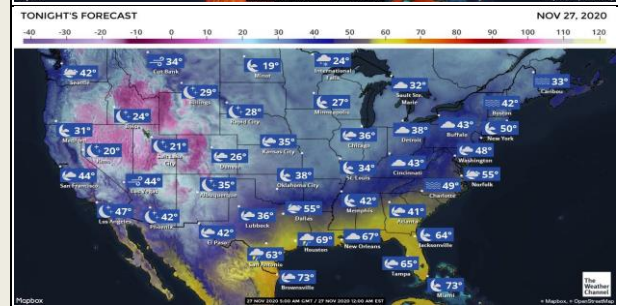
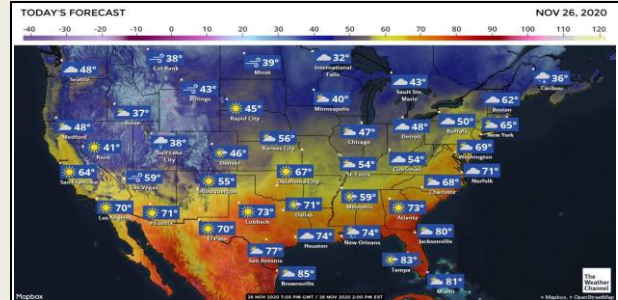
U.S. MIDWEST: Today's forecast includes less precipitation overall during the next two weeks and late-season fieldwork should advance well overall and especially in the northwest where little precipitation of significance is expected.

o The driest areas in and around western Iowa will see little precipitation during the next two weeks, but there is plenty of time to recharge the soil moisture during the next several months before spring planting.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST:

The Delta and the Southeast will see a wet weather pattern through Dec. 4 and late-season fieldwork will be slowed with some local flooding possible, especially in the southern Delta where heavy rain will fall Friday into Sunday.

