

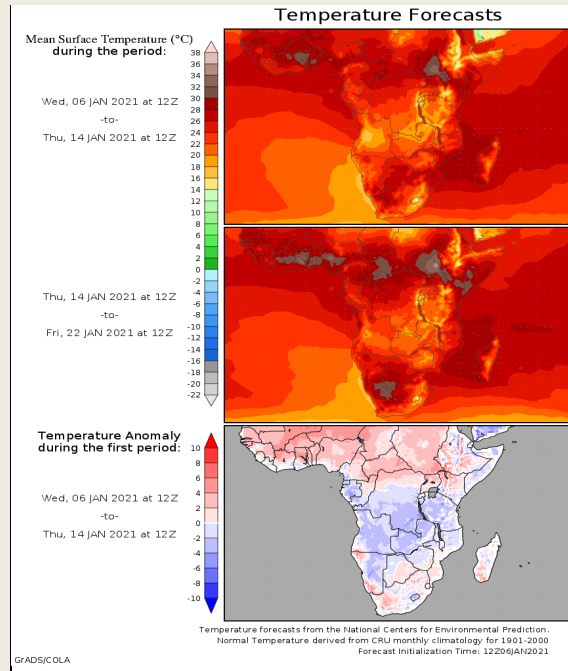
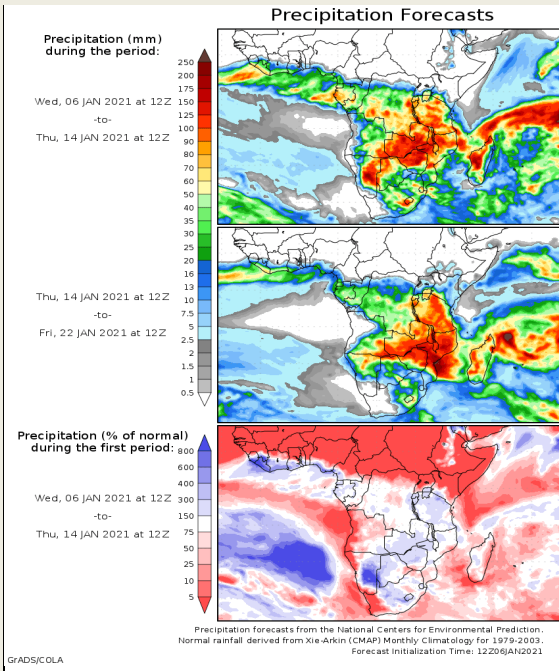
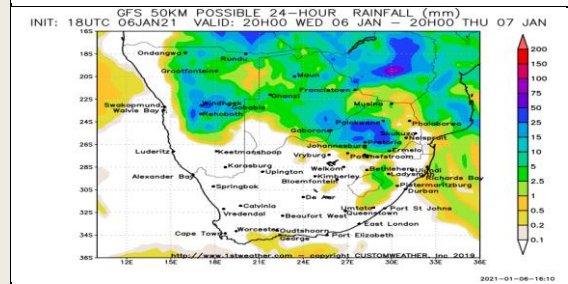
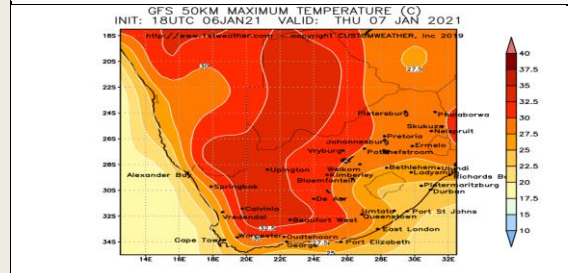
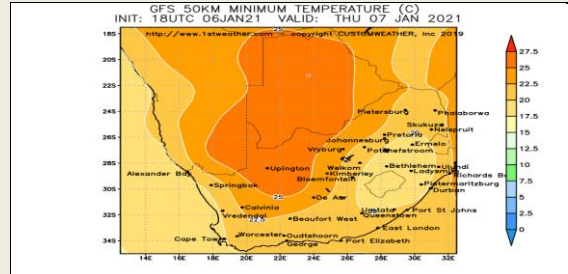
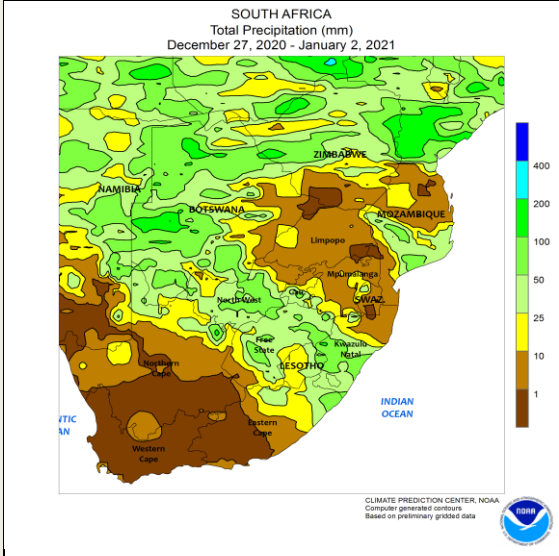


