



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
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
South Africa - Weather

South Africa's main coarse grain and oilseed areas will continue to see a good mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. The rain will keep soil moisture at adequate to excessive levels by the end of next week, though portions of Limpopo may again trend a little dry at times. The environment will remain favorable for aggressive crop growth. Fieldwork may be sluggish during the wettest periods.









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: A tranquil weather pattern will continue through the next ten days to two weeks as dry weather will be most common with a couple rounds of mostly light precipitation and no significant storm systems for at least ten days. No major temperature swings will occur during the next week with temperatures gradually cooling starting late this week, but remaining warmer than normal in most areas and much warmer than normal in the northwest. Temperatures will begin to cool in the northwest Jan. 16.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a few rounds of precipitation during the next two weeks with dry weather most common overall, Precipitation will fall today from the Carolinas into southern Virginia where moisture content will be 0.10-0.40" and locally more with lighter precipitation in parts of southern South Carolina. A rain and snow mix will occur with 1 to 3 inches of snow in northwestern and north-central North Carolina and nearby Virginia and lighter snow further to the east.

② Other areas will be mostly dry.









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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: A good mix of rain and sunshine and favorable conditions for crop development will occur across much of Brazil and Paraguay during the next two weeks with a beneficial increase in rain beginning this weekend in Bahia and northeastern Minas Gerais.


o Central into eastern Bahia and northeastern Minas Gerais will continue to see poor conditions for


crop development in unirrigated areas until rain increases this weekend.

ARGENTINA: No significant changes have been made to the two-week outlook since Thursday and stress to crops should continue to rise before timely rain event Sunday into Monday and Thursday into Jan. 16 induce at least temporary relief from dryness in most areas. If both of these rain events occur as advertised, much of Argentina will receive enough rain to stop declines in crop conditions and restore some yield potential, at least for a while. Dire weather will resume Jan. 17-22 and most areas outside of the pockets mentioned above will have adequate soil moisture to support the needs of crops through Jan. 22, but rain will need to return soon to prevent dryness and crop stress from increasing.









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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Precipitation will be greatest over southern portions of the European Continent through Tuesday and an increase in snow cover will occur in Spain and as well as northern and central Italy and Slovenia into Greece Saturday into Monday


AUSTRALIA: Rain showers and thunderstorms will continue over southeastern Queensland today and linger over northern sorghum production areas into the weekend


o Additional moisture totals will range from 0.10 to 0.80 inch and local totals in excess of 1.00 inch in southeastern Queensland's production areas most often.

Otherwise, dry weather will prevail most often through Tuesday in eastern Australia.









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
