

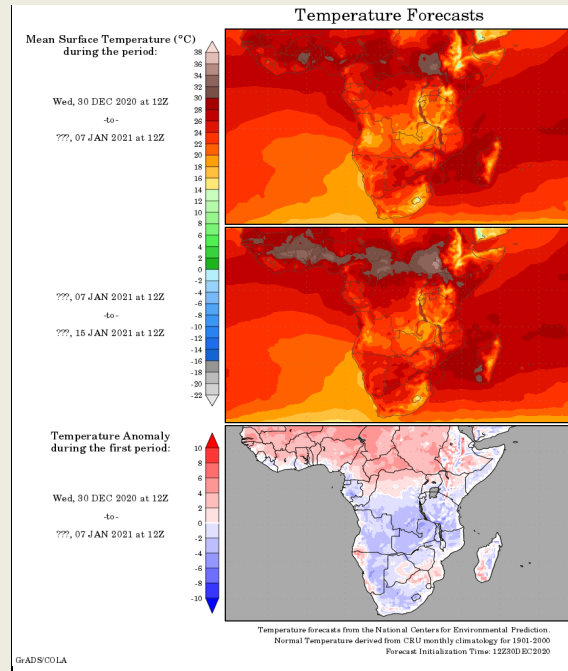
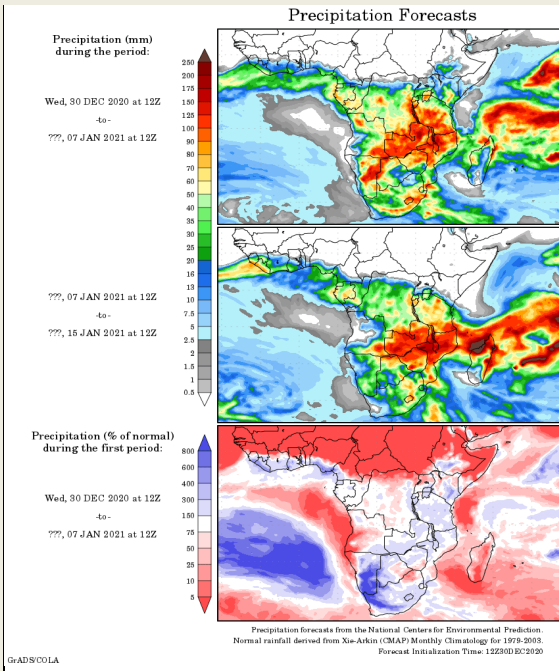
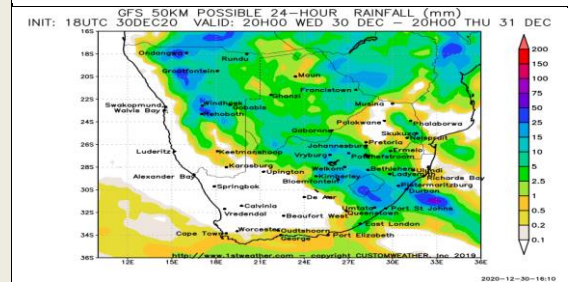
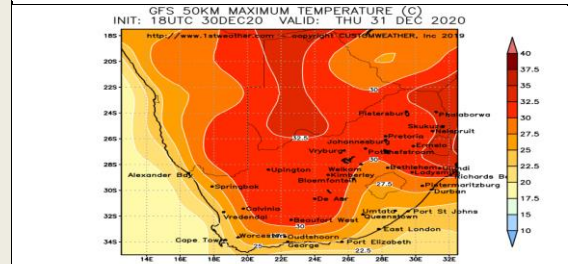
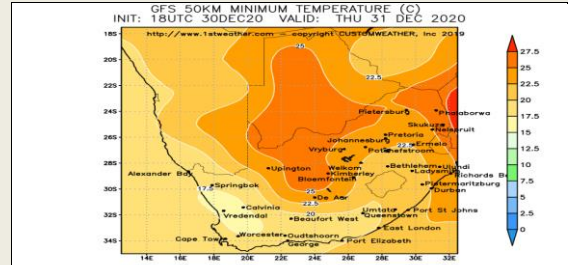
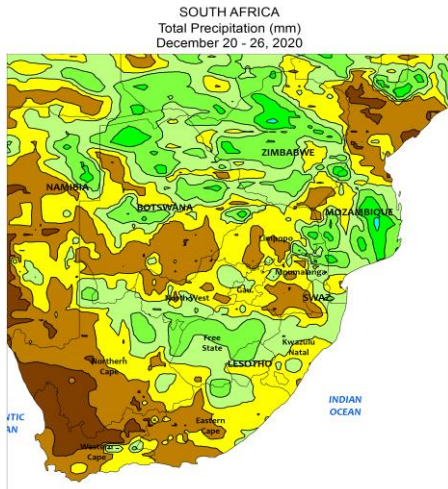