Weather Report

07 January 2021

South Africa - Weather

The main coarse grain and oilseed areas in eastern and central South Africa will continue to see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the middle of next week. The rain will help bolster or keep soil moisture at adequate to excessive levels. The environment will remain generally favorable for aggressive crop development. Fieldwork may otherwise be sluggish during the wettest periods. Late-season winter wheat harvesting will advance swiftly in Western Cape during the coming week due to mostly dry weather. Any harvesting not yet completed in Free State, North West, and Northern Cape will otherwise be slowed during the periods of rain.

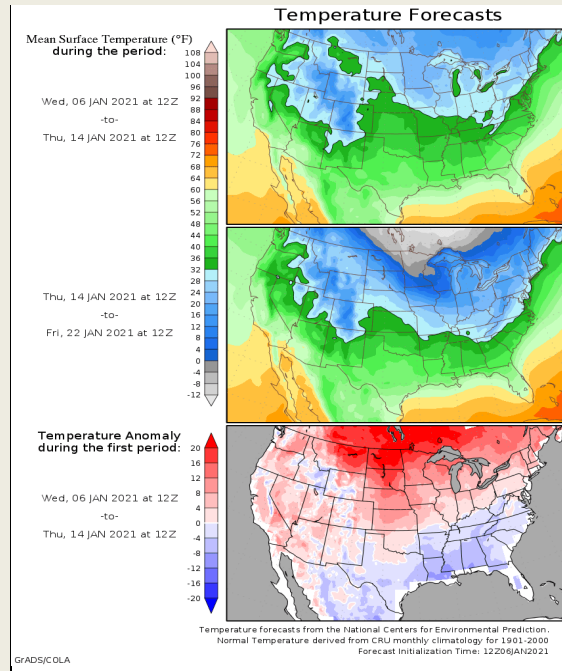
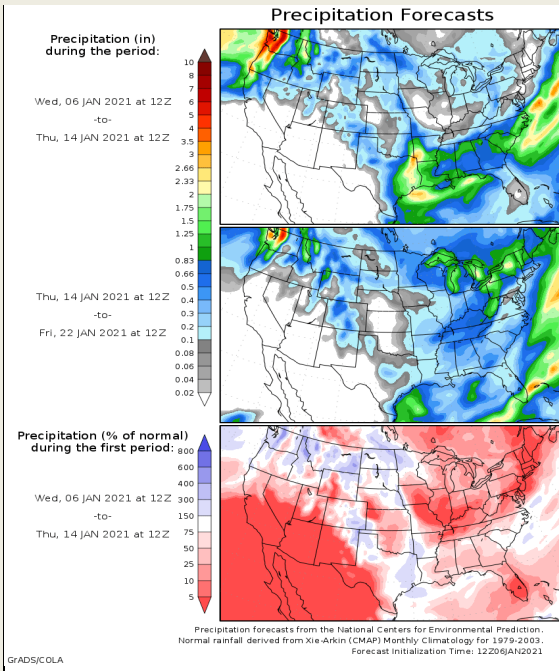
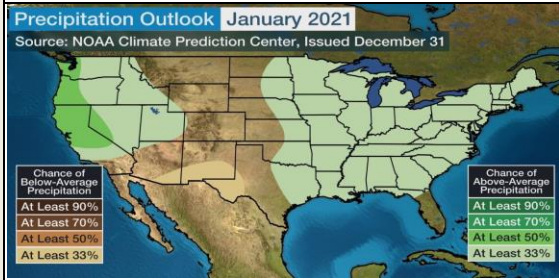
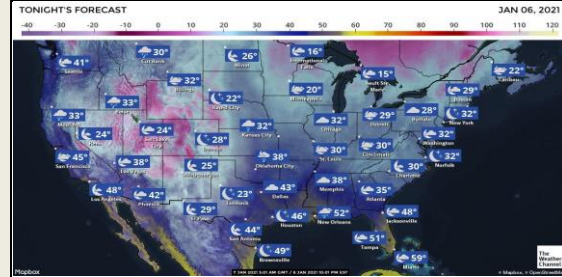
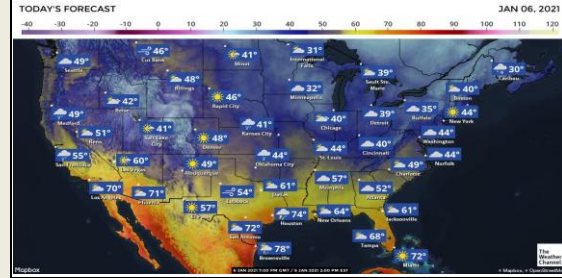
United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: A tranquil weather pattern will occur during the next ten days to two weeks with a few rounds of mostly light precipitation on occasion and no significant storm systems expected for at least ten days.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a few rounds of precipitation during the next ten days to two weeks with dry weather most common overall.

