

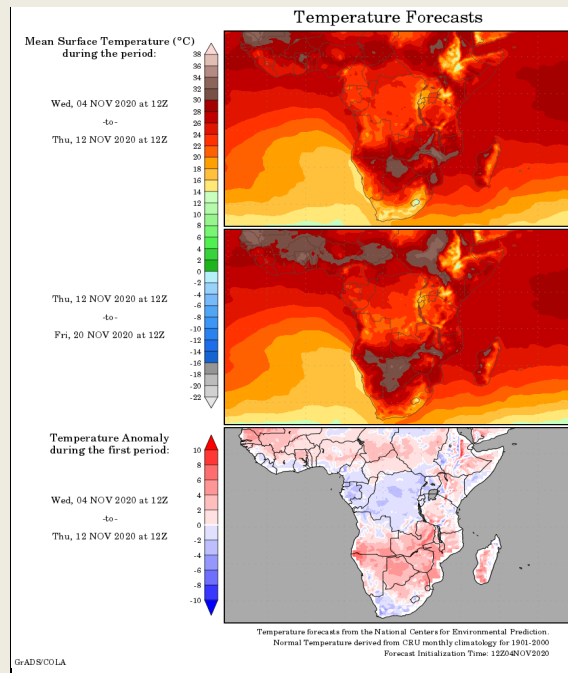
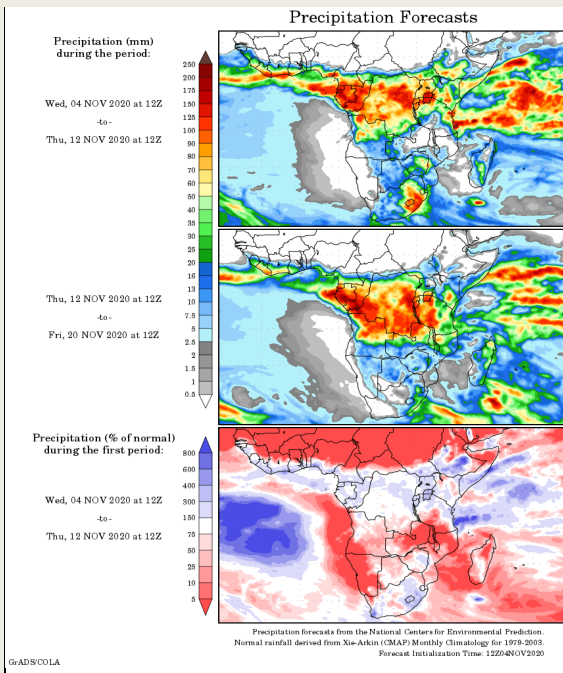
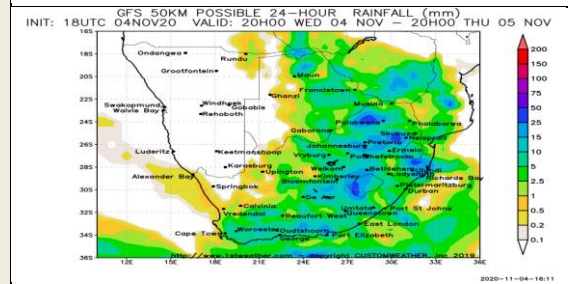
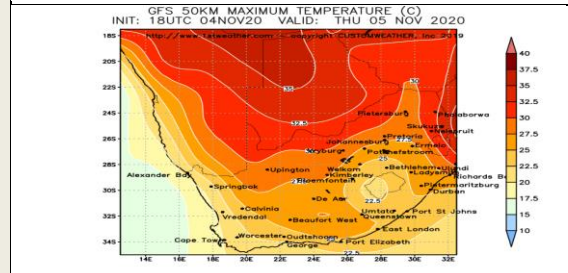
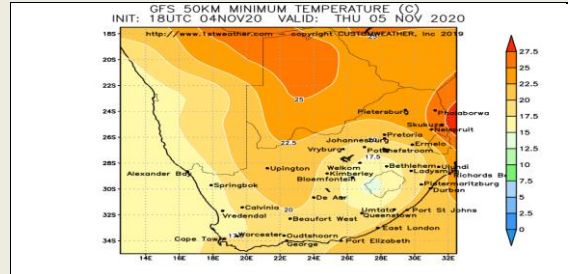
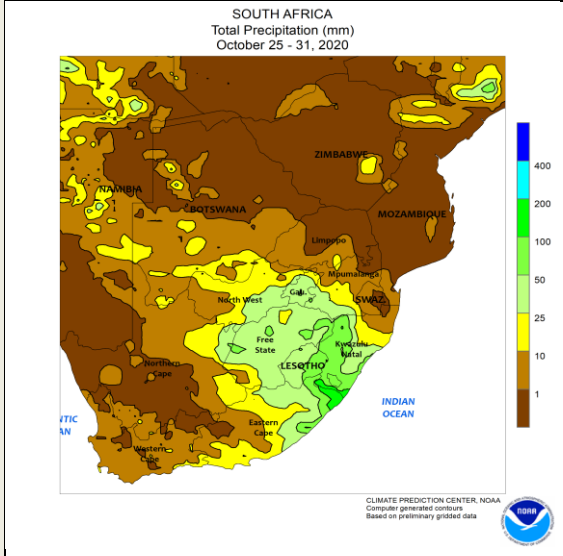