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

Much of the main coarse grain and oilseed areas in South Africa will see a good mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. The rain will help bolster soil moisture in most locations with exceptions for portions of Limpopo. Crop development conditions will be generally favorable. Fieldwork may otherwise be sluggish during the wettest periods. Western Cape's winter wheat areas will not receive much rain during the coming week and late-season harvesting will advance swiftly. Harvest delays will likely occur on a frequent basis in the unharvested winter wheat fields in Northern Cape, Free State, and North West.



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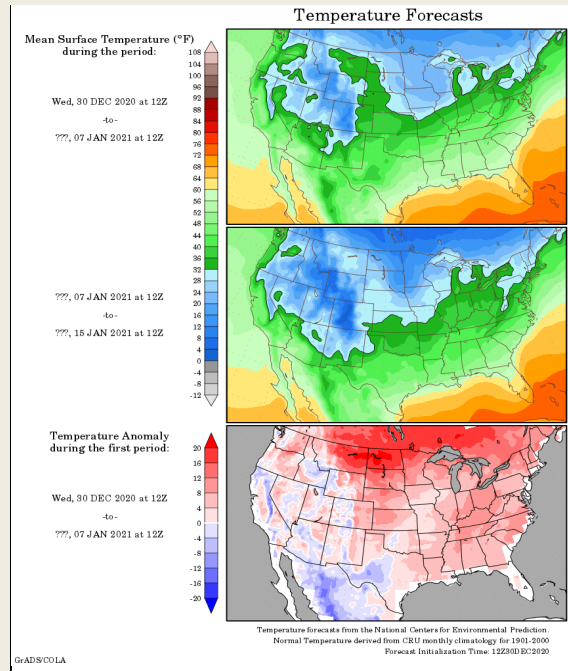
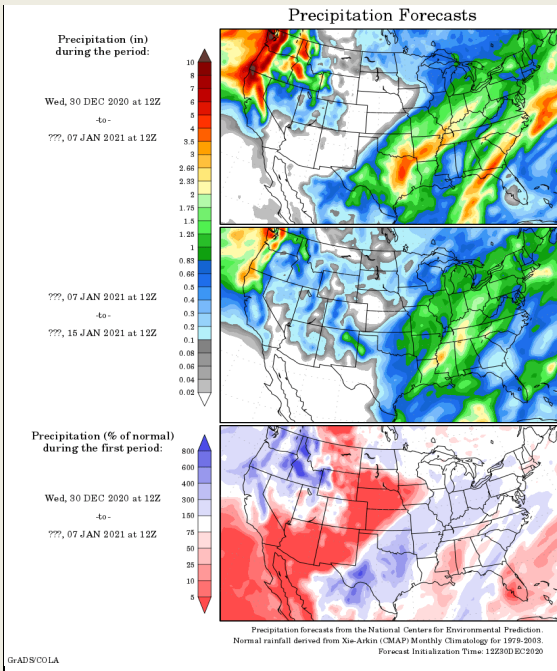
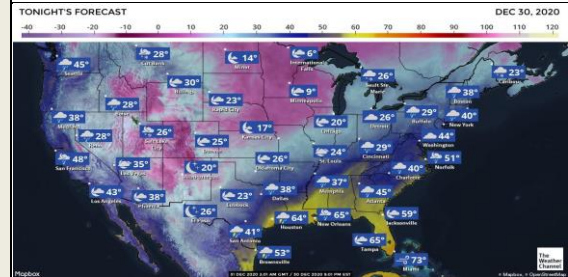
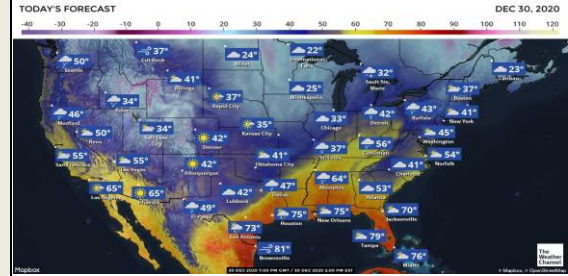
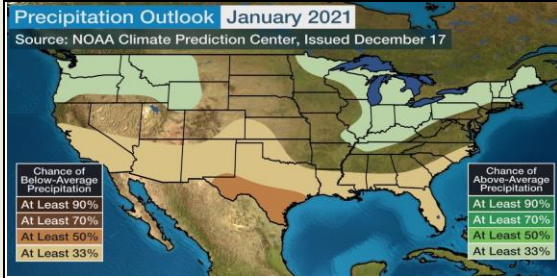
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see two significant storm systems from Tuesday through Friday before a quiet weather pattern occurs this weekend through early next week with another two storm systems impacting the region during the Jan. 6-9 period.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see periods of wet weather Wednesday through Friday and Jan. 6-10 with dry weather most common during the remainder of the period through Jan. 11.

