
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
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
South Africa - Weather


will help bolster soil moisture in much of Natal, Mpumalanga, Limpopo, and eastern sections of Free State, North West and Eastern Cape. Establishment and growth for the coarse grains and oilseeds will continue under generally favorable conditions, though portions of Limpopo will remain a little too dry for ideal development. Planting may be sluggish during the wettest periods. Western sections of Free State and North West into eastern Northern Cape will receive little to no rain through the latter part of next week. Any rain that does occur will generally be too light to counter evaporation. Recent rainfall will help support good establishment and growth for the short-term, though most locations need additional rain to support ideal crop conditions. Winter wheat harvesting will advance swiftly in much of Western Cape, Northern Cape, and western sections of Free State and North West during the coming week due to the lack of rain. Areas further east in Free State and North West may otherwise see harvest delays during periods of rain.

Precipitation will be restricted to the eastern half of South Africa during the coming week. The rain









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United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: A restricted precipitation pattern will continue through the next ten days to two weeks and late-season fieldwork should advance well around the few rounds of organized precipitation expected.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast should see late-season fieldwork advance well overall during the next two weeks, although a few rounds of rain will occur and will cause temporary delays to farming activity.


o Today through Thursday will be mostly dry before rain increases in the Delta Friday into Saturday and in the Southeast Saturday into Monday.

® Rainfall totals in the Delta and the Southeast will be 0.20-1.0" and locally more with a few bands of 1.0-2.0" and locally more scattered across the region.









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
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
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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Much of Brazil and Paraguay will see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the next two weeks and production potentials should rise in most areas, but dryness earlier this season in parts of Mato Grosso, southern Golas, western Parana, and Paraguay likely stressed crops enough that a full restoration of yield potentials is not possible especially for early planted crops. Bahia will continue to be an exception and much of the state outside of western areas will see little rain through the next two weeks and stress to

crops should rise with enough rain likely in the west to prevent serious stress from taking place. ARGENTINA: The rain is not likely to be heavy enough to prevent the moisture from quickly becoming lost to evaporation when drier weather resumes Sunday into next week and stress to crops should steadily increase in that region and in other dry areas in western Argentina during the next two weeks. Outside of rain in Buenos Aires, most areas will be dry today before showers and thunderstorms increase from eastern Cordoba and eastern Santiago del Estero to northern Buenos Aires, Entre Rios, and Corrientes Friday through Sunday.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will continue to increase over western and southern Europe during the coming week. In the meantime, restricted precipitation will occur over Poland, the Czech Republic and northeastern Germany. Moisture will be greatest in southern Europe through the middle of the week, but will increase over west-central and northwestern Europe Friday into Monday.

AUSTRALIA: Rain will increase over coastal portions of southeastern Queensland and New South Wales into eastern Victoria this week. The moisture will reach locations within 200 miles of the eastern coast most frequently. Temperatures will trend cooler than the recent extreme heat over east-central Australia and some relief to crop stress will occur. However, interior locations west of the increased rain this week will need much more than cooler temperatures to "significantly improve" conditions and a widespread soaking needs to return to counter drying.









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
