
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
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
South Africa - Weather


Northern Cape and western sections of both Free State and North West will continue to dry down through the end of next week. There is enough moisture in the subsoil to maintain a generally good environment for the coarse grains and oilseeds during the next few days. However, the ground will gradually become too dry for aggressive growth in the dryland areas next week. A good soaking of rain would be welcome in March to reverse the drying trend and maintain a good environment for most crops.

The remaining coarse grain and oilseed areas will see a good mix of rain and sunshine through the end of next week. The rain will help keep soil moisture at adequate to excessive levels. Development may be sluggish in the wettest fields, though no significant quality impacts are expected. The environment will otherwise remain mostly favorable for the crops.









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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see relatively quiet weather pattern through Thursday with little precipitation of significance before two storm systems impact the region from Feb. 26-Mar. 1. The lower and eastern Midwest will be wettest. Gradual warming will continue during the next few days and by the early to middle part of next week most areas will be warmer than usual before some cooling occurs late next week.


U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: The Delta and the Southeast will see a drier weather pattern into Wednesday, but most areas will remain too wet for early season fieldwork before two more rounds of precipitation affect much of the region Wednesday night into Mar. 1.

o Southern Georgia and northern Florida into central and eastern South Carolina will miss much of the precipitation Wednesday night into next Friday and some early season fieldwork may occur.









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South America - Weather


BRAZIL: Most of northern Brazil will see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms through the next two weeks with the rain slowing fieldwork and threatening some soybeans with quality decline while the moisture is supportive of developing crops.


o Mato Grosso and Goias to Minas Gerais will be wettest overall and some fieldwork should advance around the rain, but a large part of the second season corn crop in Mato Grosso will planted later


ARGENTINA: Today's forecast is drier for Feb. 28 into the first days of March and with warm to hot temperatures and limited rain in most areas through the next week stress to crops is likely to rise in many areas in early March.


o Soil moisture in place today and the light rain expected in many areas should support crop development for another week with some exceptions in the drier areas of La Pampa and western Buenos Aires where crop stress is likely to increase.

o Stress to crops should steadily increase and expand in early March until greater rain falls and some production cuts may occur if rain does not increase during the second week of the month.









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
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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: Rounds of precipitation will impact northern portions of the continent during the coming week while restricted precipitation occurs over most of mainland Europe. The only exceptions in mainland Europe will be areas from northern France, Belgium and the Netherlands through northern Germany and Denmark into Poland as well as northwestern Spain and northern Portugal.

AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will impact southeastern Queensland into northeastern New South Wales today into Tuesday. The greatest rain will occur in coastal areas and back into a few interior eastern key summer crop regions. Scattered thunderstorms will result in moisture totals varying from 0.75 to 2.00 inches in a few areas while surrounding areas receive light moisture up to 0.75 inch. Western Queensland and interior New South Wales summer crop areas will continue to dry down through the weekend and into Tuesday.









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
