

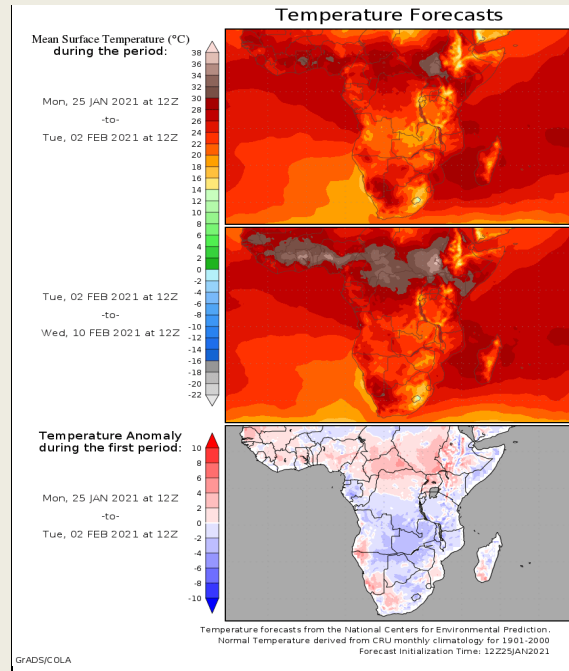
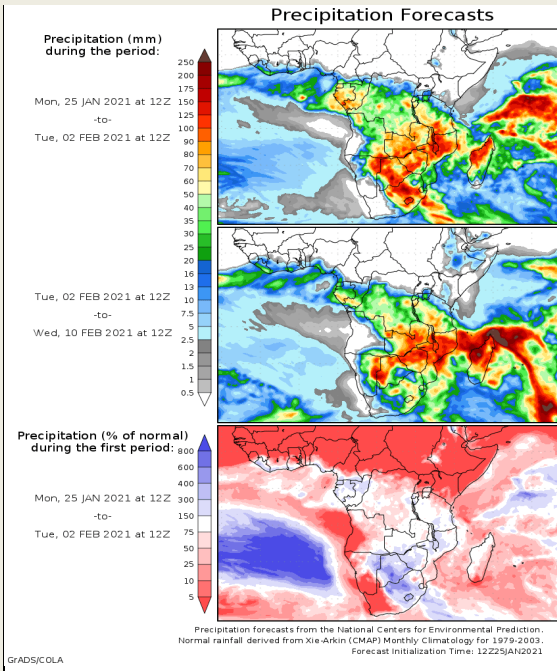
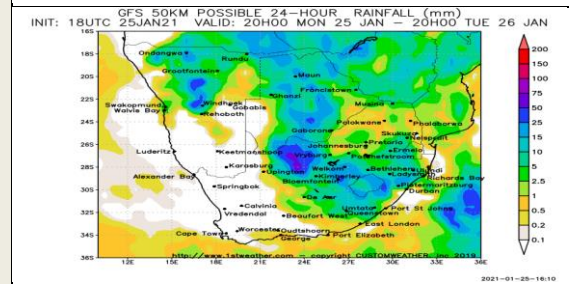
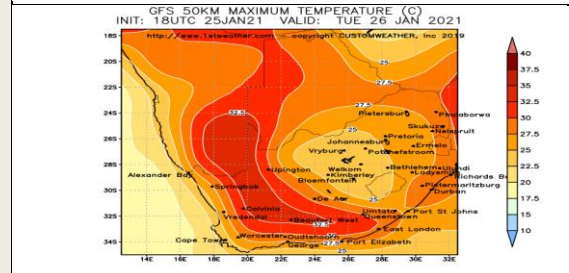
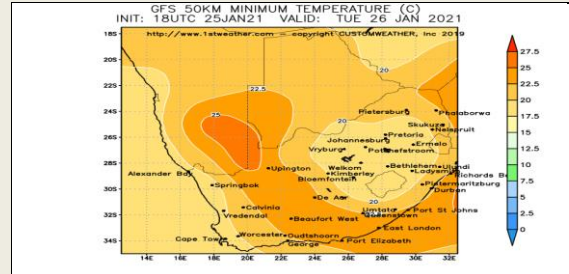
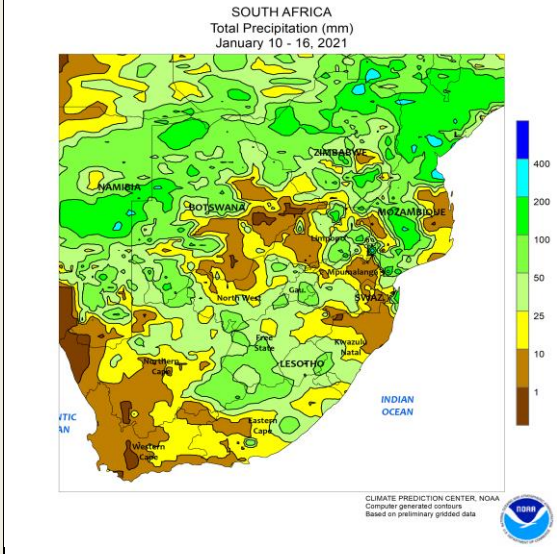


