

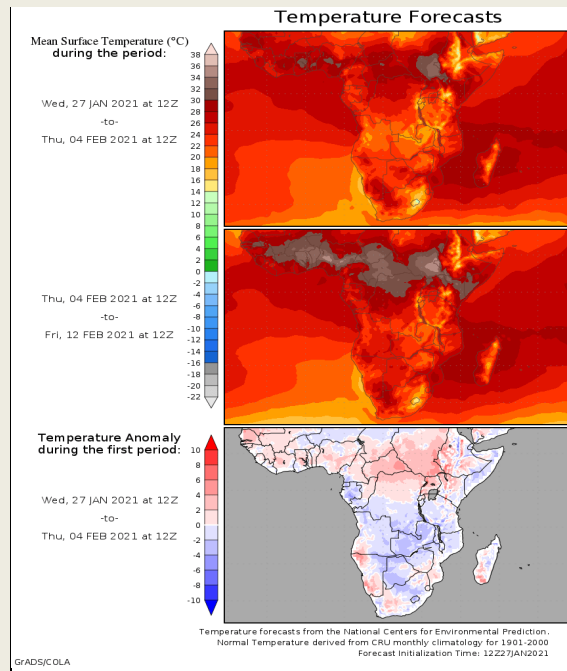
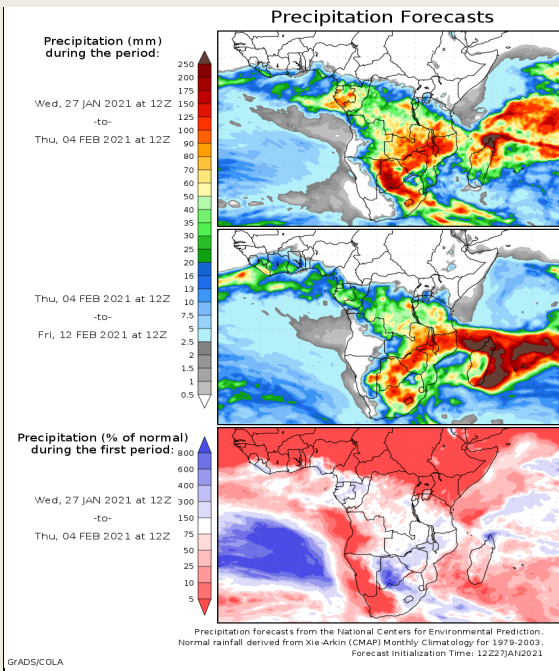
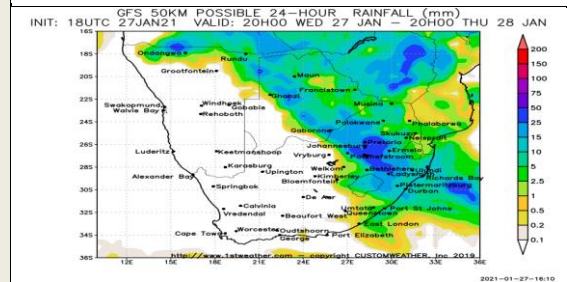
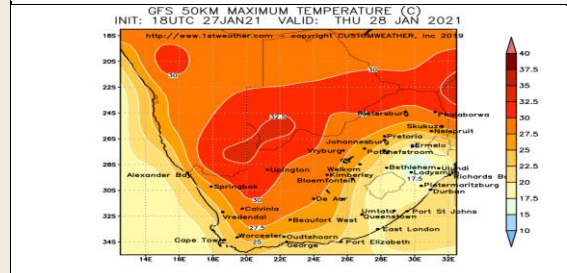
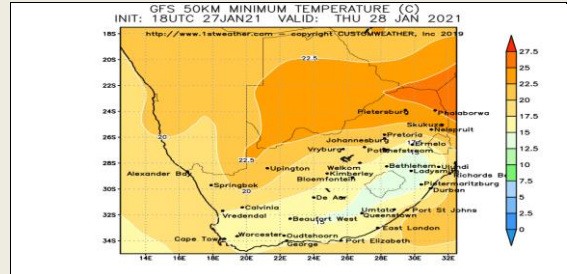
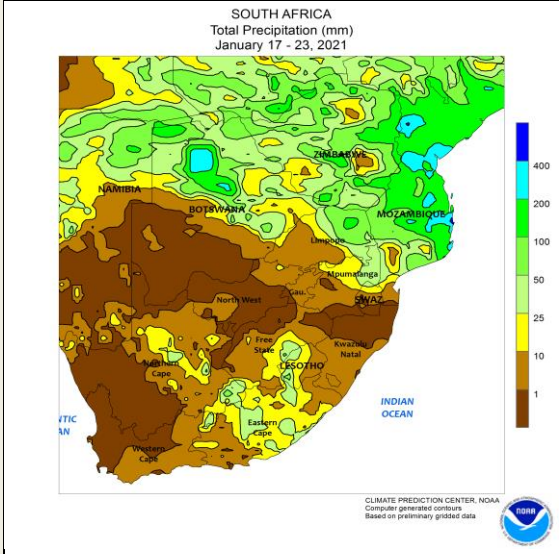