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

The main summer crop areas in eastern and central South Africa will see several waves of rain during the coming week. The rain will gradually bolster soil moisture and support a good environment for aggressive germination, establishment, and growth. Planting may otherwise be sluggish during the wettest periods. Planted acreage is expected to be up compared to last year due to the La Nina environment over the growing season. Winter wheat maturation and harvesting will otherwise be slowed or delayed on a frequent basis in Free State, portions of Northern Cape, and neighboring areas due to the rain. Minor quality reductions will be a concern in the wettest areas of Free State, though no significant production impacts are expected. Western Cape will also receive enough rain to slow winter wheat harvesting at times. Producers will still have opportunities to get into the fields between rain events.



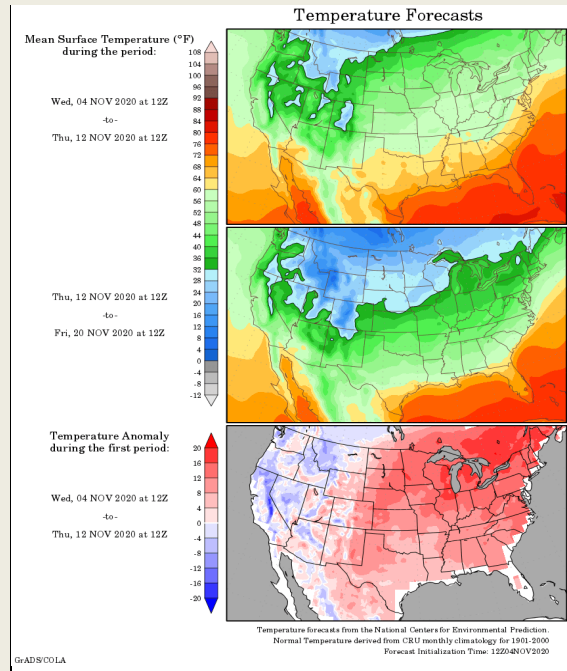
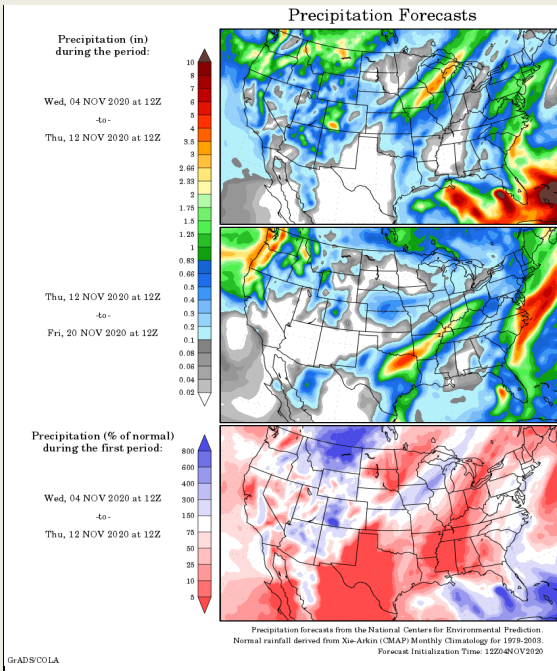
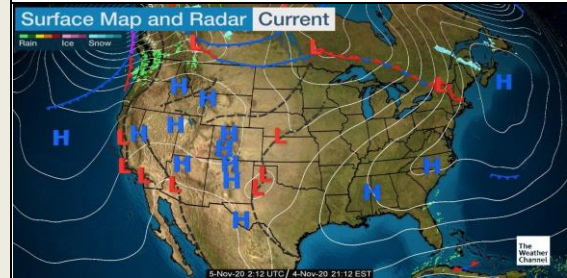
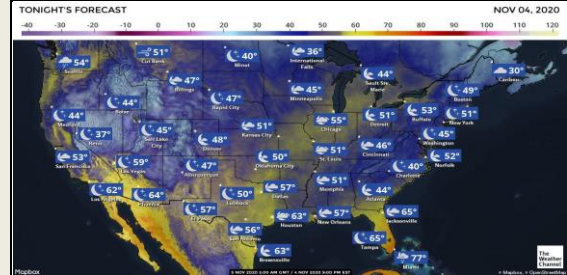
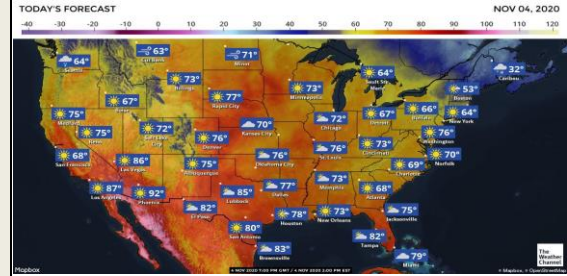
