



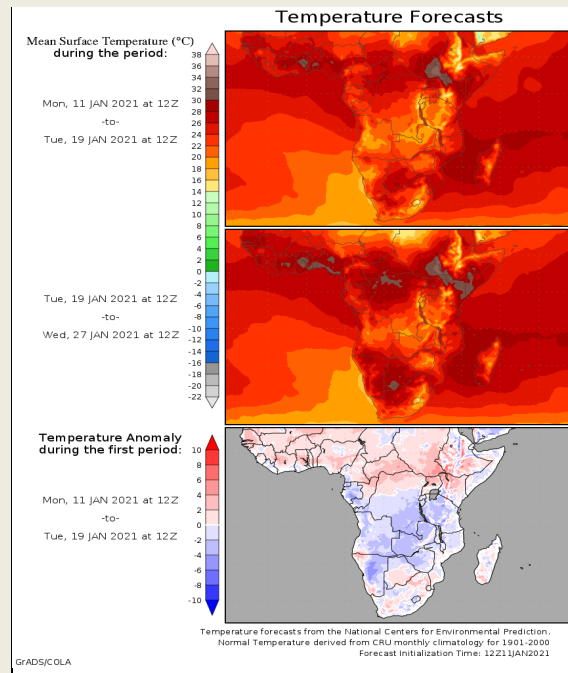
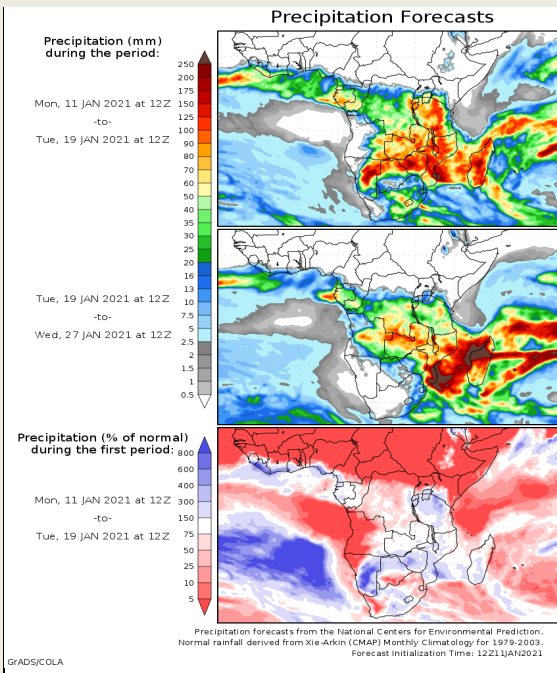
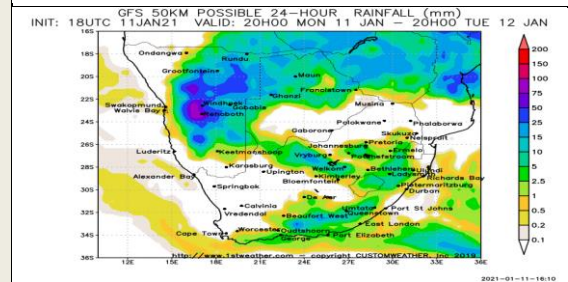
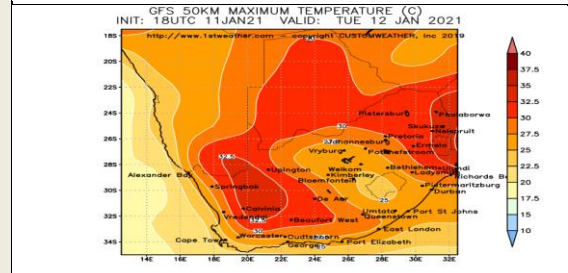
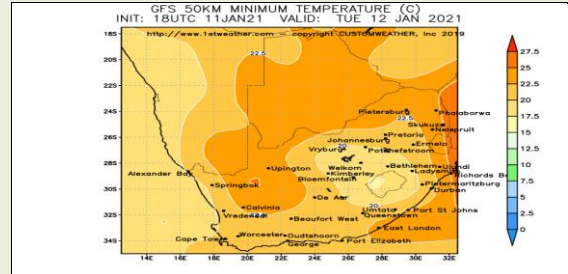
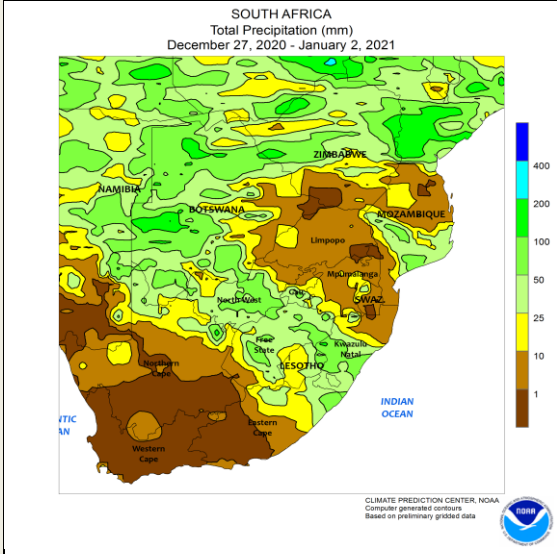
Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