o Today into Wednesday will be mostly dry before precipitation increases Wednesday evening into Friday and is widespread across the Delta and the Southeast.

o Most of the precipitation will be rain and totals will vary from 0.20-1.10" and locally more with a light wintry mix of precipitation types possible in some northern areas.

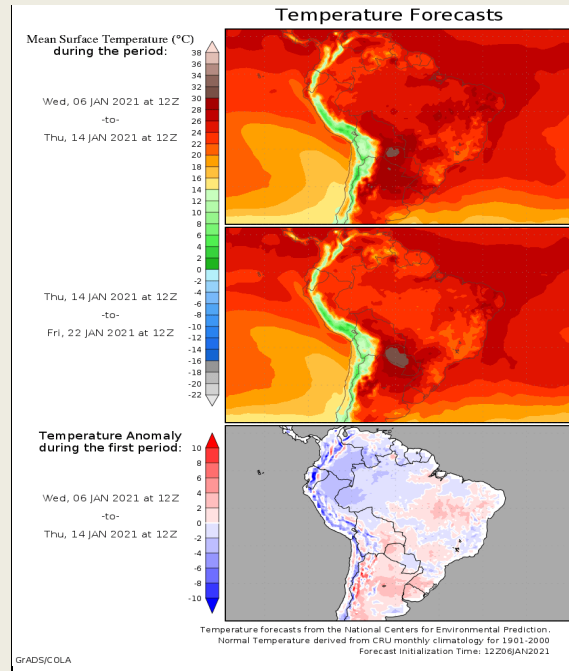
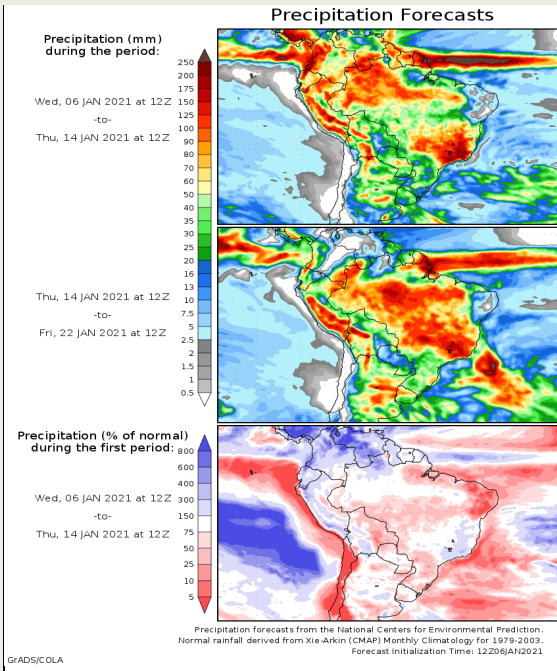
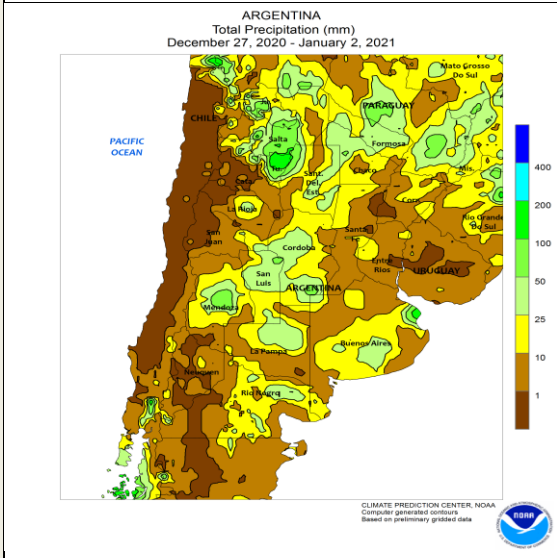
South America - Weather