o Today into Tuesday will be mostly dry before rain increases Wednesday into Friday.

o The northern Delta will be wettest and will receive 2.0-3.30" of rain and locally more while other areas in the Delta and the Southeast see totals range from 0.40-2.0" and locally more with a few pockets of lighter rain.



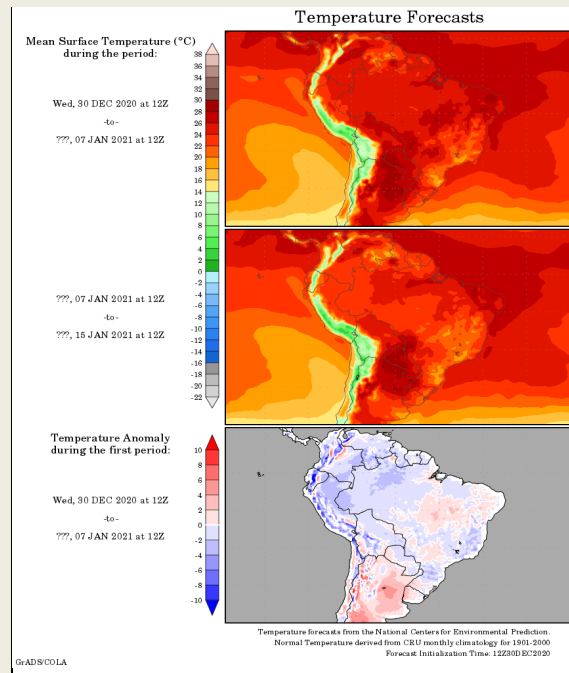
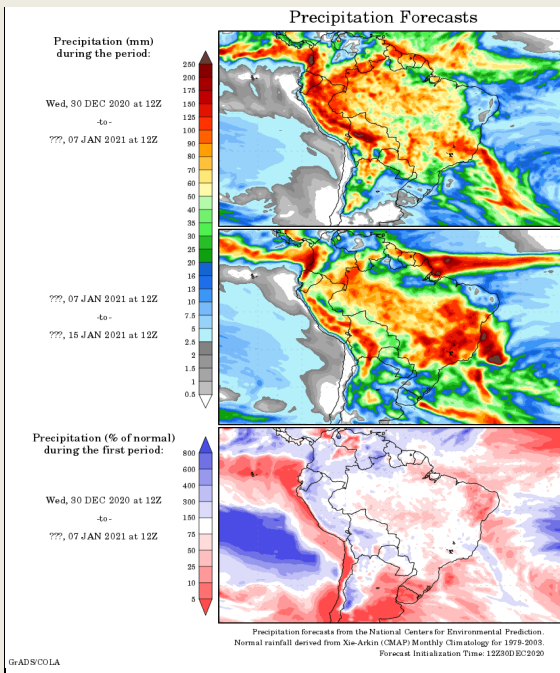
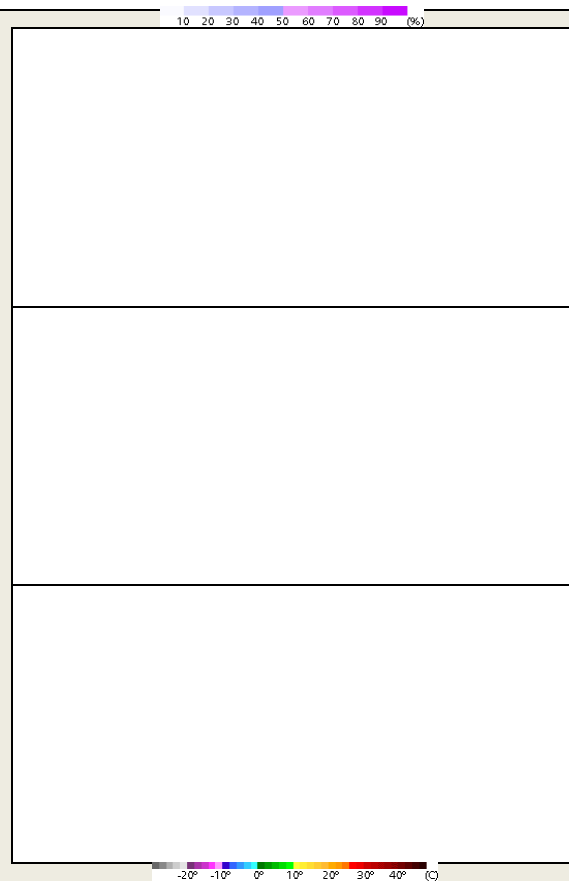
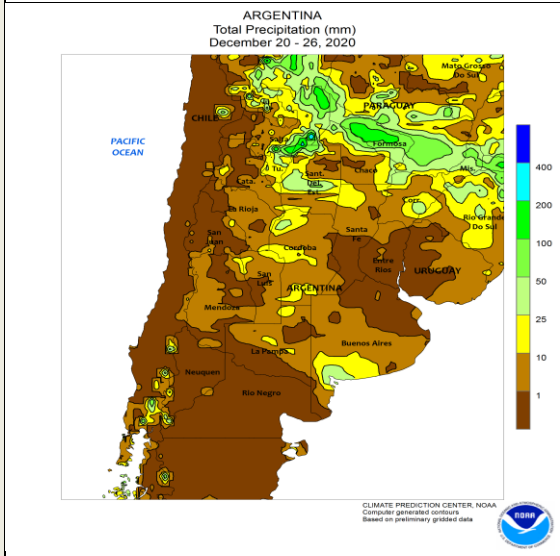
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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Most of northern Brazil will see a welcome increase in rain starting Saturday that will continue into January 13 and most areas should see gains in soil moisture and improvements in crop conditions with some exceptions in the driest areas in central and eastern Bahia. An exception will extend from west-central into southern Rio Grande do Sul where soil moisture is still favorable, but little rain is expected through the next two weeks.

ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina is not likely to receive enough rain during the next two weeks to prevent rising levels of crop stress in many areas and crops that are planted during the next two weeks are not likely to become established without an increase in rain.

o Much of the country will receive rain by Wednesday, but with warm to hot temperatures and little to no follow-up rain in most areas Thursday into at least the middle of next week, the moisture will quickly be lost to evaporation. The region should see steadily increasing levels of crop stress with the warm to hot temperatures expected during most of the next week accelerating declines in crop conditions.

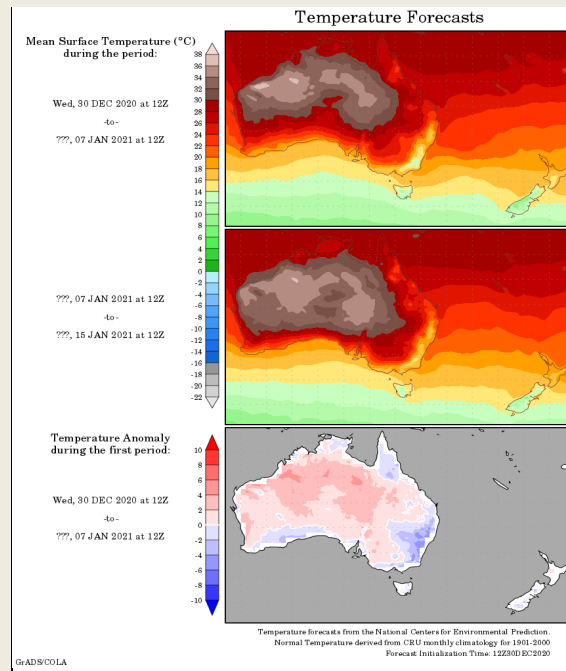
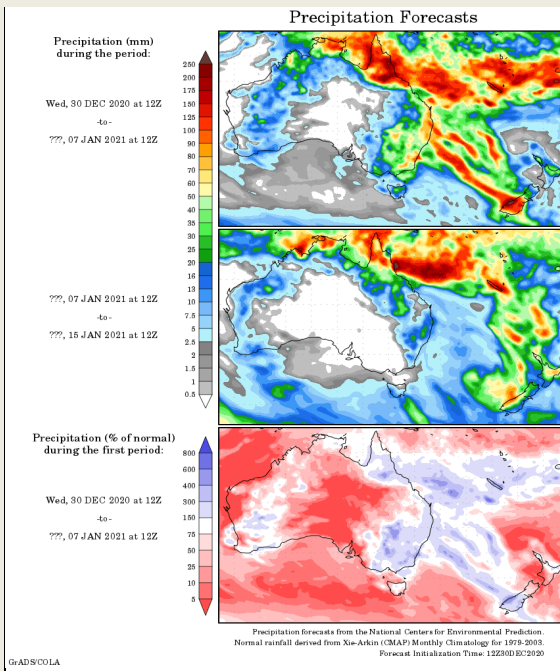
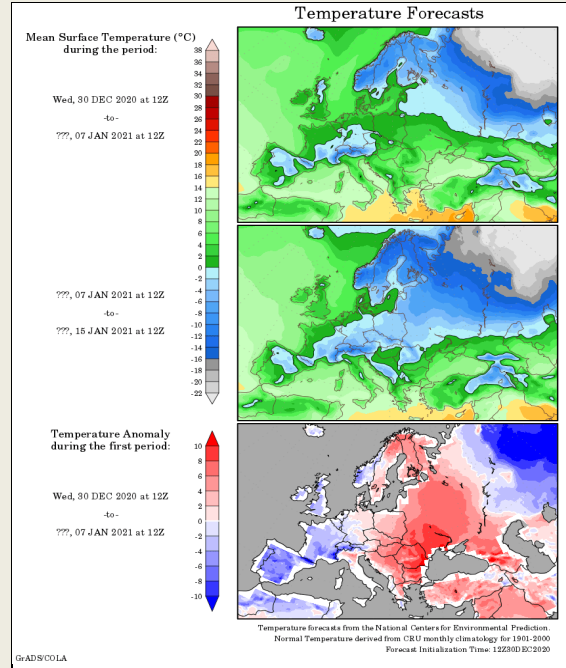
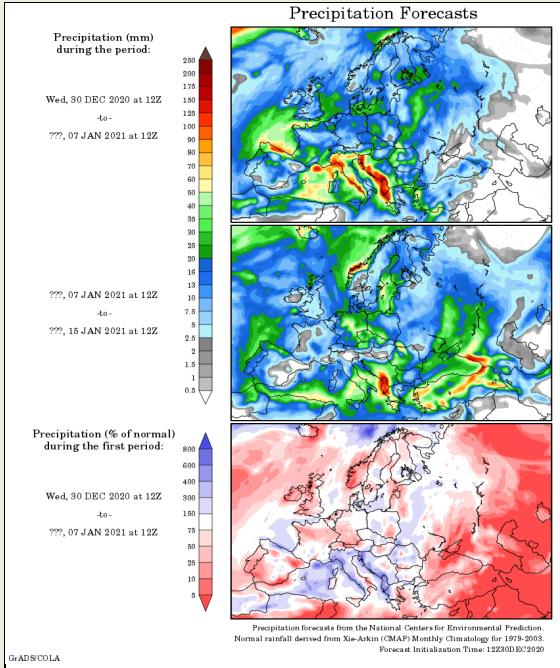


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Weather pattern changes are not expected anytime soon. The next ten days will promote frequent precipitation in Ukraine, western Russia, the Baltic States and Belarus while leaving the middle and lower Volga River Basin, Russia's Southern Region and Kazakhstan with little to no moisture. The wetter areas will continue to experience improving soil moisture and snowpack for use to crops in the spring. In the meantime, drought in Russia's Southern Region, lower Volga River Basin and western Kazakhstan will continue to be closely monitored

AUSTRALIA: Sufficient rain is expected in cotton, sorghum and other summer crop areas of New South Wales and Queensland during the next two weeks to improve dryland crop development potential and maintain a good outlook for irrigated crops. Some flooding rain is expected in sugarcane areas especially along the upper coast of Queensland and throughout the Cape York Peninsula. Livestock grazing conditions should improve with additional moisture throughout Queensland and New South Wales during the next two weeks.



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