Eastern and central South Africa will see several waves of erratic rainfall this week
 o The most widespread rain in the main production areas will occur through Friday
 o Precipitation will generally be restricted to eastern South Africa this weekend
 o Moisture totals by next Monday morning will range from 0.75-3.00" and local amounts over 4.00" or more from Natal and Mpumalanga into Eastern Cape, Free State, North West, and eastern Northern Cape

- Limpopo will receive 0.50-2.00" of rain with drier pockets
- Western Cape and western Northern Cape will receive little to no rain this week
- o Any rain that does occur will be lost to evaporation
- Light rain will often be scattered across the eastern half of the country January 19 – 25
- o The western half of South Africa will receive little to no rain



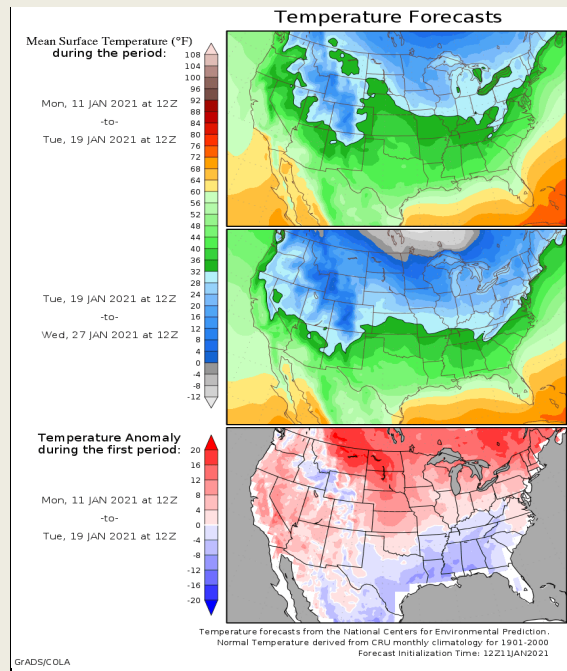
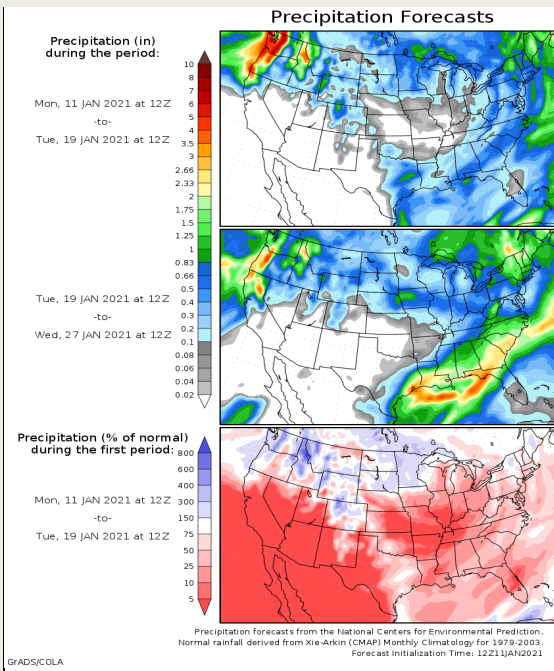
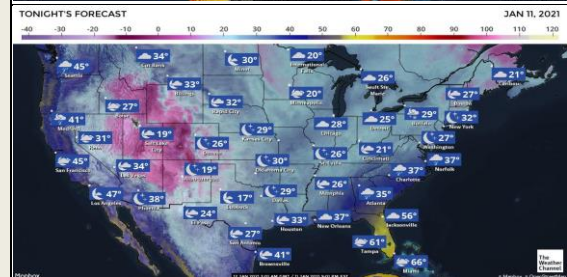
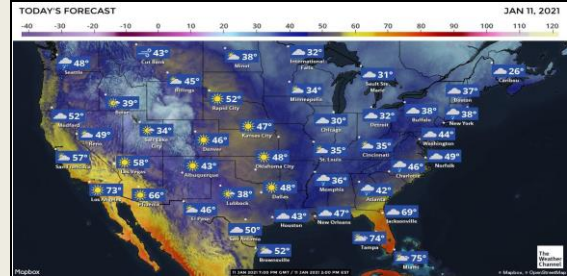
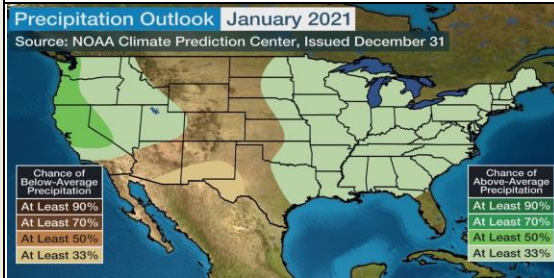