Weather Report

South Africa - Weather

Remnants of Tropical Cyclone Eloise will continue to generate rain in portions of central and eastern South Africa today. The main coarse grain and oilseed areas will continue to see several waves of rain for the remainder of the week as well. The precipitation will bolster soil moisture or keep soil moisture rated favorably in most locations. Aggressive crop development is expected, though fieldwork may be sluggish at times in the wettest areas.

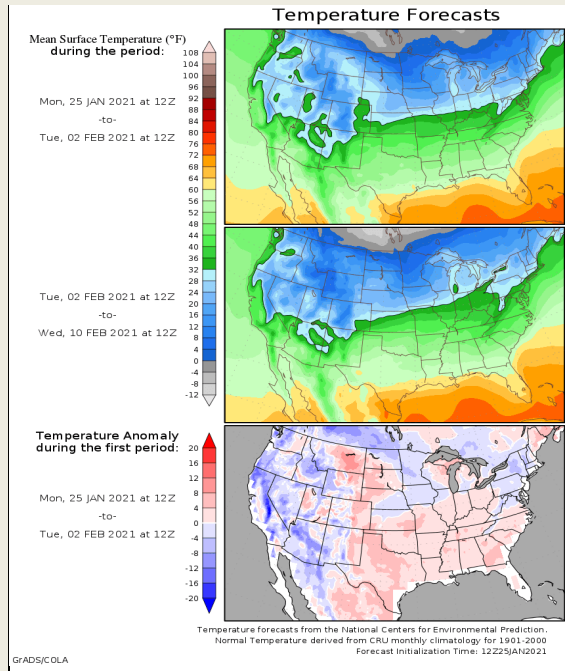
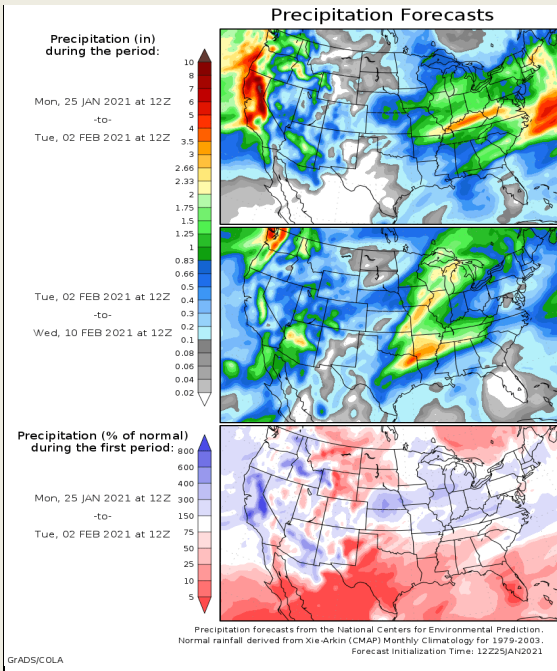
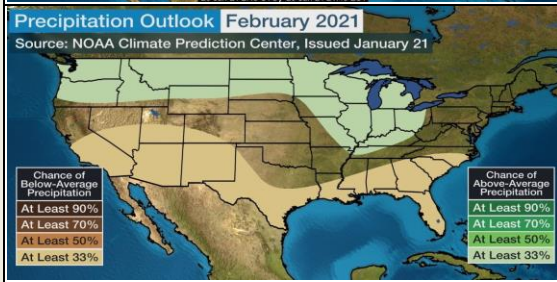
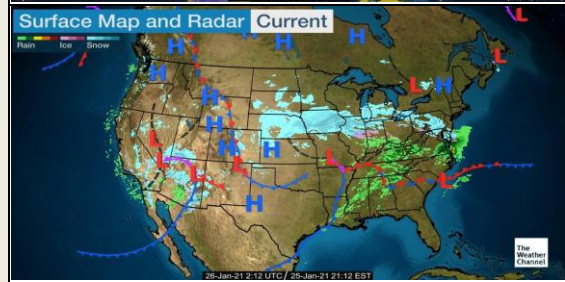
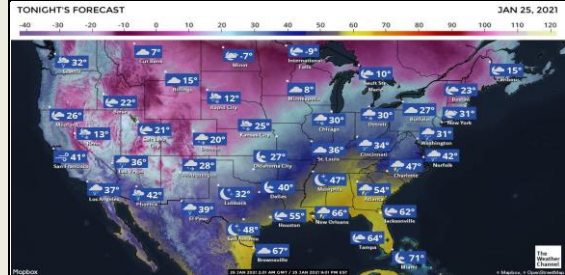
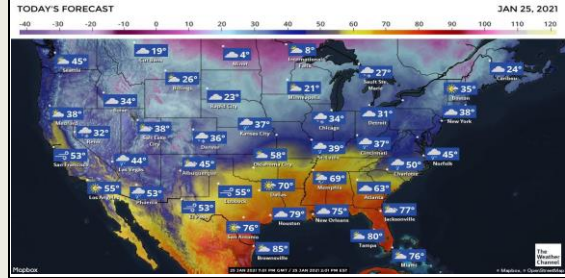
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: Today's forecast is a little wetter for the first days of February and regular rounds of precipitation will cross the Midwest through the next two weeks.

