

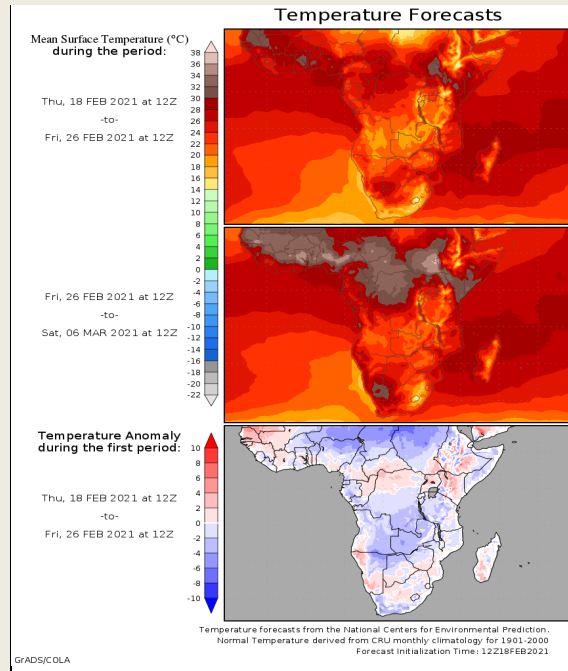
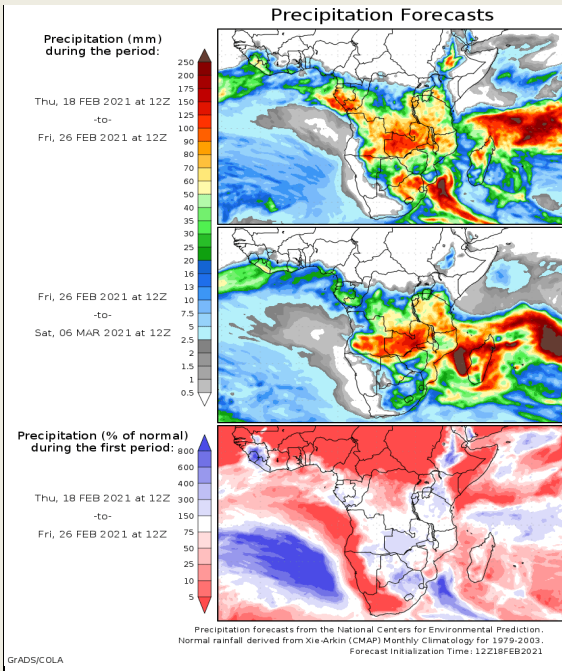
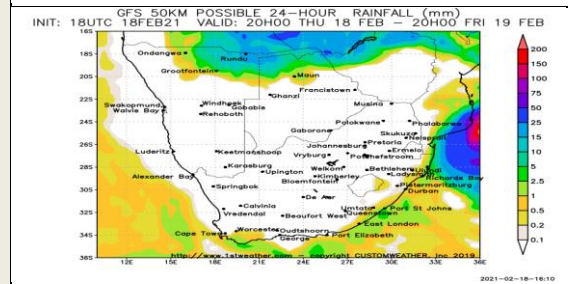
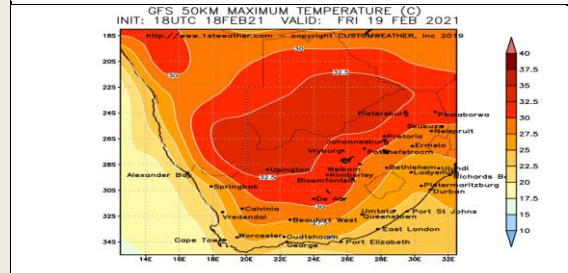
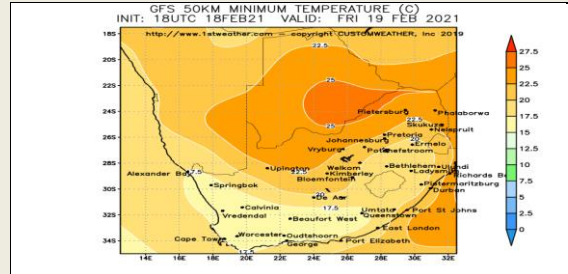
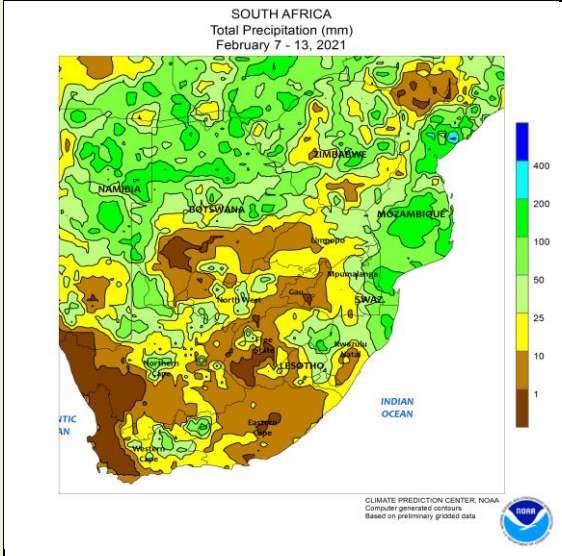