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A tranquil weather pattern will remain in place the next two weeks as dry weather will be most common with a couple rounds of mostly light precipitation and no significant storm systems for at least ten days.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The two-week outlook has not changed much since late last week and the Delta and the Southeast will see a few rounds of precipitation during the period with dry weather most common overall.

o Precipitation will fall today in most of the Southeast while the Delta is mostly dry.



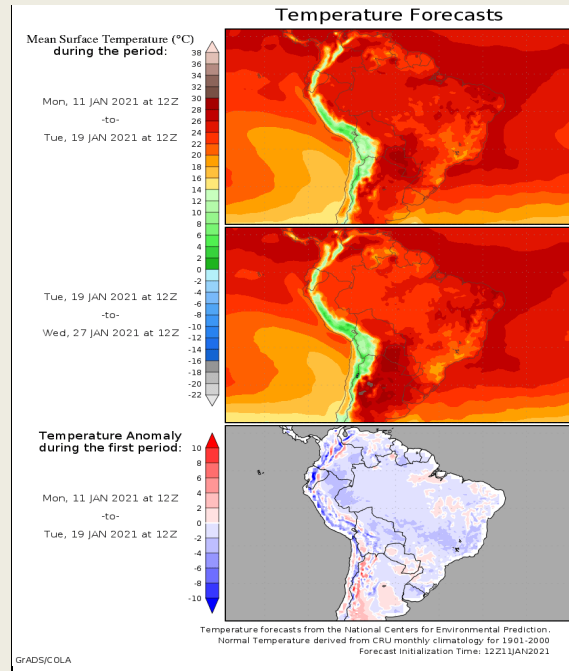
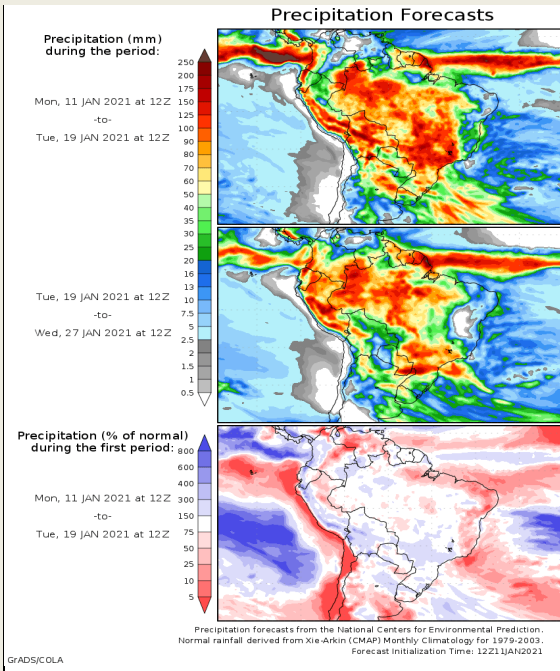
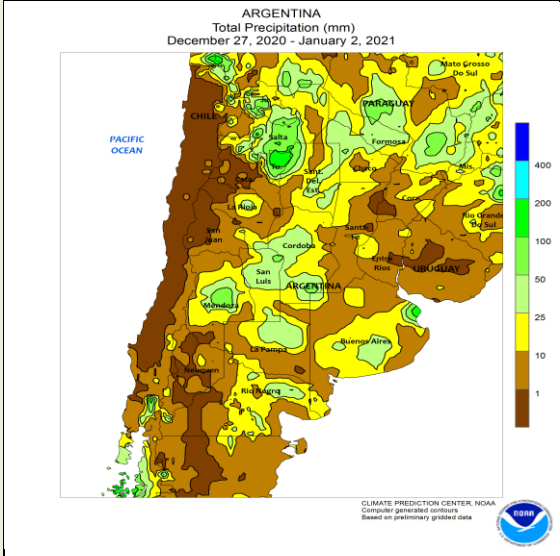

