



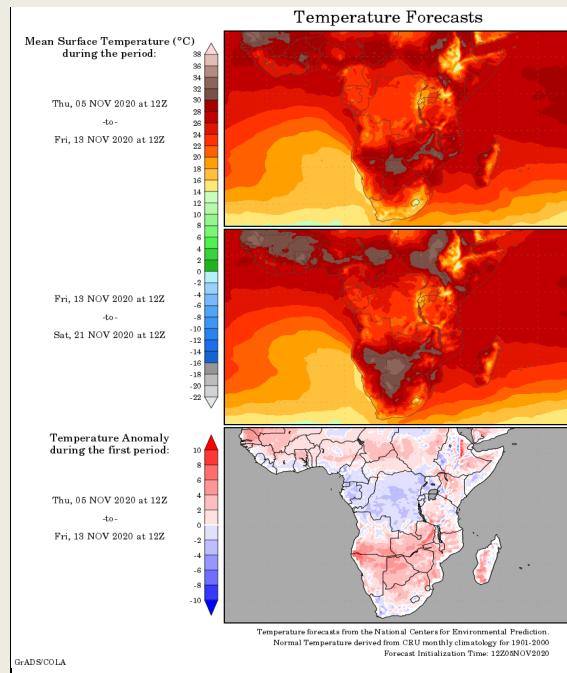
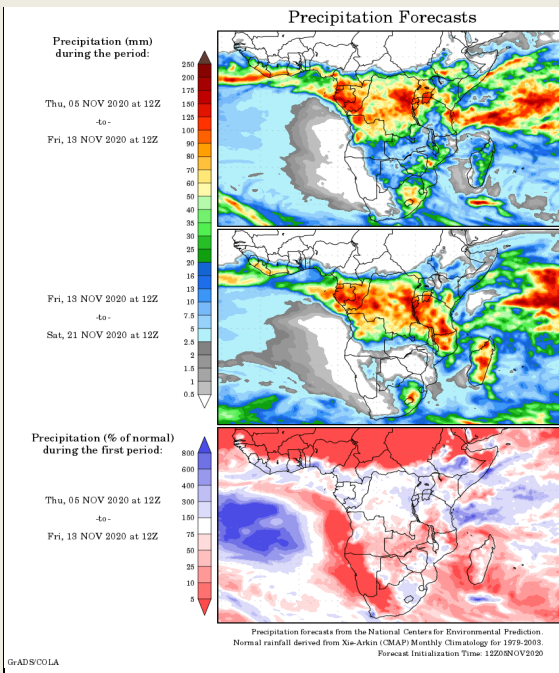
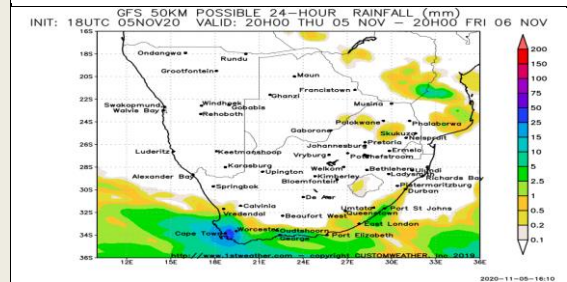
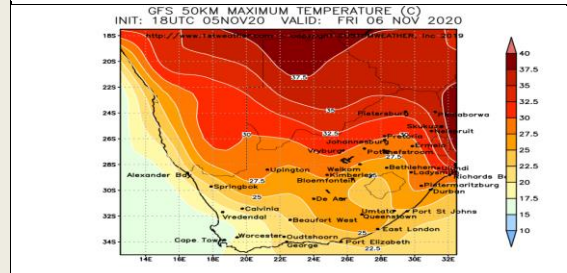
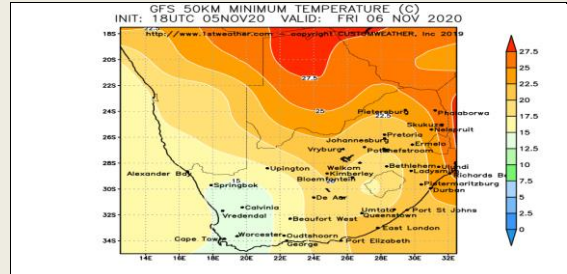
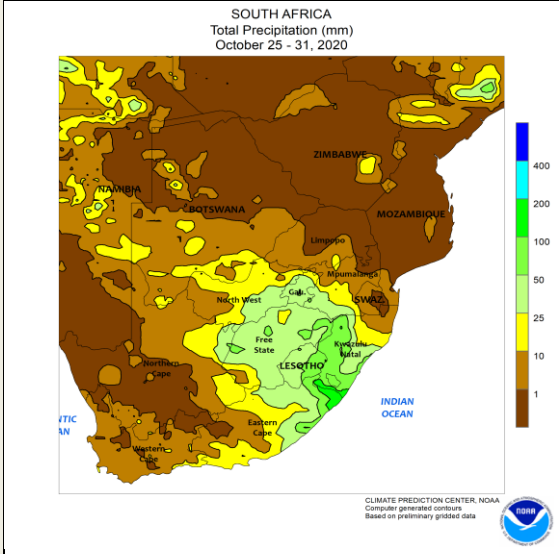
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

