
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
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
South Africa - Weather


There is potential Tropical Cyclone Eloise will impact eastern sections of South Africa early next week. Significant rain and strong winds will be possible, though confidence is low. No significant production impacts are expected even if Tropical Storm Eloise moves near or into eastern South Africa.

South Africa's main production areas will otherwise be drier biased during the coming week. Periods of light and erratic precipitation will still occur in many locations. However, resulting rainfall will be too light to counter evaporation or impact long-term soil conditions. There will be enough moisture in the ground to maintain aggressive crop development.









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see regular rounds of mostly light precipitation through the end of the month with the strongest storm system likely occurring Monday into Wednesday of next week when some significant accumulations of ice or snow should impact at least a part of the central or southern Midwest.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a wet weather pattern through the next two week with occurrences of heavy rain infrequent enough to prevent serious concerns over flooding.

o Showers will return to areas from the central Delta to central Alabama today with the central and northern Delta to northern Alabama seeing light rain Wednesday before rain increases from the central and southern Delta to Georgia, northern Florida, and southern South Carolina Thursday into Friday.









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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Outside of some dry pockets in northern and eastern Minas Gerais and Espirito Santo, rain was nearly widespread during the holiday weekend with Rio Grande do Sul benefitting most from the rain where some soil moisture deficits were greatly reduced. The bottom line to the two-week outlook has not changed since late last week and remains favorable for most developing crops as a good mix of rain and sunshine will continue with exceptions continuing in parts of northeastern Brazil where soil moisture is already short and rain is not likely to be great enough to significantly improve soil conditions


ARGENTINA: A warm and drier weather pattern will return to Argentina during the next two weeks and significant drying will occur in much of the country.



o Crop stress should rise in southeastern areas while most other areas will receive at least some ra and should have enough soil moisture to support developing crops through the next two weeks.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Several rounds of precipitation will impact the U.K. and France, Belgium, the Netherlands into Switzerland and surrounding southwestern Germany the next ten days. Mostly light precipitation will occur in western France through the weekend, but moisture will increase next workweek throughout western portions of the nation.

AUSTRALIA: Net drying will occur over east-central to southeastern Australia this week. Conditions will not be completely dry, but rain that occurs will be light and erratic and net drying will occur in most locations. The only exception to drying will be a few small pockets of stronger thunderstorms in northeastern New South Wales in and around the Great Dividing Range.









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