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The two-week outlook remains favorable for most developing crops in Paraguay and Brazil as a good mix of rain and sunshine will continue with two rounds of timely rain during the next week in the driest areas of Rio Grande do Sul while an exception to favorable conditions occurs in parts of northeastern Brazil where rain is not likely to be great enough to significantly improve soil conditions.

ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is more favorable for crops in much of Argentina than advertised late last week due to the better-than-expected rain that fell during the weekend, additional rain in the driest areas today, and another round of rain Thursday into Saturday.

o Recent rain and rain expected through Saturday should leave nearly all of Argentina with enough soil moisture to support developing crops into late this month, but with another period of drier weather occurring Sunday into Jan. 25 rain will be needed again in the last days of the month or early February.



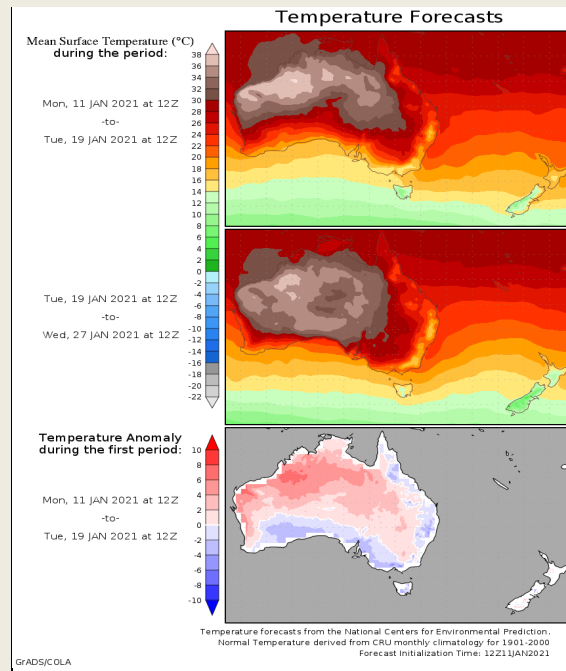