Weather Report

19 February 2021

South Africa - Weather

Much of eastern and central South Africa's main coarse grain and oilseed areas will continue to see a good mix of rain and sunshine during the coming week. The rain coming next week will be enough to keep soil moisture rated adequate to excessive outside Northern Cape and western fringes of Free State and North West. Crop development conditions will be mostly favorable, though development may become sluggish at times in the driest fields in Northern Cape.



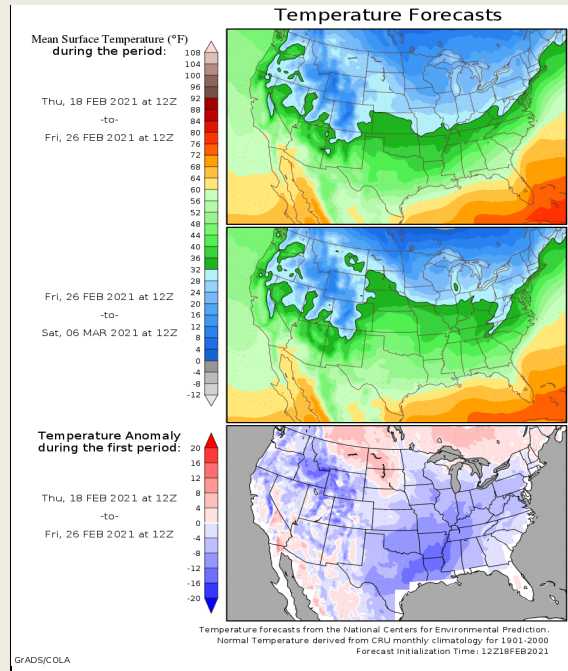
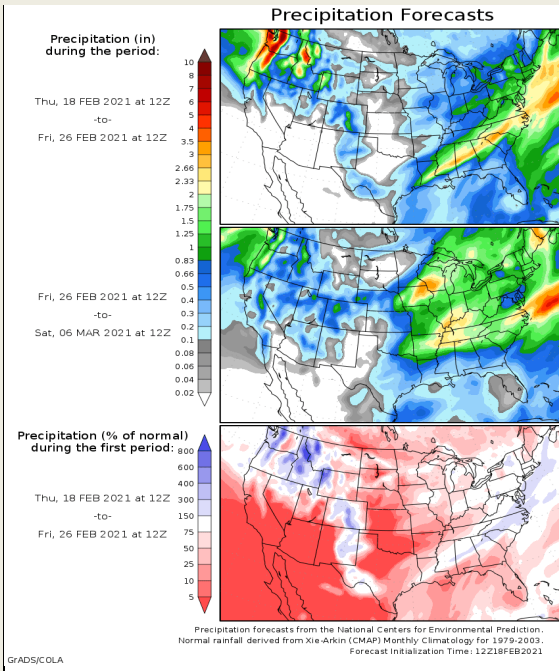
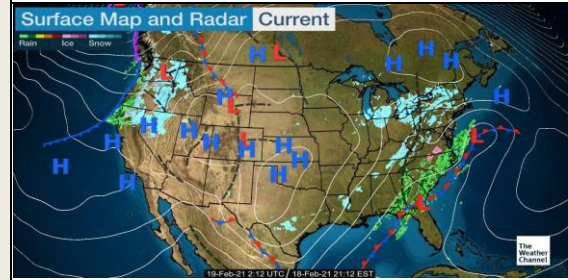
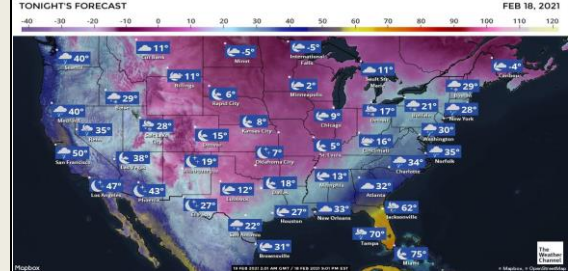
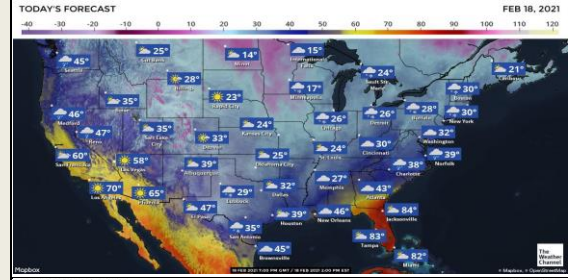
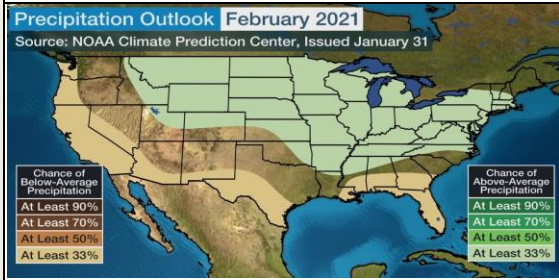
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United States of America - Weather

