South Africa - Weather

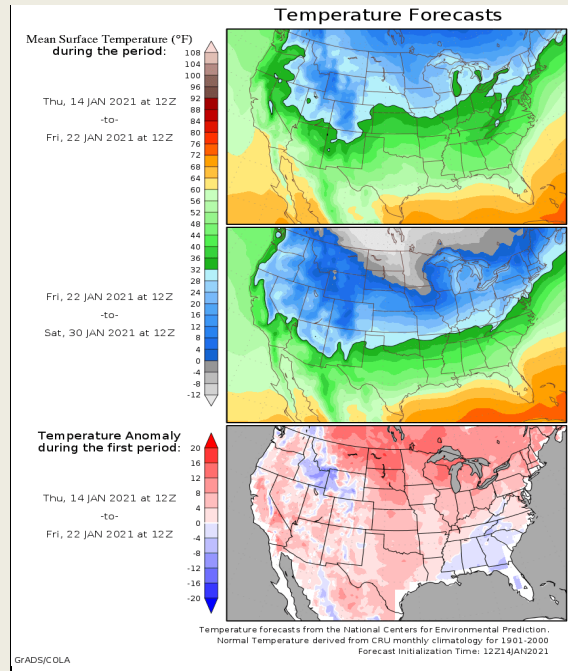
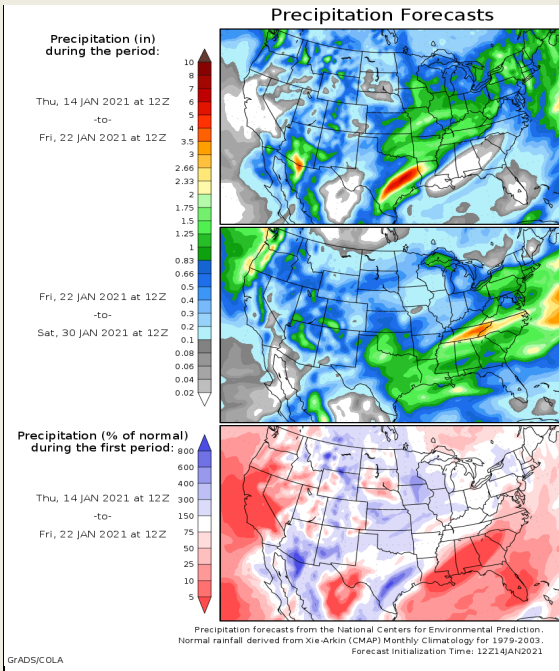
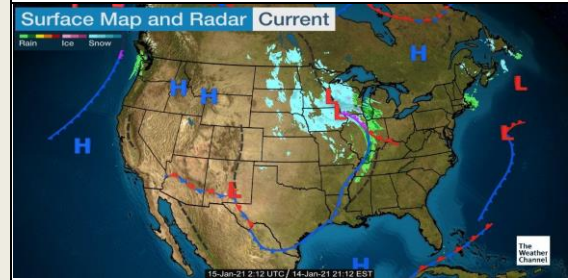
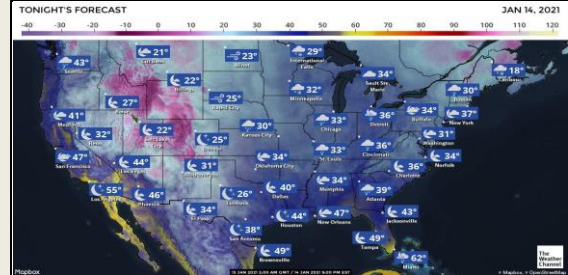
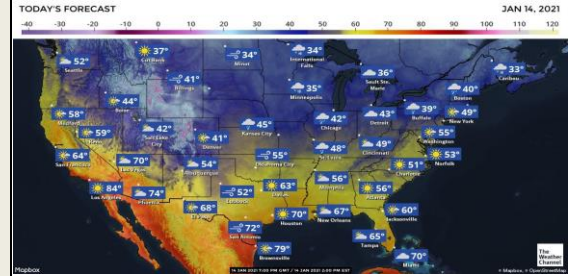
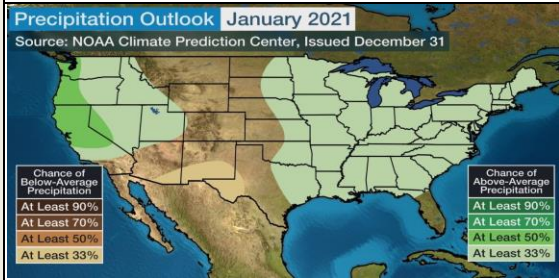
The main coarse grain and oilseed areas in eastern and central South Africa will continue to see a mix of erratic rainfall and sunshine during the coming week. The rain will help keep soil moisture near current levels in most locations, though minor amounts of drying will likely occur in portions of Limpopo and Mpumalanga. Aggressive crop development conditions will continue for most locations despite many areas in eastern South Africa drying down. Fieldwork may be sluggish during the periods of rain.

