

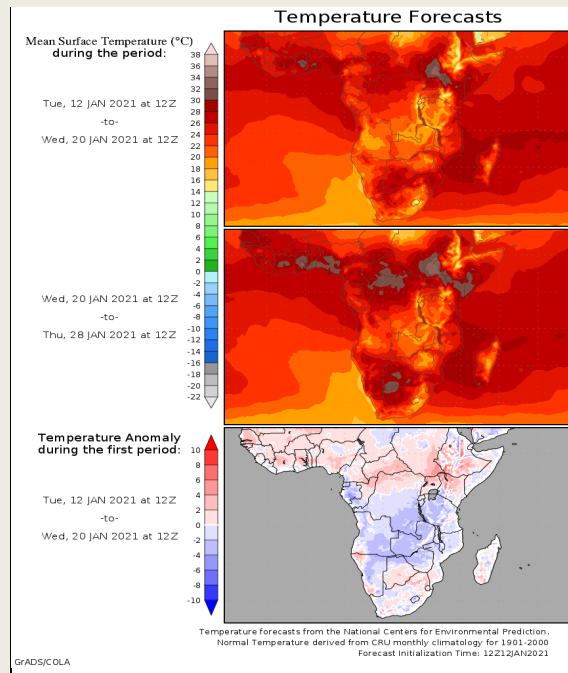
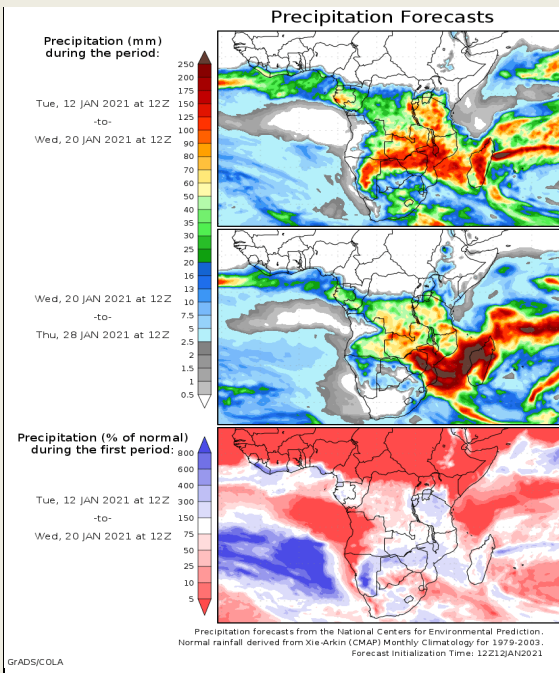
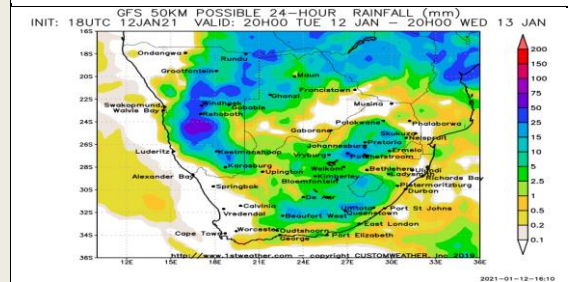
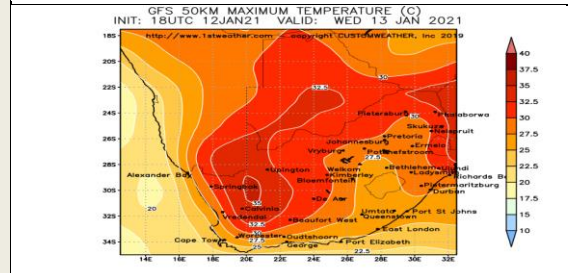
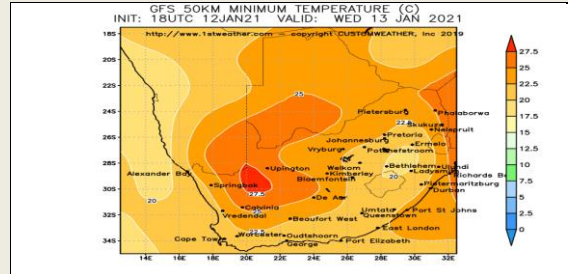
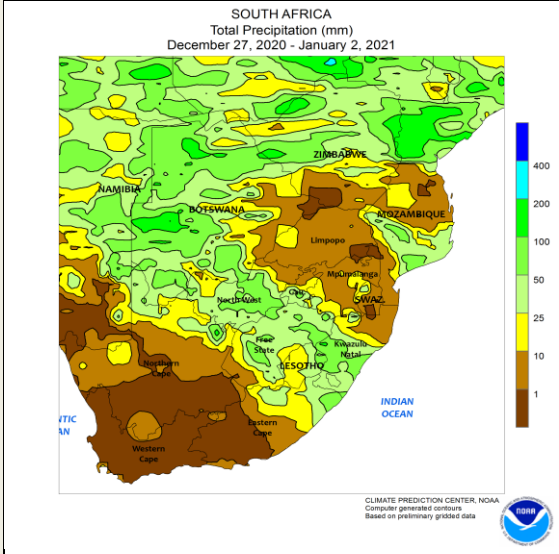


