



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
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
South Africa - Weather

Very good summer crop conditions are prevailing across the nation. Alternating periods of rain and sunshine are expected. Soil moisture will stay favorably rated except possibly in a few eastern Northern Cape and neighboring locations where dryness is expected periodically. There may also be a few pockets of dryness in Limpopo, as well.









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
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
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
United States of America - Weather


U.S. MIDWEST: The Midwest will see a relatively quiet weather pattern through Thursday before regular rounds of mostly light precipitation impact parts of the region Friday into Mar. S. The lower Midwest will be wettest overall while the far northwestern Corn Belt is driest. Temperatures will be warmer than normal most often through the next week and significant melting of snow will occur with the lower Midwest snow-free by the middle of the week.

U.S. DELTA AND SOUTHEAST: Rain will not be evenly distributed and the central and northern Delta through northern Georgia and into North Carolina and southern Virginia will be wettest and some heavy rain is likely, especially in the northern Delta where some flooding may occur. The lower Delta to southern Georgia, southern South Carolina, and northern Florida will see rain, but the rain should be light enough that some early season fieldwork advances around the precipitation.









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
South America - Weather


BRAZIL: The two-week outlook has not changed much since late last week and most of northern Brazil will continue see regular rounds of showers and thunderstorms with the resulting rain slowing fieldwork and threatening some soybeans with quality declines while the moisture is supportive of developing crops.


 Mato Grosso and Goias to western into southern Minas Gerais will be wettest overall and some fieldwork should advance around the rain, but planting delays for the second season corn crop in Mato Grosso will be extended.


ARGENTINA: Much of Argentina will see warm to hot temperatures and little rain through the next week and pockets of crop stress are likely to expand, but rain during the weekend and at least some rain into Thursday along with soil moisture still in place should prevent most crops from becoming seriously stressed right away.

 Greater rain will be needed very soon to prevent crop stress from becoming more serious with central and southwestern areas driest.









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
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
Europe, New Zealand and Australia - Weather


EUROPE: A restricted precipitation pattern will occur over a large portion of the European Continent during the coming week to ten days. Very little moisture will impact most of France, Italy and Germany into eastern Europe and southern Scandinavia and some locations will remain completely dry. Drying during the next ten days will increase the need for rainfall to return in March, but crops will continue to be supported from current soil moisture.


AUSTRALIA: Scattered showers and thunderstorms will impact southeastern Queensland into eastern New South Wales this week and help support summer crop development. The greatest rain will occur in coastal areas of northeastern New South Wales into a few surrounding interior areas where amounts will vary from 1.00 to 3.00 inches and locally greater amounts. In the meantime, moisture totals elsewhere will vary from 0.30 to 1.00 inch and local totals varying from 1.00 to 2.00 inches.

o Southwestern Queensland and western New South Wales into Victoria and southeastern South Australia summer crop areas will remain dry this week and crop moisture stress will continue to increase.









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