BRAZIL: A good mix of rain and sunshine and favorable conditions for crop development will occur across much of Brazil and Paraguay during the next two weeks with a beneficial increase in rain beginning this weekend in Bahia and northeastern Minas Gerais.

o Central into eastern Bahia and northeastern Minas Gerais will continue to see poor conditions for crop development in unirrigated areas until rain increases this weekend.

ARGENTINA: The two-week outlook is more favorable for some crops in western and southern Argentina than what was advertised Monday due to rain Monday into today and follow-up rain Sunday into next week.

o Significant improvements in soil moisture and crop conditions have not and will not be widespread as many areas will not receive enough rain to allow for a lasting increase in soil moisture in temperatures that will often be hot. Drier weather will return Jan. 16-19 and unless rain returns soon, stress to crops should steadily increase again with the most serious stress from central Santa Fe to Entre Rios and then expanding to the south and west.

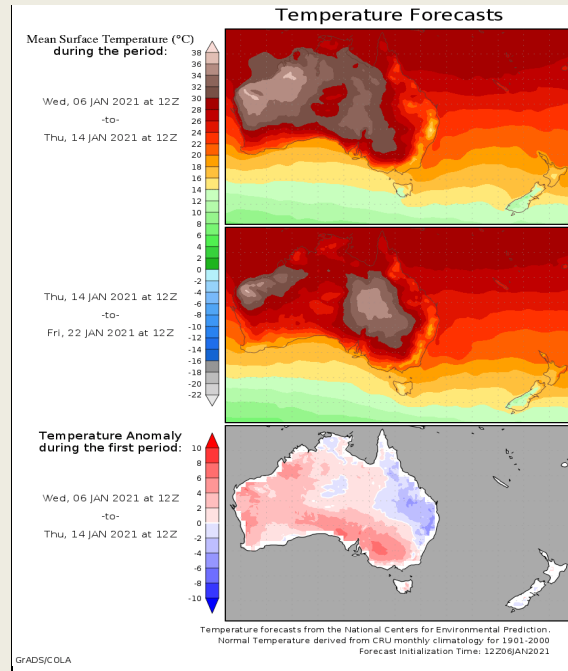
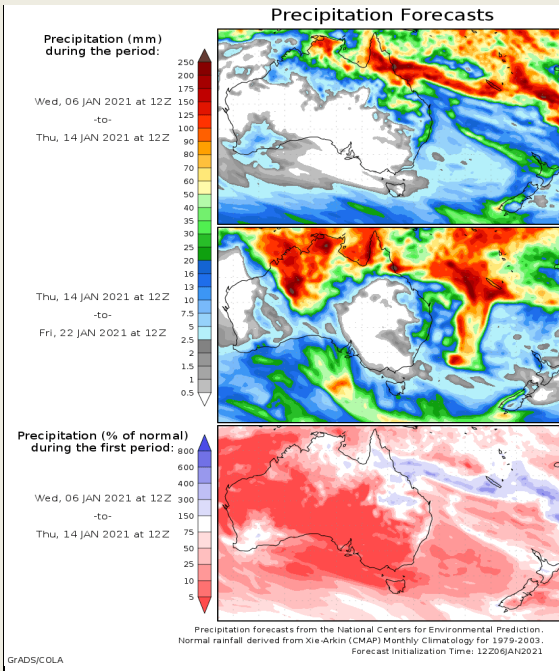
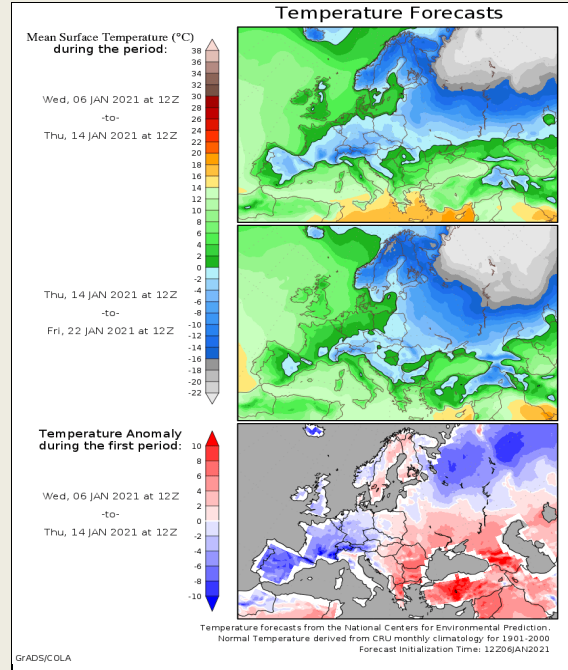
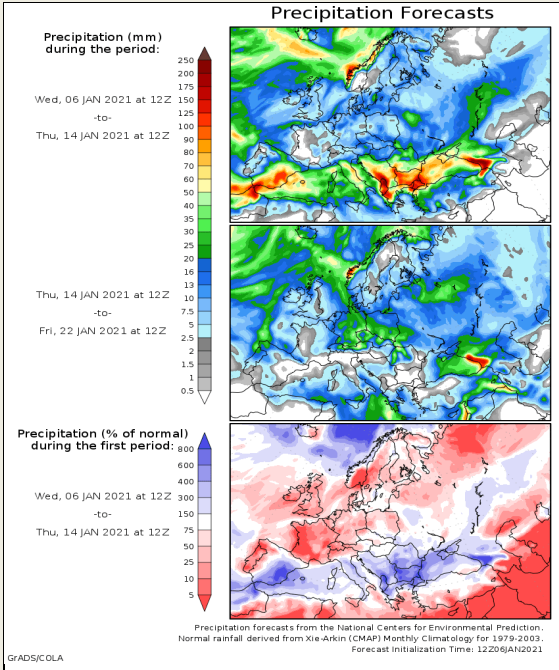
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Precipitation will be greatest over southern portions of the European Continent this week. Scattered precipitation will occur over south-central to southeastern Europe and Poland early this week and increase over the Iberian Peninsula Wednesday into Friday and return to southeastern Europe this coming weekend.

o Moisture totals by this time next week will range from 1.00 to 3.00 inches in southeastern Spain as well as southeastern France, Italy into the Balkan Nations.

AUSTRALIA: Rain showers and thunderstorms will occur over northeastern New South Wales and southeastern Queensland this coming week. The rainfall will be great enough to improve conditions in cotton and sorghum areas of southeastern Queensland, especially Wednesday into Thursday.

o Moisture totals will vary from 0.75 to 1.75 inches and local totals in excess of 2.50 inches.