o Most of the precipitation will be light and the only round of nearly widespread precipitation will occur Saturday through Monday.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a wet weather pattern through the next two weeks with some heavy rain and Saturday night into Monday from the central and northern Delta to northern Georgia.

o Some localized flooding may occur, but serious flooding does not appear likely.

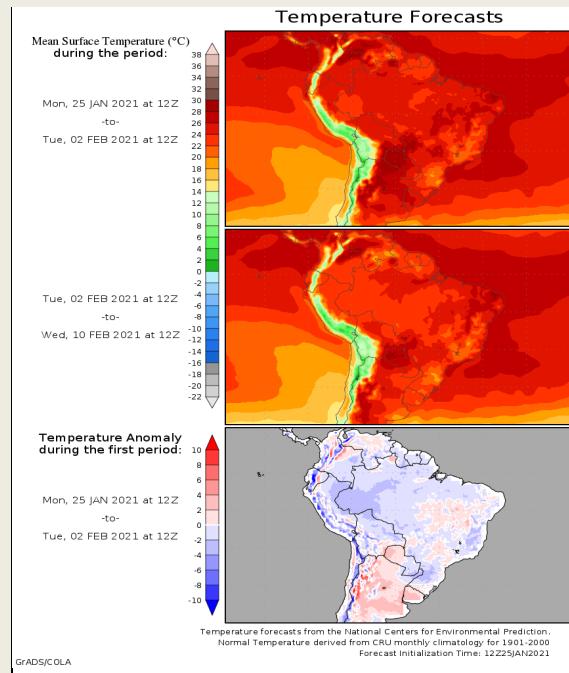
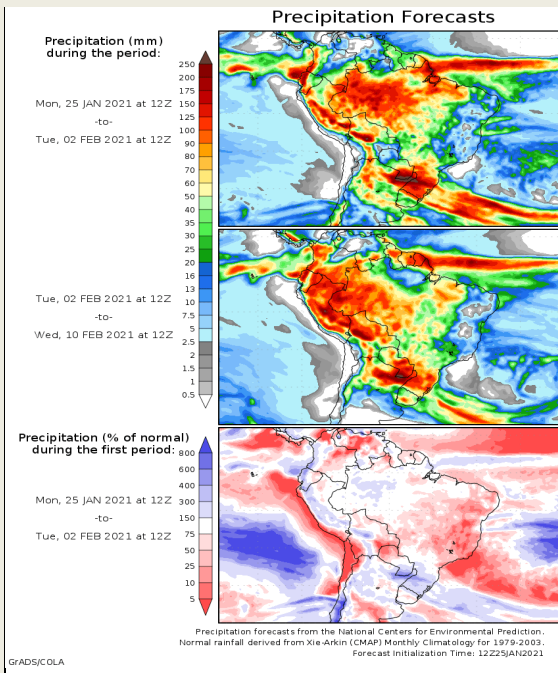
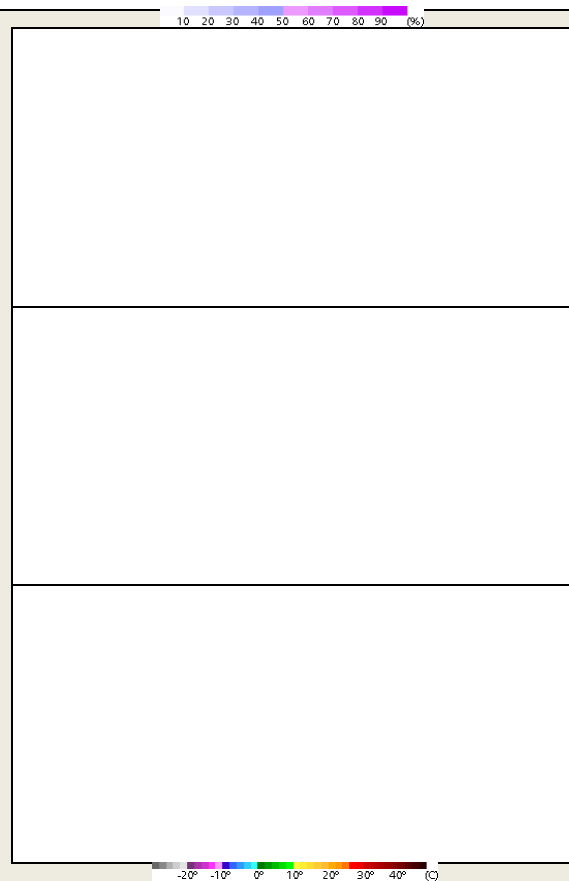
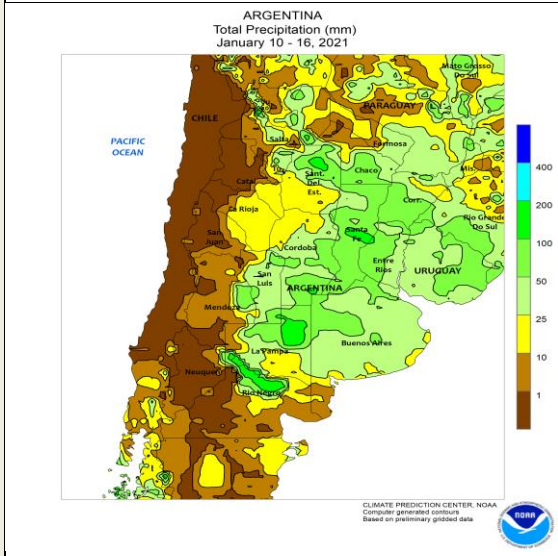