Eastern and central South Africa's summer crop areas will see a mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. The rain will help bolster soil moisture and support a better environment for germination and establishment. Planting will also advance between rain events. Northern Cape, western sections of Free State and North West, and portions of Limpopo will still need additional rain later this month to completely fix the moisture deficits and support an ideal environment for the crops.

Winter wheat maturation and harvesting will otherwise be slowed or delayed on a frequent basis in Free State, North West, and neighboring areas due to the rain. Producers will still have opportunities between rain events to get into the fields and continue the harvest. No significantly quality declines are expected. Northern Cape and Western Cape will also receive enough rain to briefly slow the harvest, though fieldwork conditions will be mostly favorable.



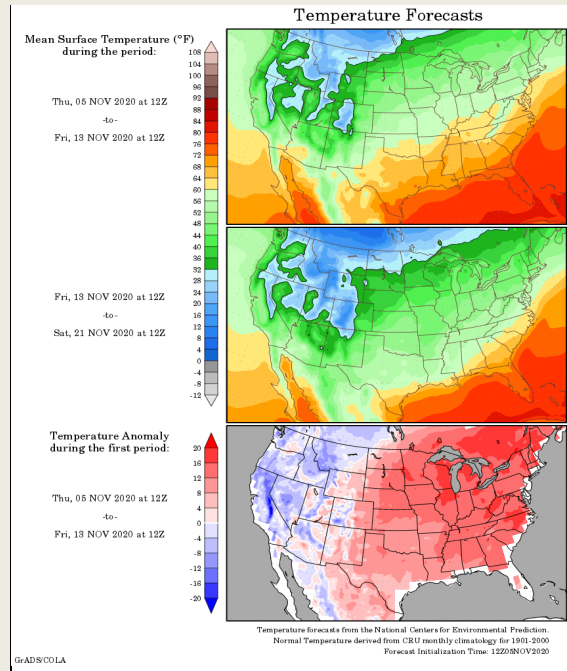
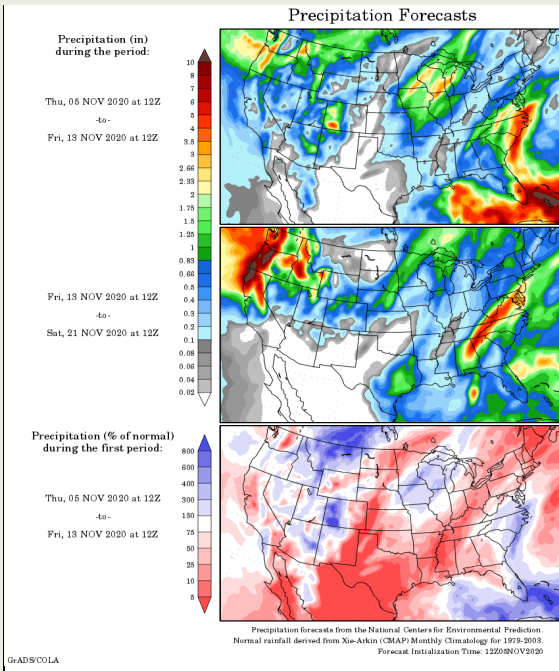
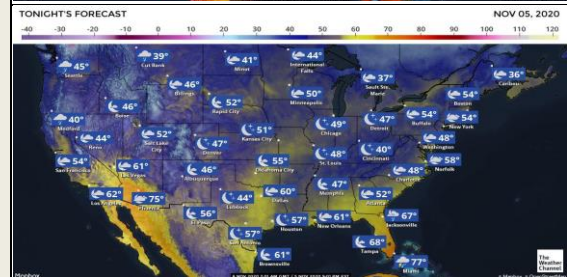
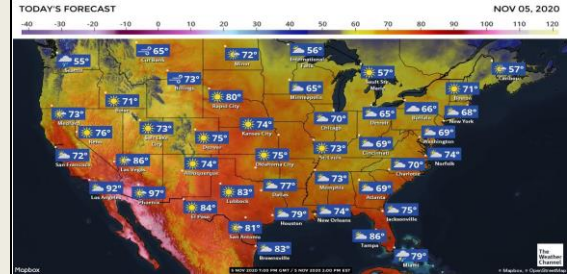
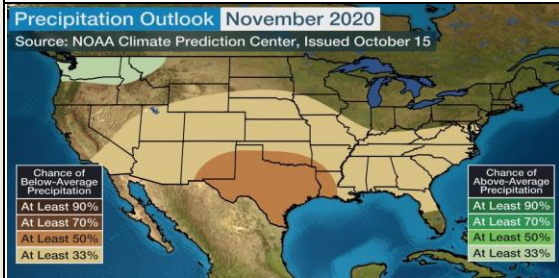
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see two rounds of precipitation Sunday into next week with dry conditions most common during the remainder of the next two weeks allowing harvesting to soon be completed in most areas.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta will continue to see dry weather most often and good harvest progress overall through the next two weeks while the outlook for the southeastern states is wetter than what was advertised Wednesday as Tropical Depression Eta is now expected to at least enhance rainfall in the region late next week into the following weekend. A wide variety of forecasts are still being made by the various computer forecast models for the track of Tropical Depression Eta after it moves back into the Caribbean Sea and little confidence can be placed on the details of the storm's track. The remnants of the storm will likely become better organized once it is over water again and it should become a tropical storm Friday as it moves towards Cuba.