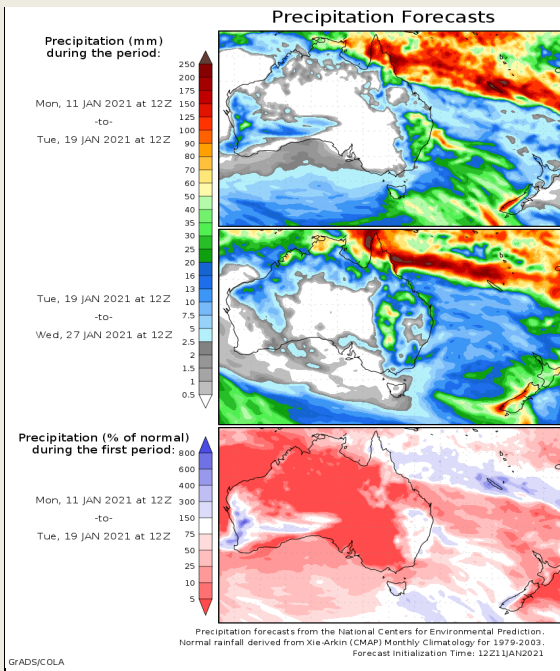
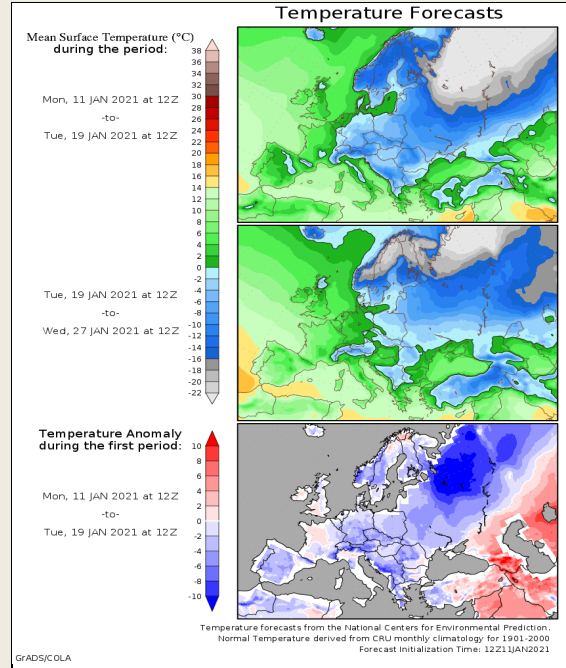
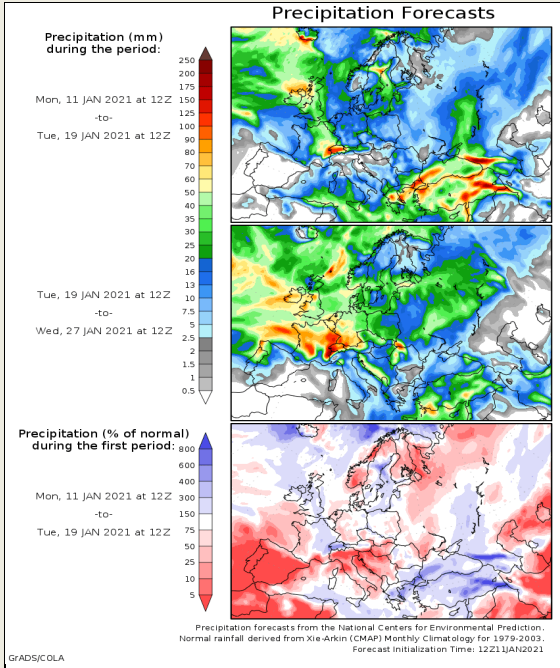

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Significant precipitation will continue to impact areas from Greece into Bulgaria today into Tuesday. Moisture totals will vary from 0.50 to 2.00 inches and locally greater amounts. Surrounding areas of the Balkan Nations will receive additional moisture totals up to 0.50 inch the next couple of days.

AUSTRALIA: East-central and southeastern Australia will be mostly dry this week. Showers and thunderstorms will increase over eastern New South Wales and southeastern Queensland Friday through the weekend. Moisture will be greatest in areas along the coast and just west of the Great Dividing Range where moisture totals will vary from 0.50 to 1.50 inches and local totals up to near 3.00 inches.

Otherwise surrounding locations will receive totals varying from a trace up to 0.80 inch in the remainder of southeastern Queensland and eastern New South Wales. Drying will prevail throughout Victoria and western New South Wales most often.