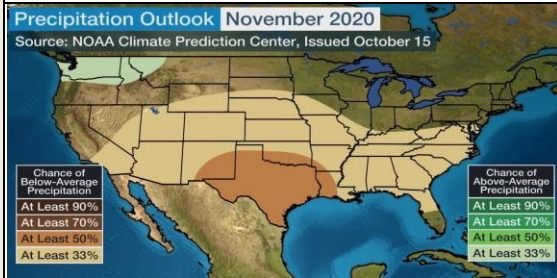
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: High temperatures today will be in the middle 60s to the middle 70s with some upper 70s from eastern Nebraska to southern Minnesota. Thursday through Saturday's highs will be in the 60s and lower 70s with some upper 50s in the far northwest and some middle and a few upper 70s from eastern South Dakota and southwestern Minnesota to eastern Kansas to eastern Missouri. Far northwestern areas will become cooler Saturday and will see highs range from the upper 30s through the 50s.

o Cooling will continue in the west Sunday and by Monday highs from eastern Kansas through southern and eastern Wisconsin and the eastern Corn Belt will be in the 60s to the middle 70s with some upper 50s along the northern edge of the region. Highs elsewhere will range from the upper 20s through the 40s with some 50s n

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a restricted rainfall pattern through most of the next two weeks and good harvest progress should be made, but that could change if Tropical Storm Eta eventually moves into the Gulf of Mexico and into the Delta or the Southeast.