o Rain will fall today into Thursday from the southern Delta through much of the Southeast.

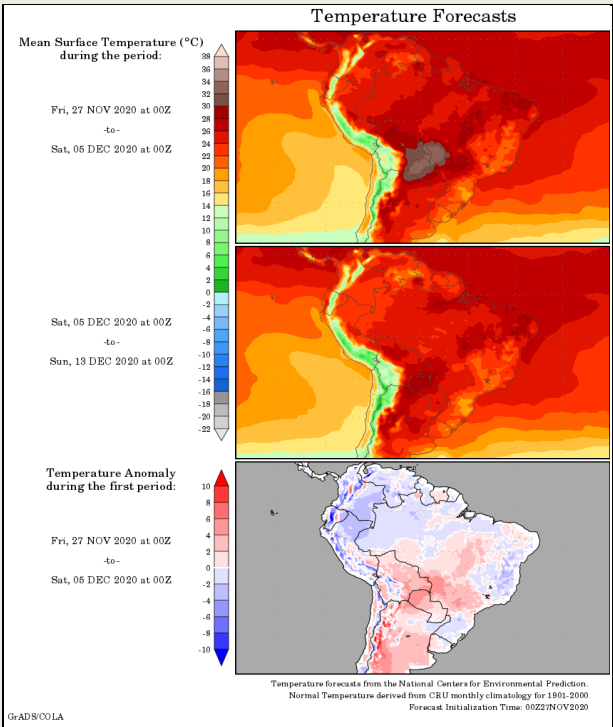
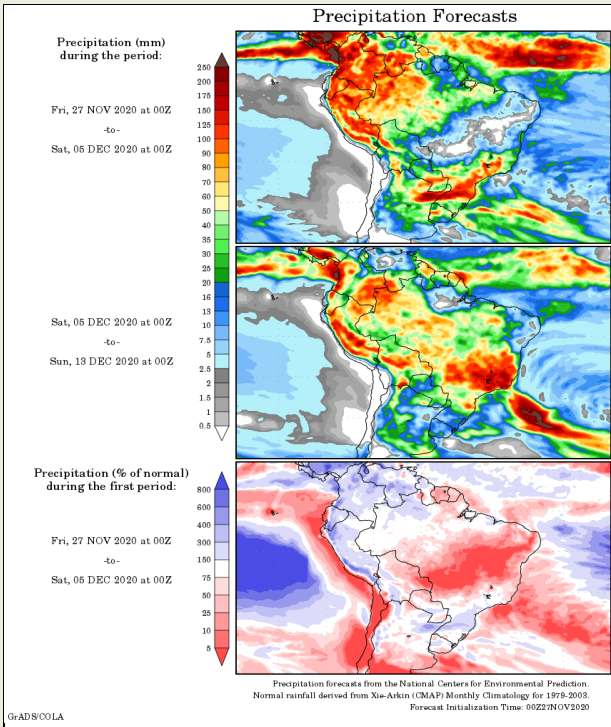
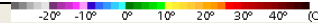
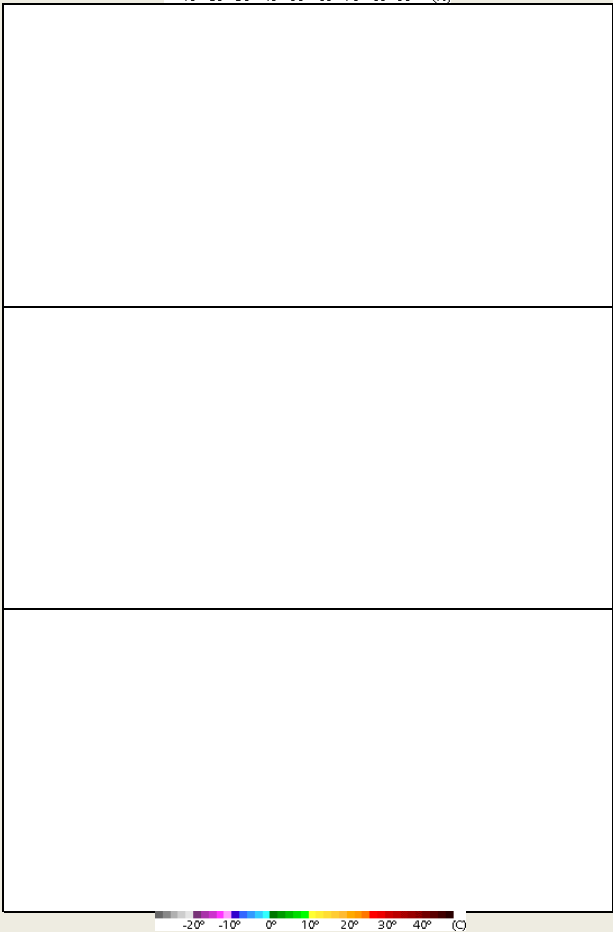
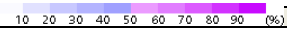
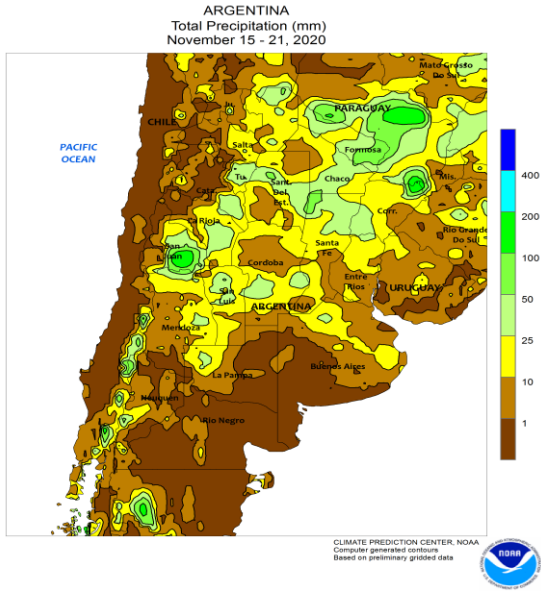
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Rain will increase in far southern Brazil tonight and will continue into Wednesday, Dec. 2 with showers and thunderstorms extending into central and eventually northern Brazil Dec. 2-9 and if rain falls as advertised crops should have enough soil moisture to develop favorably into the second week of December.