South America - Weather

BRAZIL: The most notable change in the two-week outlook since late last week include a temporary increase in rain in northeastern Brazil Feb. 1-3 and less frequent rain in Mato Grosso Feb. 1-8 where some soybean harvesting and planting of second season corn should occur. Mato Grosso needs a drier biased weather pattern during the next three to four weeks to allow soybeans to be harvested as quickly as possible to prevent further delays to planting of the second season corn crop.

ARGENTINA: Relief from the warm to hot and dry weather that most areas have recently experienced is still expected this week and nearly all of the country will receive enough rain by Sunday to at least temporarily improve soil moisture and most areas should be left with enough soil moisture to support developing crops through the first week of February.

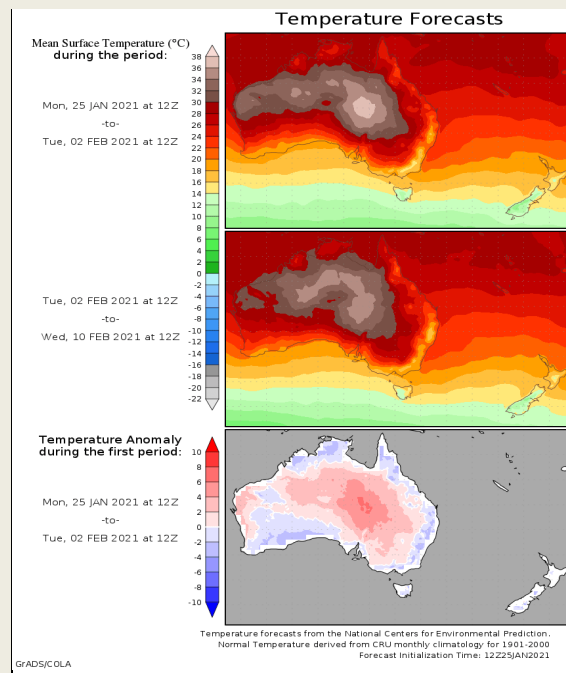
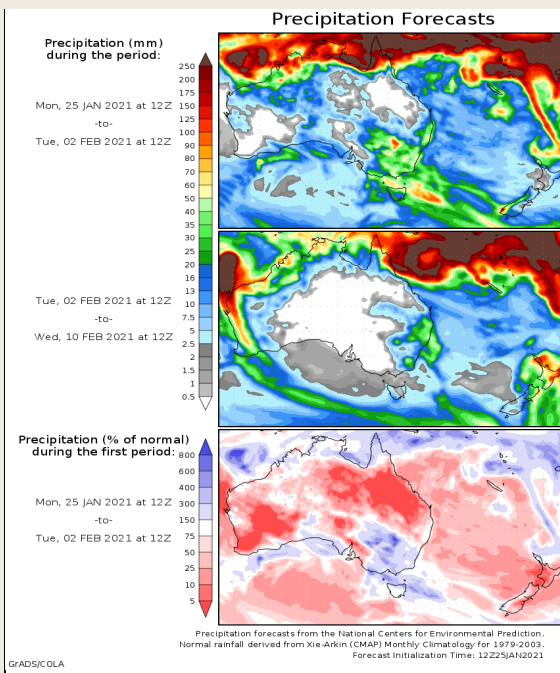
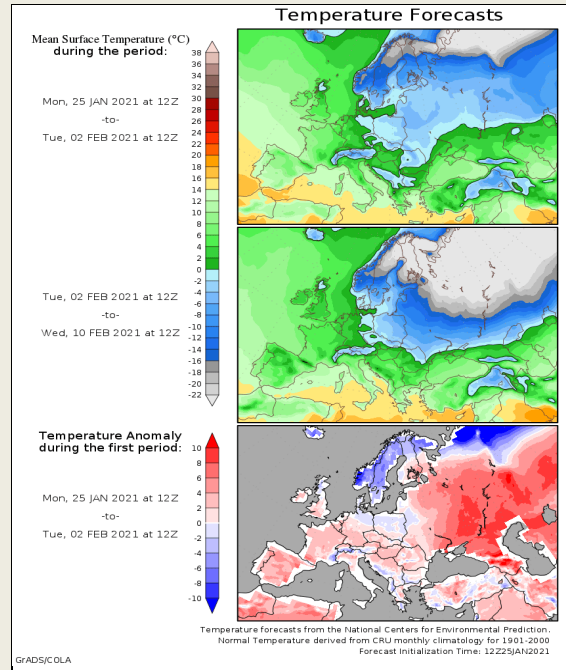