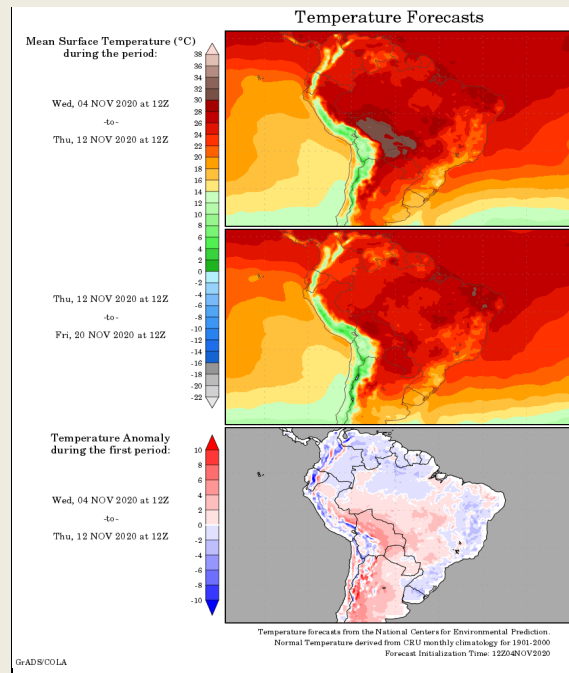
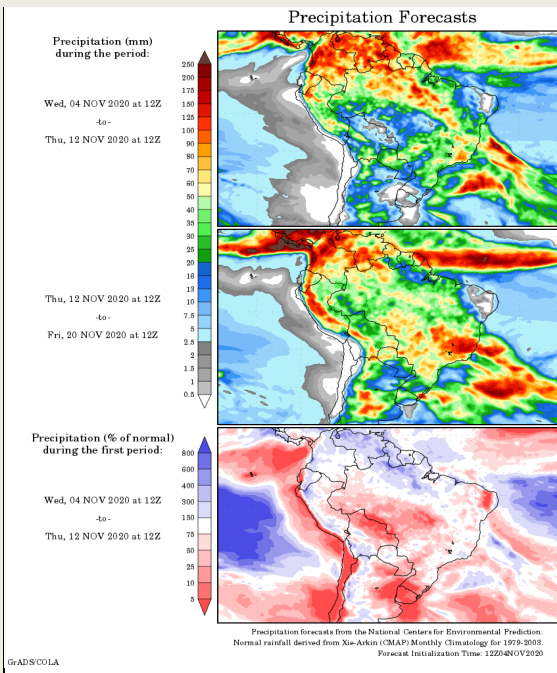
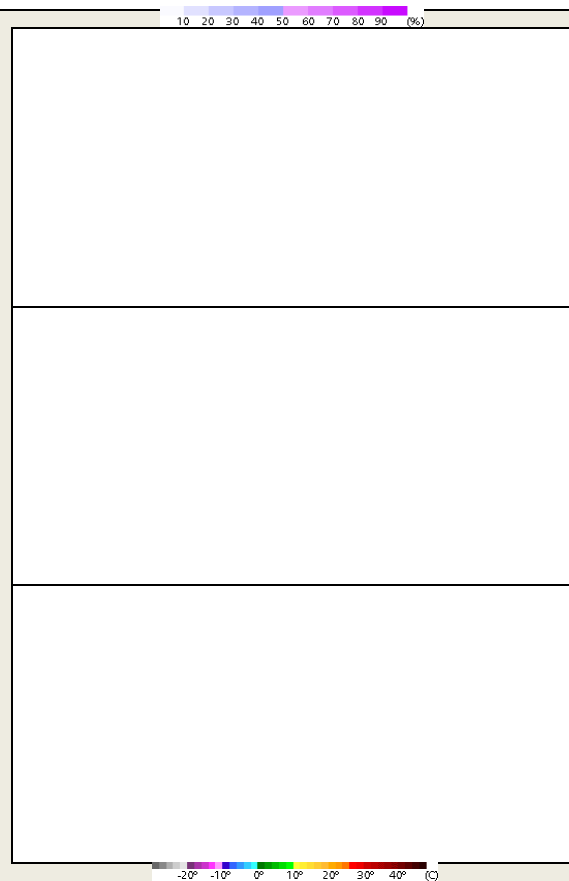
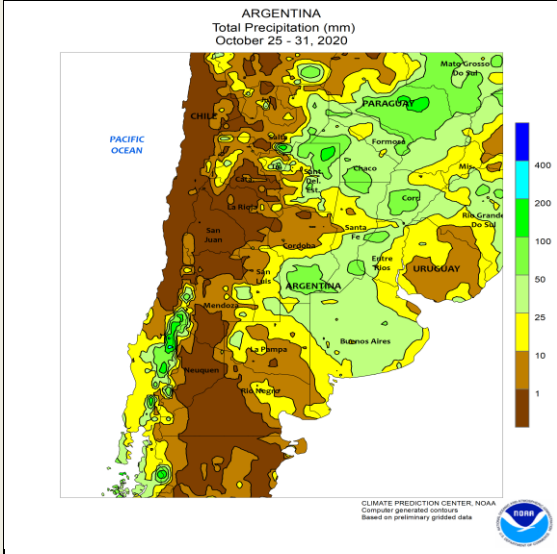