After the storm moves across Cuba it may impact southern Florida early next week and the soonest the northern Gulf of Mexico region in the U.S. would be impacted would be late next week.



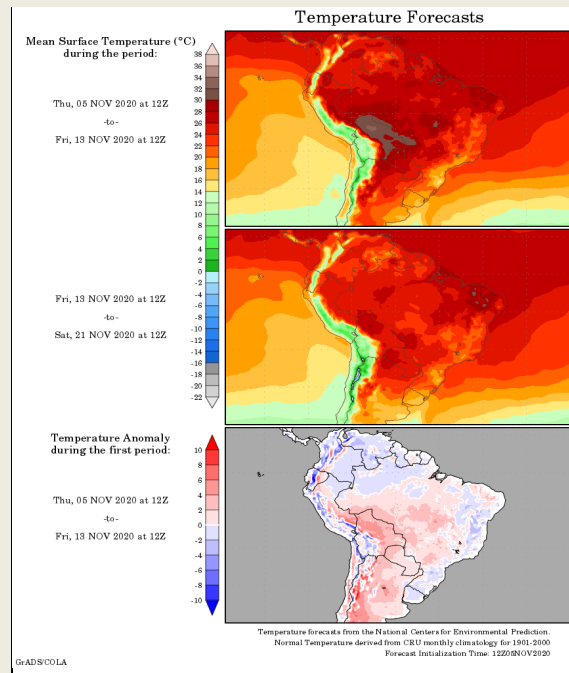
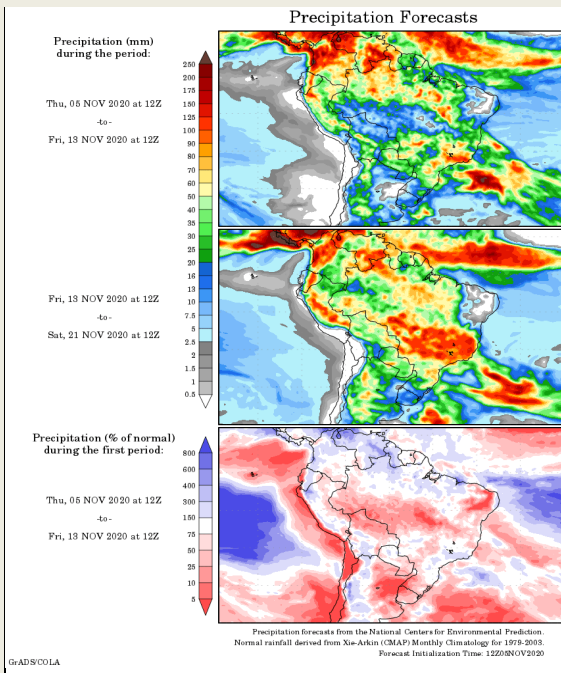
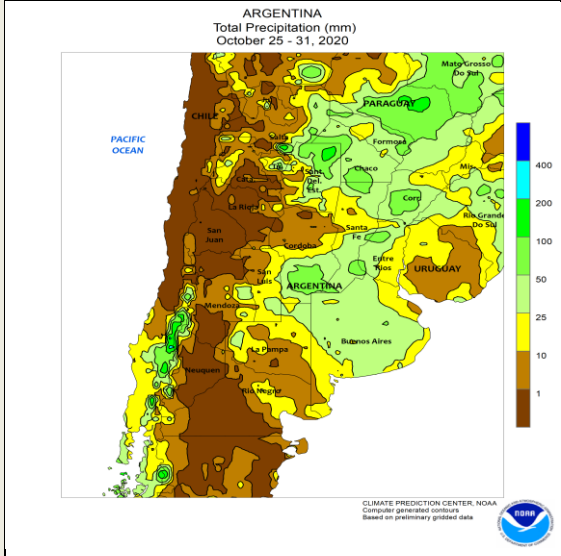
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see little to no rain and good planting progress through Sunday with some showers and thunderstorms continuing in parts of northeastern Brazil while some crops from southern Paraguay to Parana to Sao Paulo and into parts of southern Minas Gerais and southern Goias see rising levels of stress due to a lack of moisture.

ARGENTINA: Continued drying will occur through late next week in much of Argentina and good planting progress should be made while some crops in the drier western and northern areas see increasing levels of crop stress.

- Some showers will occur next week in west-central and southwestern areas where many areas should receive enough rain to buy crops more time before serious stress evolves with few areas seeing enough rain to induce a lasting increase in soil moisture.