United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Blizzard conditions and some heavy snow will occur in portions of the western Corn Belt into Friday with regular occurrences of mostly light precipitation favoring the lower and eastern Midwest expected this weekend into next week.
 o Strong winds and snow will create low visibilities and cause travel delays from eastern South Dakota into central Minnesota and western Iowa with similar conditions, but weaker winds, in a large part of the remainder of the western Corn Belt.
U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see dry weather most common through Monday with precipitation more frequent Tuesday through Jan. 26 and some heavy rain possible next week in the Delta.
 o Today will be mostly dry before light rain returns to parts of the region from northern Florida and Georgia to southern Virginia tonight into Friday.



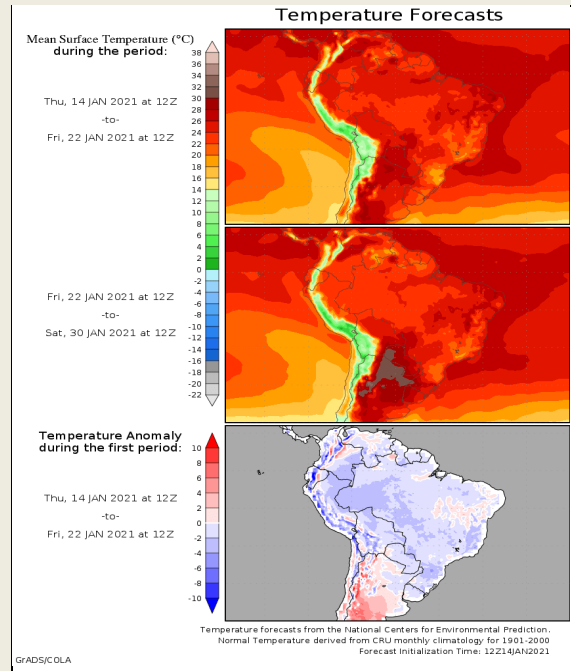
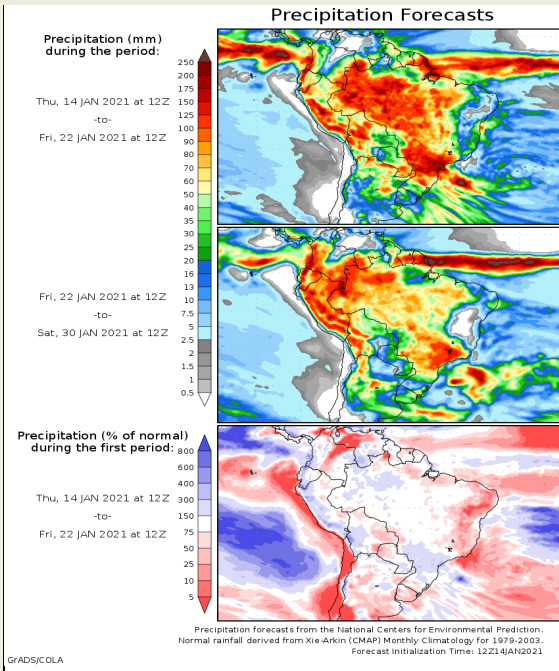
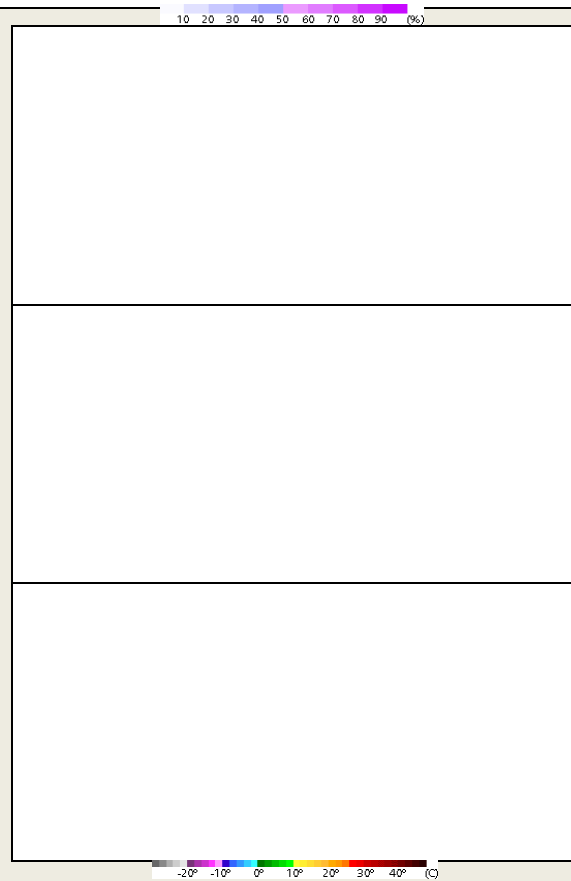
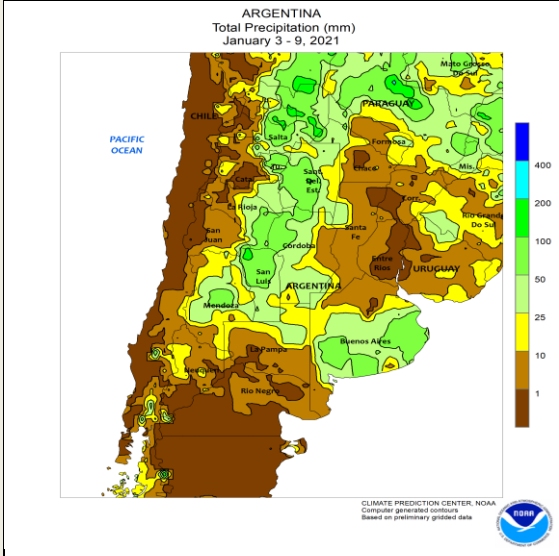