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Showers and thunderstorms will continue through Sunday in portions of northeastern Brazil while much of the remainder of Brazil and Paraguay will see little to no rain and good planting progress should be made while the soil dries and some crops from southern Paraguay to Parana to Sao Paulo and into parts of southern Minas Gerais and southern Goias become stressed by a lack of moisture. Rain will fall regularly from the northeastern corner of Mato Grosso to northern Goias to Bahia and northern Minas Gerais to Espirito Santo and eastern Minas Gerais. A timely increase in rain will begin Monday in Paraguay and portions of southern Brazil and it will spread into the remainder of western, central, and southern Brazil Tuesday into Nov. 12.

ARGENTINA: A restricted rainfall pattern will continue across central and eastern Argentina through most of the next two weeks and by Nov. 18 many areas will have dried down significantly to possibly slow emerging and establishing crops. Some crop stress is expected as well. Good planting progress will continue. In the meantime, scattered showers in the far west next week and into mid-month will bring spotty relief to dryness



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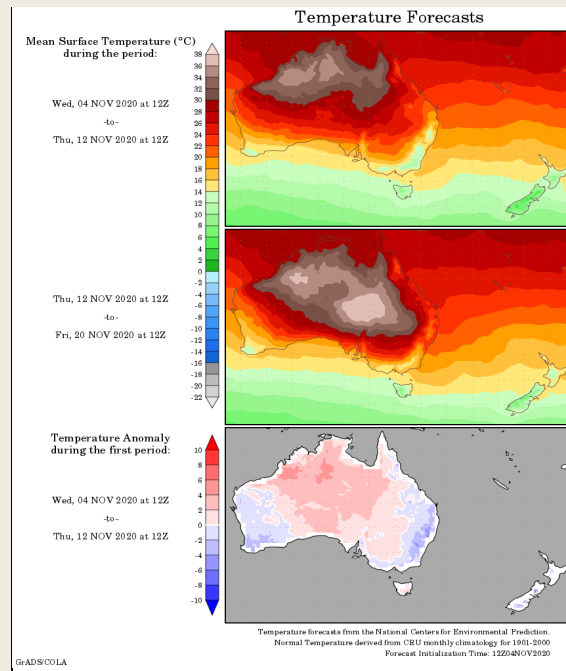
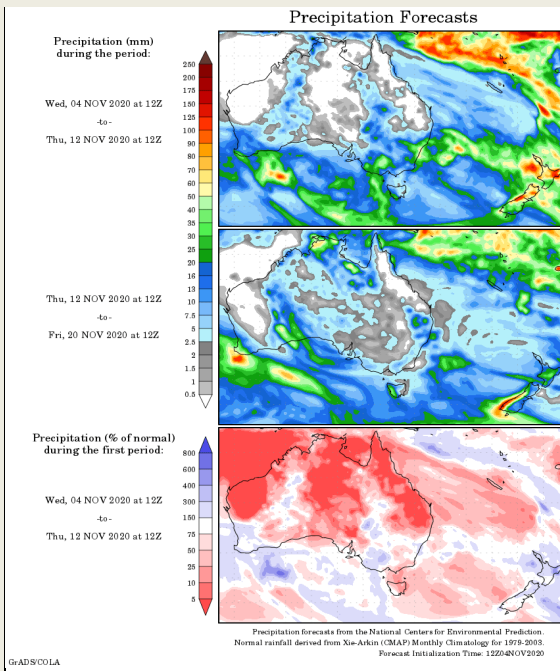