Weather Report

28 January 2021

South Africa - Weather

Periods of heavy rain will continue for Free State, North West, and neighboring areas during the next few days. Flash flooding will be possible and could damage a small amount of coarse grains and oilseeds. However, no significant production losses are expected. Development may be slowed in the wettest areas as well. The environment will otherwise remain mostly favorable for the summer crops in eastern and central South Africa.



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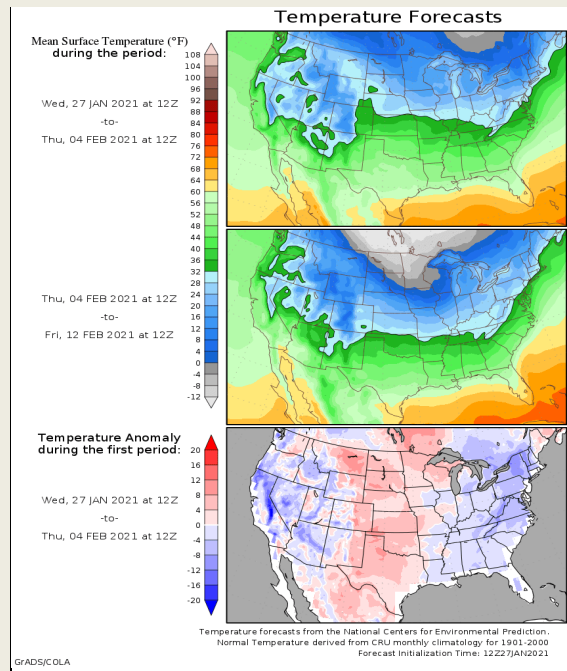
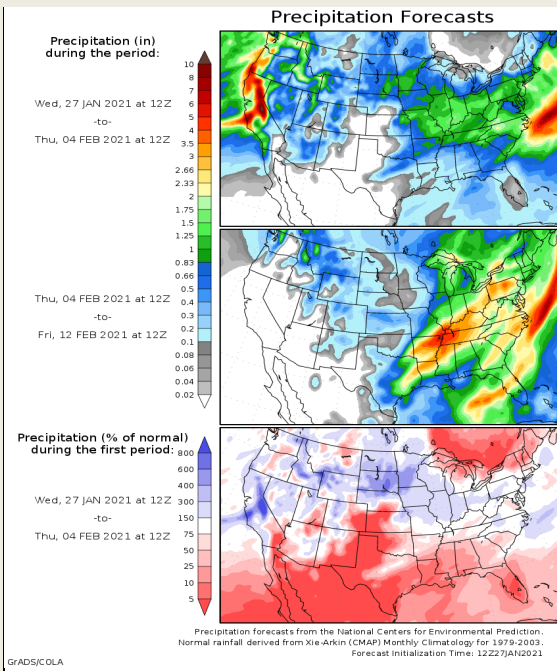
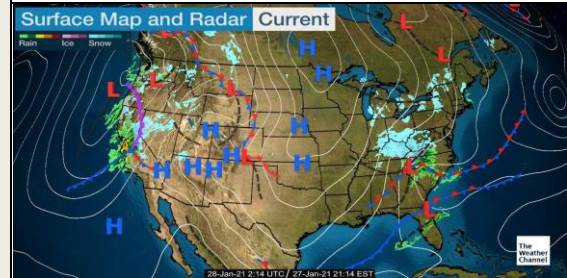
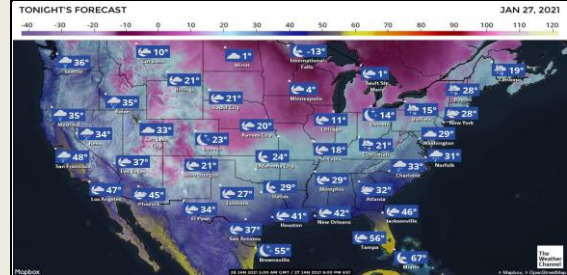
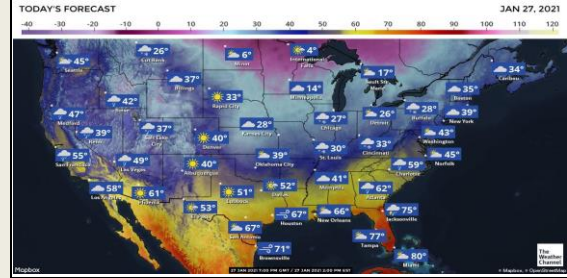
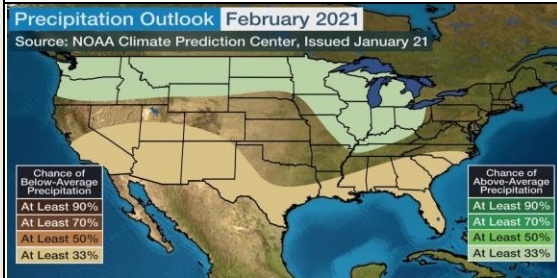
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see an active weather pattern through late next two week with little heavy precipitation through this weekend before a significant storm system affects the region Feb. 3-5.