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The bottom line to the two-week outlook has not changed since Wednesday and a good mix of rain and sunshine will favorably support most developing crops in Brazil.

- An exception will occur in parts of northeastern Brazil where soil moisture is already short and rain is not likely to be great enough to significantly improve soil conditions

ARGENTINA: Recent rain and rain expected today through Saturday should leave nearly all of Argentina with enough soil moisture to support developing crops into late this month, but with another period of warmer and drier weather occurring Sunday into at least Jan. 24 rain will be needed again in the last days of the month or early February.



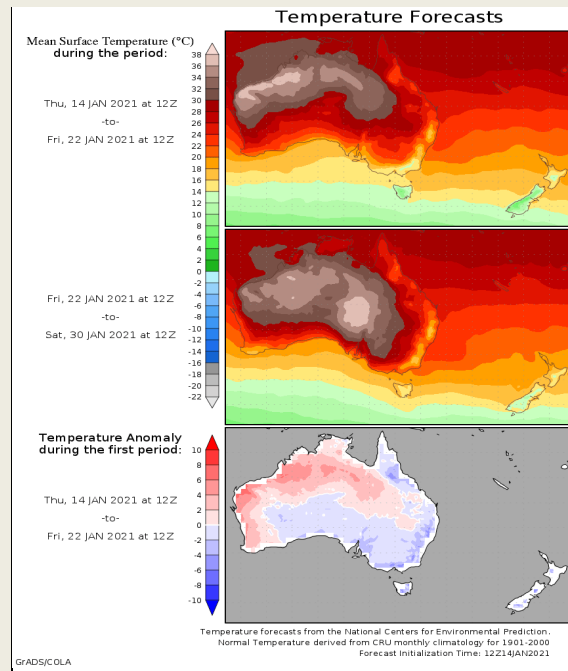
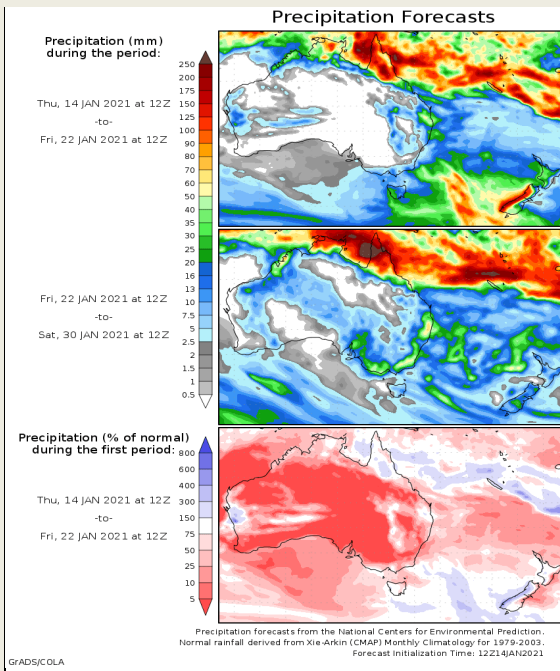
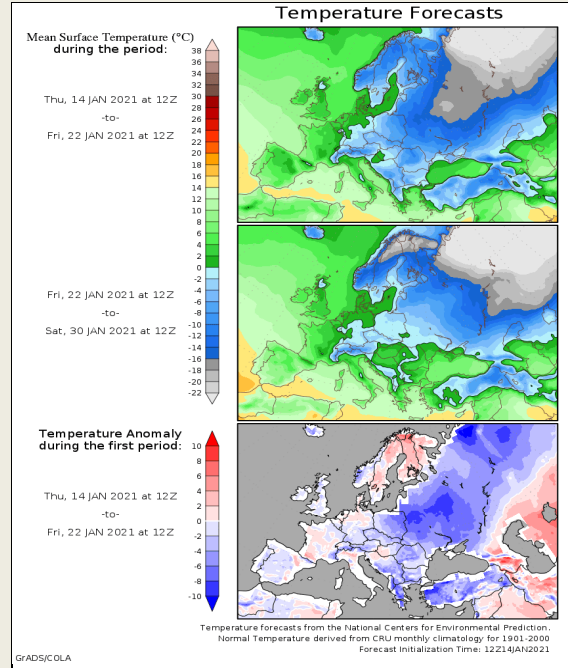
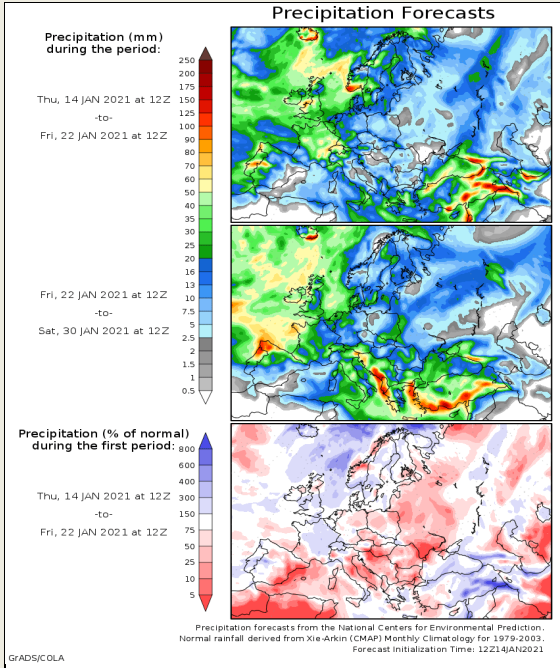

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Several rounds of precipitation will impact the U.K. and France, Belgium, the Netherlands into Switzerland and surrounding southwestern Germany the next ten days. Mostly light precipitation will occur in western France through the weekend, but moisture will increase next workweek throughout western portions of the nation.

AUSTRALIA: Net drying will occur over east-central to southeastern Australia during the coming ten days to two weeks. Sorghum and cotton development should progress with current soil moisture conditions in easternmost production areas, but crop stress will occur in western production areas and will return to some eastern areas during the second week of the outlook.

o Conditions will not be completely dry, but periodic rainfall that does occur will be brief and confined to small portions east-central to southeastern Australia most often.