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

The main coarse grain and oilseed areas in South Africa will continue to see a good mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. The precipitation will be enough to keep soil moisture rated favorably in most locations. Crop development will advance swiftly. Fieldwork may otherwise be sluggish during the wettest periods.

United States of America - Weather

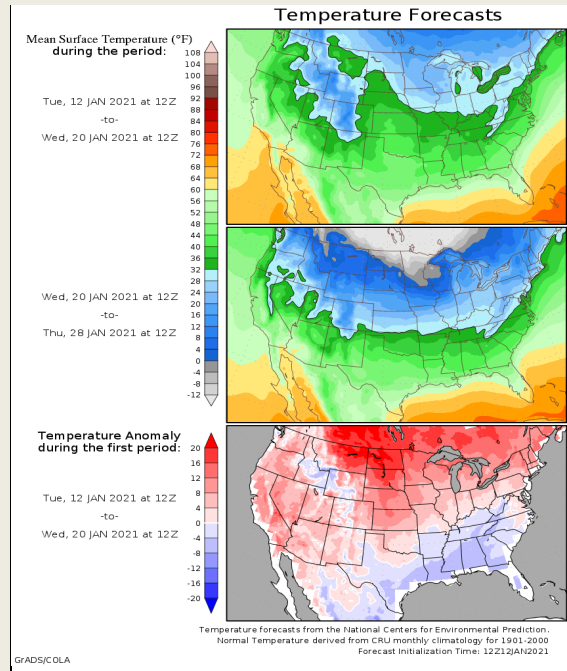
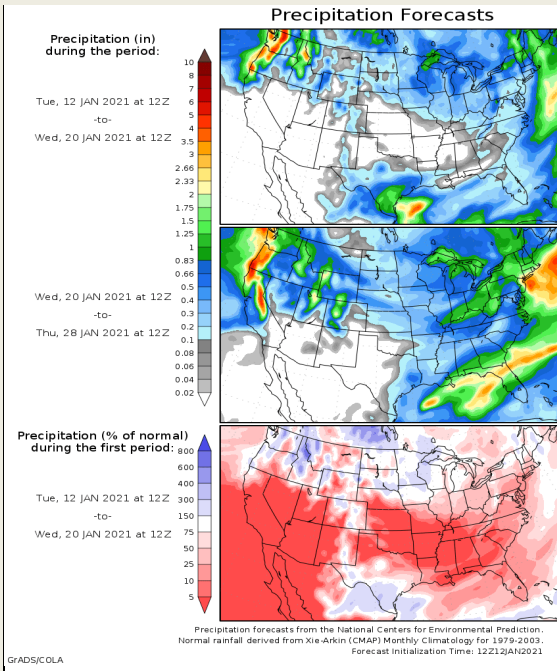
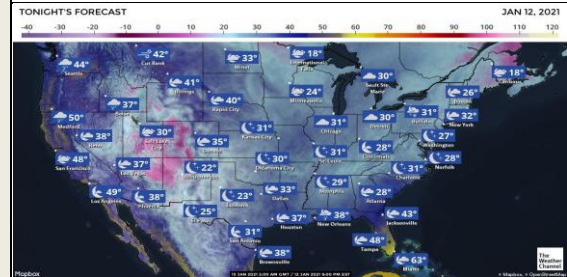
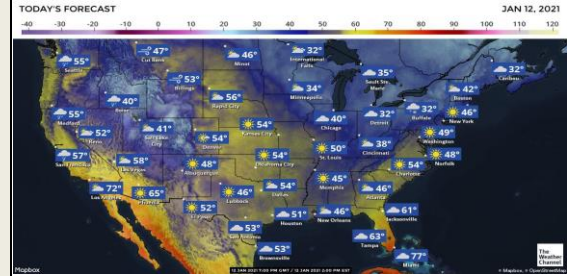
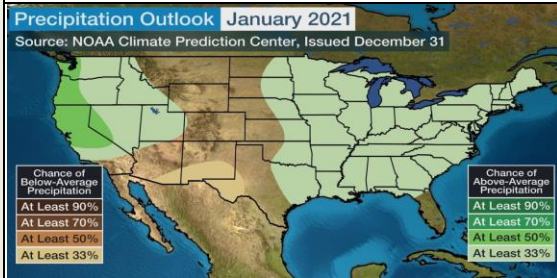
U.S. MIDWEST: Outside of some heavy snow in portions of the Upper Midwest Wednesday into Friday a relatively tranquil weather pattern will occur through the next two weeks with dry weather interrupted by a few rounds of light precipitation.