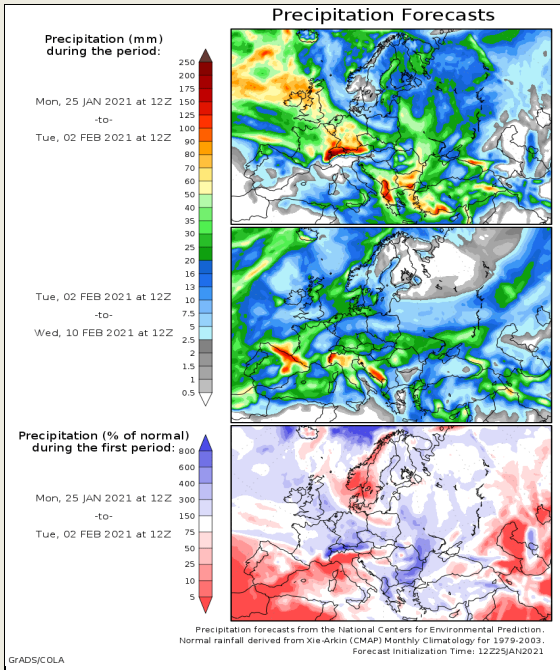

Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Not much has changed in the outlook since Thursday. Precipitation will continue to spread from northern Spain and France to southern Germany, Italy and the eastern Adriatic Sea Nations during this coming week. Precipitation will also spread into eastern Europe, Scandinavia and the U.K. this coming week, but the greater amounts of moisture will not occur until next workweek. Some pockets of limited precipitation will occur in a few areas in southeastern Spain near the coast as well as a few areas of eastern Europe.

AUSTRALIA: Frequent rounds of rain will impact southeastern South Australia and northwestern New South Wales through east-central and southeastern New South Wales and Victoria this week. Rainfall in northeastern New South Wales will be confined to areas near the coast back into the Great Dividing Range. The rain will bolster soil moisture for improved dryland and irrigated cotton, sorghum and other crops.