U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see relatively quiet weather pattern through Wednesday with little precipitation of significance before two storm systems impact the region from Feb. 25-Mar. 1. The lower Midwest will be wettest Feb. 25-26 with most of the precipitation seeing precipitation Feb. 28-Mar. 1. Gradual warming will continue during the next several days and by the early to middle part of next week most areas will be warmer than usual before some cooling occurs late next week.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a drier weather pattern Friday into Wednesday of next week, but most areas will remain too wet for early season fieldwork before two more rounds of precipitation affect large parts of the region Wednesday night into Mar. 1.

o Central and southern Georgia and the northern Florida Peninsula into southern Virginia will miss much of the precipitation Wednesday night into Friday of next week and some early season fieldwork may occur.

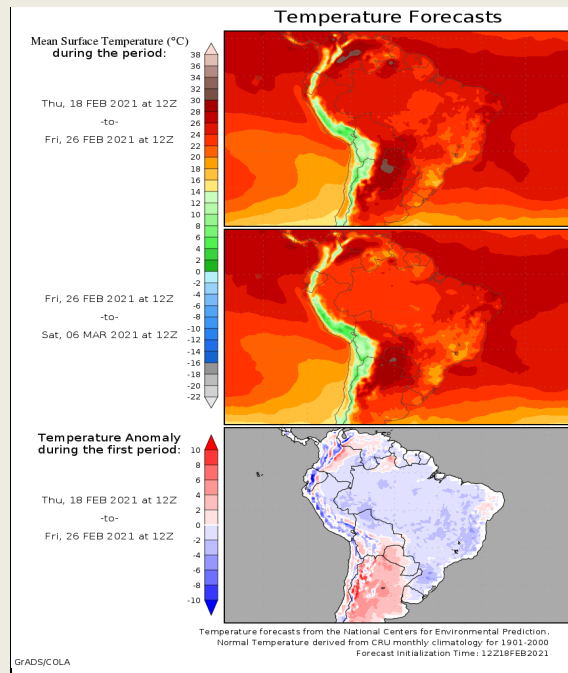
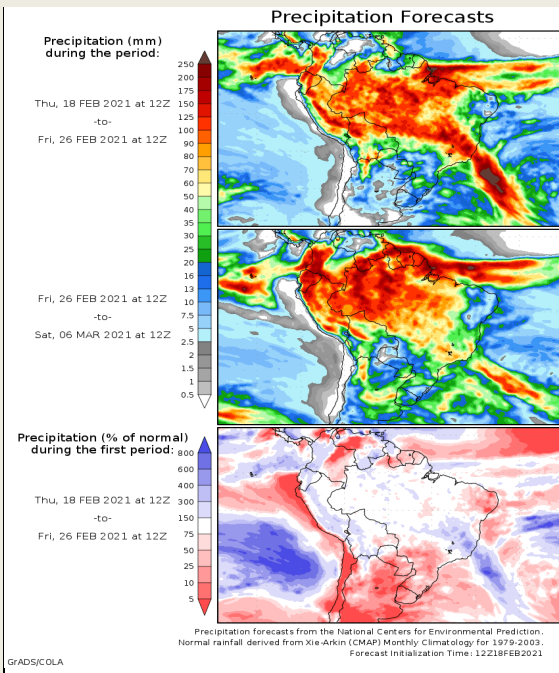
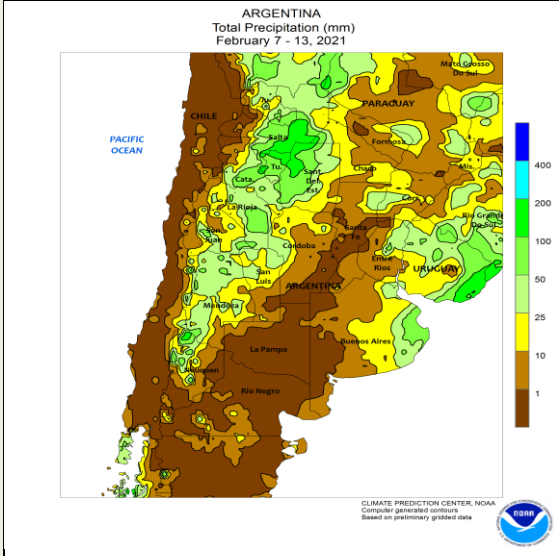


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South America - Weather

BRAZIL: Most of northern Brazil will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks with the rain slowing fieldwork threatening some soybeans with quality declines while the moisture is supportive of developing crops.
 o Mato Grosso and Goias to Minas Gerais will be wettest overall and some fieldwork should advance around the rain, but a large part of the second season corn crop in Mato Grosso has not and will not be planted in the optimal period which ends Saturday

ARGENTINA: Most areas then will see little to no rain of significance Wednesday through Saturday, Feb. 27 and stress to crops should expand from the driest areas of the southwest with most crops not yet likely to become "seriously" stressed.
 • A timely increase in showers should occur Feb. 28-March 3 and although most areas should not receive the soaking of rain needed to induce lasting improvements in soil moisture. Enough rain should fall to at least buy crops more time before more serious crop stress evolves.