- o Precipitation will be nearly widespread Saturday into Sunday with eastern Kansas to Ohio and Kentucky wettest.
- o The Feb. 3-5 storm system will be closely monitored as there could be some heavy snow associated with the storm and much colder temperatures following the storm system.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a wet weather pattern through next week with most of the precipitation not likely to be heavy enough to raise serious concerns over flooding.

- o Rain will fall on the northern Delta and a large part of the Southeast today.
- o Rainfall totals will be up to 0.40" and locally more most often with most of North Carolina and southern Virginia seeing 0.30-1.0" and locally more while eastern Mississippi to central Alabama is mostly dry.

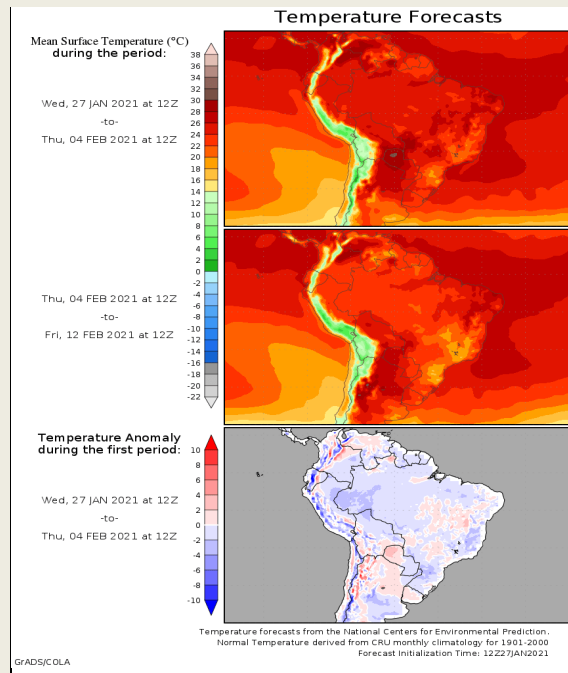
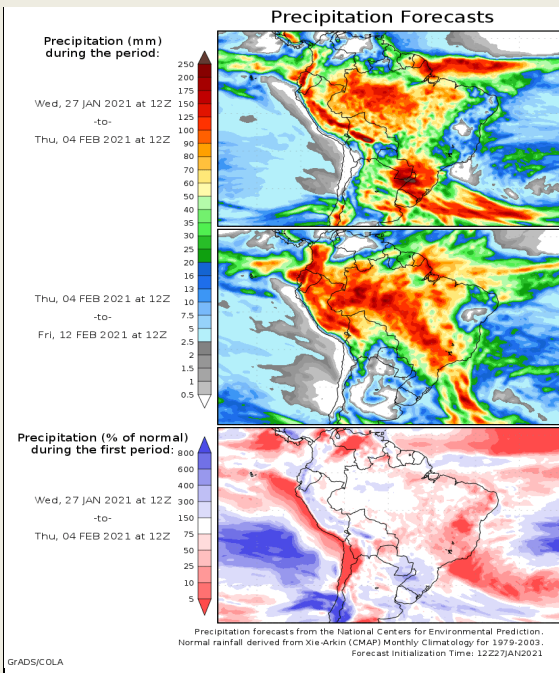
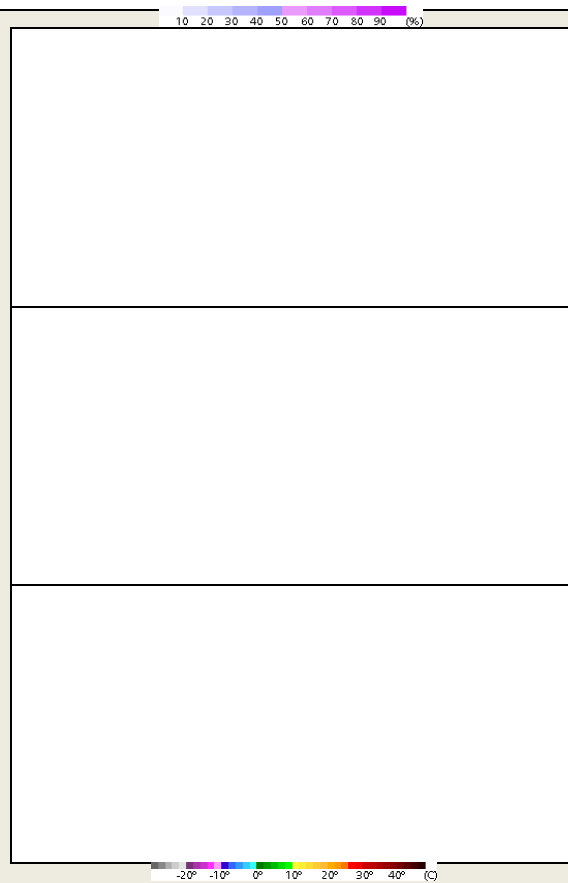
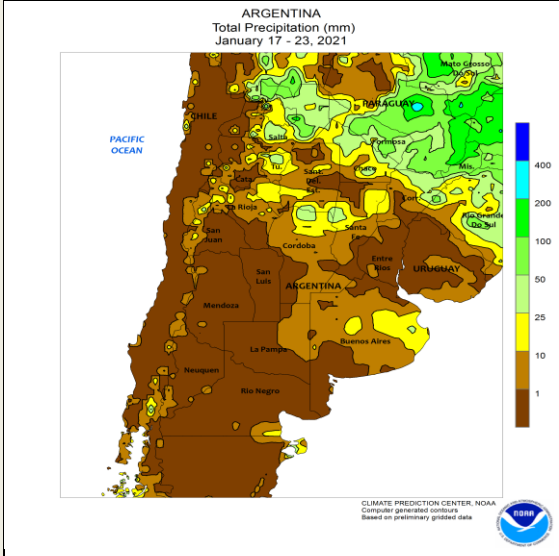