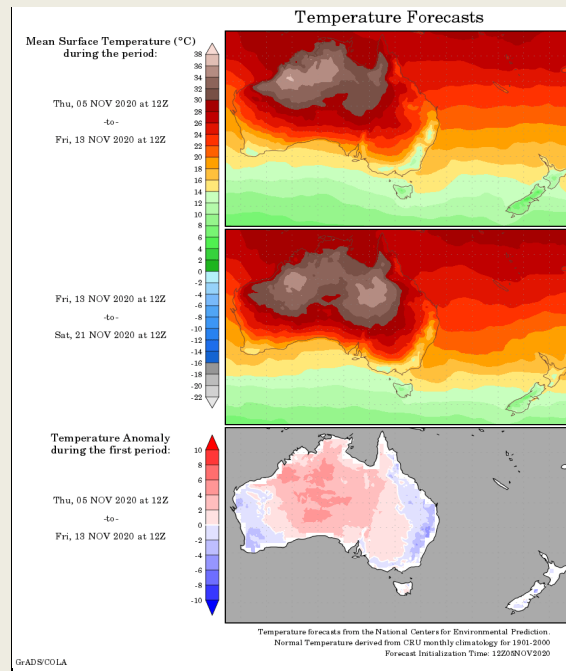
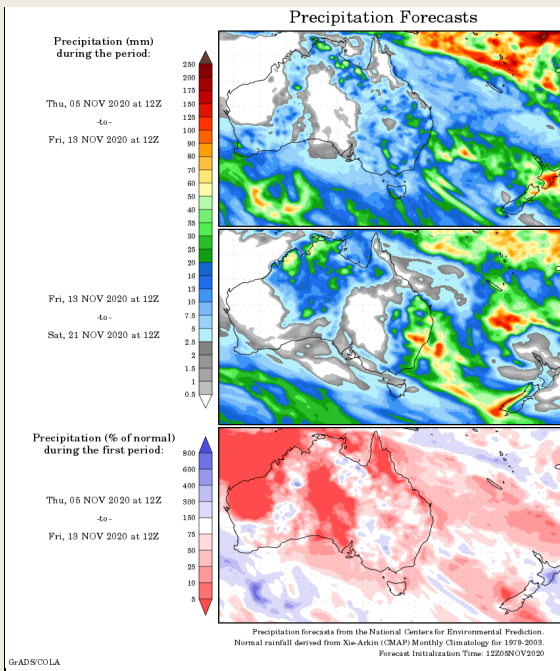
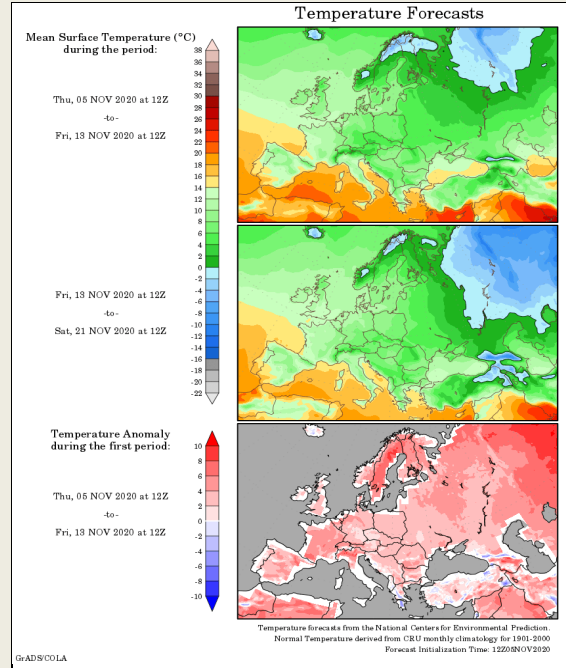
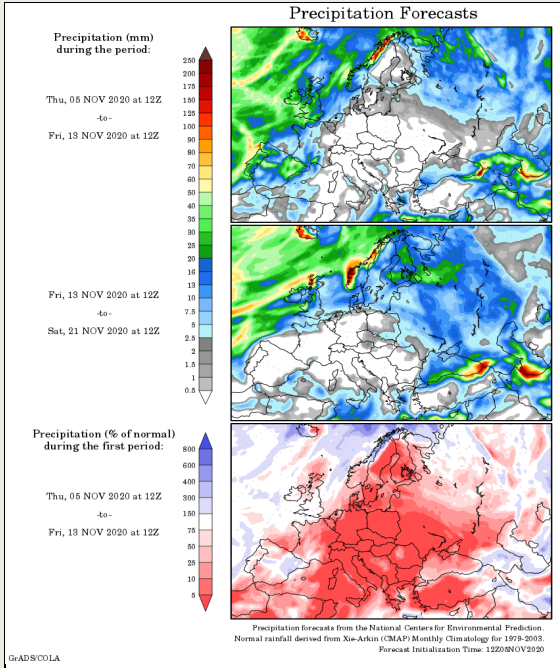


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Scattered showers will become confined to the Iberian Peninsula into western France and the U.K. into the North Sea as well as southern Norway and surrounding areas of Belgium, the Netherlands, Denmark and southwestern Sweden during the next week to ten days while mostly dry weather occurs elsewhere. Rain will be confined to the Iberian Peninsula through Friday and expand into portions of western France and the U.K. this weekend through early next week. The greatest rain in the U.K. and surrounding northwestern France will occur Monday into Wednesday.

AUSTRALIA: A good mix of rain and sun will allow for increased planting and harvest during the drier days while rain that does occur will help support planting and crop establishment in southeastern Australia. Widespread drying will occur today into Monday. Restricted precipitation and net drying will continue in much of Queensland and northern New South Wales this week promoting favorable conditions for harvesting and fieldwork this week. However, greater rainfall needs to return to the region or concern over summer planting, emergence and establishment will continue to rise. Restricted precipitation and drying will occur over Western Australia the next ten days to two weeks.



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
