



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
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
#### **South Africa - Weather**

Tropical Cyclone Eloise is still slated to track from Madagascar through southern Mozambique and eventually into eastern South Africa through early next week. Eloise will generally impact Limpopo, northeastern Mybumalanga, and neighboring areas late Saturday into Monday. Flooding due to heavy rain will be the greatest concern, though the most significant precipitation will occur outside the main crop production areas. Overall impacts to the coarse grains and oilseeds will be minimal. Outside of Limpopo and northeastern Mybumalanga, arinfall will be restricted for the main coarse grain and oilseed areas in eastern and central South Africa during the coming week. Light rain will still occur at times, though resulting rainfall will be too light to counter evaporation. There will still be plenty of moisture to maintain aggressive growth in most locations. Timely rain will likely be needed later in February to keep the ground from becoming too dry for the crops.









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
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
#### **United States of America - Weather**


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see regular rounds of mostly light precipitation through the next week with nearly widespread precipitation this weekend more localized precipitation during the remainder of the period before drier weather returns Jan. 28-Feb. 3.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a wet weather pattern through Monday with some heavy rain Thursday into Friday and Saturday night into Monday before drier weather Tuesday through Feb. 3 prevents serious concerns over flooding.

o The central and northern Delta to northern Alabama to northern Georgia will see light rain today before rain increases from the central and southern Delta to Georgia and nearby Florida and central and southern South Carolina Thursday into Friday.









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
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
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
#### **South America - Weather**


BRAZIL: The two-week outlook remains favorable for most developing crops as a good mix of rain and sunshine will continue with exceptions continuing in parts of northeastern Brazil where soil moisture is already short and rain is not likely to be great enough to significantly improve soil conditions. Mato Grosso will need drier weather late this month and in early February to allow soybeans to be harvested as quickly as possible to prevent further delays to planting of the second season corn crop.

ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is wetter for the last days of the month and after warm to hot and dry weather in most areas into Monday depletes the topsoil moisture a timely period of wet weather will occur in much of the country outside of some southern areas Tuesday through Sunday, Jan. 31. o The rain should arrive in time to prevent serious crop stress in most areas outside of the exceptions listed below, but most areas will not receive the soaking of rain needed to ensure flavorable crop conditions deep into February without another round of timely rain soon.









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
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
# **Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather**


EUROPE: Precipitation will spread throughout western and northern Europe into central Italy and the eastern Adriatic Sea Nations through Friday and eventually into Eastern Europe this weekend into Tuesday.
Although some pockets of limited precipitation will occur in a few areas in southeastern Spain near coast as well as a few areas of Eastern Europe.


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