- o Mato Grosso will be wetter than other areas in northern Brazil and will see daily showers starting Monday.

ARGENTINA: Argentina will see timely rain through Tuesday and most of the country will be left with enough soil moisture to support crops through the first nine days of December when drier weather returns, but today's forecast includes less rain for portions of southern Argentina than advertised Tuesday and some areas may soon see rising levels of crop stress.

- o Planting will be interrupted by the rain, but outside of some northern areas impacted by locally heavy rain, most of the rain should not be heavy enough to cause lasting delays to fieldwork.

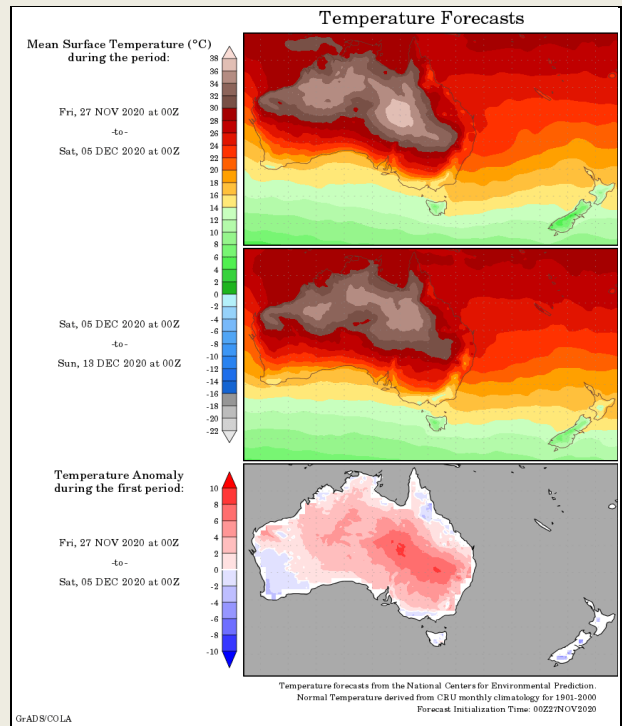
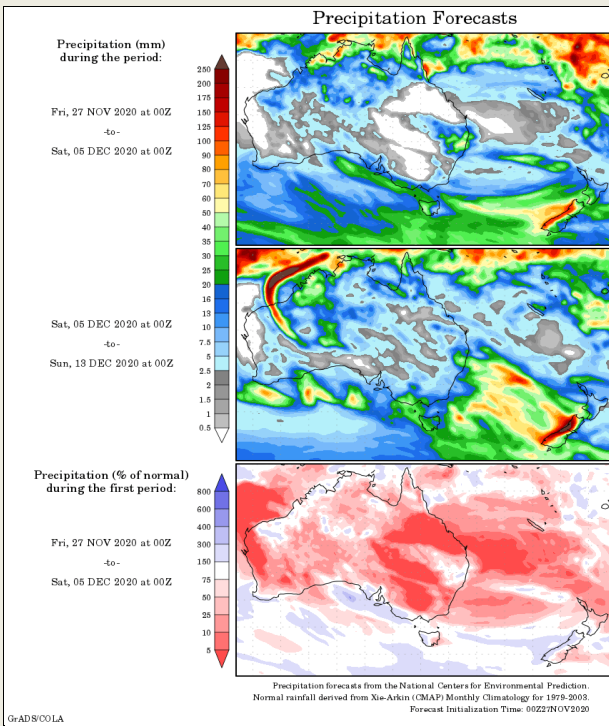
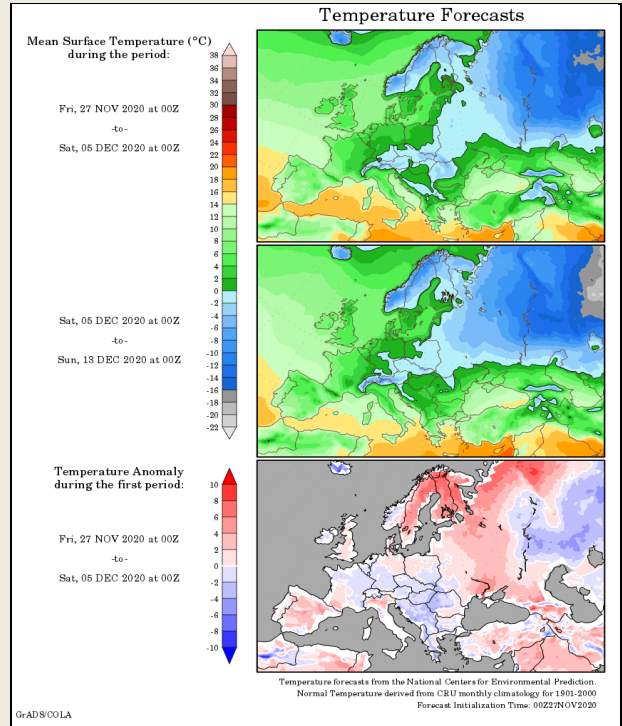
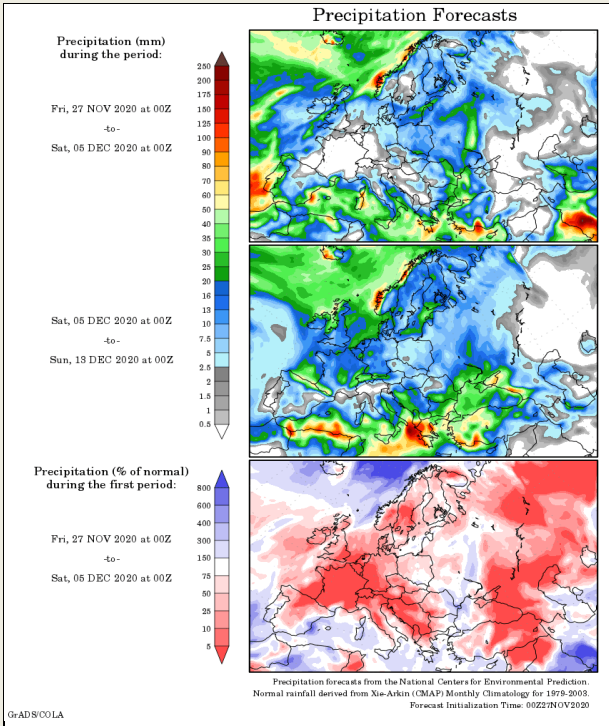

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Restricted precipitation will allow for swift crop maturation and harvesting in most of mainland Europe during the coming week. However, isolated to scattered rain will occur over Italy today into Friday and erratic showers will also occur over Romania during this period as well. Isolated heavy rain over southern Italy will vary from 1.00 to 3.00 inches and locally more the next couple of days. Meanwhile, totals will be no more than 0.80 inch in Romania.

AUSTRALIA: Restricted precipitation and net drying will occur over most of Australia's major production areas during the coming week. Hot and dry weather will continue to increase the need for a return in rainfall to support planting, emergence and establishment of summer crops, especially in northern New South Wales and southeastern Queensland. Heat will occur over Australia the next seven to ten days as restricted precipitation continues.