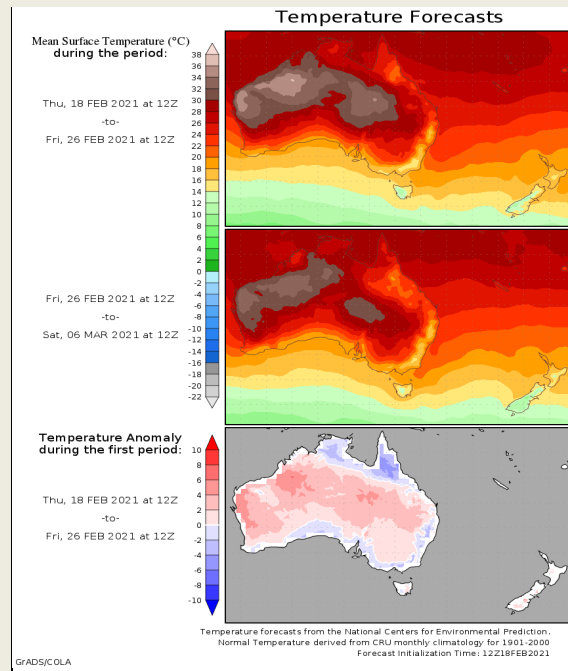
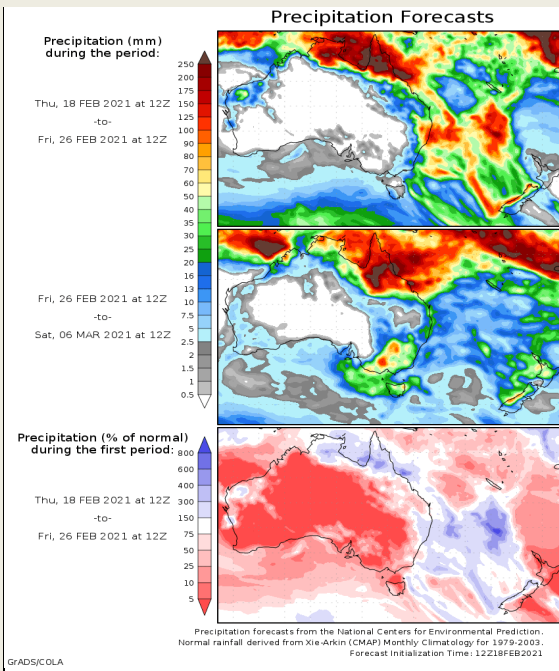
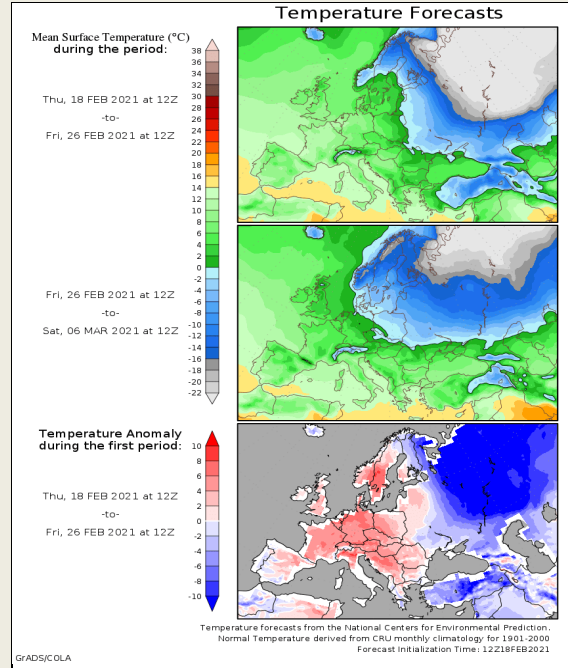
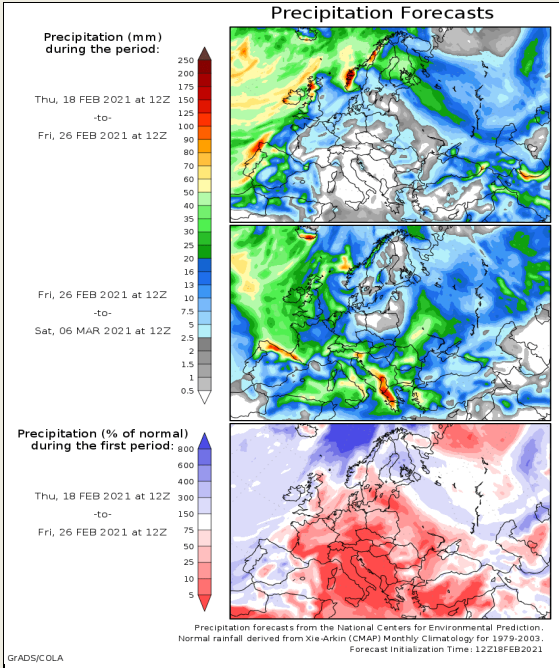


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Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather

EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will impact northern portions of the continent during the coming week while restricted precipitation occurs over most of mainland Europe. The only exceptions in mainland Europe will be areas from northern France, Belgium and the Netherlands through northern Germany and Denmark into Poland as well as northwestern Spain and northern Portugal.

AUSTRALIA: Key crop areas over interior southeastern Queensland and eastern New South Wales will receive an increase in shower and thunderstorm activity today into Saturday and again mid to late next workweek. The brief increases in scattered rainfall will be welcome and help provide some timely moisture for key crop areas. With that said, greater moisture would be welcome and net drying will occur most often. Moisture totals by this time next week will vary from 0.10 to 0.70 inch in most key crop areas and a few totals will vary from 1.00 to 2.00 inches.



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