- Temperatures will be unseasonably warm through Thursday before cooling occurs Friday into early next week when temperatures will be closer to normal, but will remain warmer than usual in most areas.

- o A more significant round of cooling may occur late next week.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Rain and some snow fell on most of the Southeast Monday while the Delta was mostly dry. Moisture content of the precipitation was 0.06 to 0.31 inch most often with a few totals of 0.35 to 0.49 inch in southern Alabama while the northern Florida Peninsula into southeastern Georgia was mostly dry with southern Virginia into northern and central North Carolina mostly dry through midnight CST.

- o Snow fell Sunday night into Monday from interior southern to northern Mississippi into northwestern and north-central Alabama where totals were 1 to 4 inches with local totals to nearly 7 inches just east of central Mississippi.

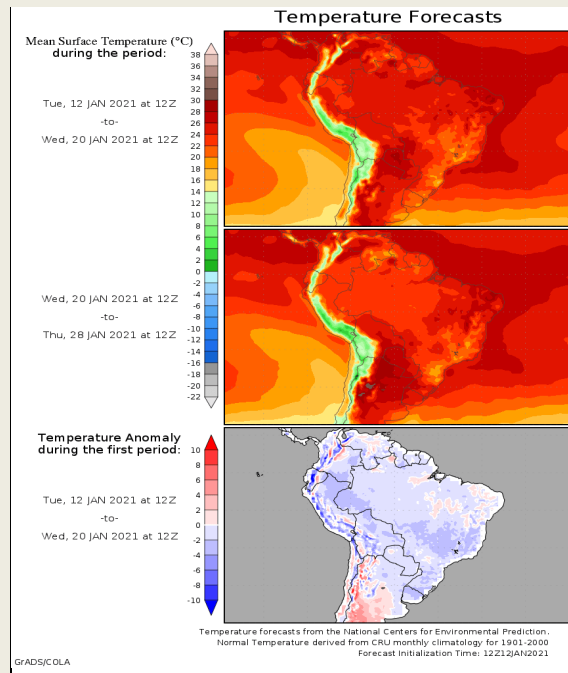
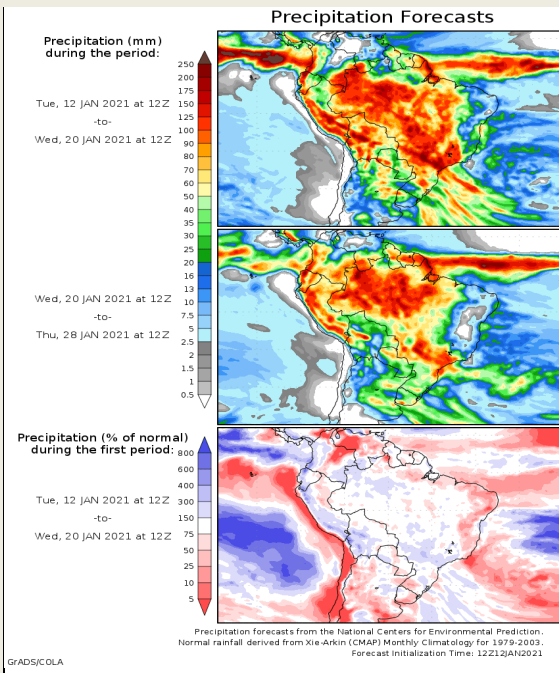
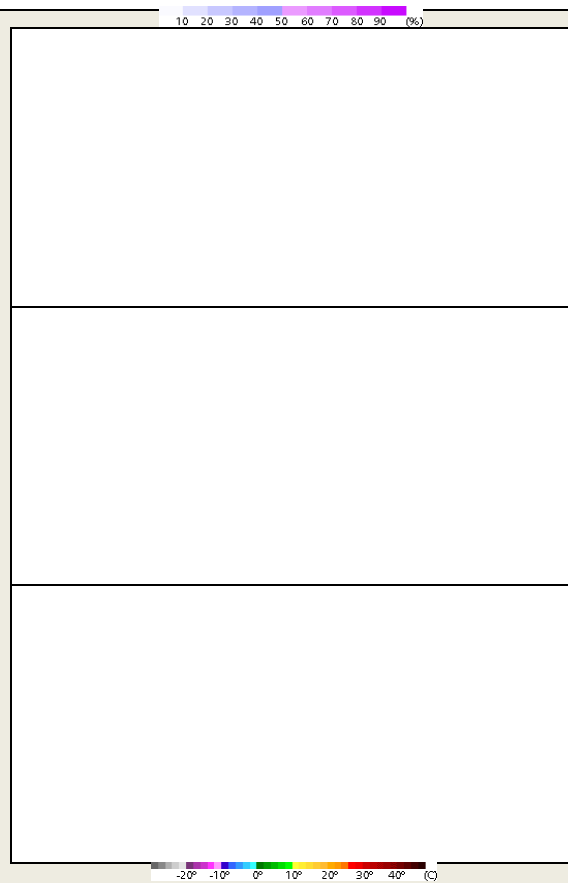
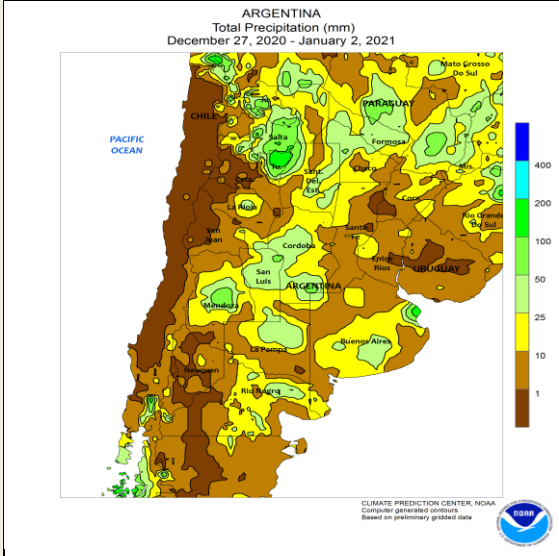

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Most developing crops in Paraguay and Brazil will see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the next two weeks another round of timely rain this weekend in the driest areas of Rio Grande do Sul while an exception to favorable conditions occurs in parts of northeastern Brazil where rain is not likely to be great enough to significantly improve soil conditions.

ARGENTINA: Recent rain and rain expected Thursday through Saturday should leave nearly all of Argentina with enough soil moisture to support developing crops into late this month, but with another period of drier weather occurring Sunday into at least Jan. 24 rain will be needed again in the last days of the month or early February.