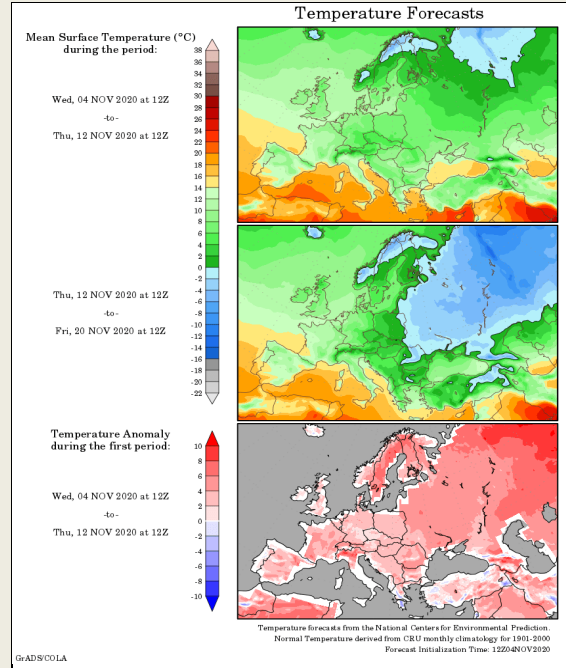
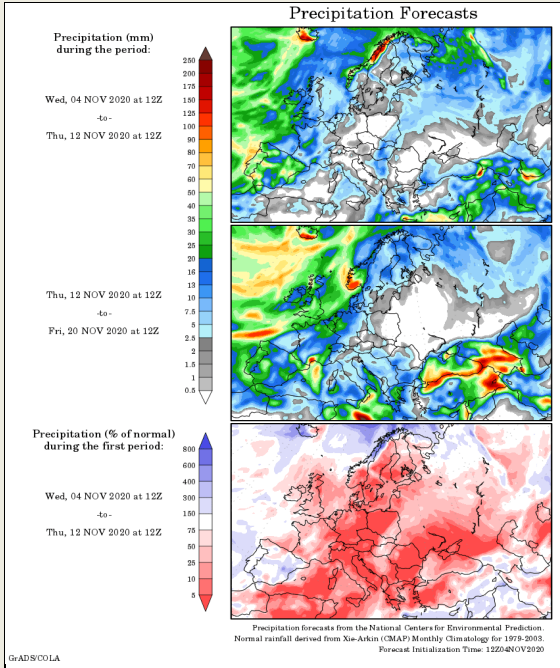
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Scattered showers will become confined to the Iberian Peninsula into France, Belgium, the Netherlands and the U.K. during the next week to ten days while mostly dry weather occurs elsewhere.

- o With that said, showers will linger over the northwestern Balkan Nations through Hungary, Slovakia and eastern Poland today where totals will vary from 0.05 to 0.65 inch and locally more.
- o Otherwise, rain will be confined to the Iberian Peninsula through Friday and expand into portions of western and southern France and the western U.K. this weekend through early next week.

AUSTRALIA: A good mix of rain and sun will allow for increased planting and harvest during the drier days while rain that does occur will help support planting and crop establishment in southeastern Australia. Widespread drying will occur Friday into Monday.

- o Rain will increase from central to east-central and southeastern New South Wales and eastern Victoria today into Thursday. The greatest rain will occur near the coast where a few totals will exceed 1.00 inch. Otherwise, totals will vary from 0.05 to 0.70 inch most often. Rain will increase over southeastern Australia Tuesday into next Thursday, November 12.



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