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: An increase in rain is still expected in northeastern Brazil next week while Mato Grosso will see regular rounds of rain during the next two weeks that will slow fieldwork, but there will be breaks in the rain and some fieldwork, should advance around the precipitation. Mato Grosso needs a good balance of sunny weather and rainfall during the next three to four weeks to allow soybeans to be harvested as quickly as possible and to prevent further delays to planting of the second season corn crop. Most crops in Paraguay and Brazil outside of the northeastern areas mentioned above, will receive enough rain during the next two weeks to maintain favorable conditions for crop development with some heavy rain and flooding from southern Paraguay into Rio Grande do Sul.

ARGENTINA: Additional relief from dryness will result from regular rounds of rain through the next week and by next Wednesday nearly all of the country will be left with enough soil moisture to support developing crops through the first ten days of February.

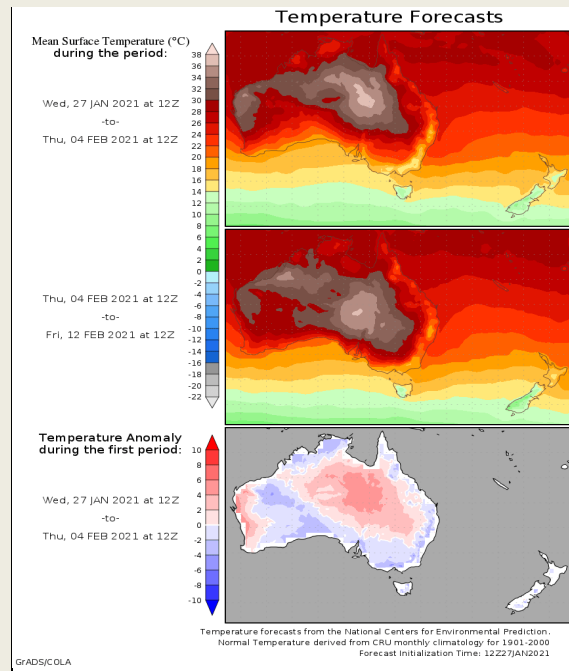
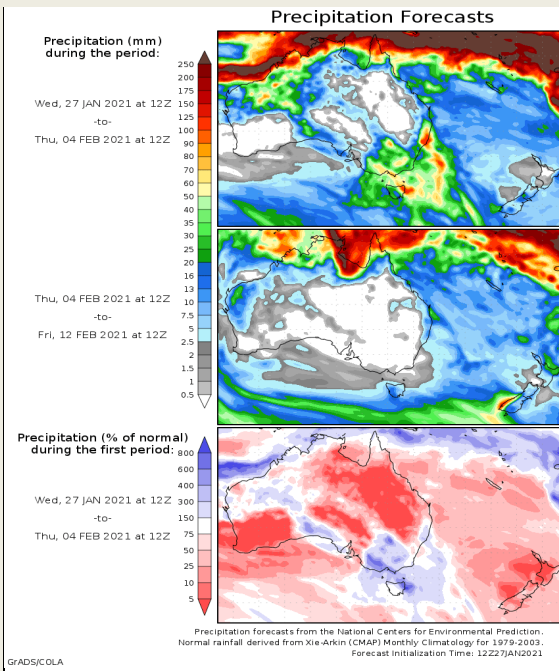
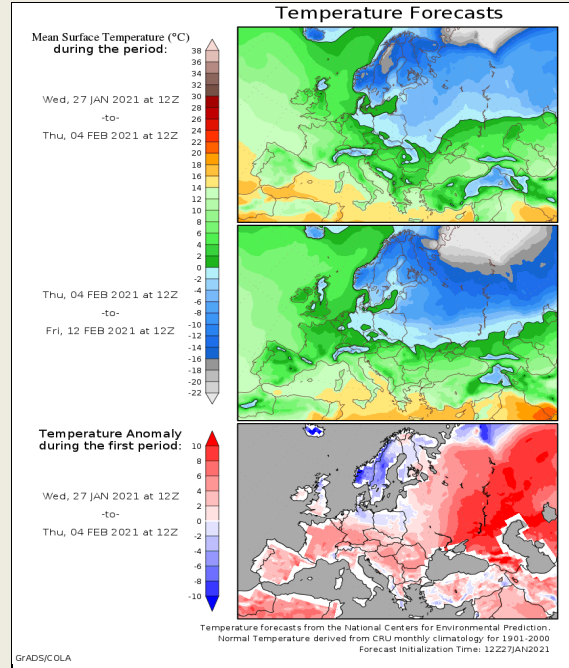