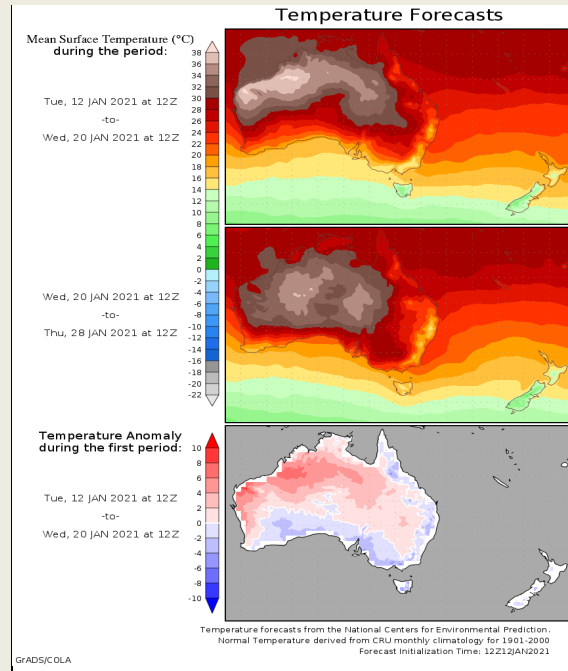
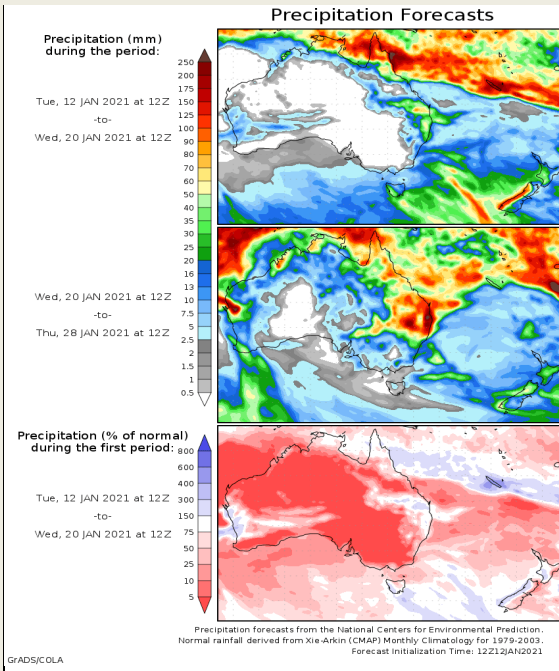
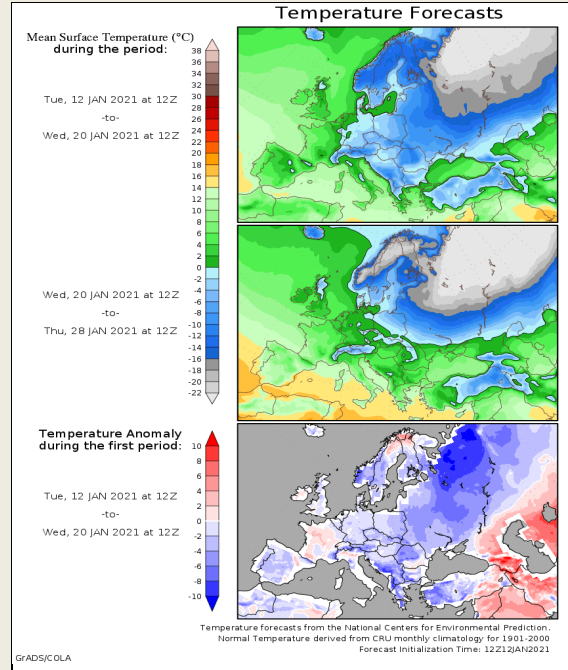
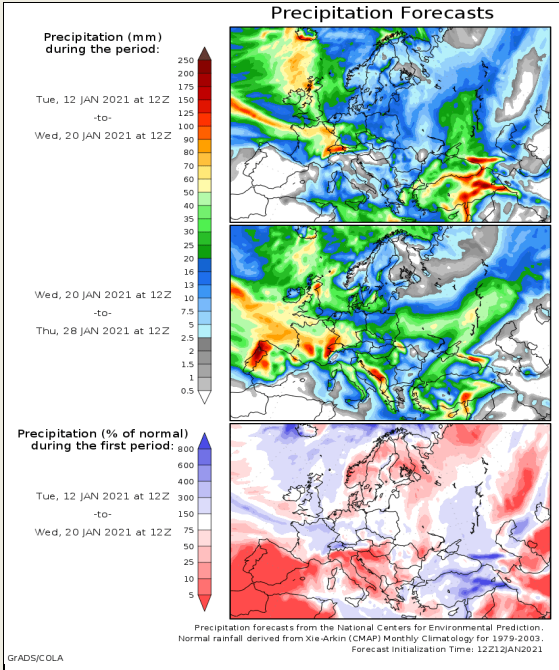

EUROPE: Significant precipitation will continue to impact areas from Greece into Bulgaria today into Tuesday. Moisture totals will vary from 0.50 to 2.00 inches and locally greater amounts. Surrounding areas of the Balkan Nations will receive additional moisture totals up to 0.50 inch the next couple of days.

AUSTRALIA: East-central and southeastern Australia will be mostly dry this workweek. Rounds of showers and thunderstorms will return to northeastern New South Wales and Queensland this weekend through next workweek. The moisture will continue to support summer crops in northeastern New South Wales and improvements in soil moisture will continue into southeastern Queensland.