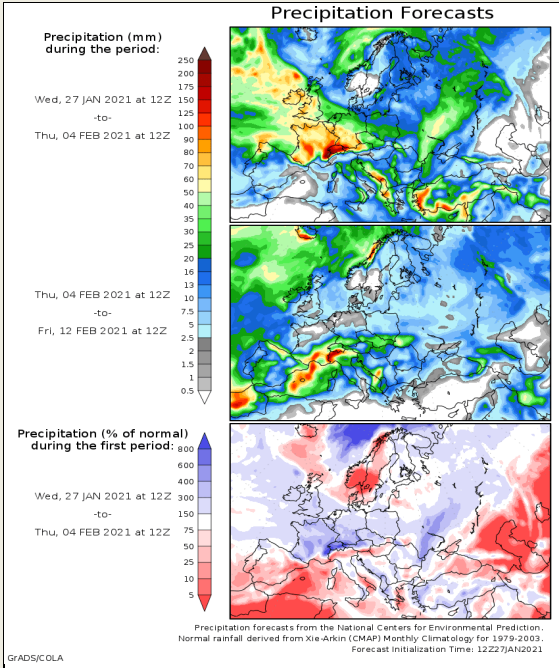


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Not much has changed in the outlook since Tuesday. Rounds of precipitation will impact northwestern and west-central Europe into Germany, Switzerland, northwestern Austria and the Czech Republic as well as southern Italy and the Balkan Nations this week. The greatest moisture in the Balkan Nations and southern Italy will occur Friday into the weekend. Frequent precipitation will occur in northwestern portions of the continent.

AUSTRALIA: Additional rounds of rain will impact southern New South Wales and Victoria this week, especially Thursday into Friday. Rounds of rain will also occur into coastal areas of east-central and northeastern New South Wales and southeastern Queensland, but interior areas of northern New South Wales and southern Queensland will experience drying this week. Most of the rain will occur east of the Great Dividing Range in east-central Australia. The precipitation will bolster soil moisture for improved dryland and irrigated cotton, sorghum and other crops in southeastern portions of the nation.



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
